Uley, St Giles (registers start from 1668)

Uley is an ancient parish in the Diocese of Gloucester. It has been united with Owlpen since 1842. In 1856 the parish church was demolished and rebuilt by Charles J Jackson to a new design by the architect S S Teulon.
