Why this presentation?

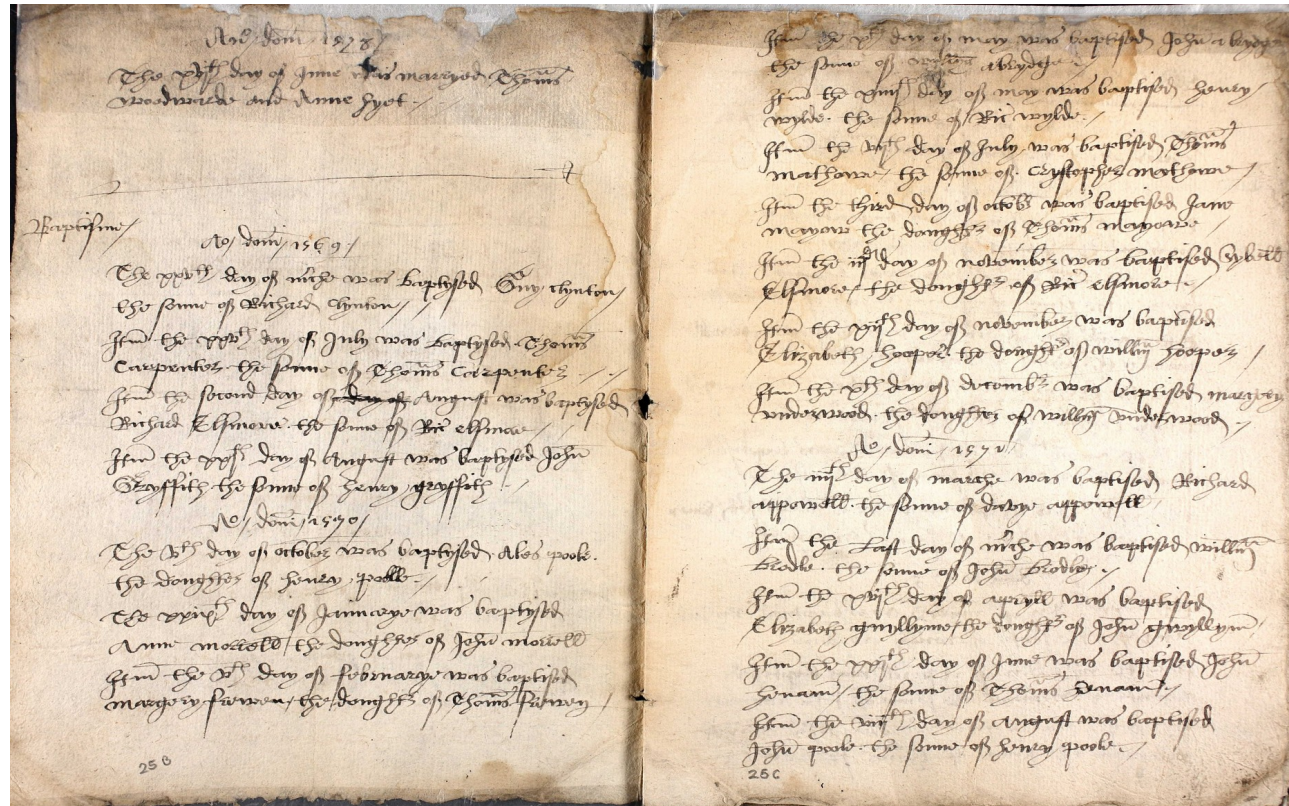
Some technology

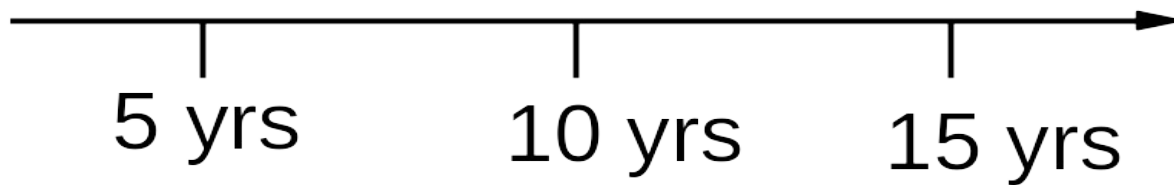
“redundancy” and “end-of-life”...

End-of-life:

need for a succession of
information systems



“Digital” versus “analogue”:

challenge #1: “survival”

challenge #2: “authenticity”

Authentic preservation:

being able to demonstrate
that information has survived

Exit plans (orderly):

audit, and
verify “authenticity”

Institutional / organisational
“failure”:

Carillion!

Exit plans (disorderly):
information “redundancy”
