

Suitable Evidence for Concessionary Bus Pass Applications

Suitable proofs of address:

You will need to provide **one** of the following proofs of address:

- Bank statement
- NHS medical card
- Benefit book / letter
- Council tax bill
- Driving licence
- Optical / medical prescription counterfoil
- Utility bill

Suitable proofs of age:

You will need to provide **one** of the following proofs of age:

- Passport
- Driving licence
- Birth certificate

Suitable proofs of disability:

You will need to provide **one** of the following proofs of disability.

- A valid Blue Badge.
- War pensioner's mobility supplement award letter
- Letter awarding the higher rate mobility component of the Disability Living Allowance
- A letter from the Department of Transport stating that under Part III of the Road Traffic Act 1988 you have been refused or had your driving licence withdrawn pursuant to section 92 of that Act
- Certificate of Vision Impairment signed by a Consultant Ophthalmologist

If you are unable to provide a proof of disability:

If you are unable to provide one of the proofs of disability listed above you will need to provide **one** of the **forms D1 to D8**, which are included in *Your Free Bus Travel Pack*. The form must be completed and signed by your consultant or specialist.

Note that a letter or certificate from your doctor/GP will not be accepted as evidence.

A D1 to D8 form is only required if you cannot provide one of the proofs of disability listed above.
