Selection of Contractors

Gloucestershire County Council will procure these works through Open Tender to select the Contractors offering the best value for money.

The Contractors selected will be required to be members of the “Considerate Constructors Scheme”, to ensure that they are sensitive to local concerns.

Regular Liaison

Prior to the site works commencing, there will be further publicity and communications with the local community as the scheme develops.

During the site works Gloucestershire County Council will have representatives on site and their contact details will be made available to ensure feedback and any concerns are addressed promptly.

Environment

Approach To Assessment And Appraisal

The scheme is progressing through the Environmental Assessment Process, through screening/scoping, and site visits enabling any environmental constraints to be mitigated and incorporated into the final design.

Ecology

Habitat surveys are being carried out to identify the presence of any protected or invasive species that may affect the proposed works.

Trees

Any Tree Prevention Orders (TPOs) will be confirmed as the design is finalised. Due to the proximity to trees, an arboricultural method statement will be prepared to ensure that works are undertaken in accordance with regulations.

Water

Parts of the Lydney Recreation Trust Ground are classified by the Environment Agency as a Flood Zone 3 (land assessed as having a 1 in 100 or greater annual probability of river flooding), and the river Lyd is classified as a ‘Main’ river. The design has been developed to have negligible impact on the flood zone and liaison with the Environment Agency will continue regarding any ‘Flood Risk Activities’.
