Gloucestershire Early Years Conference

Following feedback from the sector it has been agreed that the Early Years and Childcare Service will hold **2** conferences in the academic year 2026/27.

The details confirmed so far:

- Duplicate events will take place on Friday 6th November 2026 and Saturday 24th April 2027.
- Events will take place at The Cheltenham Chase Hotel
- Both dates will be open to daycare and childminder providers
- There will be 120 delegate places available at each event
- There will be a keynote speaker, a choice of 4 workshops, and an endnote speaker. Each workshop will take place in a breakout room as opposed to the main room which has previously been used.
- Providers can book 4 spaces at each event. If spaces are not filled by a specific date providers may book more spaces.
- There will be a short lunch break of 45 minutes where a buffet lunch of sandwiches and hot chips will be included in the ticket cost.

More details will follow over the coming months. Bookings will be open on **the 7th September 2026** so save the dates in your diary now!

Support for children with additional needs transitioning to primary school

The Advisory Teaching Service would like to inform providers of the upcoming deadline for requests for involvement for preschool children who will be transitioning to primary school in September 2026.

To ensure timely planning and support, all requests for involvement for children currently attending preschool and due to start primary education must be submitted to the Advisory Teaching Service **no later than Friday, 20 March 2026**.

This deadline enables their team to review information, allocate advisory support, and liaise with receiving schools to ensure smooth and effective transitions for children with additional needs.

Please ensure referral forms are completed fully and submitted via the usual process. If you have an urgent or priority case that falls outside the timeframe above, please speak to your locality Lead Advisory Teacher for advice.

Early Years Inclusion Champion Award

We are excited to announce the launch of our Early Years Inclusion Champion Award!

This award will acknowledge and celebrate Early Years Providers that deliver high quality inclusive practice to all children, including those with SEND. We know that many of you are already doing this, and we would therefore encourage you to sign up to showcase your practice and receive recognition and financial reward.

To successfully gain the award, you must demonstrate that your setting meets the standards of inclusion as set out on the platform. There is no time limit on completion so you can work through this at your own pace. All applications will be quality assured by the Early Years Inclusion Team and additional support/advice is available from this team throughout your journey. On successful completion, the award is valid for 3 years.

You should consider re-applying for this award after two years to ensure continuous Champion status.

Total Communication Training in the Early Years - This training is

provided in house at your setting.

You can now book Total Communication in the Early Years through GCC+. To do this you will need to log into your setting's GCC+ account. Go to the **search bar** on the **home page**, and type in Total Communications and **press the search key**.

You will then see the link for the Total Communications for you to book.

(Please note – if you search in the ‘training section’ or the ‘services’ section, you won’t find it. It must be searched for in the home page search and the search key pressed). NB - If you just press enter, it won’t find it.

Once you have booked and checked out your training, you will be contacted by an EY Inclusion Advisor to arrange the date and time for the delivery of your course. If you have not heard from us within 2 weeks, please contact the EY Admin Team: eyservice@goucestershire.gov.uk.
