<p><b>6</b></p>	<p><b>GLOUCESTERSHIRE YOUTH COUNCIL</b> (Pages 21 - 24) (20 minutes)</p> <p>Please refer to the report attached outlining a suggested approach following the decision made by the County Council on 26 June 2019. The resolution below received unanimous support:</p> <p><b>RESOLVED</b> that this Council notes that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are nearly 40,000 young people, aged 11-18 in Gloucestershire, representing a significant proportion of the county’s population.</li> <li>• Youth councils have the potential to benefit those involved by giving participants a sense of control in decision-making processes as well as developing participants’ skill-sets.</li> <li>• Youth councils have the potential to benefit the wider community by bringing fresh ideas and solutions to the Council.</li> </ul> <p>The Council also notes the work of District Councils, the Police and Crime Commissioner and the NHS to engage more effectively with young people in Gloucestershire.</p> <p>This Council further notes that Gloucestershire’s inability to retain and attract young adults has been identified as one of the critical challenges to the economic viability of the county.</p> <p>This Council therefore resolves to work with Leadership Gloucestershire to establish a Youth Council to give young people a voice on the issues that affect them across Gloucestershire, irrespective of which body is responsible for those services.</p>	<p>Cllr Mark Hawthorne Chris Spencer</p>
