

## WW1 Diaries Example sources and Starter Sentences

Read the 'Dairy of Everyday happenings in France 1918' and 'Dairy of Leading Stoker Victor Bethell, HMS Gloucester 1916'. Use the internet to access the following accounts:

**Harry Patch - the Last Tommy** - Henry John "Harry" Patch (born 17 June 1898, died 25 July 2009) was known as 'The Last Tommy' as he was the last surviving soldier known to have fought in the trenches of the First World War. **The Diary of Arthur Linfoot** - Arthur Linfoot volunteered for the Royal Army Medical Corps in 1915 aged 25. Instead of fighting, his role was to rescue injured soldiers on the battlefield, offering first aid and taking them to the hospitals behind the frontline.
