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# VAT AFFECTING PRIVATE SCHOOLS

Since 1 January 2025, all chargeable education services provided by private schools have been subject to VAT. This has raised some queries regarding the Early Years funded entitlements for children at these schools.

Gloucestershire County Council are currently looking into this, and we hope to be able to update settings shortly with a planned procedure to address this issue.

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## 12 WEEKS FUNDING – SPRING & SUMMER TERM

From the academic year 2024/25, we have reverted to the pattern of 14-12-12 funded weeks. We are aware that in the current Spring term, there are 13 academic weeks and only 11 weeks in the Summer term. Term time only providers should claim 12 weeks in both the Spring and the Summer terms to ensure they receive the correct entitlements for their children.

The starting point of eligibility, detailed in section 5.4 of the Local Provider Agreement, will apply for the Summer term, with 28 April being the start date of that term:

5.4 Children become eligible for the funded entitlement from the term after they reach the age of eligibility and up until statutory school age, which is the term after their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday (as long as they remain at an Early Years provision and do not accept a place at a school, see 13.12). The following table shows when a child is eligible to receive funding, these dates are consistent with those used for determining the start of compulsory education (all dates are inclusive):

When child turns the relevant age (9 months, 2, 3 or 4 years)	When they can get their hours from
1 January to 31 March	Term starting on or after 1 April
1 April to 31 August	Term starting on or after 1 September
1 September to 31 December	Term starting on or after 1 January

## Early Years and Wraparound settings- Changes to National Insurance April 2025

The government has announced several significant changes to National Insurance contributions (NICs) and the Employment Allowance, set to take effect from April 2025.

### Changes to National Insurance Contributions and Employment Allowance from April 2025:

- 1. Secondary Threshold Adjustment:** The earnings level at which employers become liable to pay secondary Class 1 NICs will decrease from £9,100 to £5,000 per year. This means employers will start paying NICs at a lower earnings threshold: [gov.uk](https://gov.uk)
- 2. Increase in NICs Rate:** The rate of secondary Class 1 NICs will rise from 13.8% to 15%. This change will increase the cost of employing staff for businesses, including early years settings: [gov.uk](https://gov.uk)
- 3. Employment Allowance Changes:** The maximum Employment Allowance will increase from £5,000 to £10,500. Additionally, the £100,000 eligibility threshold for claiming the allowance will be

removed, allowing more employers to benefit.

**Employment Allowance for Early Years Settings:** Organisations such as the National Day Nurseries (NDNA) and Early Years Alliance (EYA) continue to campaign for clarity from the government regarding eligibility for settings to access the Employment Allowance.

We will continue to put any updates into the newsletter as they become known.

## **Experience-based route for early years staff qualifications**

To support early years settings to recruit and retain staff, from 3 March 2025 eligible educators will be able to access an experience-based route to working in the Staff:Child ratios at level 3. This new route recognises the significant contribution that skilled and experienced staff can make to the education and care of young children. This is an opportunity for educators without currently approved qualifications to develop their careers, and for providers to maximise the potential of their talented staff in a way that works best for the children in their care.
