Issue 198 January 2025

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The Claimant Count is a measure of the number of people who are unemployed and claiming benefits. From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, this was based on the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead. **To reflect this change, the Claimant Count has been expanded to include people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit and who are searching for work.**

Since 2016 Gloucestershire has been transitioning to full Universal Credit with the process due to be completed in 2025. This means a broader span of claimants will be required to look for work than under Jobseekers Allowance. As more people are brought within the coverage of Universal Credit, the Claimant Count is set to rise. In addition, in May 2024 the DWP rolled out an increase in the administrative earnings threshold (AET) for full work search conditionality. This means a cohort of claimants who are in work but on an income below the AET will now be required to search for work. This change is likely to affect around 180,000 claimants across the country over around 6 months, increasing the Claimant Count over that time. INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Data, Analysis & Insights Team in the County Council's Planning, Performance and Insight function. The data are sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk). All data are rounded to the nearest 5 and may not precisely add to the sum of the number of people claiming JSA, and the number of people claiming Universal Credit required to seek work, due to independent rounding.

PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire increased to 2.7% in January 2025. The South West rate remained at 2.8%, whilst the UK rate increased to 4.1%. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.1% lower than the South West average of 2.8%, and 1.4% lower than the UK average of 4.1%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in January 2025 increased by 295 people. The amount of people claiming in January was 2.8% higher than the number in December. This compares to a 3.1% increase in the South West, and a 1.7% increase in the UK.

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

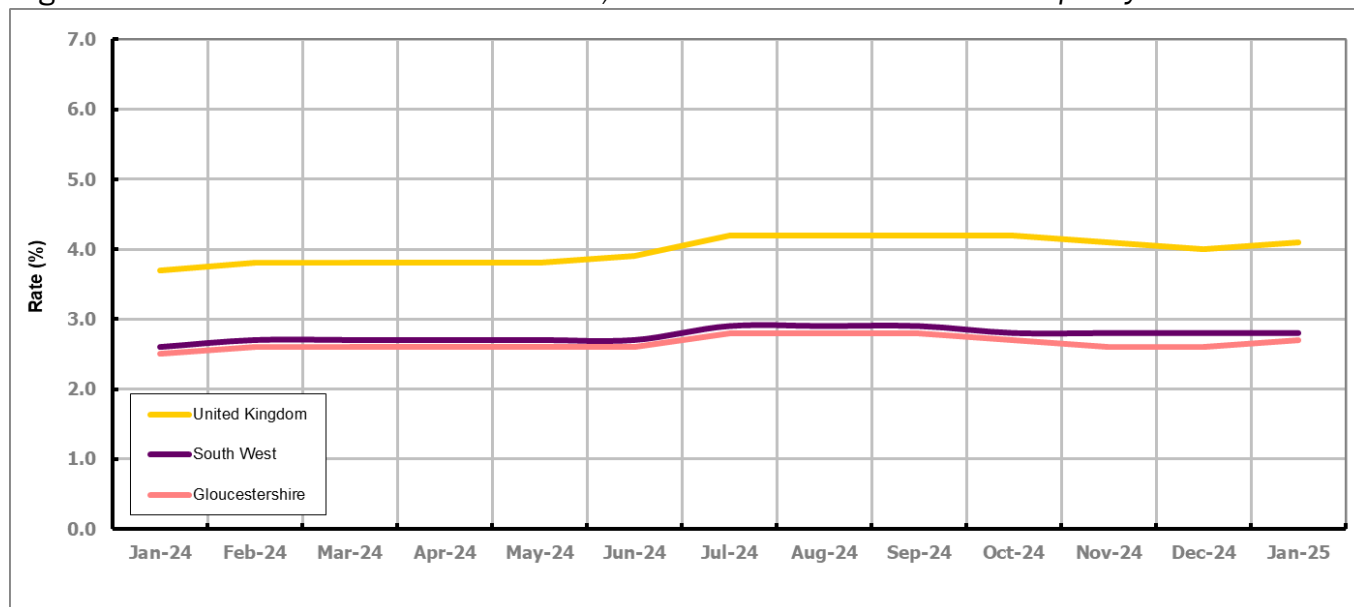


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.7% in January 2025. The Gloucestershire rate has been lower than the South West average since November 2015, with the exception of April and May 2016 and, more recently, November 2023 when it was the same. On average, it has been approximately 1.3% lower than the UK average since the same month of the previous year.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - January 2025

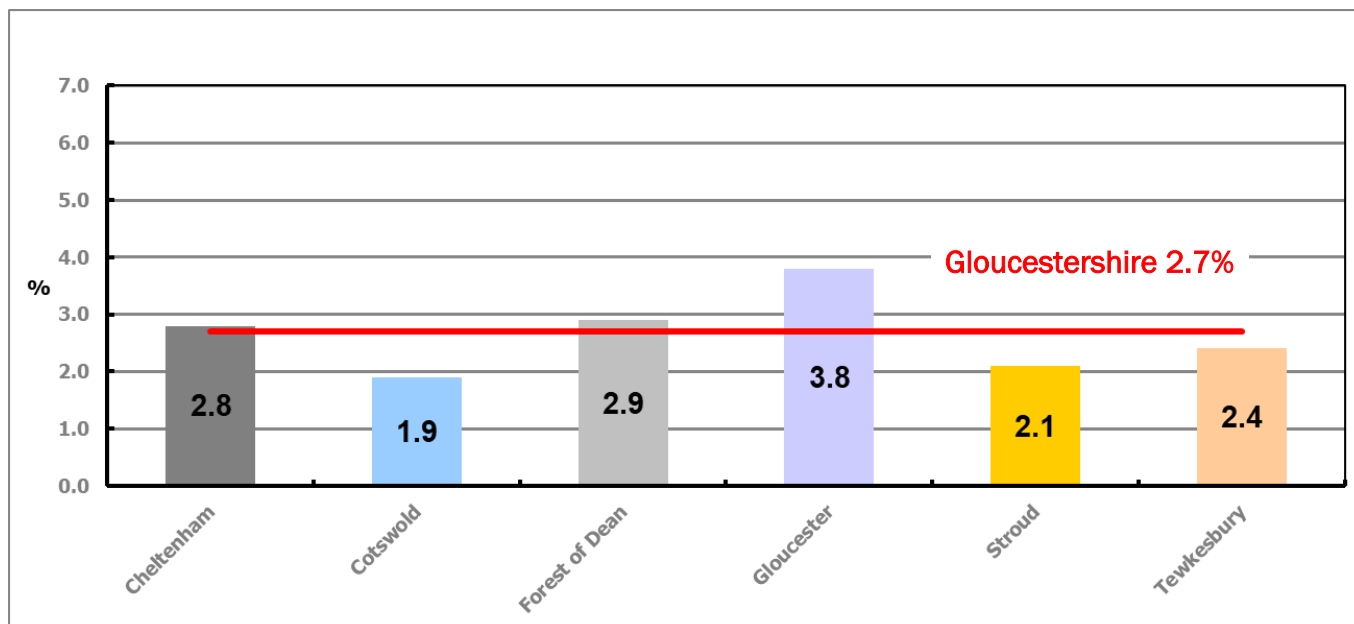


Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for January 2025 in Gloucestershire. Between December 2024 and January 2025 the rate remained the same in Cotswold and Tewkesbury, whilst the rate in all other districts increased.

Figure 3: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

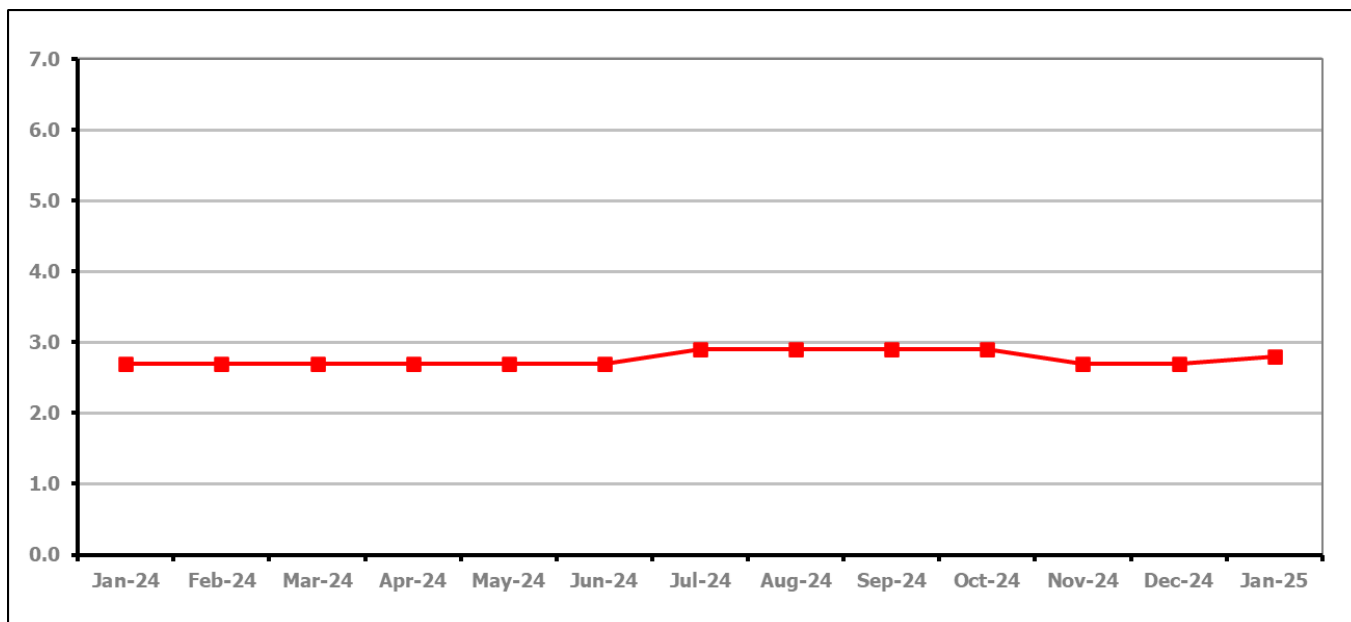


Figure 3 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham increased to 2.8% in January 2025.

Figure 4: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - January 2025

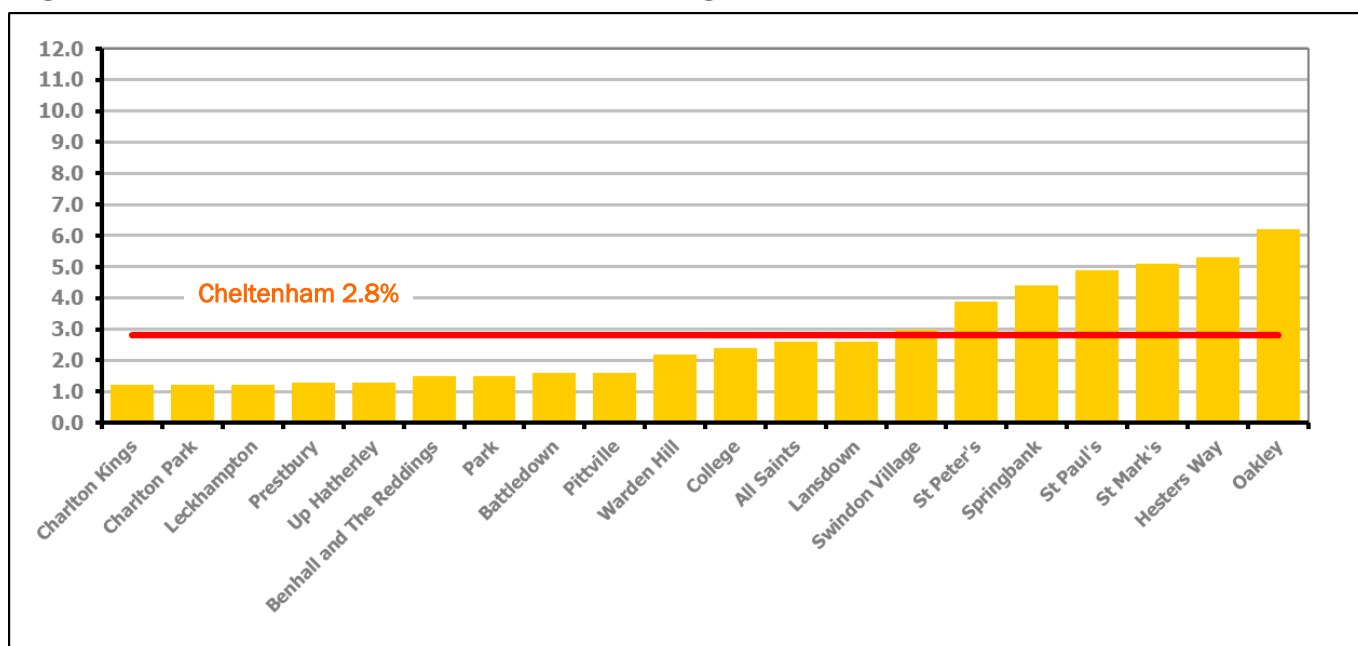

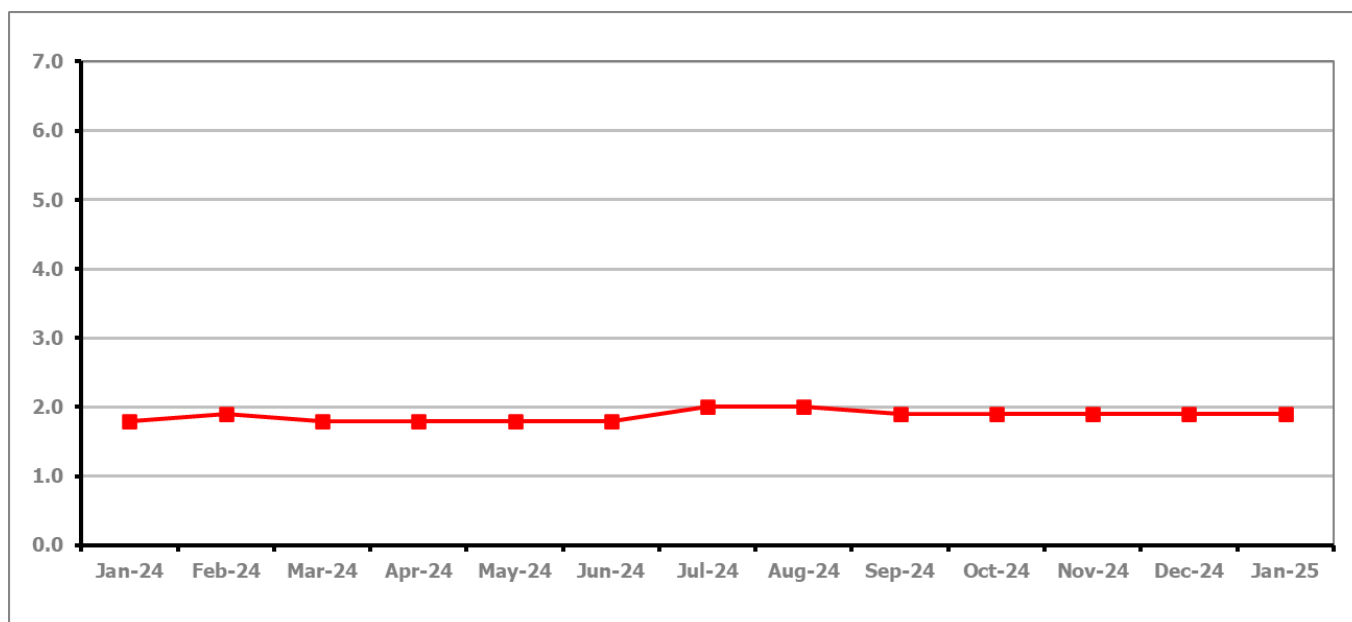

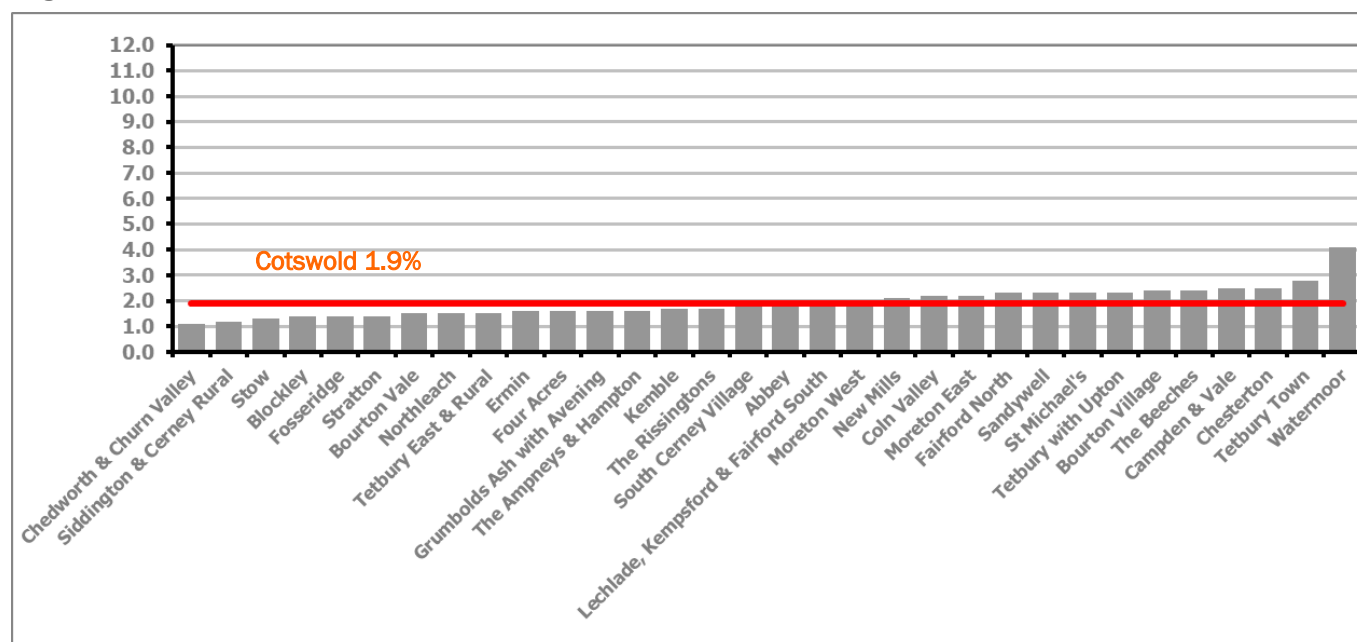
Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards – January 2025

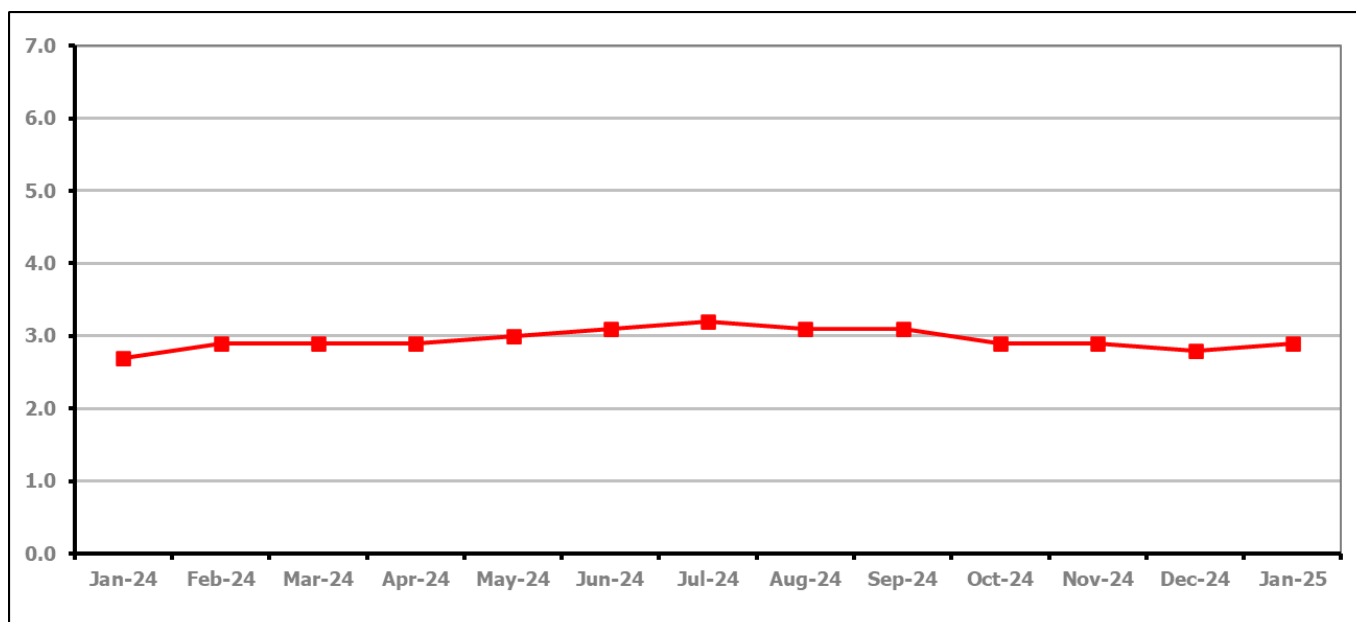

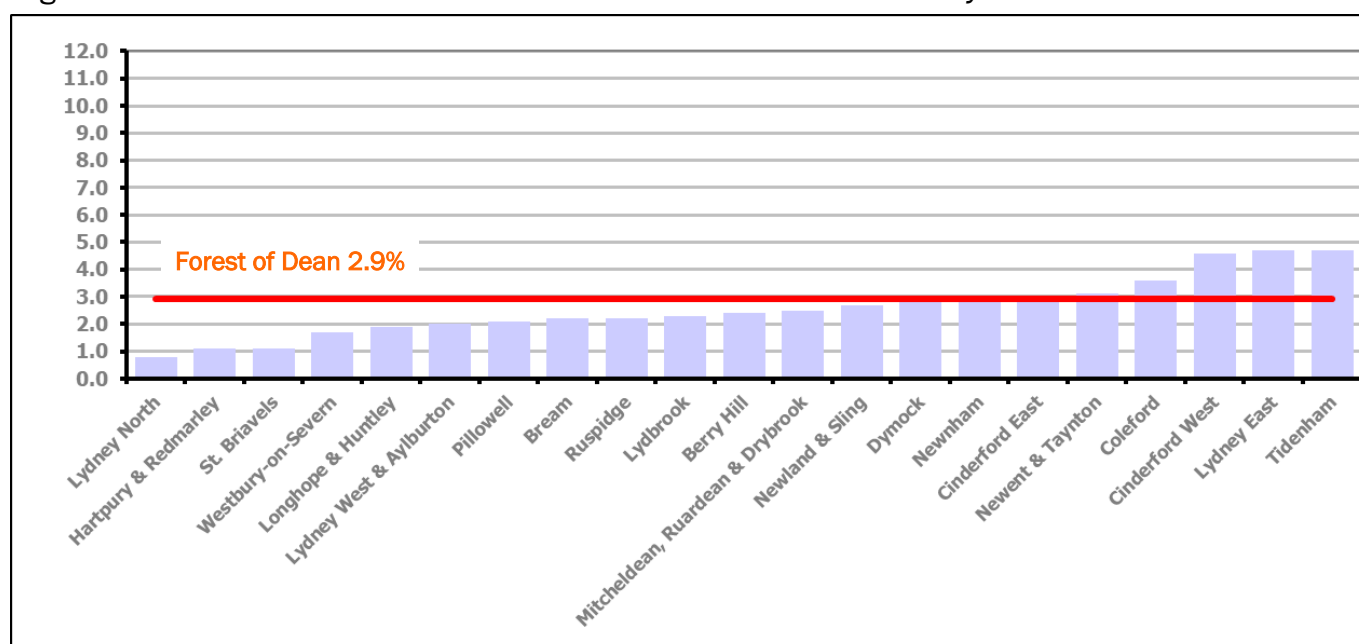
Figure 8: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards – January 2025

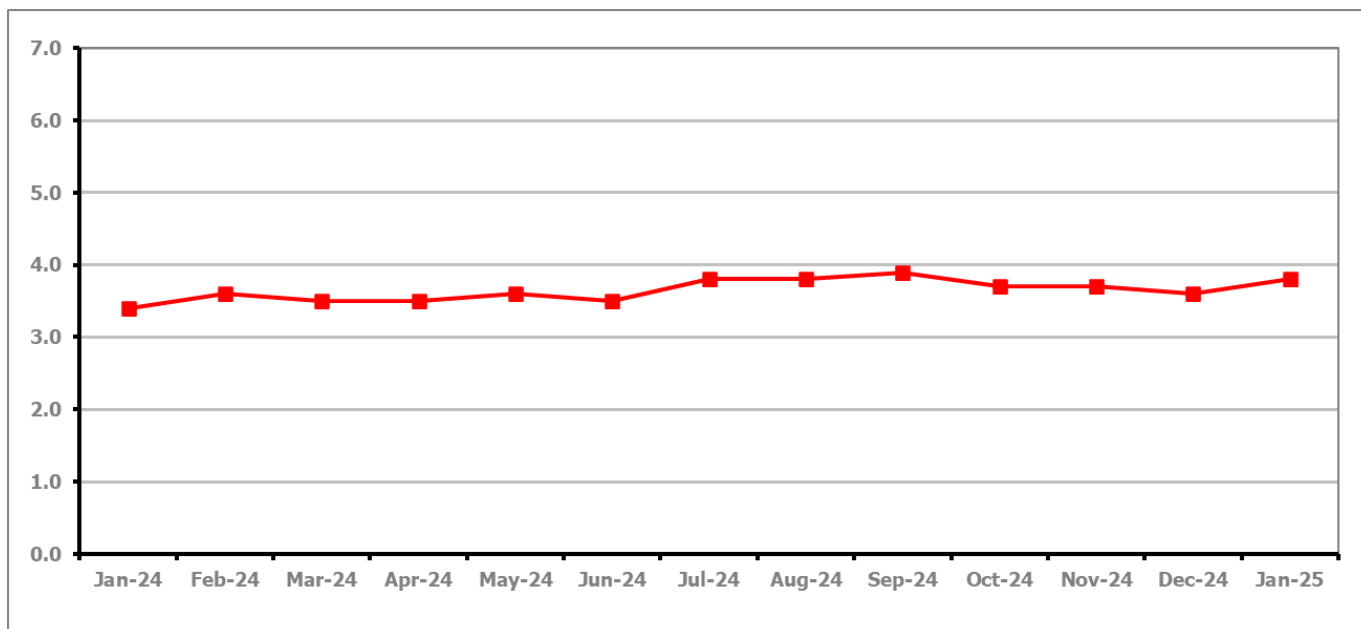

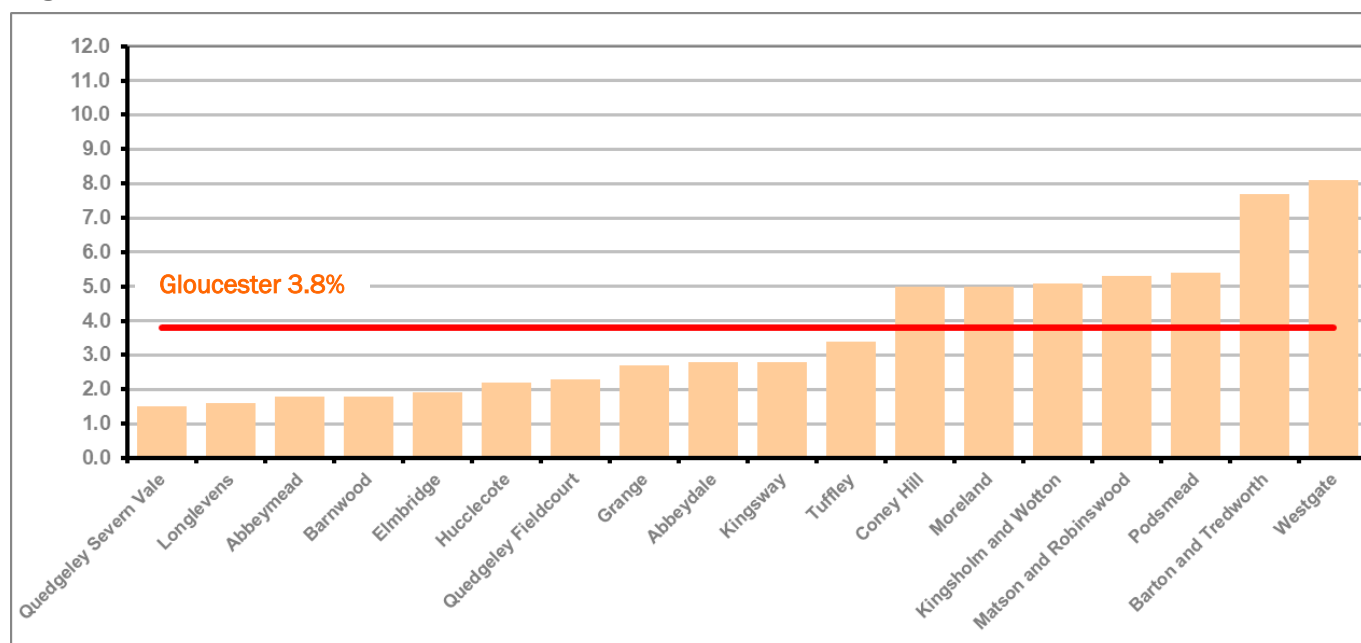
Figure 10: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - January 2025

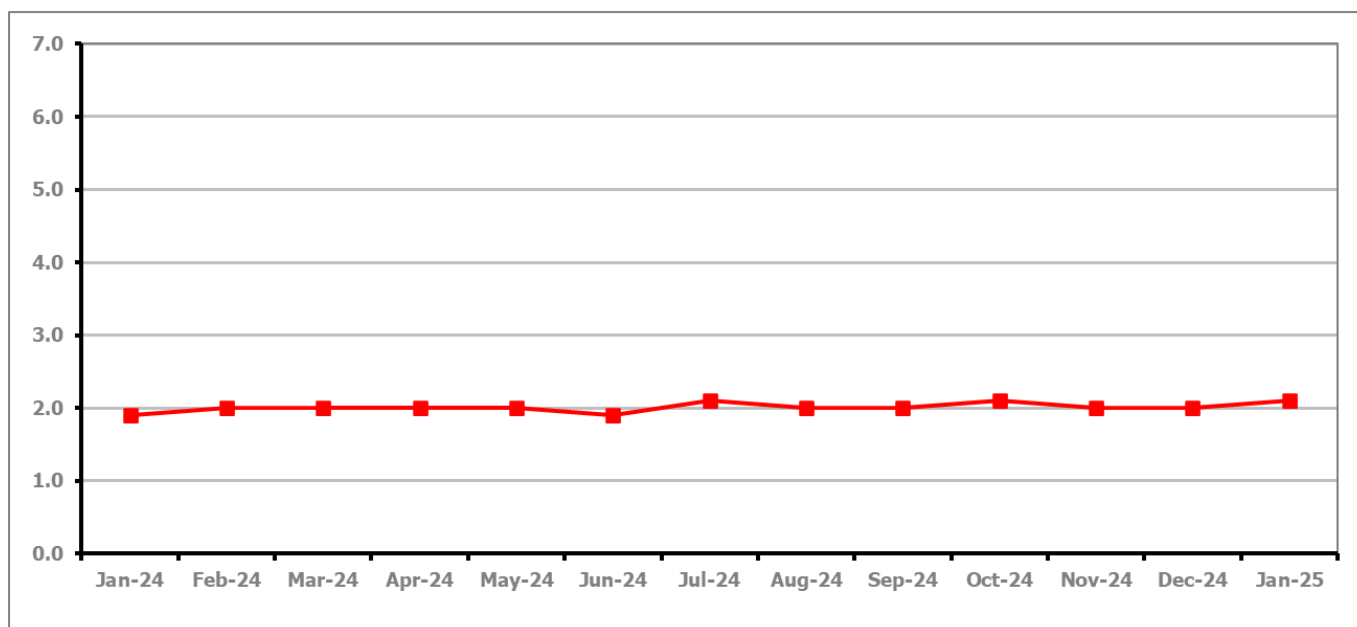

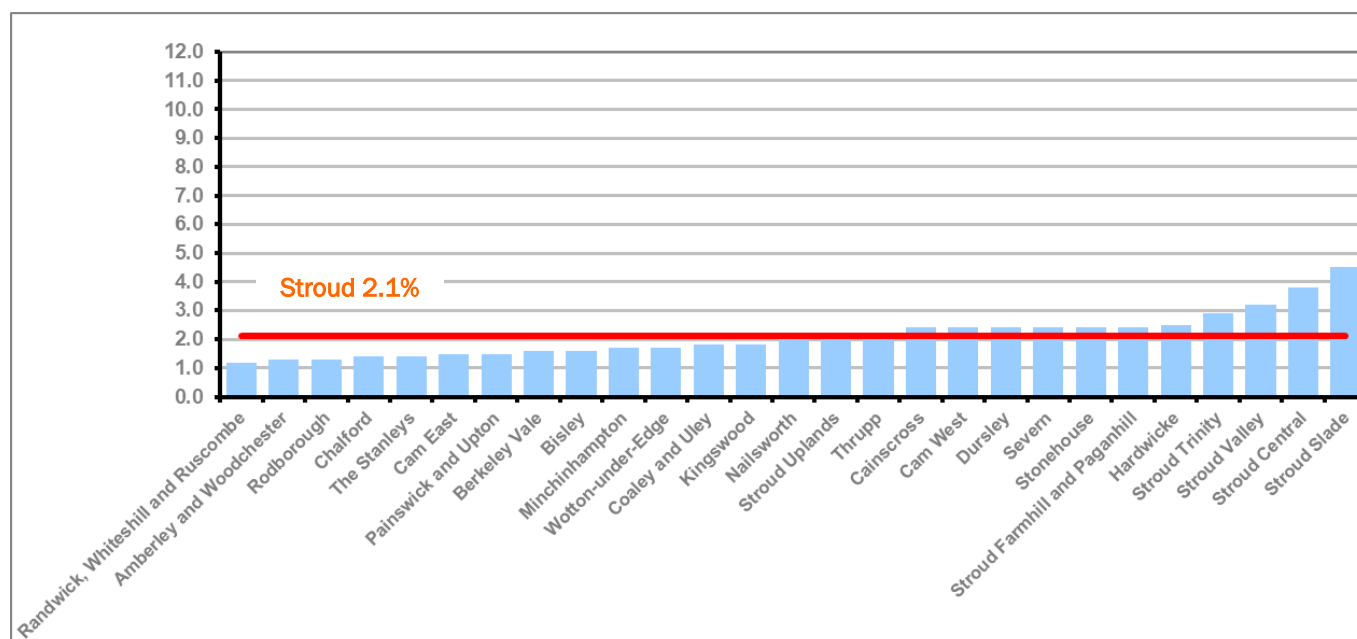
Figure 12: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - January 2025

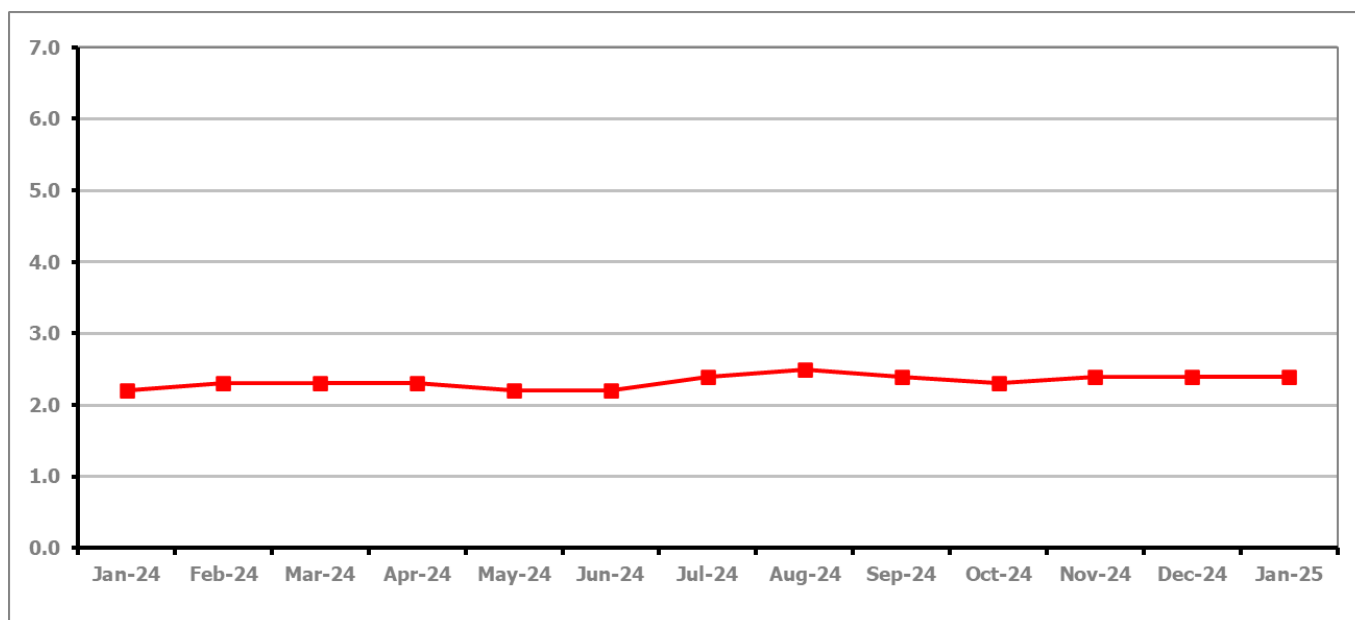

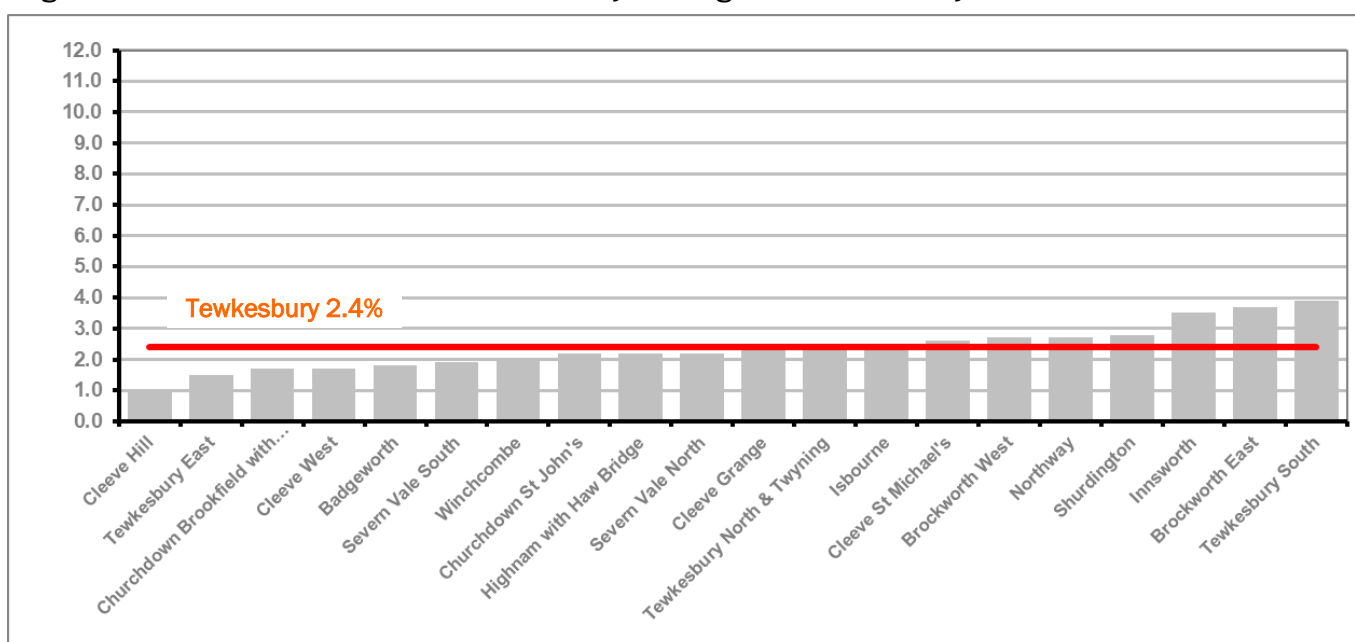
Figure 14: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury Borough wards - January 2025

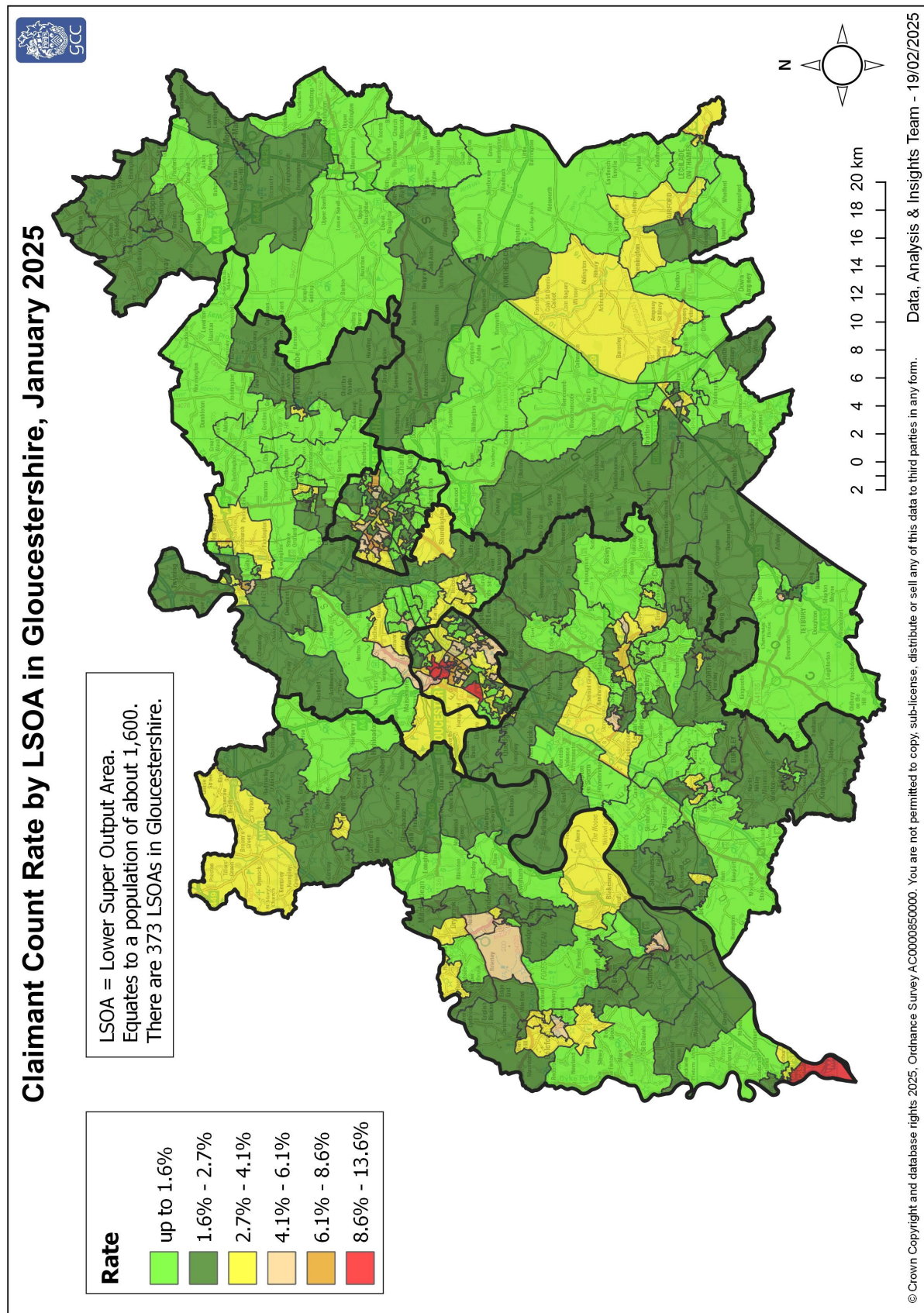

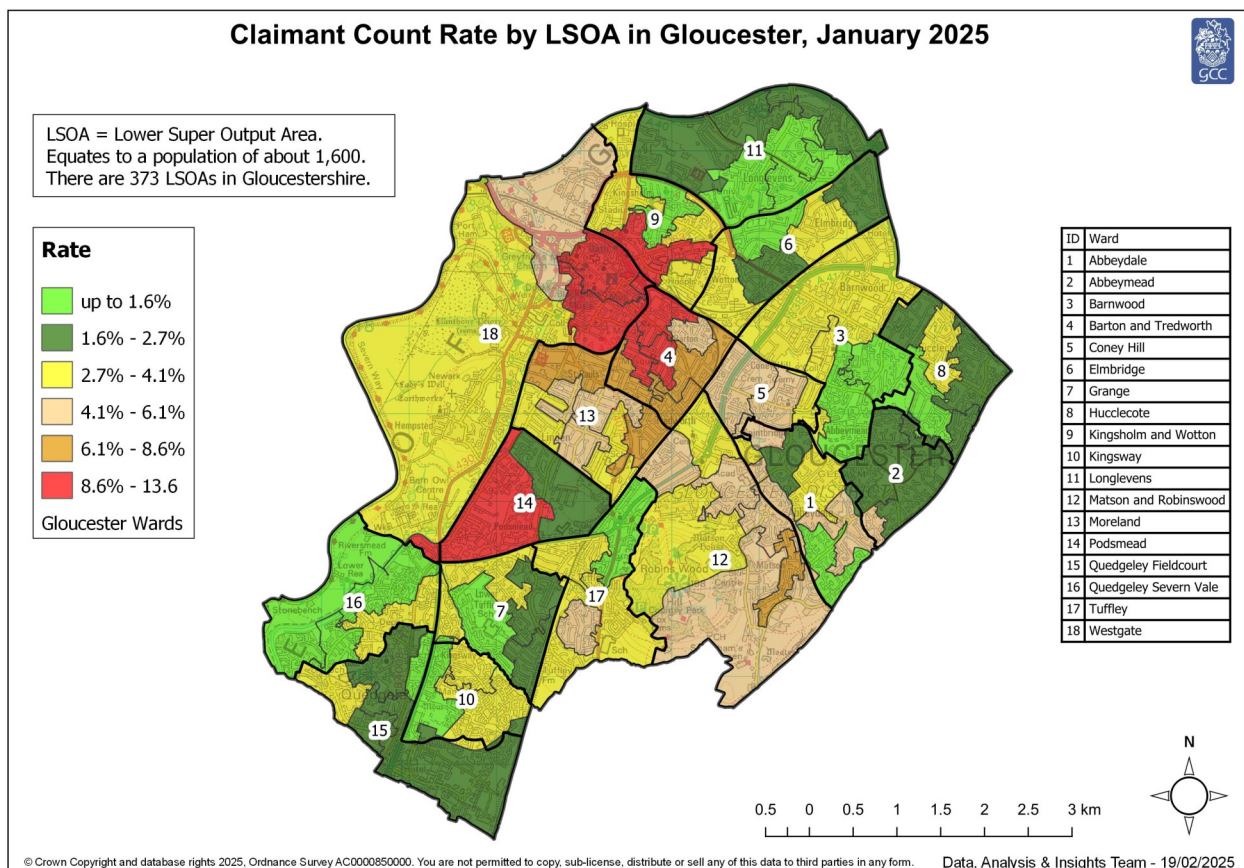
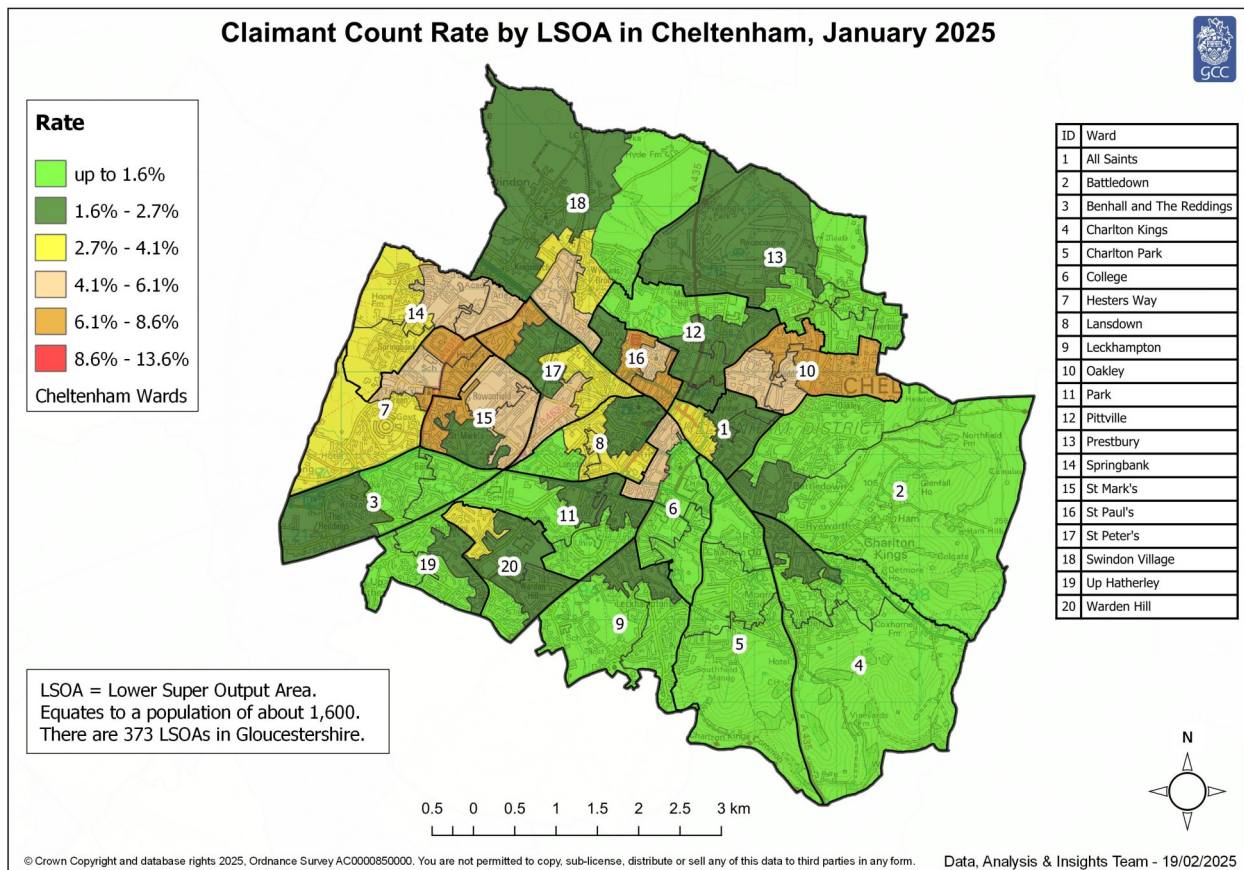

Figure 15: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year

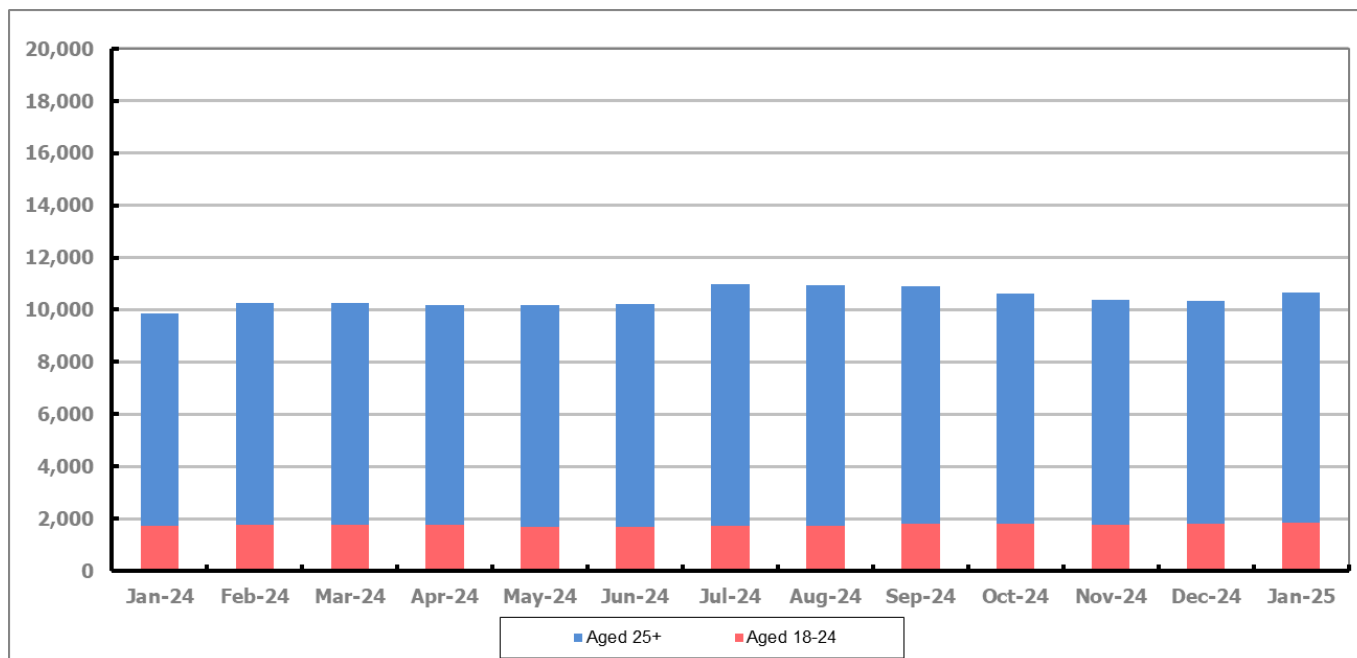


Figure 15 shows that in January 2025, 1,840 people aged 18-24 were claiming Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit who were not in work in Gloucestershire, this represents 17.2% of total working age claimants.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance on the Academic Year 12 and 13 (16/17 age) against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group to the Department for Education (DfE) on a monthly basis. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.
