

### Block of Air Geese Theatre Handbook

The group stand in a socially distant circle. The leader demonstrates a 'block of air' and using exact movements, shaping it into an object of any size or type. It might be a pair of glasses, cricket bat, violin or hang glider; it could be anything. Once the leader shapes the object, and briefly mimes how the object is used or interacted with (e.g. playing the violin). The group members then guess what it is. When the correct guess is made, the leader takes the object and 'throws' it to the next person who takes it and claps their hands to create a new block of air. This person then shapes the block of air into some other object.
