

Due Regard for Permanent/Experimental TROs

The Council has a duty to give 'due regard to' the following three aims of the public sector equality duty (section 149 of the Equality Act 2010) during the development of the 'policy'.¹

- Eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation and any other conduct prohibited by the ACT;
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it; and

An initial assessment against each of the protected groups is provided below – any issues highlighted through the consultation process will be considered and reported at the end of the consultation period.



Monitoring and Review


Please identify any aspects that require reconsideration following the TRO process, identify any amendments made in relation to due regard and give reasoning.

Representations were received regarding people with mobility issues having to park far away from their property. If these objectors are a blue badge holder they would be able to apply for an advisory disabled bay marking. Whilst this would not be able to be placed in the areas which the restrictions are proposed, it could be placed in an unrestricted section of carriageway adjacent to the restrictions and near to their property. Therefore, there would be a disabled bay near to their property for them to utilise, but in a safe location to park. Additionally Disabled Badge Holders are permitted to park on Double Yellow Lines for up to 3 hours provided that it is safe to do so.
