The Claimant Count is a measure of the number of people who are unemployed and claiming benefits. From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, this was based on the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead.

To reflect this change, the Claimant Count has been expanded to include people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit and who are out of work. For more information about Universal Credit please see the [ONS website](#).

INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).


PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.1% in March 2017. This remained the same as the February 2017 figure. The South West rate increased to 1.4% and the UK rate remained the same at 2.0%. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.3% lower than the South West average of 1.4%, and 0.9% lower than the UK average of 2.0%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in March 2017 increased by 75 people. The amount of people claiming in March 2017 was 1.8% higher than the number in February 2017. This compares to a 2.8% increase in the South West and a 2.1% increase for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 4.1% lower in March 2017 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.1% in March 2017. The Gloucestershire rate has been lower than the South West average since November 2015, with the exception of April and May 2016 when it was the same. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.8% against the UK average.

Table 1 shows that in March 2017, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 1.8% higher than the number in February 2017.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to March 2017 was 0.4%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - March 2017



Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts




Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count by district over the past year. Overall, the number of claimants has decreased slightly over the last year.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham increased in March 2017 to 1.2%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 5 shows the claimant count increased by 7.3% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased between February 2017 and March 2017 to 0.6%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - March 2017






Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - March 2017




Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean increased in March 2017 to 1.3%.

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 11 shows the claimant count increased by 1.6% since last month. The change on the previous year has decreased between February 2017 and March 2017 to -7.9%.

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - March 2017





Figure 12 shows the claimant rates for Forest of Dean District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.3%. Nine wards lie above the average.




Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - March 2017







Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - March 2017







Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - March 2017










Claimant Count Rate by LSOA in Gloucestershire, March 2017

Figure 22: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year




Figure 22 shows that in March 2017, 960 people aged 18-24 were claiming Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit who were not in work in Gloucestershire, this represents 22.3% of total working age claimants.

Figure 23: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 23 shows the number of young claimants increased in March 2017 by 6.1%, this represented 55 people. Over the last year the number of young claimants decreased by 6.3% or 65 people.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of March 2017 there were 459 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.18%. The total number of NEET young people decreased by 40 in March 2017 compared to February 2017, all 6 districts saw an decrease in their figure.
