

The Team for Children with Cognition and Learning, and Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties

- The team supports children and young people who have a range of significant and additional learning and social and emotional difficulties in mainstream settings
- The Team arrange regular Teaching and Learning Groups for (Primary & Secondary) to support school staff, parents and students with complex learning needs
- Support includes **in-service training, advice on** access to the curriculum and whole school activities, and early intervention strategies
- Resource demonstrations are available to enable the individual access to the curriculum
- The team responds to referrals from settings who request support for high levels of need in both cognition and learning and SEMH
- Contribution to processes linked to the Gloucestershire Graduated Pathway including SA/EHCP

Role of the Advisory Teacher

The Advisory Teachers provide training and advice for Settings:

- Curriculum access
- Problem solving to meet individual need
- Strategies and learning approaches
- Resource demonstration and advice
- Assessment and progress monitoring
- Good practice in relation to pupils working at pre key stage levels and those working within National Curriculum
- Advice on appropriate interventions
- Enabling pupil participation



Training

Training is an important aspect of the support provided by the Cognition and Learning, and Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties Team.

Transition planning is enabled via primary/secondary transition conferences, for pupils with Cognition and Learning, Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties.
