Issue 9 April 2009

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INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Economic section of the County Council Chief Executive's Support Unit Research Team. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

Part 1: Summary
The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.


PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 3.6% in April 2009. This was an increase of 0.1% on the March 2009 figure. The rate has been continually increasing since July 2008. The UK rate has increased by 0.1% between March and April 2009 with the South West rate remaining the same at 3.1. Gloucestershire's rate remains above the South West average of 3.1%, but 0.5% lower than the UK average of 4.1%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in April 2009 rose by 474 people. The amount of people claiming in April 2009 was 3.9% higher than the number in March 2009 compared to a 1.4% increase in the South West and 2.2% for the UK.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire has been increasing since July 2008, it was 144% higher in April 2009 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

As at the end of April 2009 there were 688 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.4%

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 3.6% in April 2009. The rate has remained slightly higher than the South West average over the past year, but persistently lower by approximately 0.5% against the UK average during the same period. April 2009 represented a 0.1% increase on March 2009.

Table 1 shows that in April 2009, the numbers of claimants in Gloucestershire was 3.9% higher than the numbers in March 2009. This is 1.7% higher than the UK figure and 2.5% higher than the South West.

The average growth in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to April 2009 was 9.0%. This is 2.3% higher than the UK average and 0.4% higher than the South West region.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - April 2009




Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for April 2009 in Gloucestershire. Every district in Gloucestershire experienced an increase in the claimant rate between March 2009 and April 2009.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts




Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count for Gloucestershire over the past year. It demonstrates the gap that is widening across all the districts as the UK economy continues in recession. The widest gaps unsurprisingly reflect the urban areas of Cheltenham and Gloucester.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham was at its highest for over a year at 4.1%. The rate has been climbing for twelve consecutive months.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 5 shows the claimant count continually increasing each month since July 2008. In addition, claimant counts have increased every month compared to the same month in the previous year since July 2008.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - April 2009



Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 7 shows the claimant rate in Cotswold District was at its highest for over a year at 2.2%. The rate has been increasing since June 2008.

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - April 2009





Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District. Nine wards lie above the District average of 2.2%.



Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean was at its highest for over a year at 3.8%. The rate has been increasing since July 2008.


Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - April 2009




Figure 13: Gloucester City claimant rate over the last year




Figure 13 shows the claimant rate for Gloucester City was at the highest point for over a year at 4.8%. The rate has been increasing since May 2008.

Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - April 2009




Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City. Seven wards are above the City average of 4.8%.




Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - April 2009





Figure 18 shows the claimant rates in Stroud District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District and eleven of the wards are above the District average of 3.0%.

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 19 shows the claimant rate for Tewkesbury District was at 3.2%, the highest it has been for over a year.

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 20 shows that claimant count has on the whole been increasing since June 2008. The rate in April 2009 figure was 142% higher than it was in April 2008.

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - April 2009






Claimant unemployment rate by LSOA in Gloucestershire April 2009






PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

SUMMARY

As at the end of April 2009 there were 688 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.4%. We are pleased to be reporting that during April the rate of increase of NEET joiners has slowed and in four of the six districts, the NEET population has decreased slightly since March. Gloucester City does show an increase in its NEET population, up from 3.7% in March.

NEET prevention

A key aspect of the work undertaken by the Youth Support Service in Gloucestershire is activities and intervention to support NEET prevention. Services are working closely together to both identify young people deemed to be 'at risk' of becoming NEET and to develop strategies to re-engage this group into positive outcomes.

September Guarantee

The September Guarantee is a national initiative which supports NEET prevention by aiming to ensure that all school leavers are guaranteed an offer of Post 16 education or training. Given the current economic climate, key stakeholders (including the LA, Connexions and the LSC) are seeking to ensure that our positive performance during 2008 (which saw 94% of school leavers obtain an offer) is replicated and improved.
