Issue 116 March 2018

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The Claimant Count is a measure of the number of people who are unemployed and claiming benefits. From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, this was based on the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead.

To reflect this change, the Claimant Count has been expanded to include people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit and who are out of work. For more information about Universal Credit please see the [ONS website](https://www.ons.gov.uk/universal-credit).

INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Data & Analysis Team in the County Council's Planning, Performance and Change function. The data are sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk). All data are rounded to the nearest 5 and may not precisely add to the sum of the number of people claiming JSA, and the number of people claiming Universal Credit required to seek work, due to independent rounding.

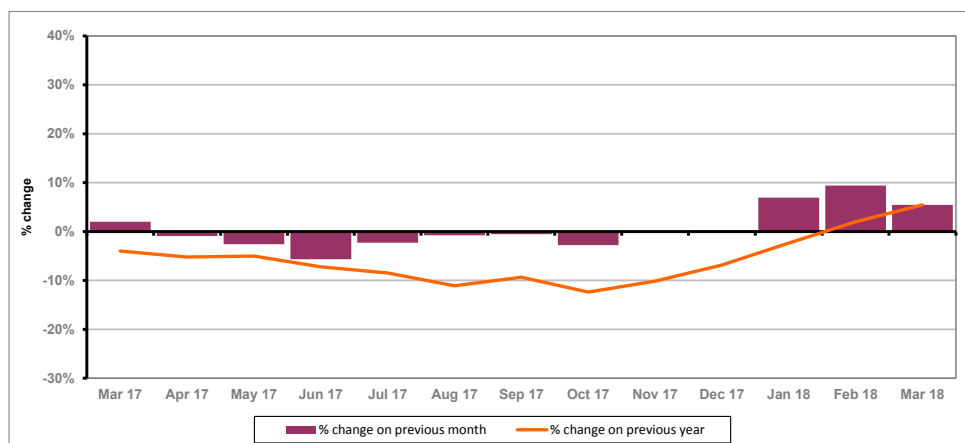
PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.2% in March 2018. This was a 5.5% increase on the February 2018 figure. The South West and UK rates both stayed the same at 1.5% and 2.1% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.3% lower than the South West average of 1.5%, and 0.9% lower than the UK average of 2.1%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in March 2018 increased by 235 people. The amount of people claiming in March 2018 was 5.5% higher than the number in February 2018. This compares to a 2.3% increase in the South West and a 1.8% increase for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has increased since last month. The count was 5.5% higher in March 2018 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

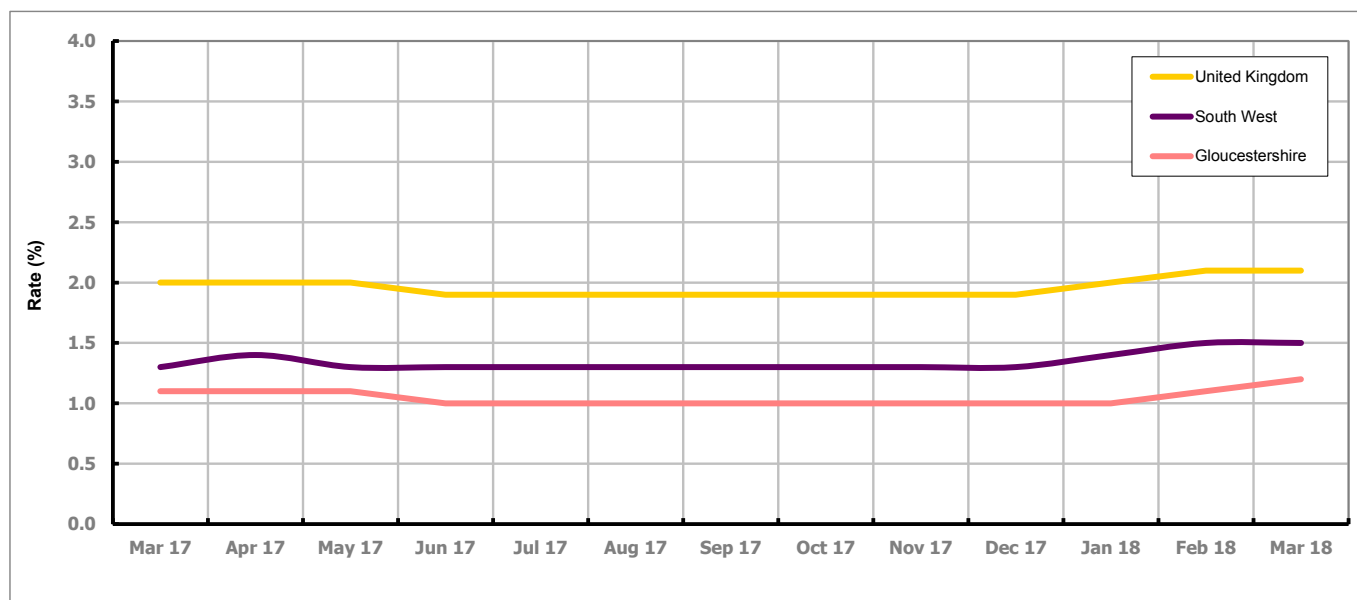


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.2% in March 2018. The Gloucestershire rate has been lower than the South West average since December 2015, with the exception of April and May 2016 when it was the same. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.9% against the UK average.

Table 1 shows that in March 2018, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 5.5% higher than the number in February 2018.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to March 2018 was 3.6%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - March 2018

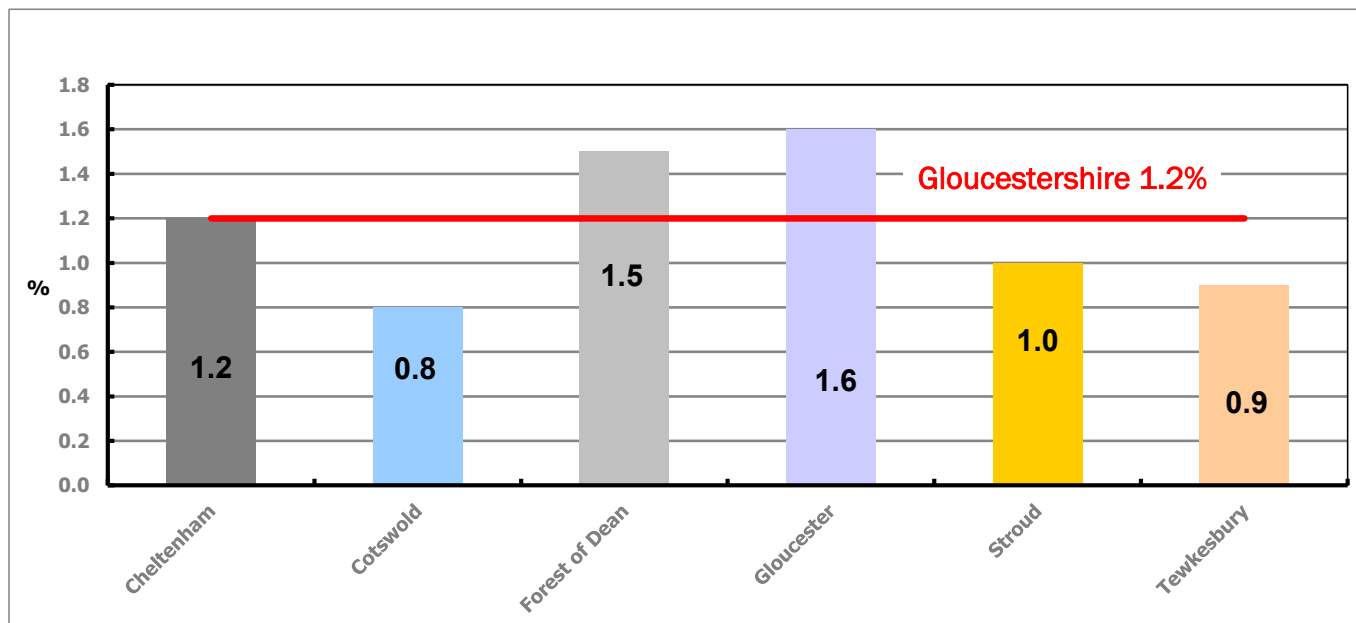

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

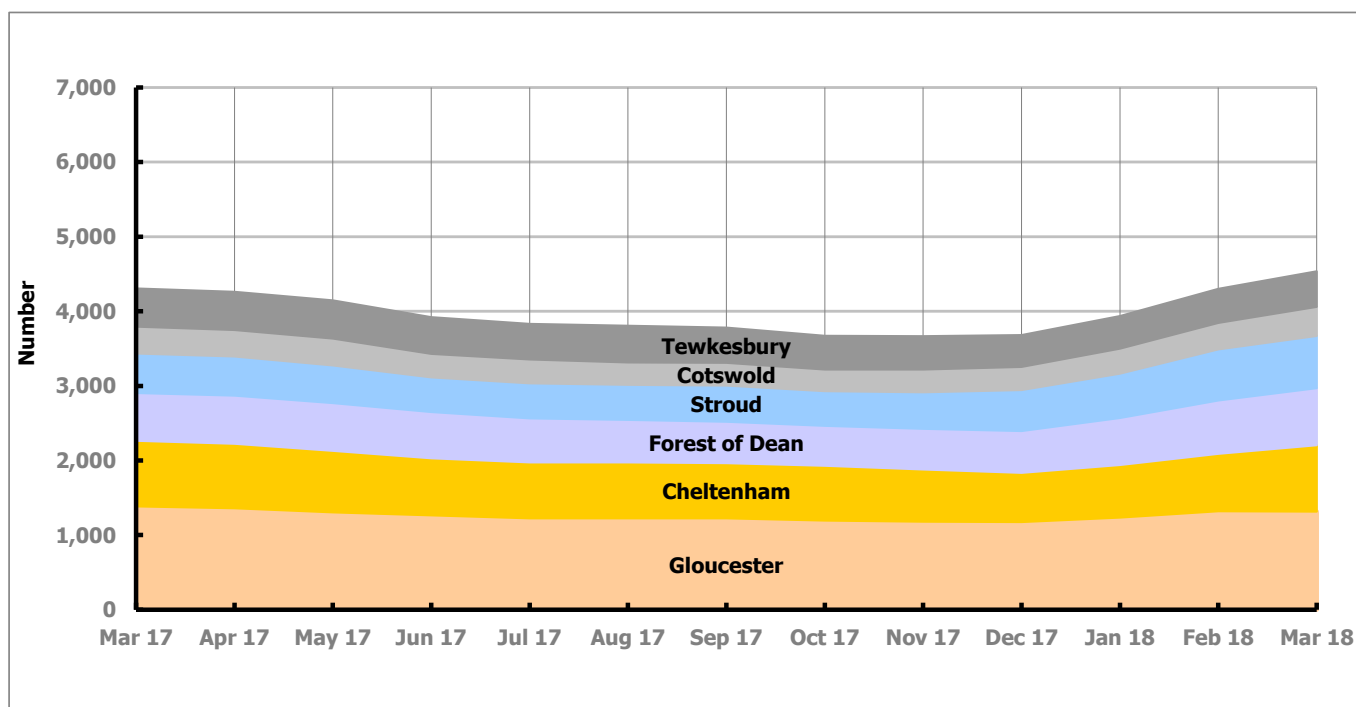

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

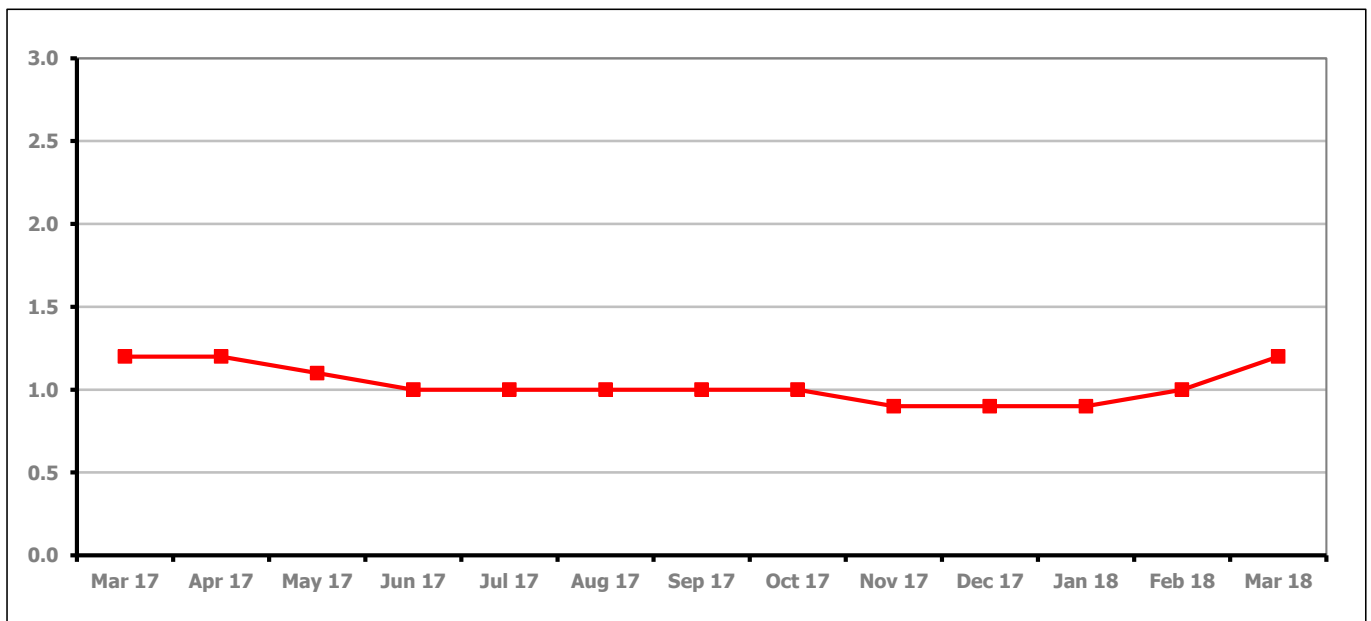


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham has increased in March 2018 to 1.2%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

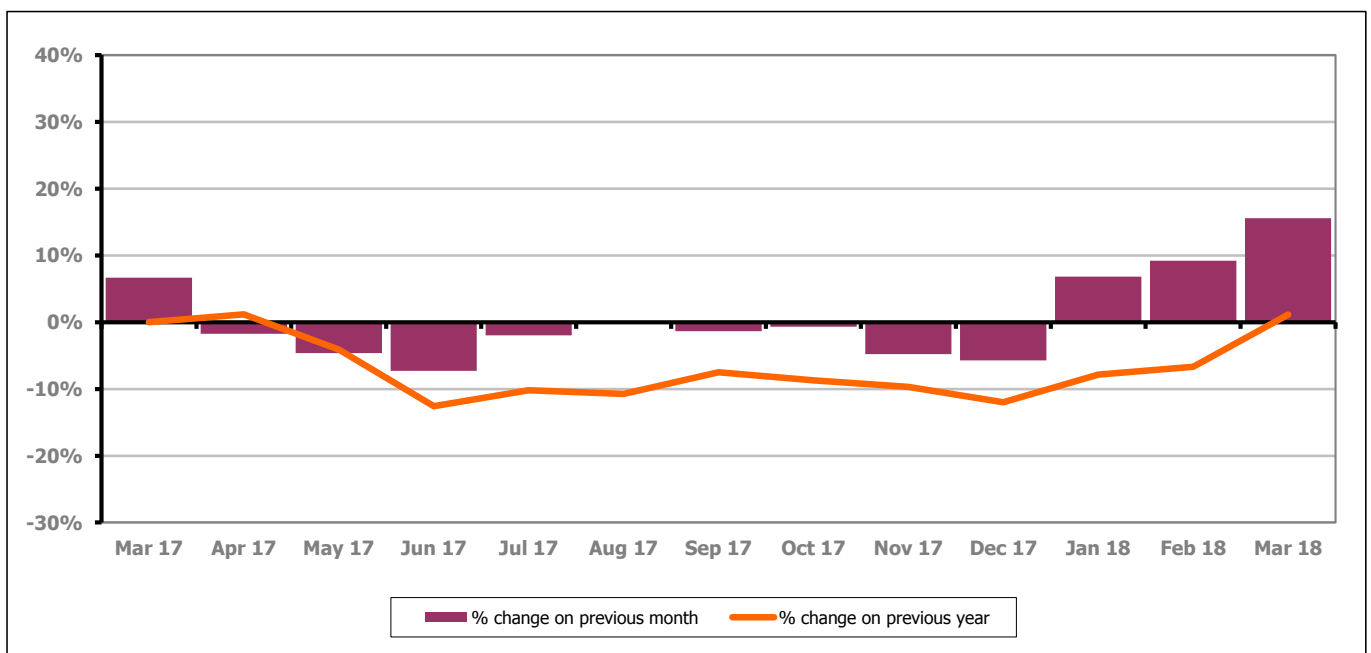


Figure 5 shows the claimant count increased by 15.6% since February 2018. The change on the previous year has increased between February 2018 and March 2018 to 1.1%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - March 2018

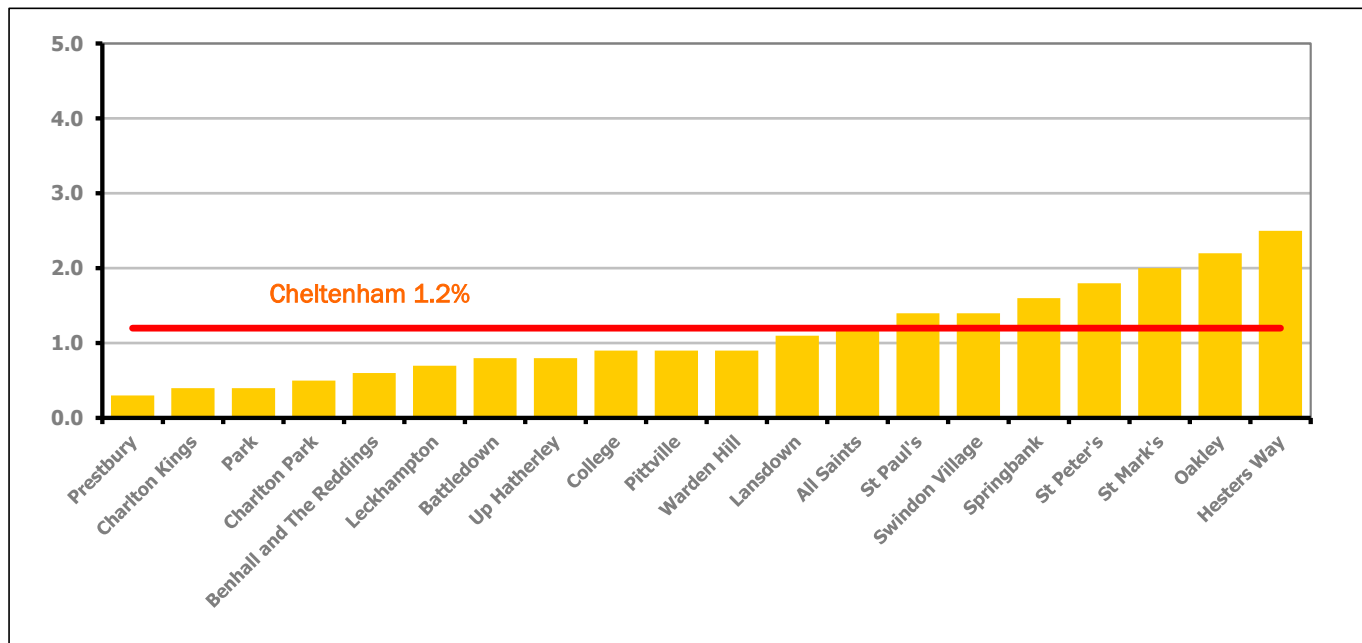

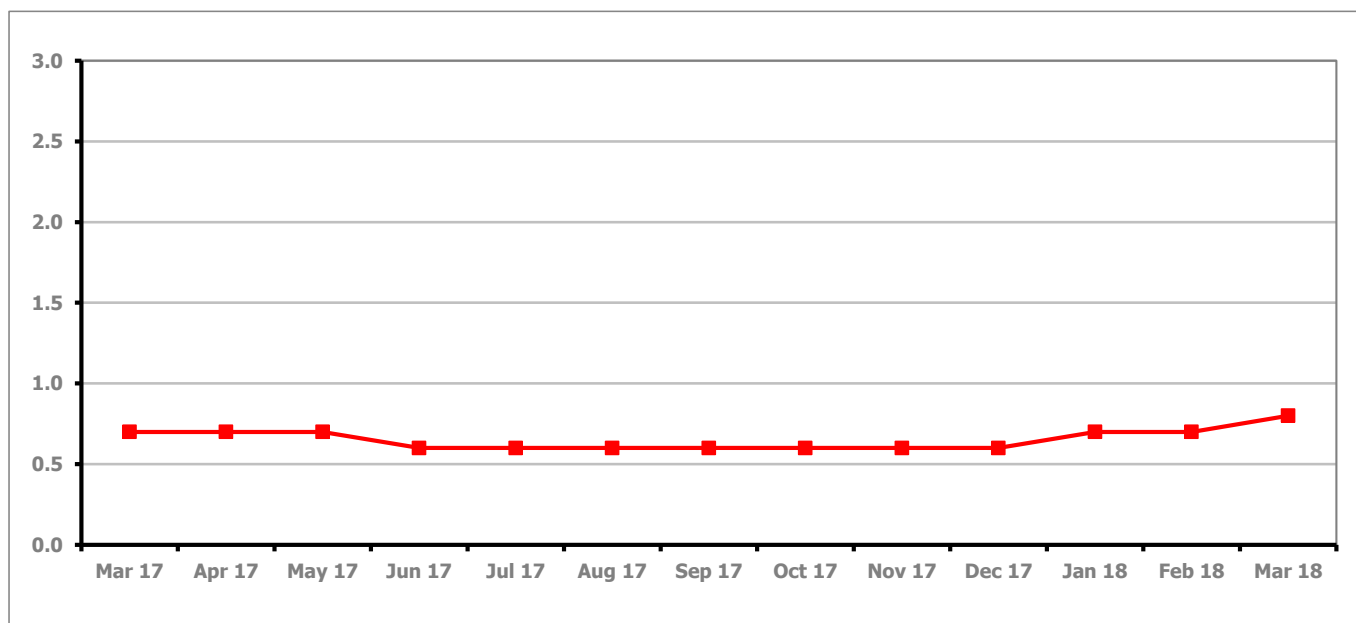

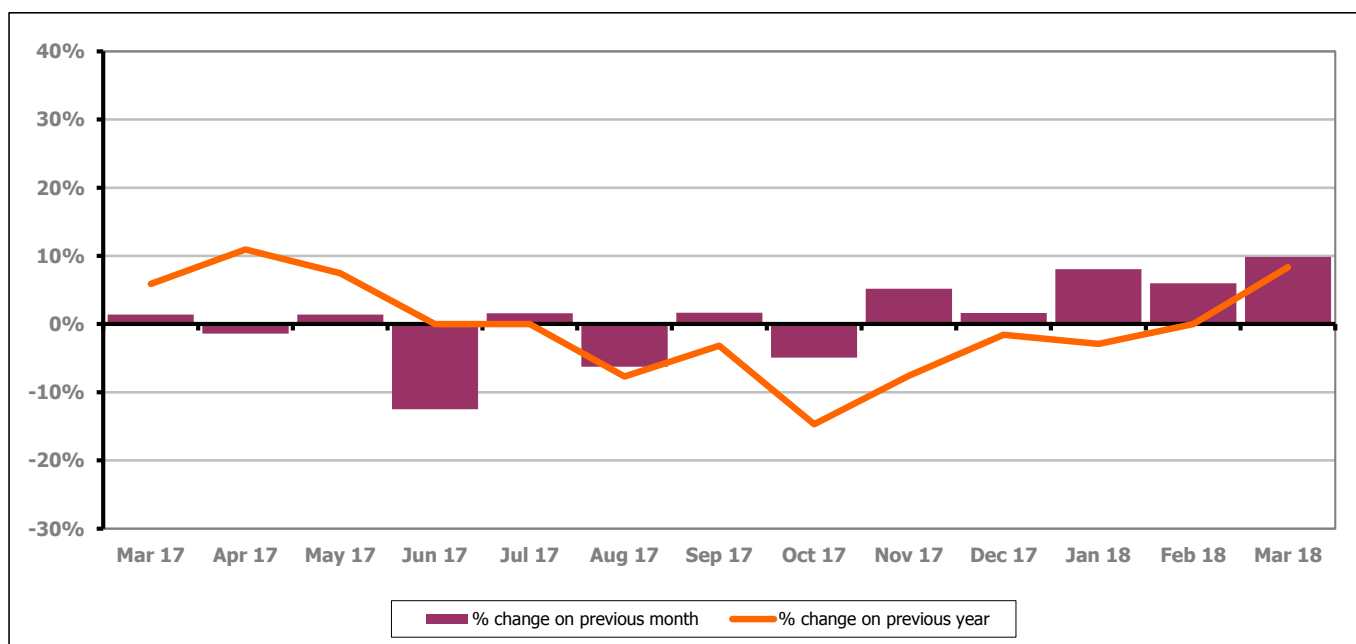
Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - March 2018

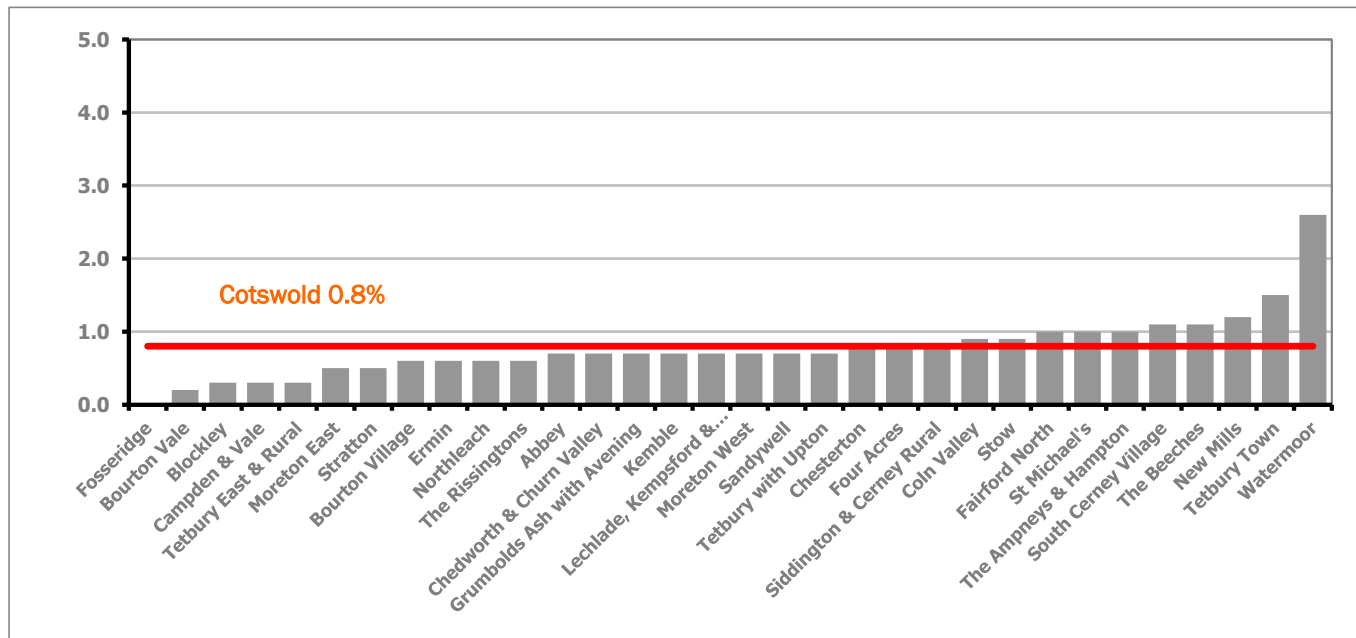
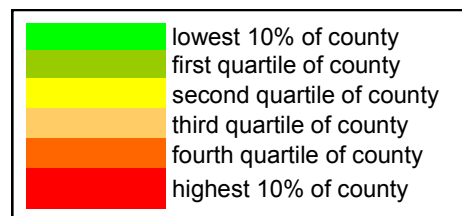


Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 0.8%. Ten wards lie above the average.

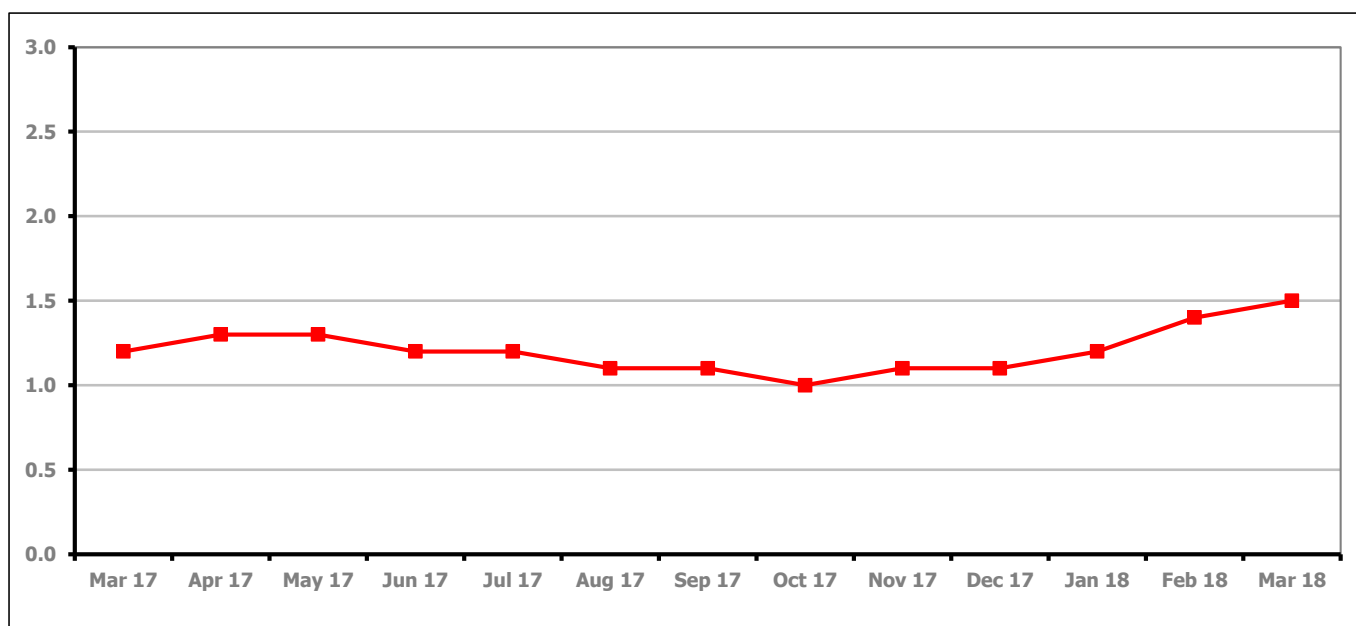

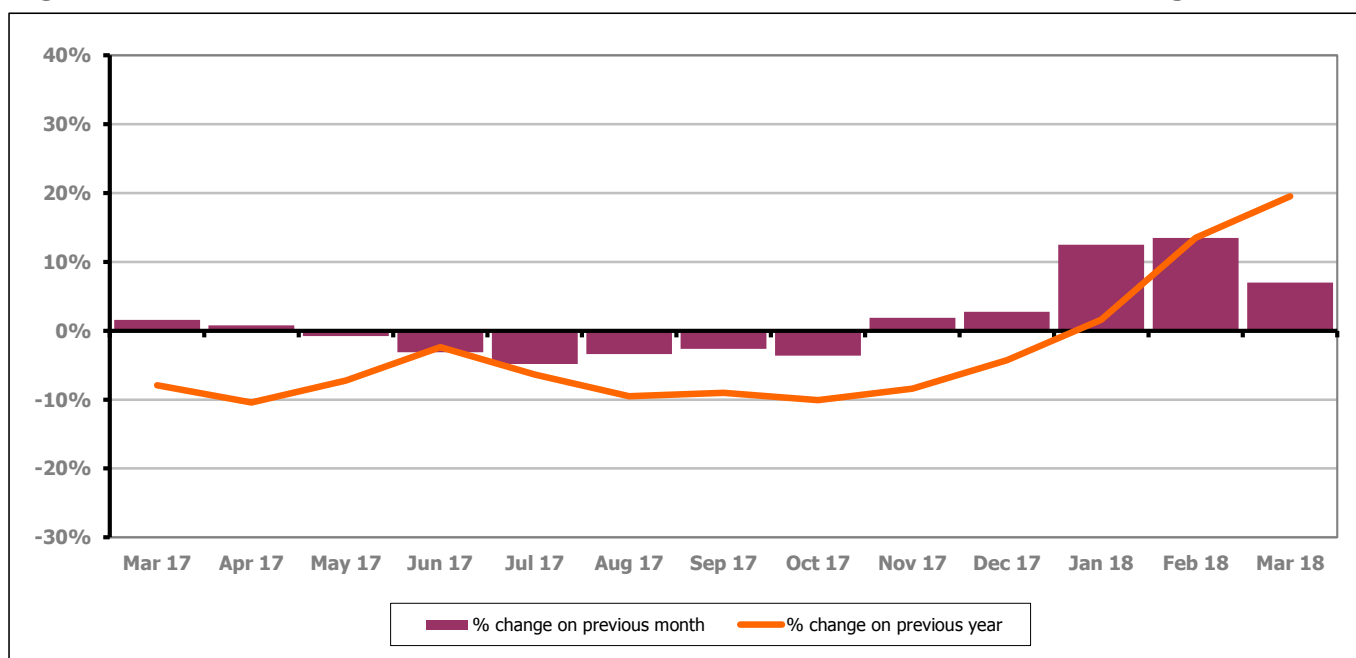
Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - March 2018

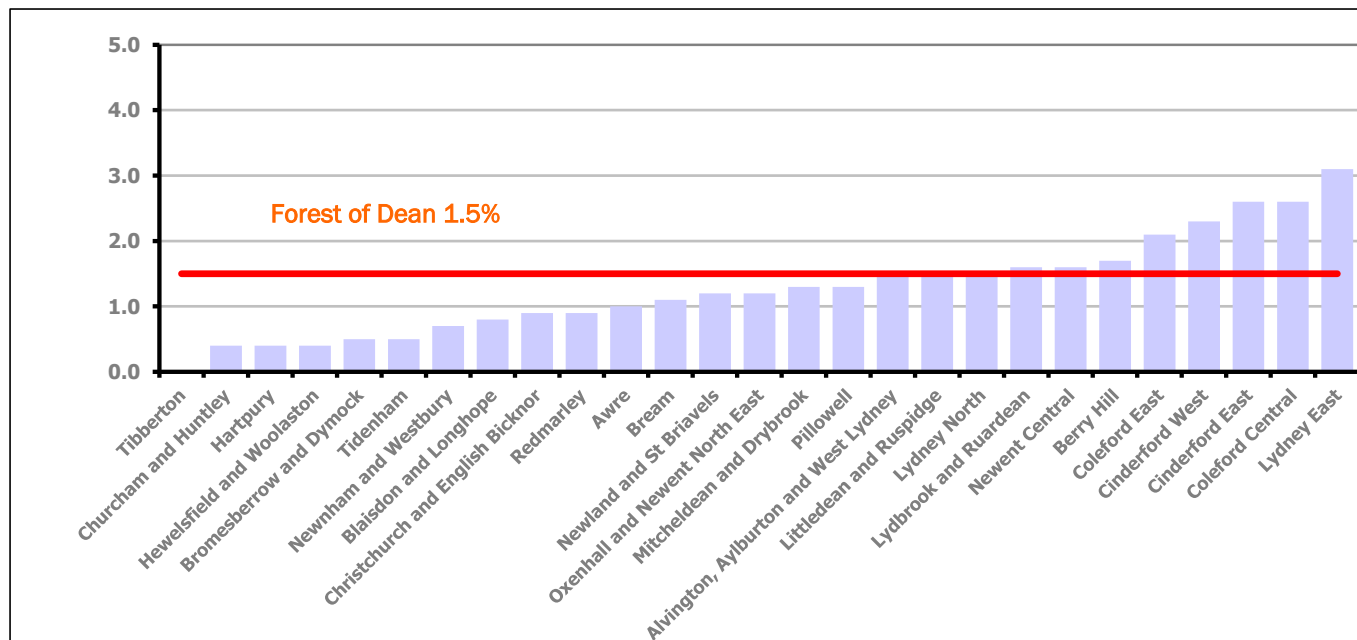
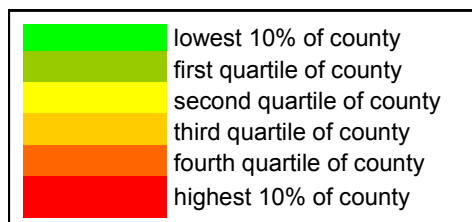

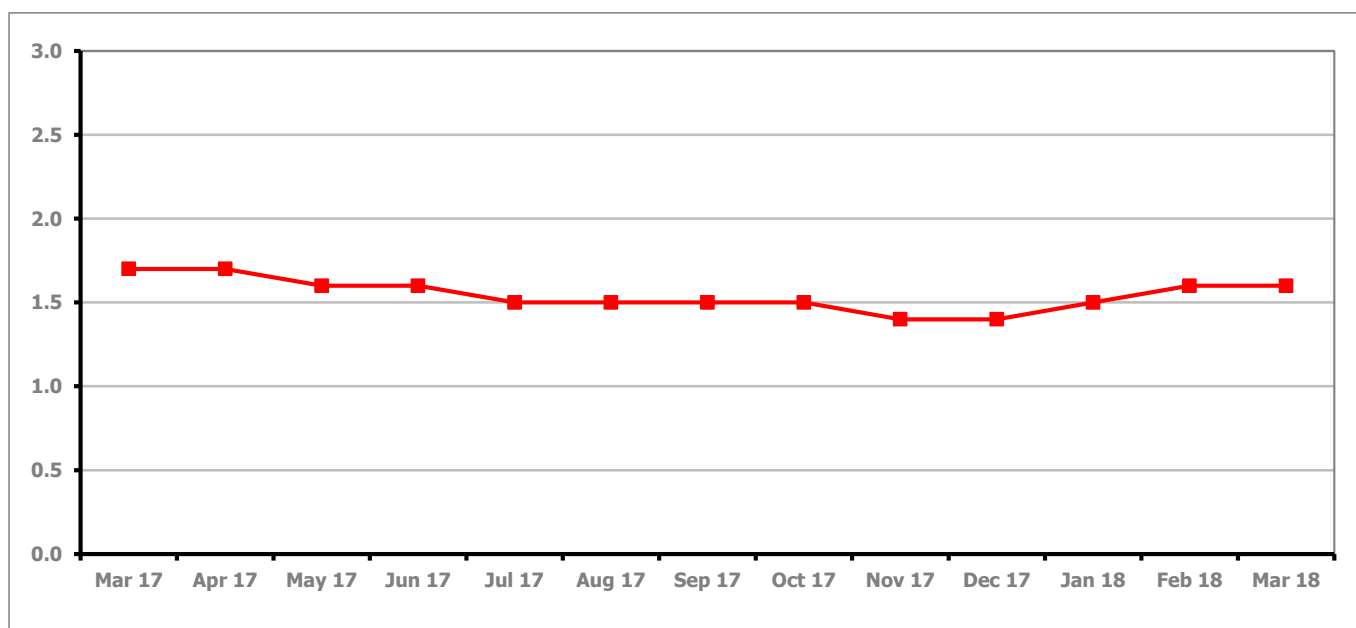

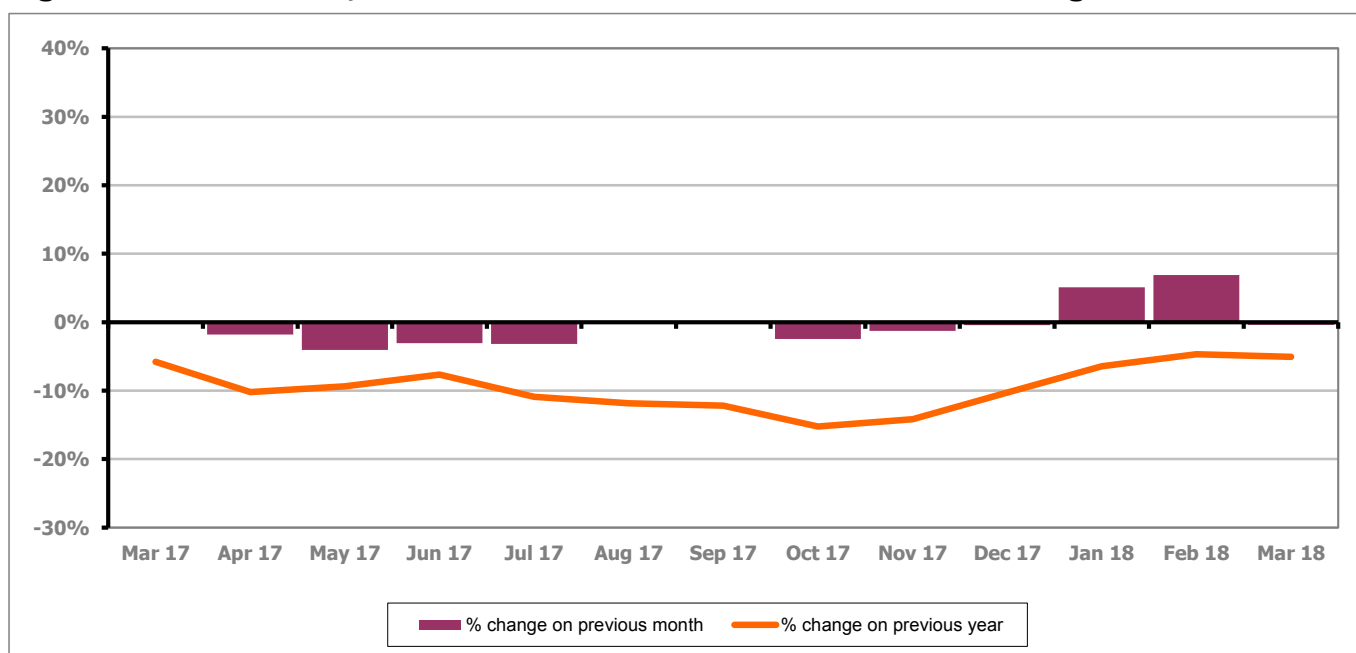
Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - March 2018

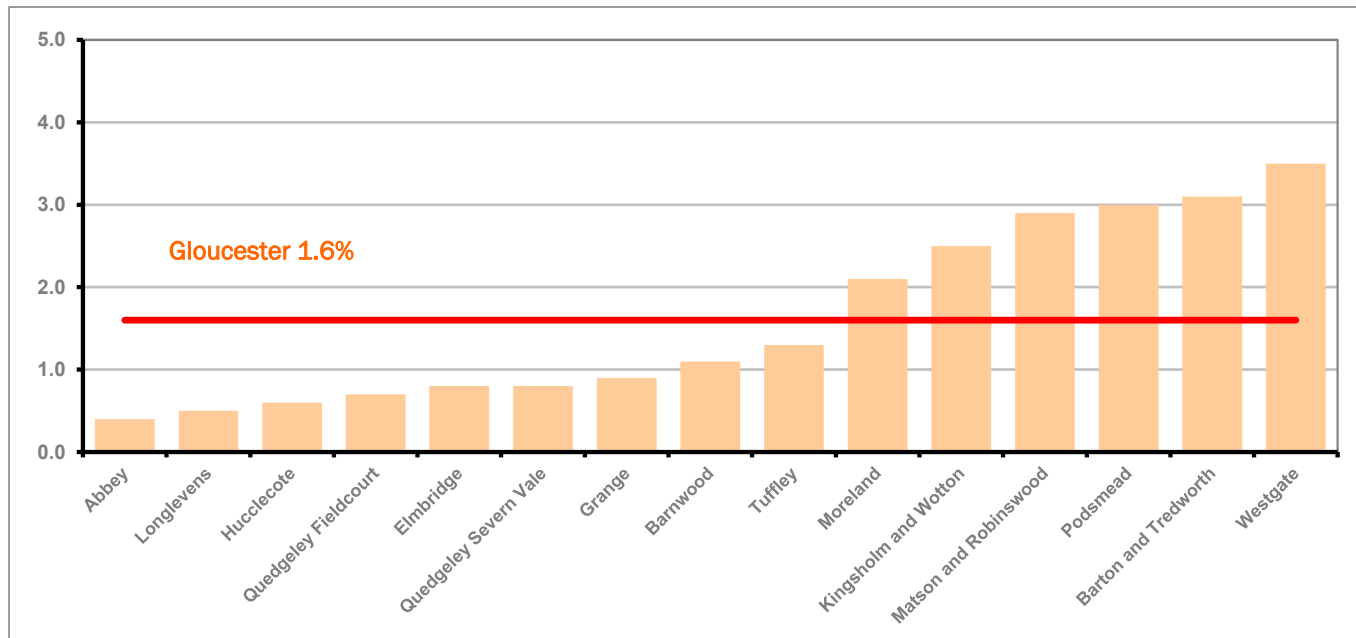
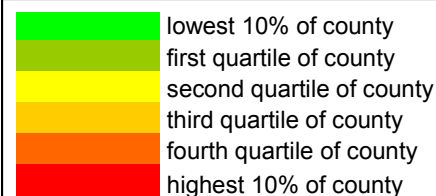


Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 1.6%. Six wards lie above the average.

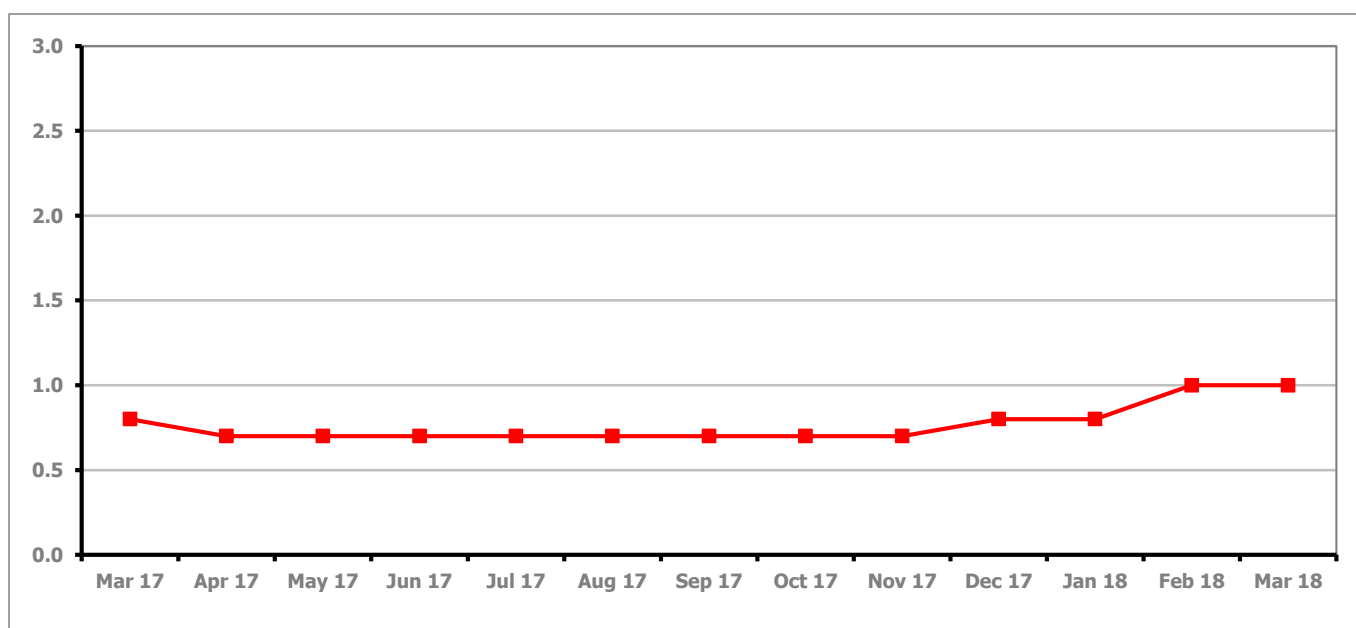

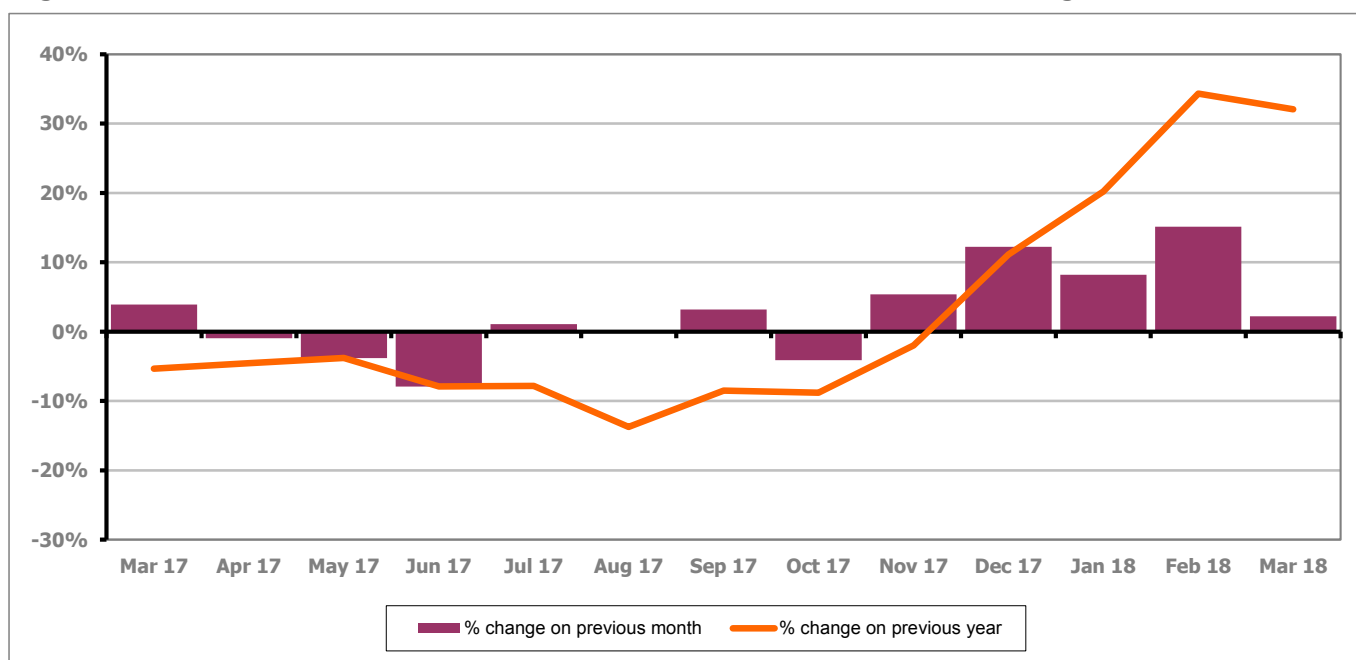
Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - March 2018

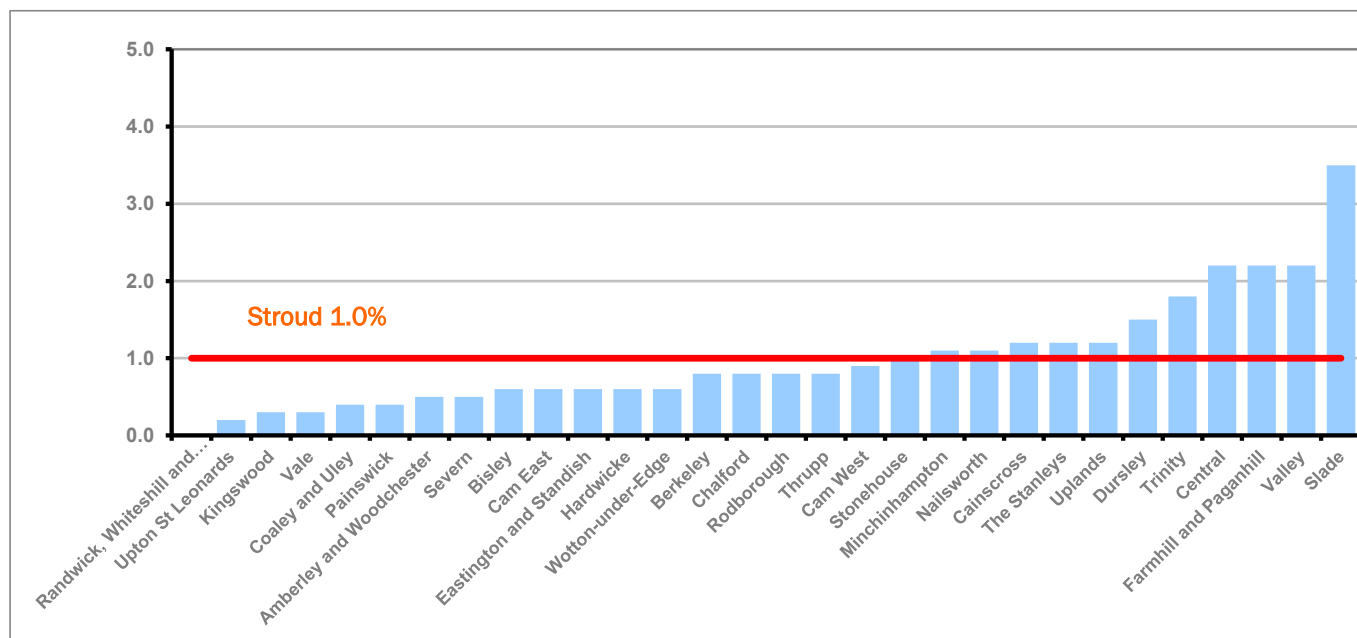
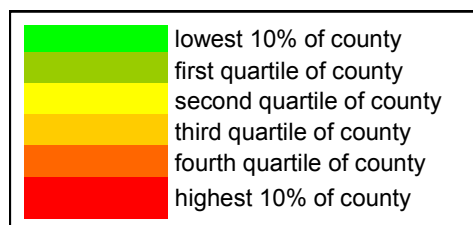

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year

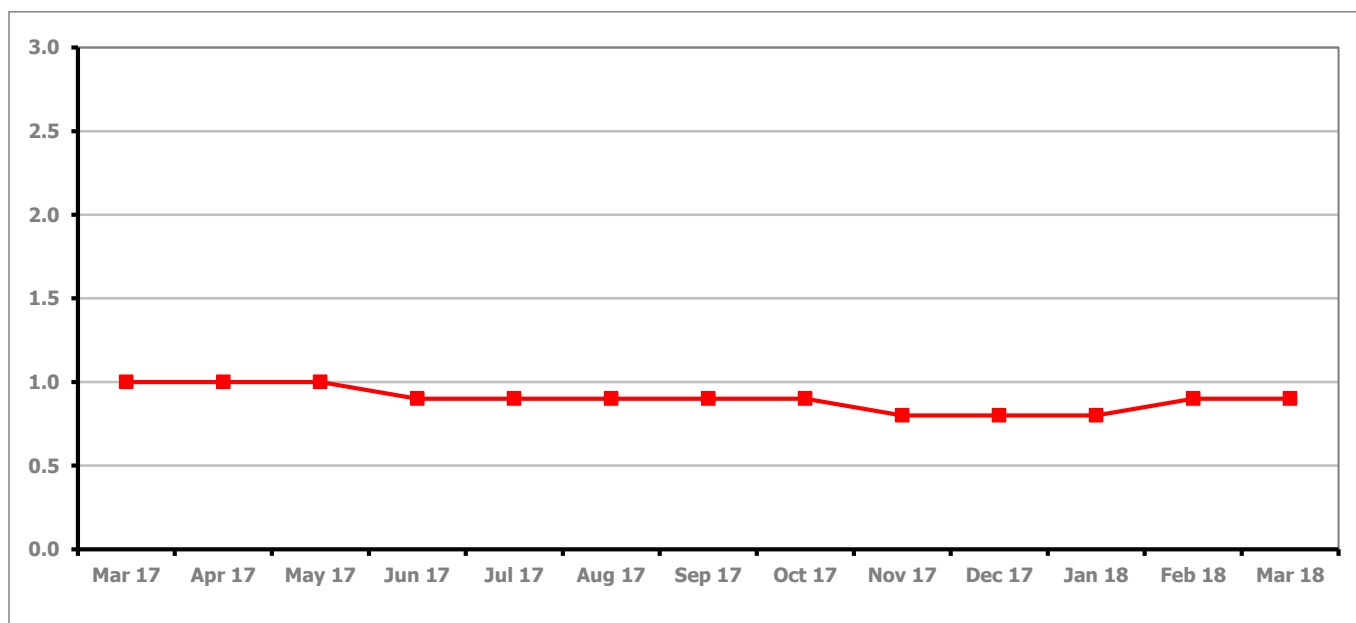


Figure 19 shows the claimant rate for Tewkesbury District stayed the same as last month at 0.9%.

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

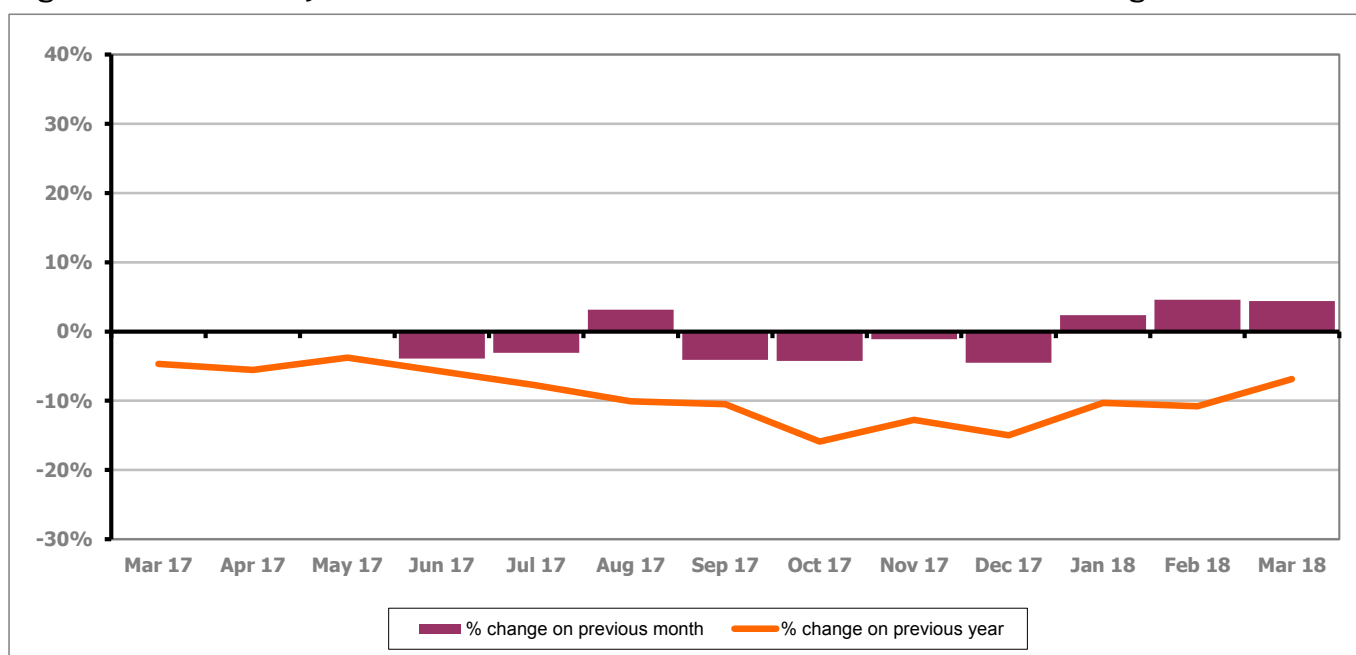


Figure 20 shows that the monthly claimant count has increased by 4.4% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased between February 2018 and March 2018 to -6.9%.

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - March 2018

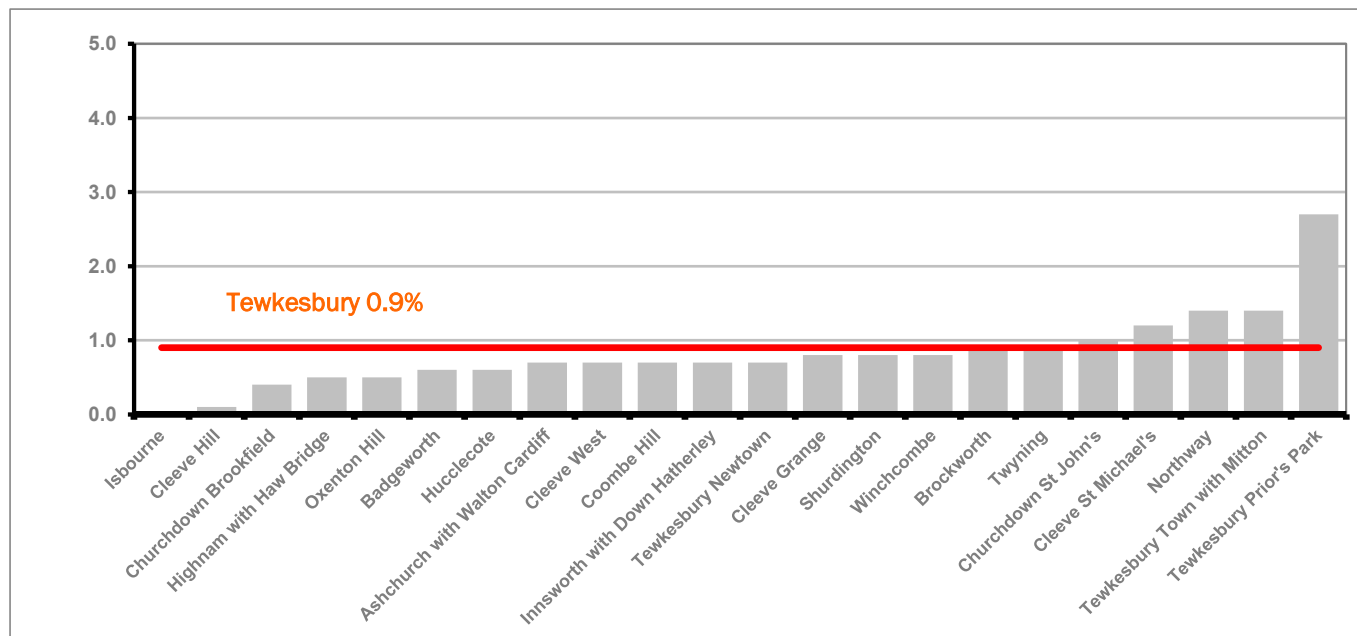

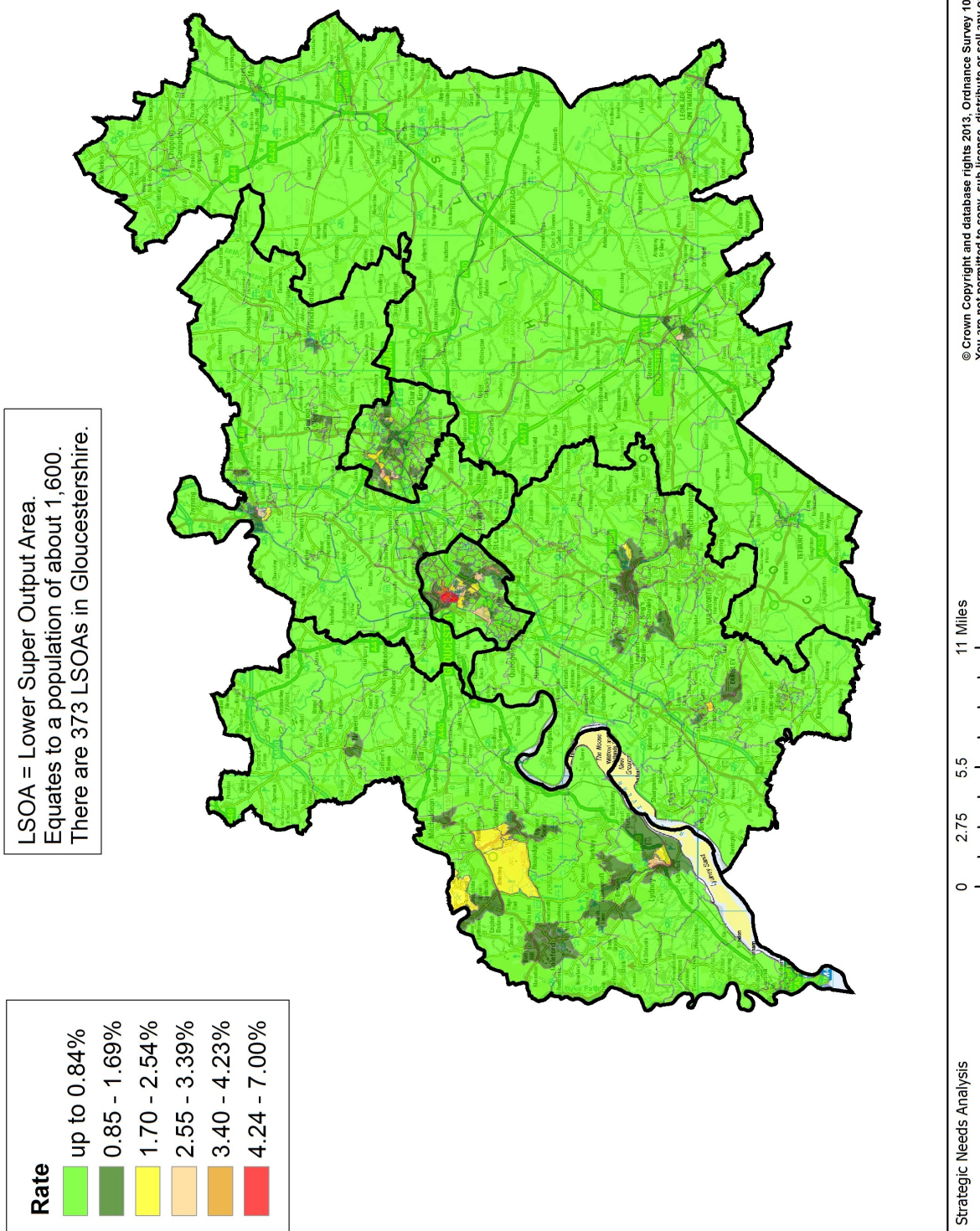

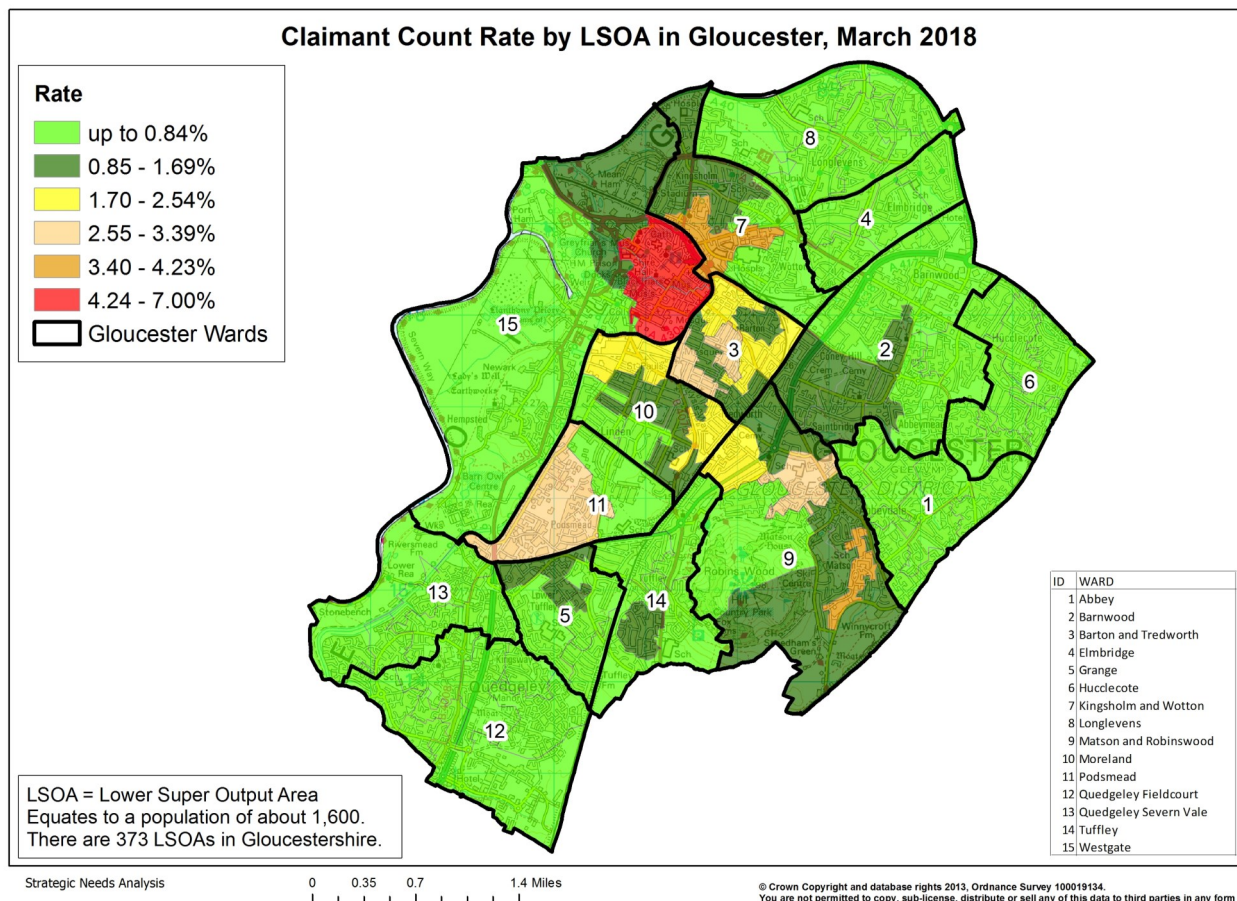
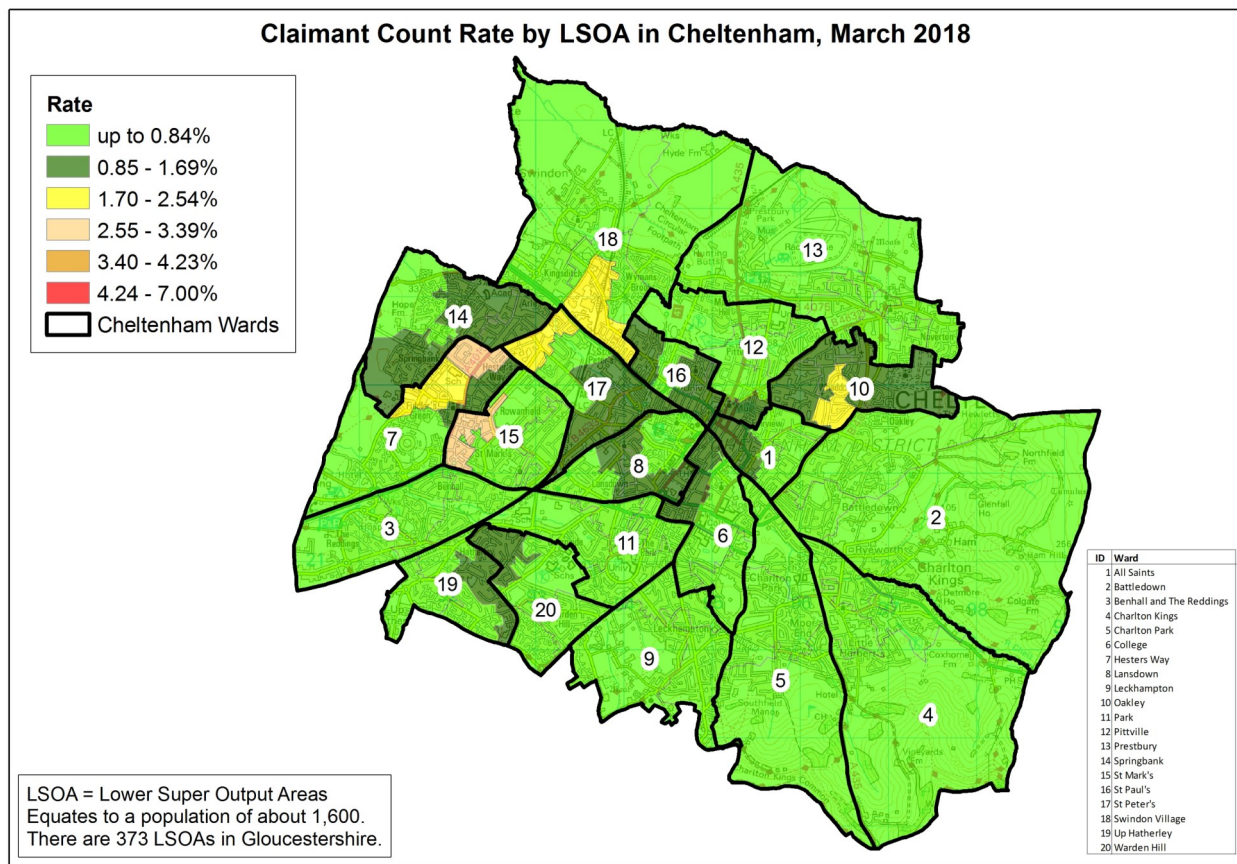

Figure 22: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year

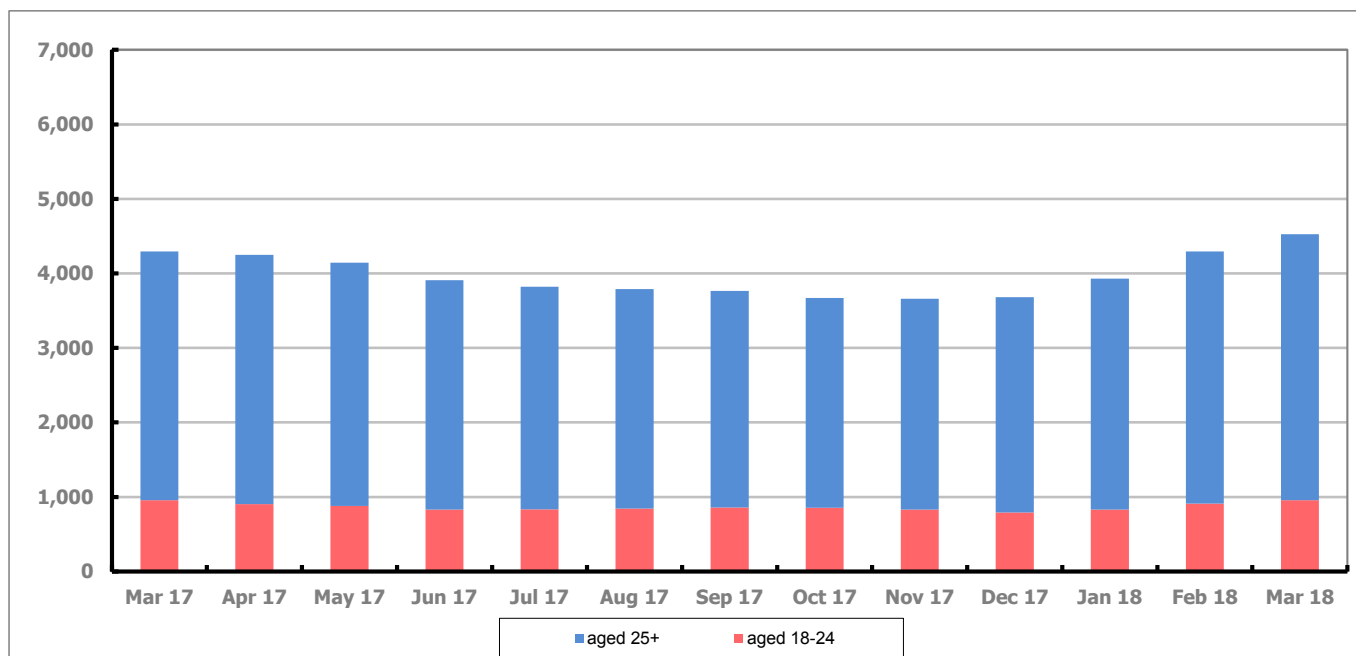

Figure 23: Youth Claimants in Gloucestershire - Month on Month and Year on Year change

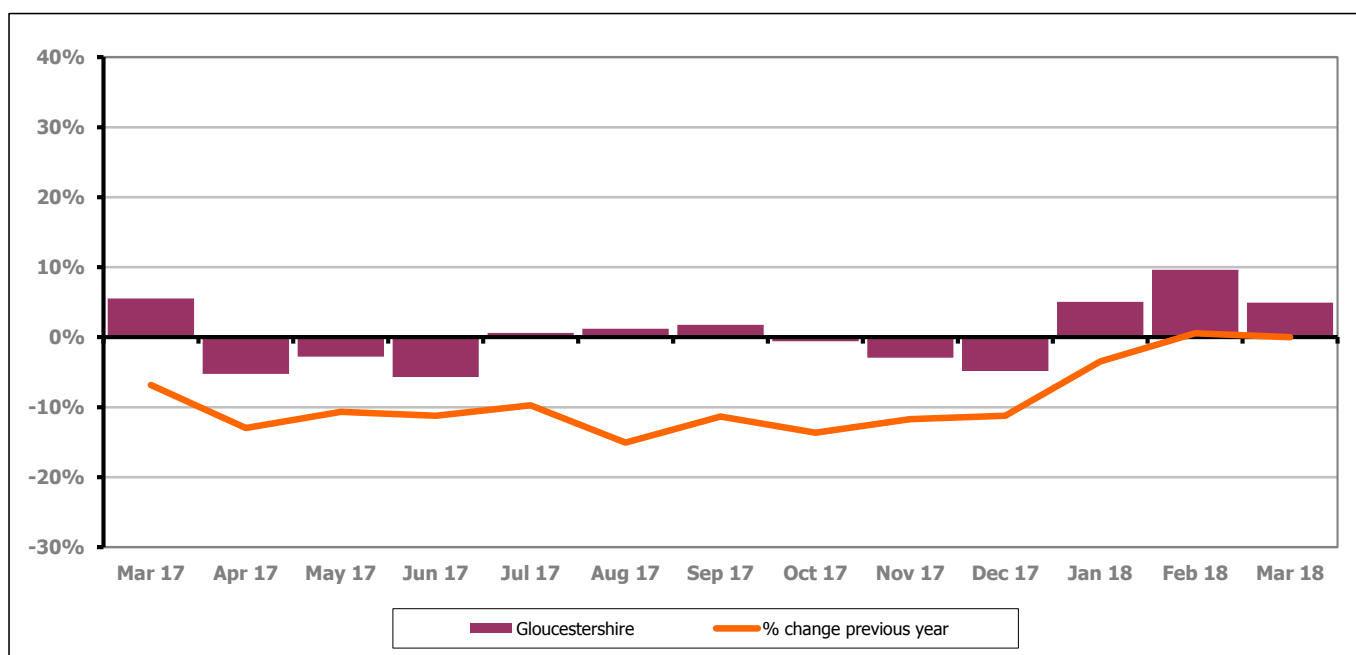


Figure 23 shows the number of young claimants increased in March 2018 by 4.9%. There has been no change in the number of young claimants compared with the same point last year.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of March 2018 there were 413 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 2.73%. The total number of NEET young people decreased by 48 in March 2018 compared to February 2018, all six districts saw a decrease in their figures.
