ADDITIONAL PUBLIC FOOTPATH FROM OAK WAY TO MST30,  
STONEHOUSE PARISH  
MODIFICATION ORDER 2025

This Order is made by Gloucestershire County Council under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that Authority that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Gloucestershire requires modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) namely the discovery by the surveying Authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonable alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates being a right of way as described in Part I of the schedule hereto

The Authority has consulted with every Local Authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates. The Gloucestershire County Council hereby Order that:

1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 10 December 2024
2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Gloucestershire shall be modified as described in Parts I and II of the Schedule hereto and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the "Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981, The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Gloucestershire – Additional Public Footpath from Oak Way to MST30, Stonehouse Parish - Modification Order 2025"

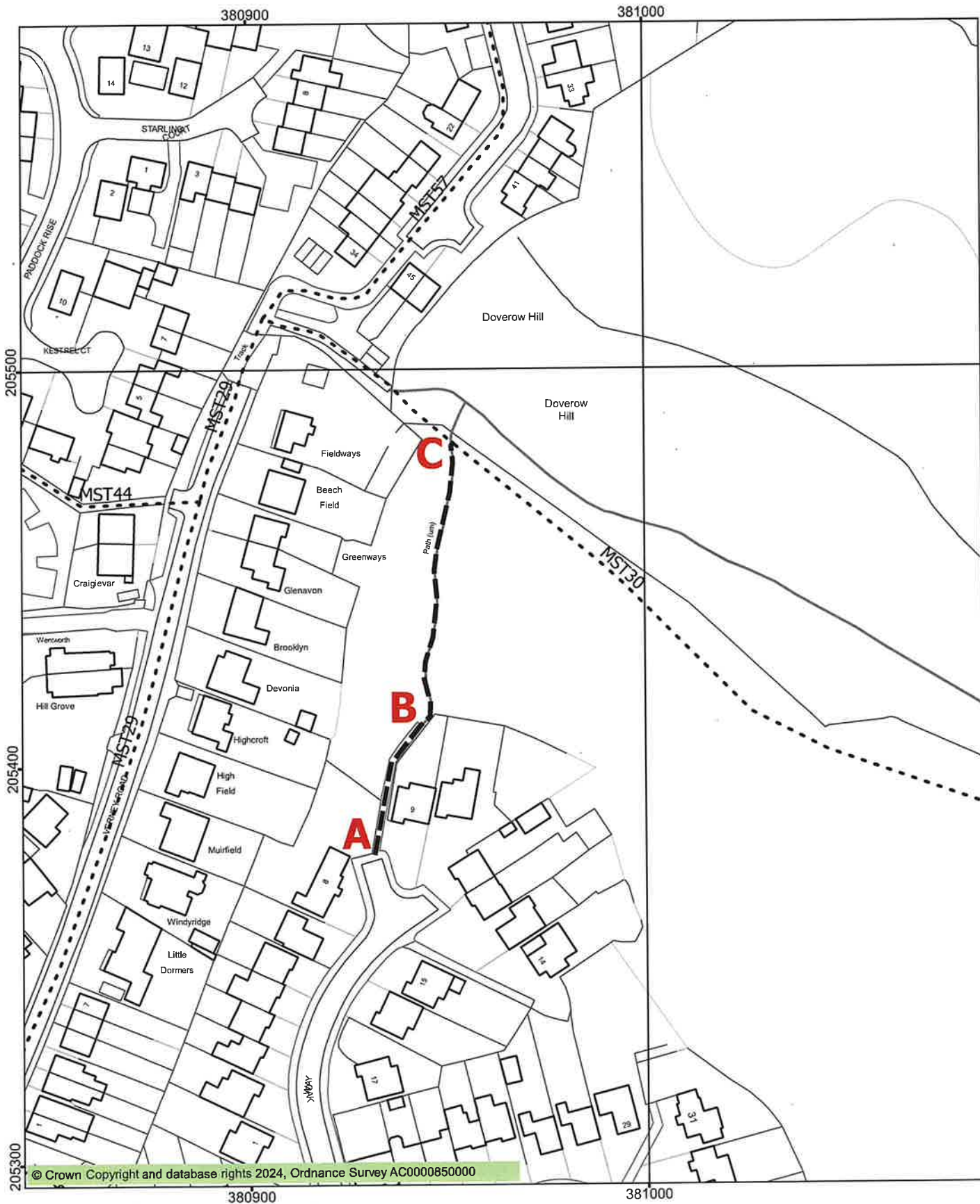
## **SCHEDULE**

### **PART I**

#### **Modification of Definitive Map**

#### **Description of Footpath to be Added**

A length of public footpath in Stonehouse Parish, Gloucestershire to be numbered MST74 which commences at a Point marked A on the Order Plan annexed hereto ("the Plan") at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference ("OSGR") SO 8093/0537 at its junction with Oak Way (publicly maintainable highway 47737) and running for approximately 8.5 metres in a generally northerly direction (co-existing with publicly maintainable highway 61293), then proceeding in a generally north north easterly direction for approximately 99 metres through a Point marked B to a point marked C on the Plan at OSGR SO 8095/0547 at its junction with public footpath MST30. The route is shown by a black broken line on the said map and having a width of 1.8 metres between points A-B and having a width of 2 metres between points B-C.
