

# Unemployment Bulletin

Issue 124 November 2018

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The Claimant Count is a measure of the number of people who are unemployed and claiming benefits. From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, this was based on the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead. **To reflect this change, the Claimant Count has been expanded to include people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit and who are searching for work.**

Gloucestershire is in the process of transitioning to full Universal Credit. This means a broader span of claimants will be required to look for work than previously under Jobseekers Allowance. As more people are brought within the coverage of Universal Credit, the Claimant Count is set to rise noticeably over time. This will happen irrespective of how the economy performs and is a feature of the design of Universal Credit which brings additional groups of people into 'Searching for Work' conditionality (and therefore the Claimant Count), to help encourage and support these claimants into work.

## INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Data & Analysis Team in the County Council's Planning, Performance and Change function. The data are sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis ([www.nomis.co.uk](http://www.nomis.co.uk)). All data are rounded to the nearest 5 and may not precisely add to the sum of the number of people claiming JSA, and the number of people claiming Universal Credit required to seek work, due to independent rounding.

## PART 1: SUMMARY

**The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.6% in November 2018.** The South West rate increased to 1.8% but the UK rate remained at 2.3%. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.2% lower than the South West average of 1.8%, and 0.7% lower than the UK average of 2.3%.

**The claimant count in Gloucestershire in November 2018 increased by 140 people.** The amount of people claiming in November 2018 was 2.3% higher than the number in October 2018. This compares to a 4.2% increase in the South West and a 1.5% increase for the UK.

### Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

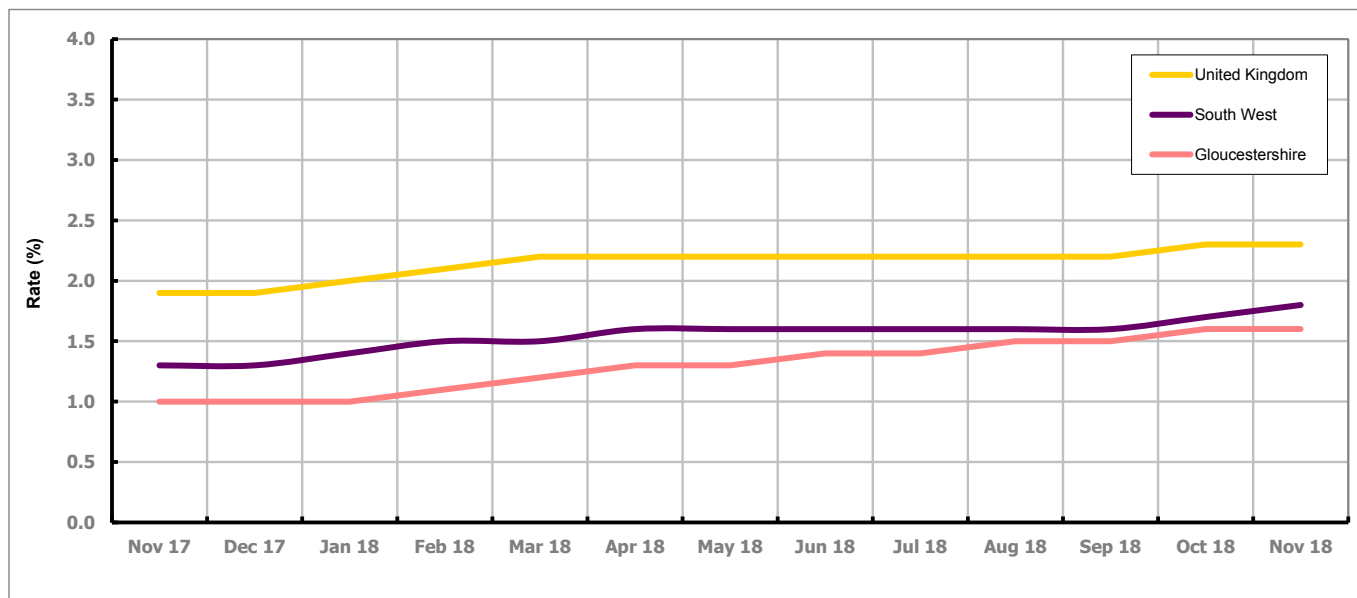


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.6% in November 2018. The Gloucestershire rate has been lower than the South West average since December 2015, with the exception of April and May 2016 when it was the same. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.8% against the UK average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - November 2018

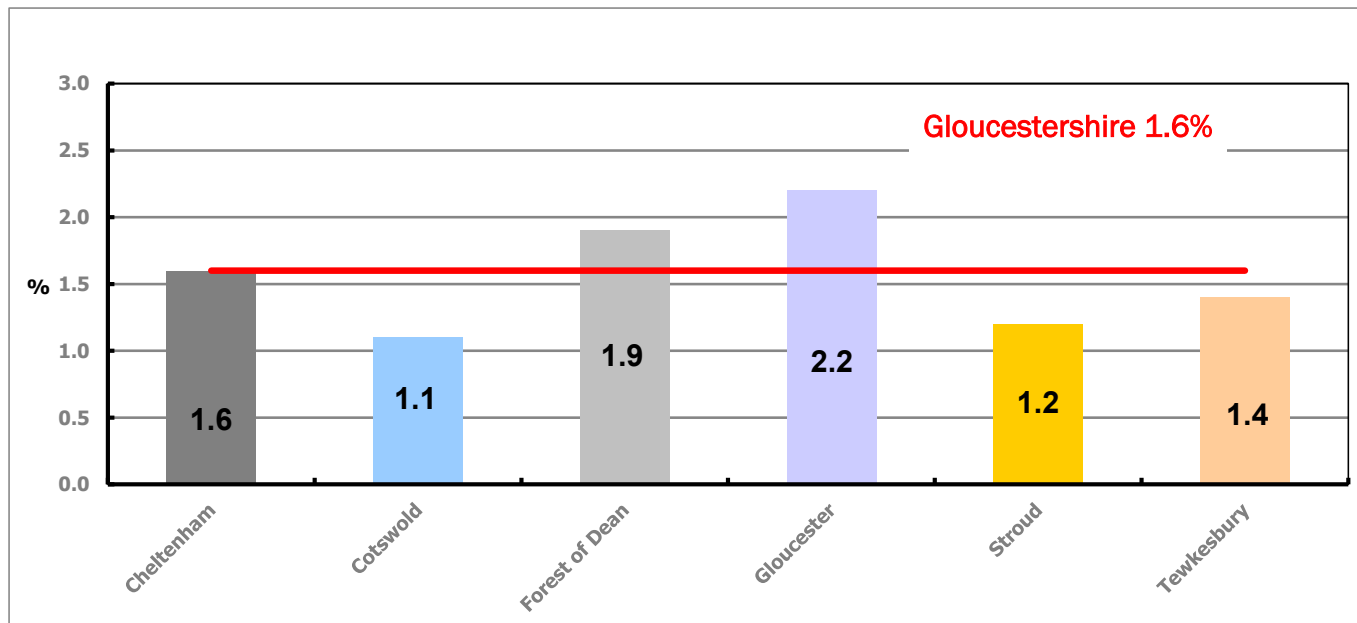


Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for November 2018 in Gloucestershire. Between October and November 2018, the rate stayed the same in all districts.

Figure 3: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

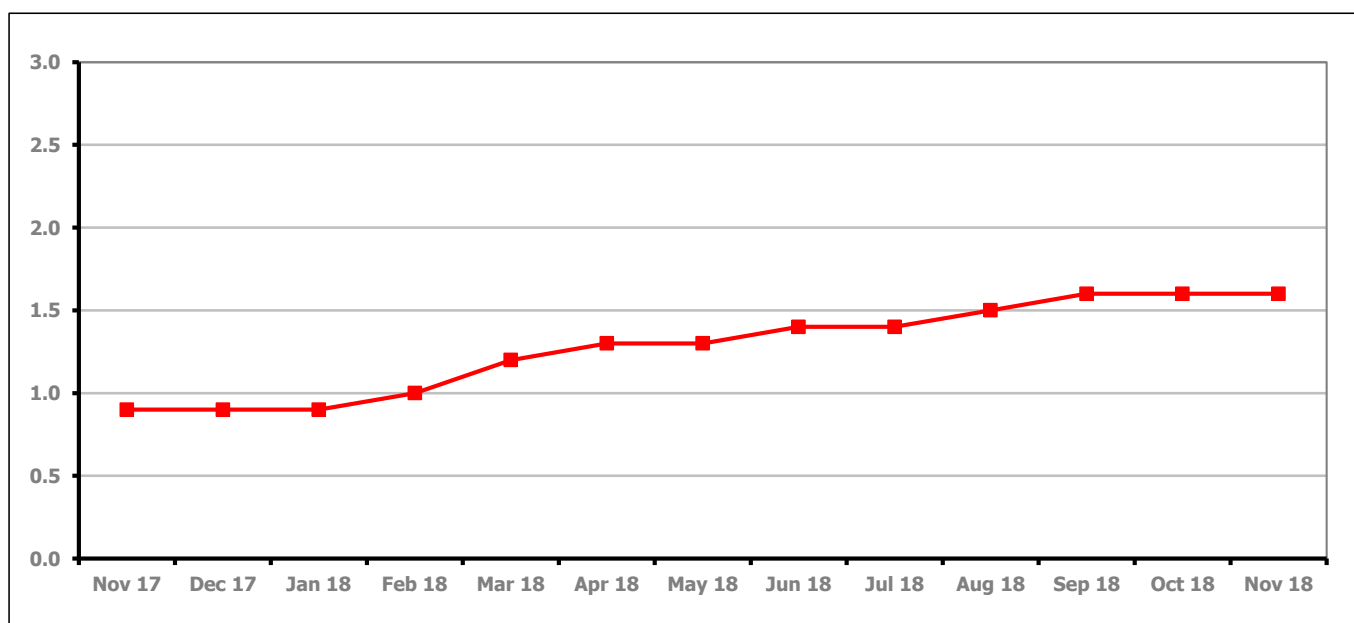


Figure 3 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham stayed the same as last month at 1.6%.

Figure 4: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - November 2018

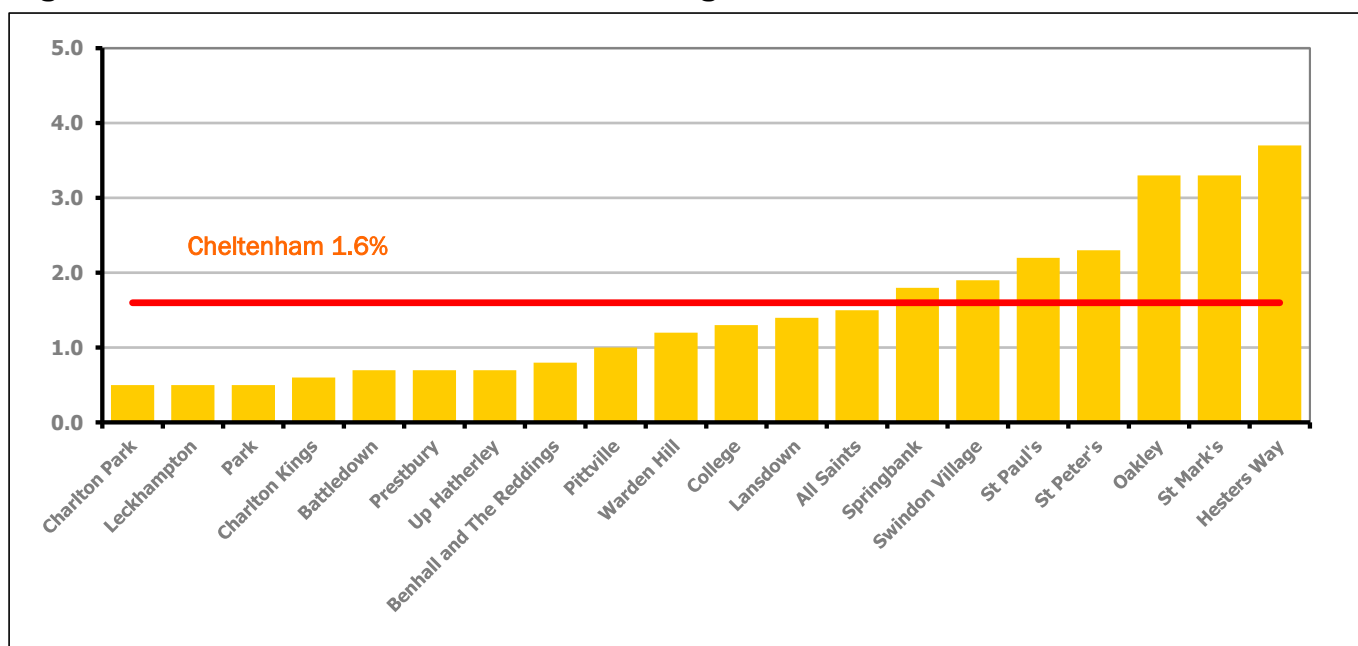

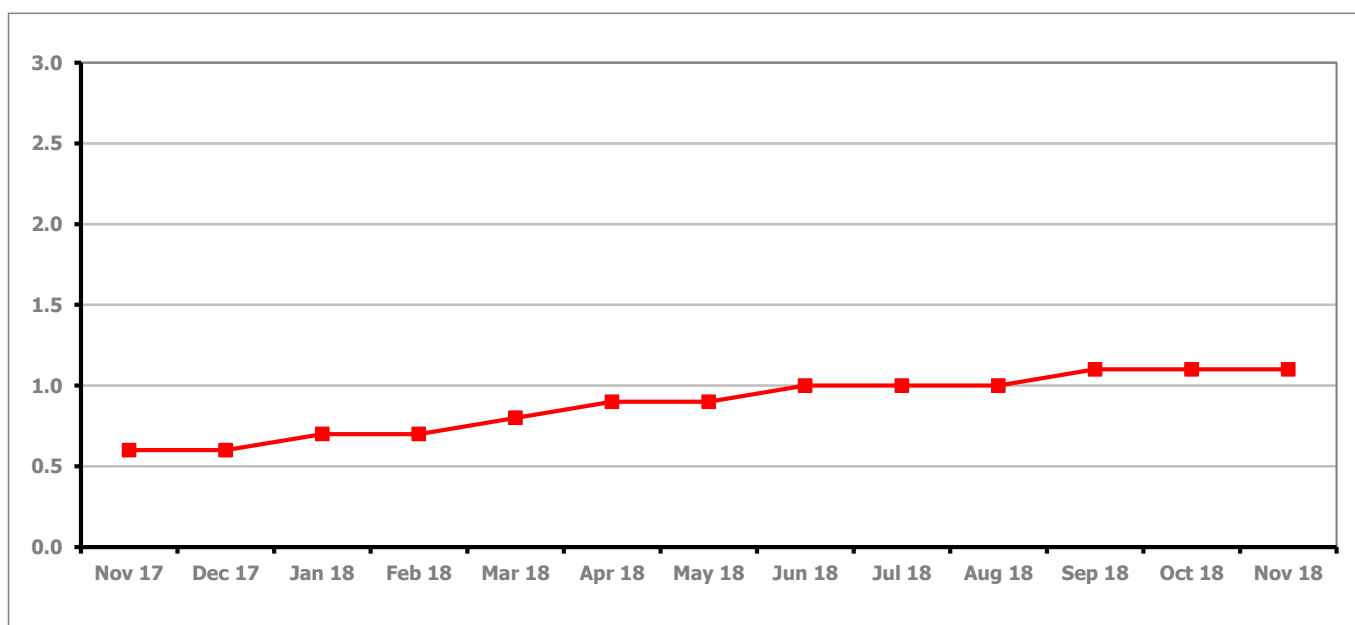

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - November 2018

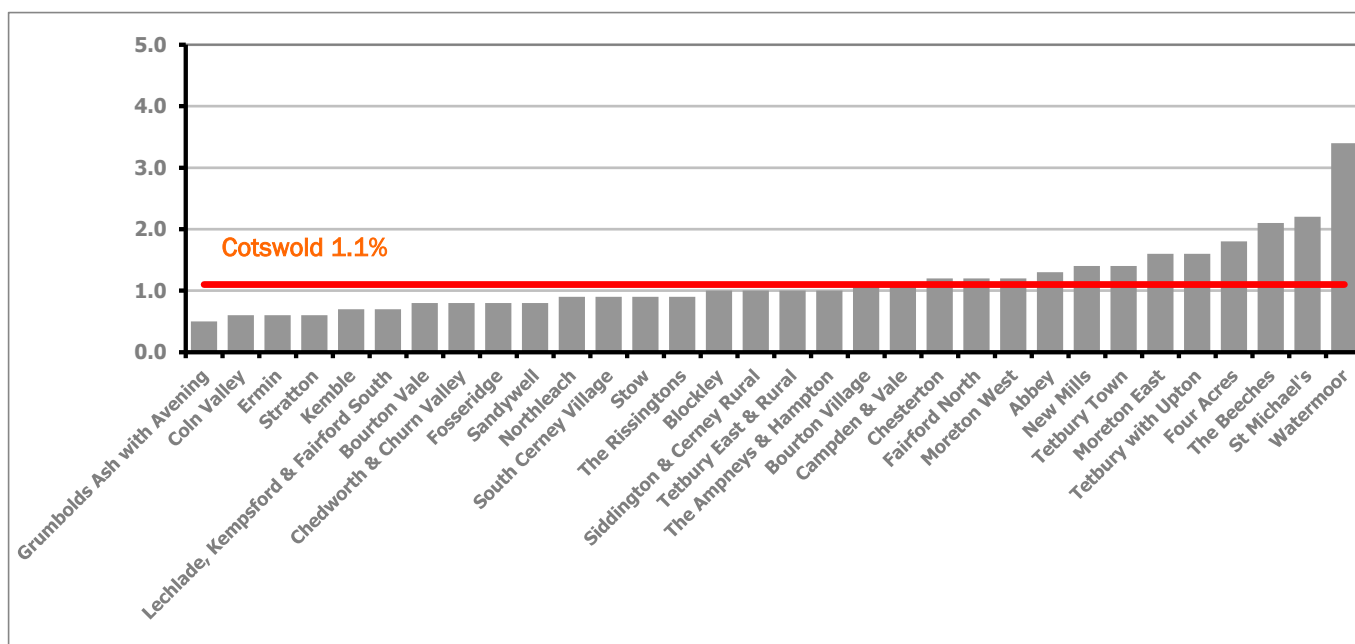


Figure 6 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.1%. Twelve wards lie above the average.

Figure 7: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

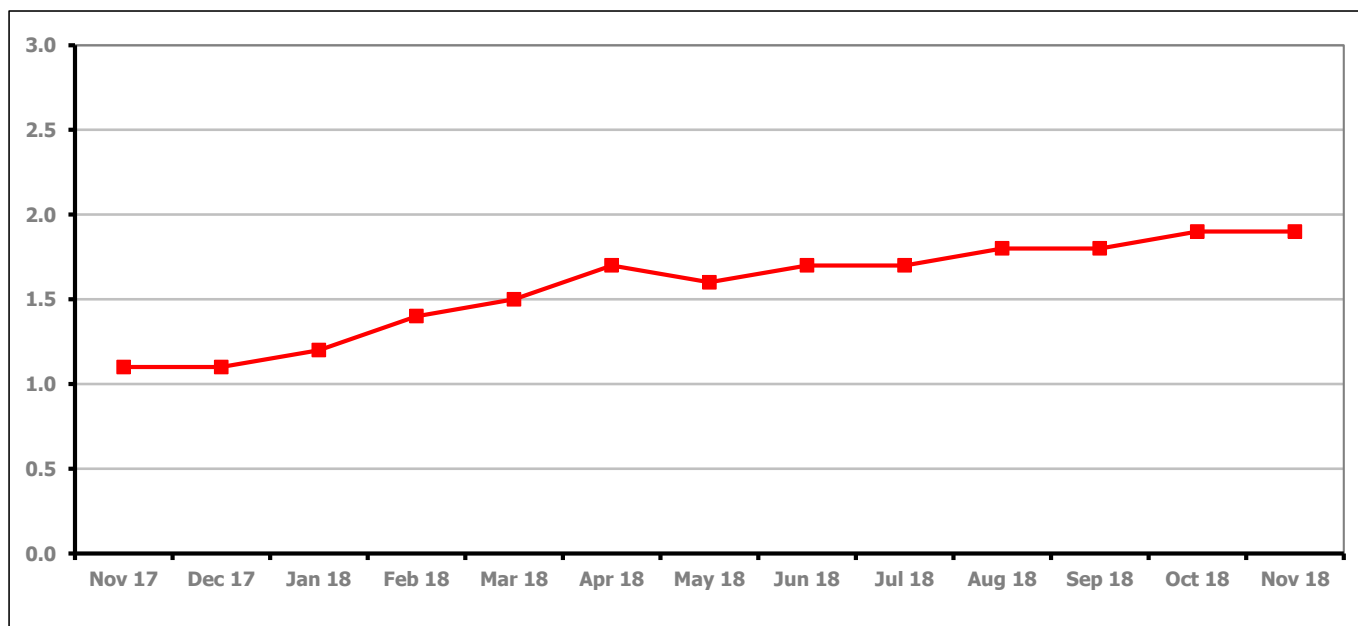

Figure 8: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - November 2018

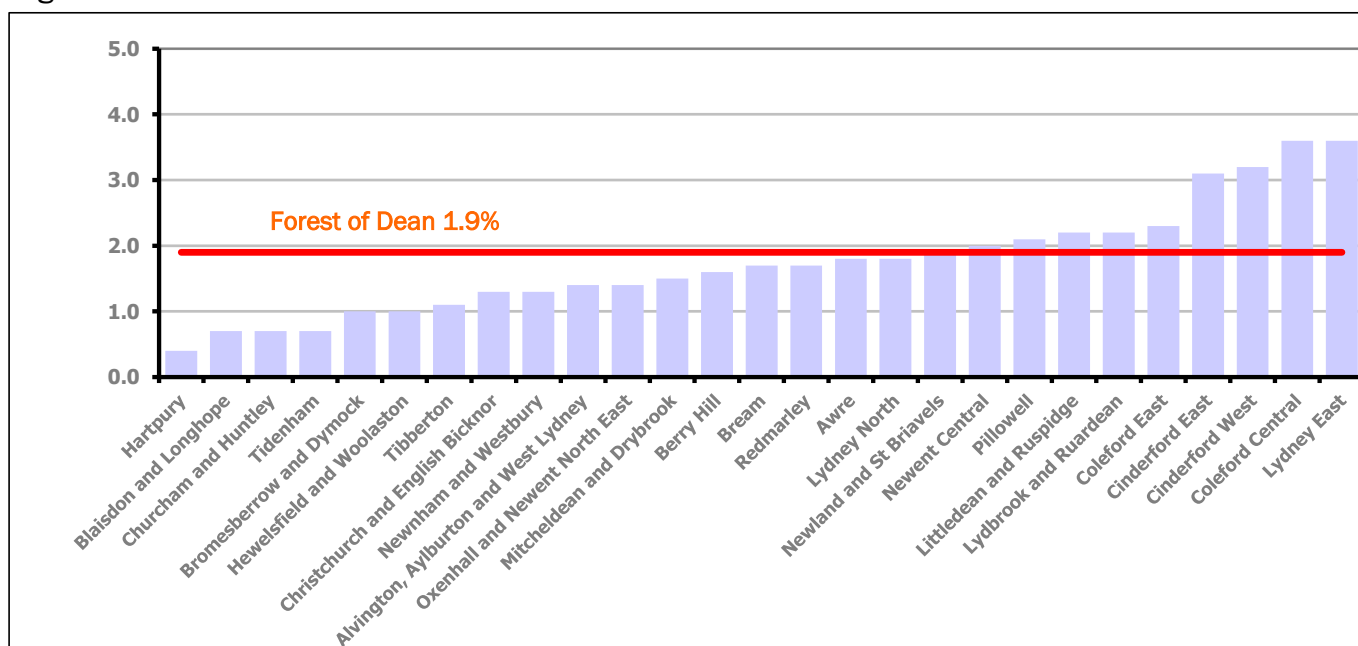

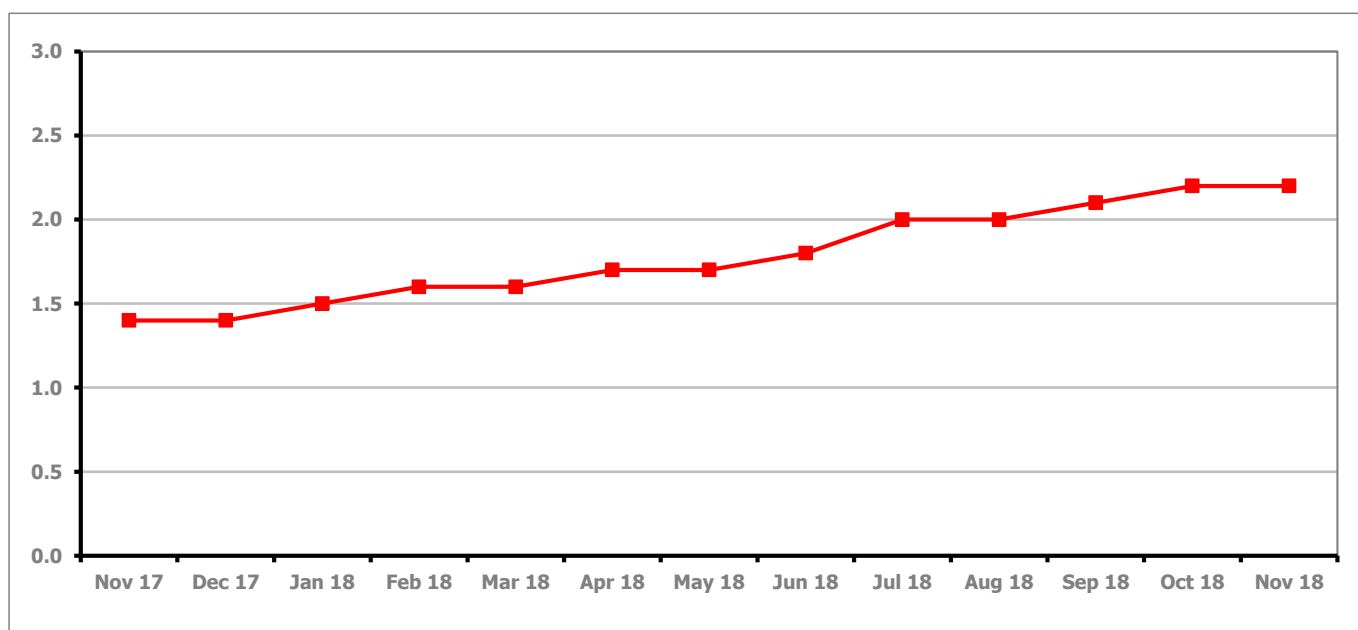

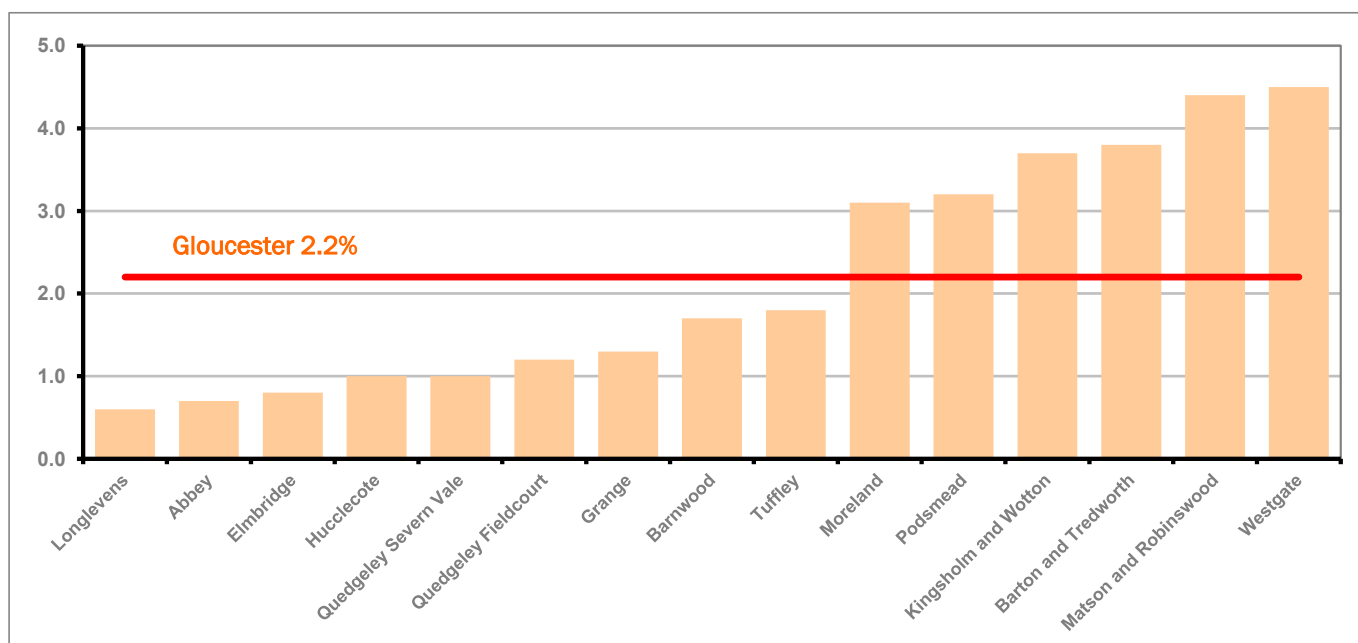
*Figure 10: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - November 2018*








Figure 11: Stroud District claimant rate over the last year

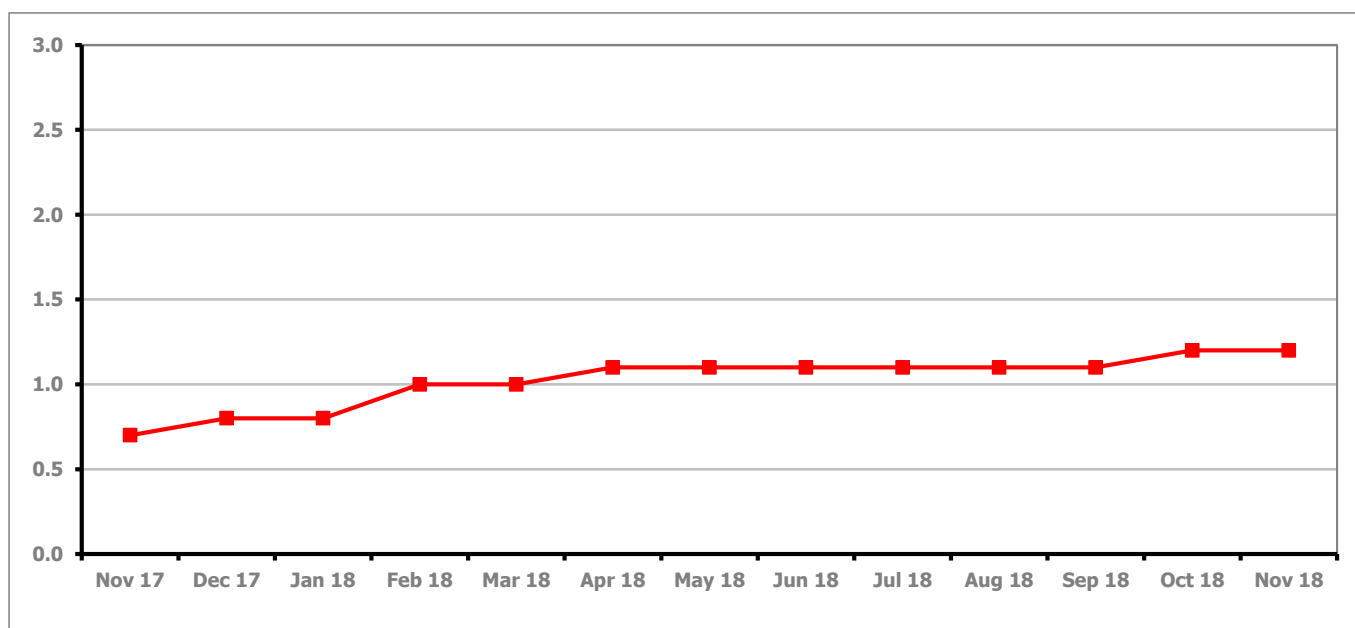


Figure 11 shows the claimant rate for Stroud stayed the same as last month at 1.2%.

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - November 2018

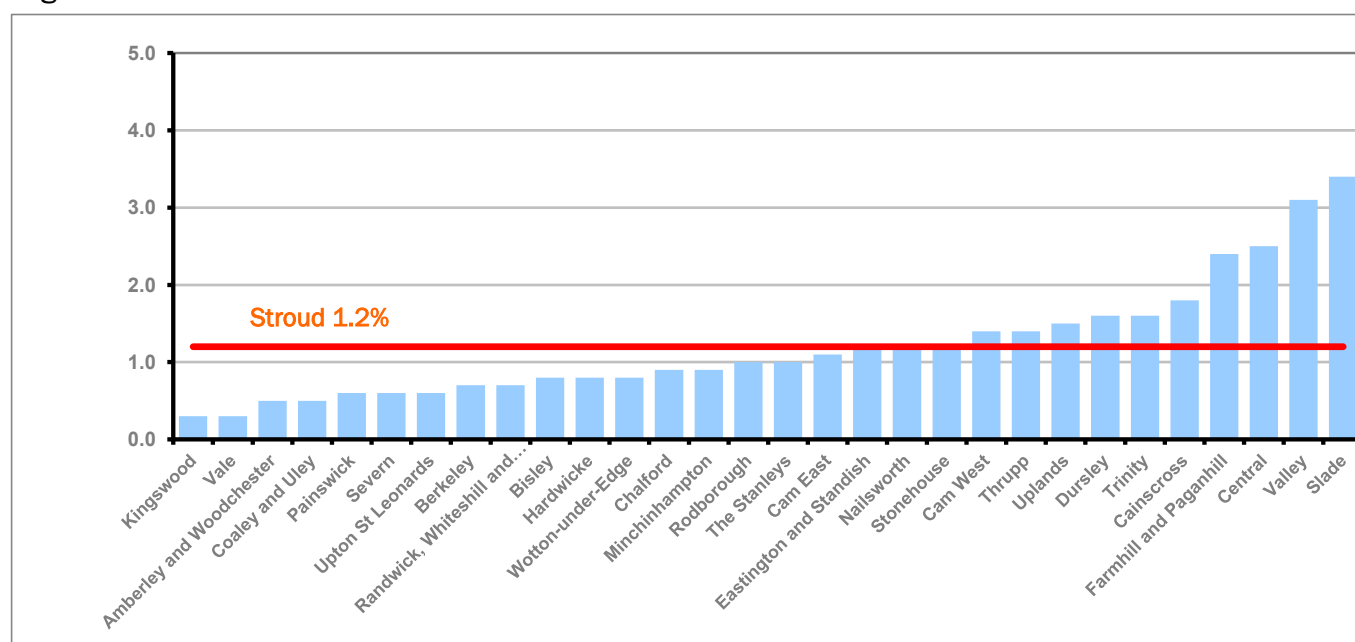


Figure 12 shows the claimant rates in Stroud District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.2%. Ten wards are above the average.

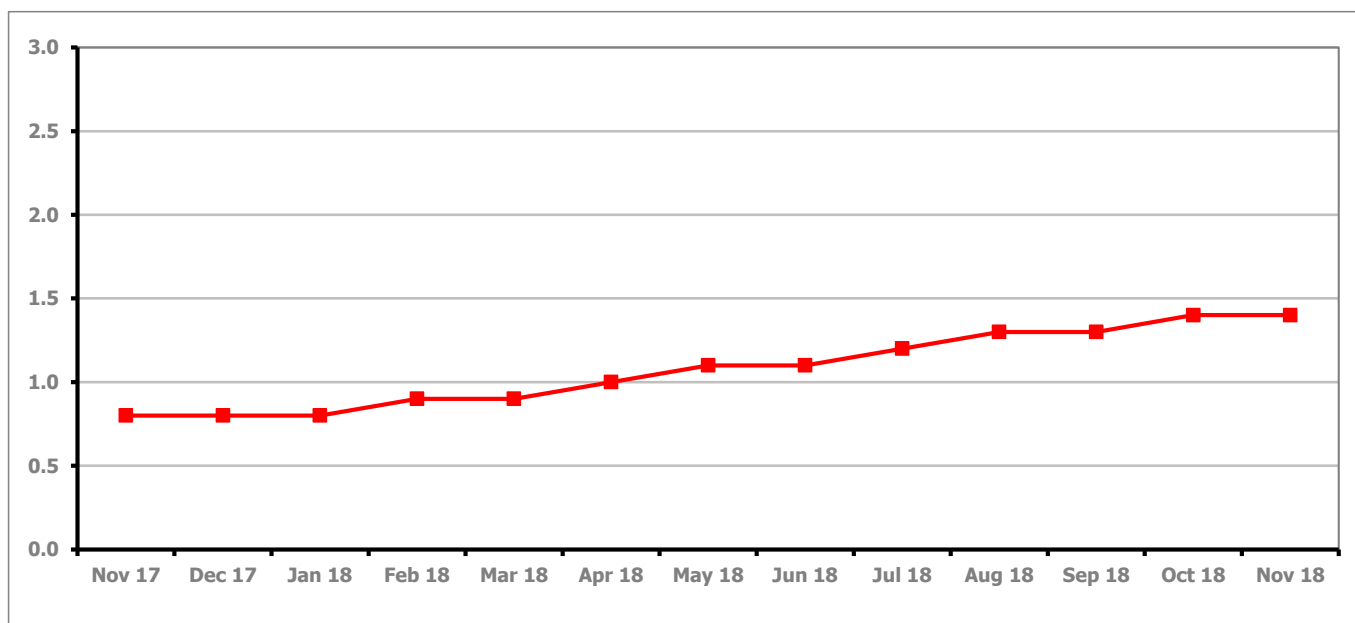

Figure 14: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - November 2018

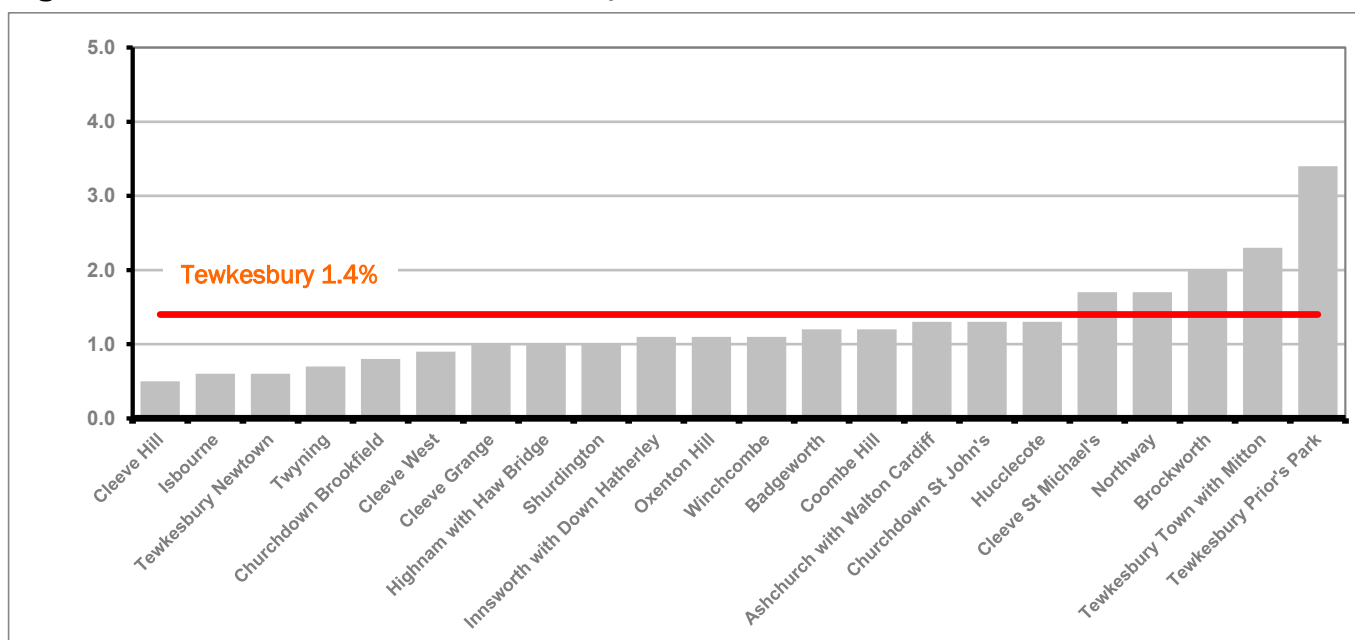


Figure 14 shows the claimant rates in Tewkesbury District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.4%. Five wards are above the average.

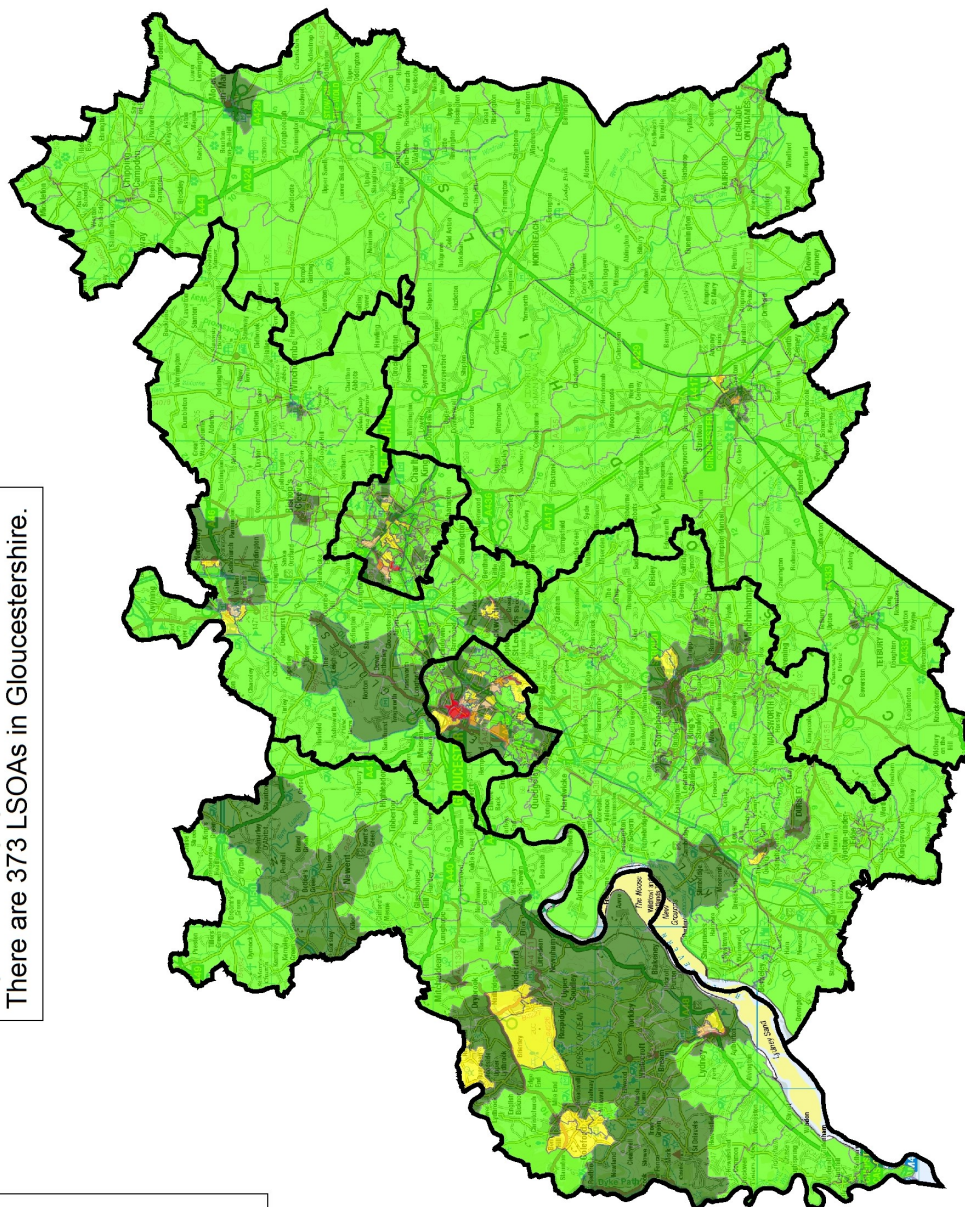
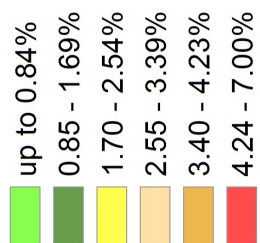

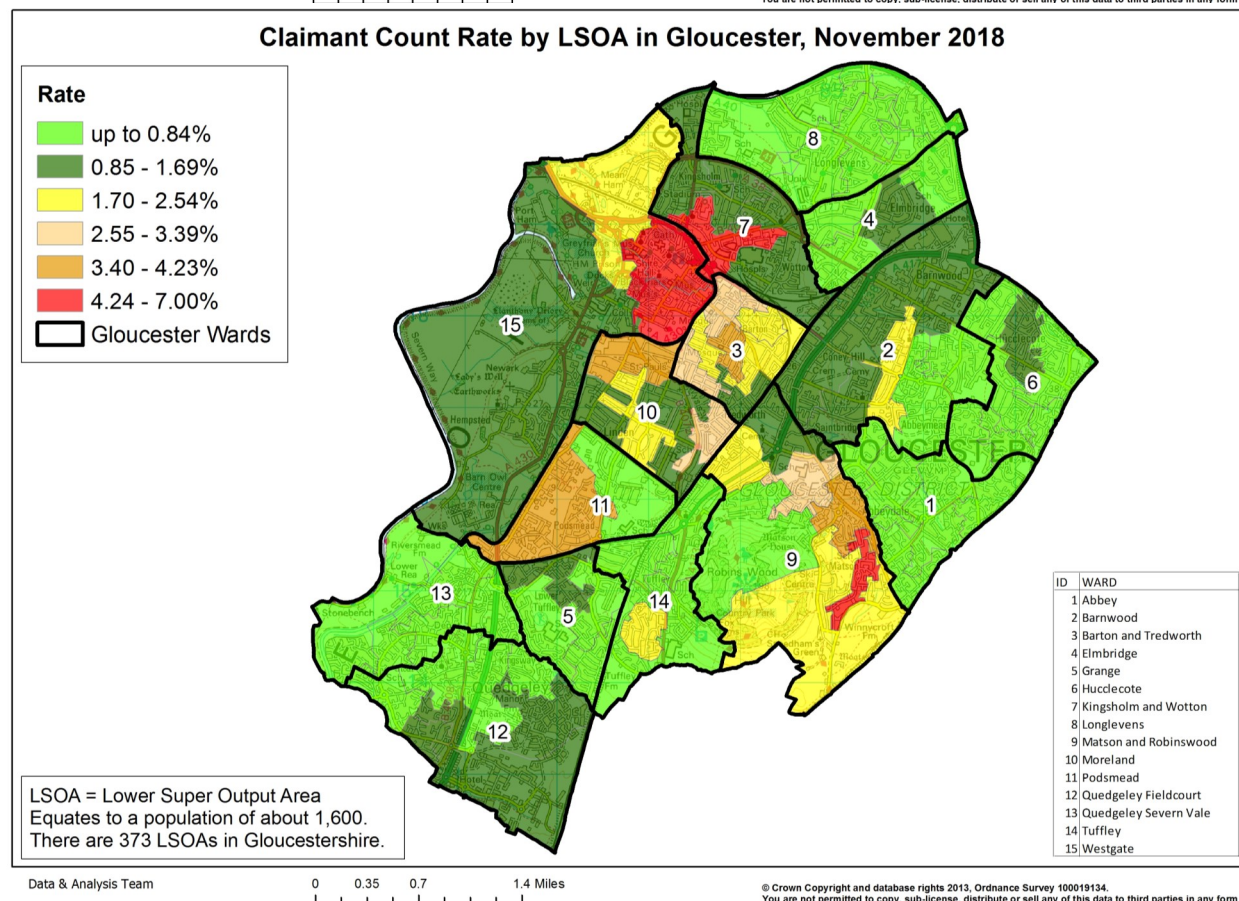
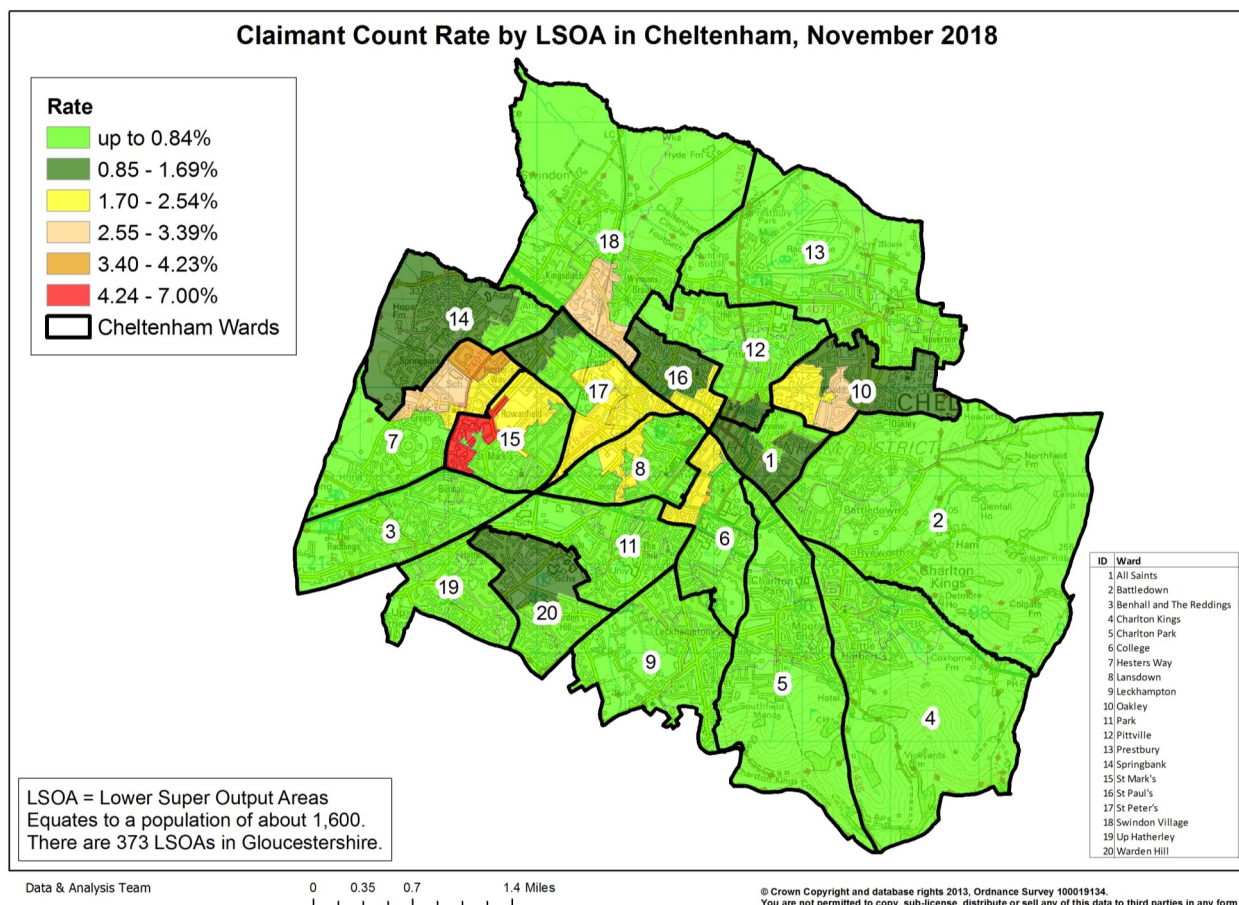

Figure 15: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year

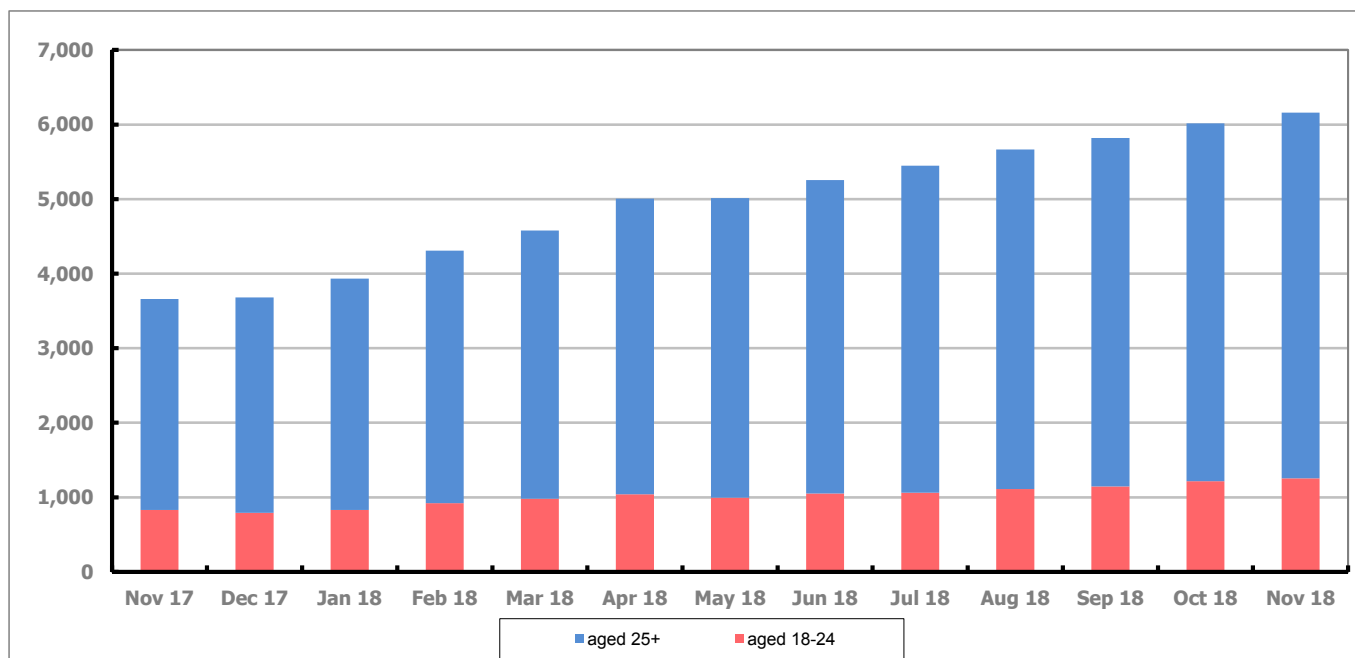


Figure 15 shows that in November 2018, 1,255 people aged 18-24 were claiming Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit who were not in work in Gloucestershire, this represents 20.3% of total working age claimants.

## PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

### Summary

At the end of November 2018 there were 404 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 2.52%. The total number of NEET young people increased by 6 in November 2018 compared to October 2018, three districts saw an increase in there figures and three districts saw a decrease.
