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INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.


PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 2.7% in October 2012. This was the same as the September 2012 figure. The South West rate and UK rate also remained the same as last month at 2.6% and 3.8% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.1% higher than the South West average of 2.6%, and 1.1% lower than the UK average of 3.8%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in October 2012 increased by 64 people. The amount of people claiming in October 2012 was 0.6% higher than the number in September 2012. This compares to a 0.5% increase in the South West and a -0.4% decrease for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has increased since last month. The count was 5.0% higher in October 2012 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

At the end of October 2012 there were 855 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 5.7%.

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.7% in October 2012. The rate remained lower or the same as the South West average, until March when it grew above the South West rate, it has been persistently lower by approximately 1.2% against the UK average during the same period. The October 2012 rate remained the same as last month..

Table 1 shows that in October 2012, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was +0.6% higher than the number in September 2012.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to October 2012 was -0.4%. This is 0.1% lower than the UK average and 0.4% lower than the South West average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - October 2012




Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for October 2012 in Gloucestershire. Between September 2012 and October 2012 the rate in the Forest of Dean declined, Stroud experienced an increase, while the other districts remained the same.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts




Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count by district over the past year. The number of claimants generally increased between October 2011 and February 2012. Since March 2012 the number of claimants has decreased, with the exception of August and October 2012, when they increased.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham remained the same as the last two months at 3.2%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 5 shows the claimant count increased by +1.6% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased in October 2012 compared to September 2012 to +7.8%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - October 2012




Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year



Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 8 shows the claimant count increased by +0.3% since September 2012. The change on the previous year has increased from September 2012 compared to October 2012 to -0.6%.

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - October 2012





Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.4%. Six wards lie above the average.

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year




Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean decreased in October 2011 to 2.5%

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - October 2012




Figure 13: Gloucester City claimant rate over the last year



Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - October 2012





Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 4.1%. Six wards lie above the average.




Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - October 2012







Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - October 2012









PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of October 2012 there were 855 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 5.7%. The total number of NEET increased by 239 young people in October 2012 compared to September 2012. All 6 districts saw an increase in their NEET figure.
