

Metz Way/Abbeymead Avenue Corridor Works

Progress Update 24 October – 14 November

Eastern Avenue & Metz Way Junction (Site 2)

We have completed 75 percent of the new bases and ducting system, to allow the new traffic signals to be installed. We are also installing the new traffic signal cables. Works on the paving for the new toucan crossings started early November and we are anticipating they will be complete before the resurfacing of the junction. From 19 November there are ten night closures planned, to allow safe working zones as we start the re-surfacing works.



Junction of Abbeymead Avenue & North Upton Lane (Site 5)

The work to make sure the badger sets on the northern side are empty is complete and the area is cleared of all trees and shrubbery. We are currently installing the kerb drainage and ducting to the southern carriageway.



Junction of St Lawrence Road & Metz Way (Site 3)

The crossing is now fully operational and the resurfacing to each approach is planned for the end of November during the night closures of Metz Way.



Metz Way / Coney Hill Roundabout (Site 4)

The footway to the North East Corner of Coney Hill Road is now surfaced as part of the widening works. Works to the south west corner have now started. Works to the splitter islands will start next week. This is due to run until the middle of December.

Abbeymead Avenue / The Oaks (Site 6)

The new ducting has all been installed and the bases to the traffic signal poles have been cast. The new blister paving has been completed and the new signals are planned for installation and commissioning in the week commencing 26 November. A temporary pedestrian crossing will be put in place to provide a safe crossing point.
