More likely to be:

- Male
- White British
- LGBTQ+

School life



Less likely to :

- Enjoy school
- Feel it gives them useful skills and knowledge
- Feel safe at school
- Get the support they need at school
- Continue in education or training

More likely to :

- Be isolated, suspended or excluded
- Often be in trouble
- Persistently absent

Less likely to have healthy food choices at home

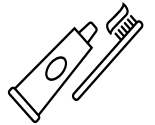


Less likely to get the recommended sleep

- Live with both parents



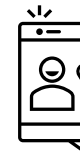
