(EASTGATE STREET, SOUTHGATE STREET, NORTHGATE STREET & WESTGATE STREET, GLOUCESTER CITY CENTRE) (GLOUCESTER)
EXPERIMENTAL ORDER NO. 1 2026

NOTICE is hereby given that Gloucestershire County Council has made an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will experimentally prohibit motor vehicles from travelling along the roads described in the Schedule below at all times, with exemptions.

THE SCHEDULE

Roads to which the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order Relates

Road Name	Description
Northgate Street (C8014)	From its junction with The Oxbode (480012) to its crossroad junction with Southgate Street (C8014)/Eastgate Street (480068)/Westgate Street (480067)
Southgate Street (C8014)	From its junction with Longsmith Street (480016) to its crossroad junction with Eastgate Street (480068)/Westgate Street (480067)/Northgate Street (C8014)
Eastgate Street (480068)	From a point approximately 15m north-west of its junction with Brunswick Road (C8001) to its crossroad junction with Westgate Street (480067)/Northgate Street (C8014)/Southgate Street (C8014)
Westgate Street (480067)	From its junction with Berkeley Street (480015) to its crossroad junction with Eastgate Street (480068)/Northgate Street (C8014)/Southgate Street (C8014)

The roads fall within the Westgate Ward of the City of Gloucester within the County of Gloucestershire.

A copy of the ETRO which comes into effect on **5th January 2026**, the consultation plan together with a copy of the Statement of Reasons and other relevant documents may be viewed at The Map Room, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TG during their normal opening hours or online at <http://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/tros> (Please quote reference CB87239).

The ETRO is Experimental and may continue in force for a period of up to 18 months expiring on 4th July 2027. In due course the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the ETRO should continue in force indefinitely.

Within 6 months of coming into force of the ETRO any person may object to its indefinite continuation. Any such representation should be sent in writing to the Assistant Director of Legal Services, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TG or emailed to highwayconsult@gloucestershire.gov.uk no later than **4th July 2026** stating the grounds on which it is made.
