

# Unemployment Bulletin

Issue 22 May 2010

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## INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Economic section of the County Council Chief Executive's Support Unit Research Team. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis ([www.nomis.co.uk](http://www.nomis.co.uk)).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.

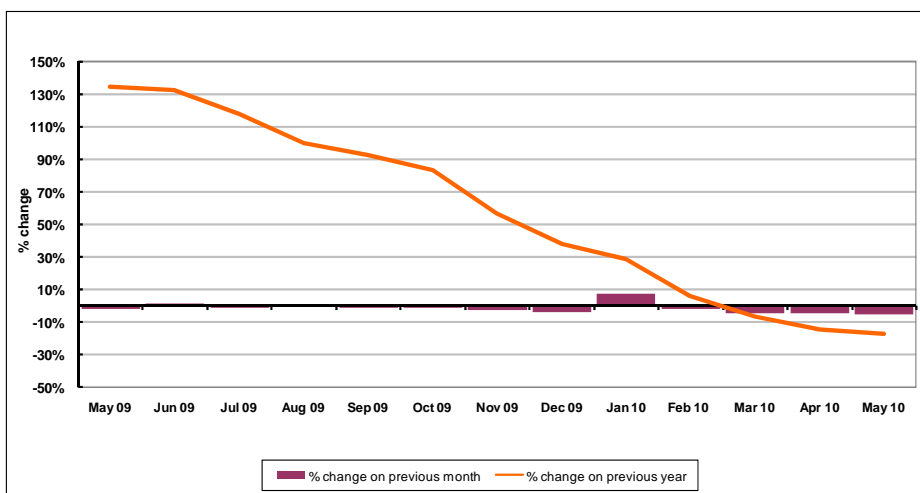
## PART 1: SUMMARY

**The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 3.0% in May 2010.** This was a decrease of 0.1% on the April 2010 figure. The UK and South West rate also decreased to 3.9% and 2.7% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate remains above the South West average of 2.7%, but 0.9% lower than the UK average of 3.9%.

**The claimant count in Gloucestershire in May 2010 decreased by 548 people.** The amount of people claiming in May 2010 was 5.0% lower than the number in April 2010 compared to a 6.0% decrease in the South West and a 4.2% decrease for the UK.

**The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased.** The count was 17% lower in May 2010 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

## YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

As at the end of May 2010 there were 615 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.2%.

### Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

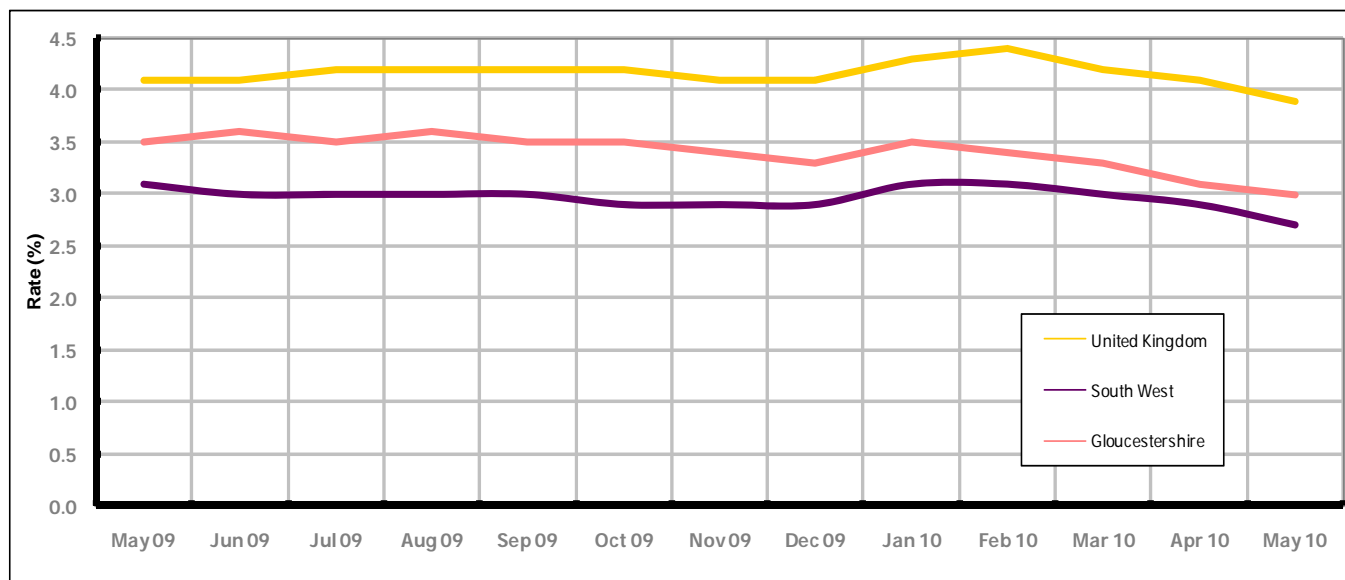


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 3.0% in May 2010. The rate has remained slightly higher than the South West average over the past year, but persistently lower by approximately 0.9% against the UK average during the same period. The May 2010 rate represented a 0.1% decrease on April 2010.

Table 1 shows that in May 2010, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 5.0% lower than the number in April 2010.

The average growth in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to May 2010 was -1.6%. This is 0.9% lower than the UK average and 0.4% lower than the South West average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - May 2010

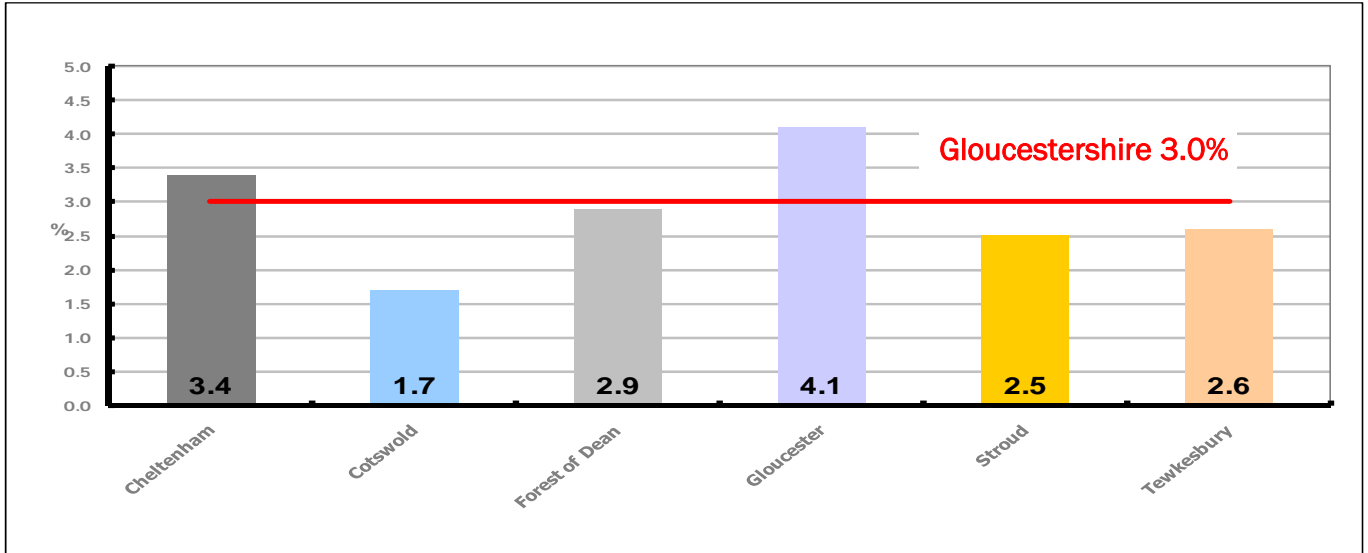


Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for May 2010 in Gloucestershire. Between April 2010 and May 2010 all districts declined.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

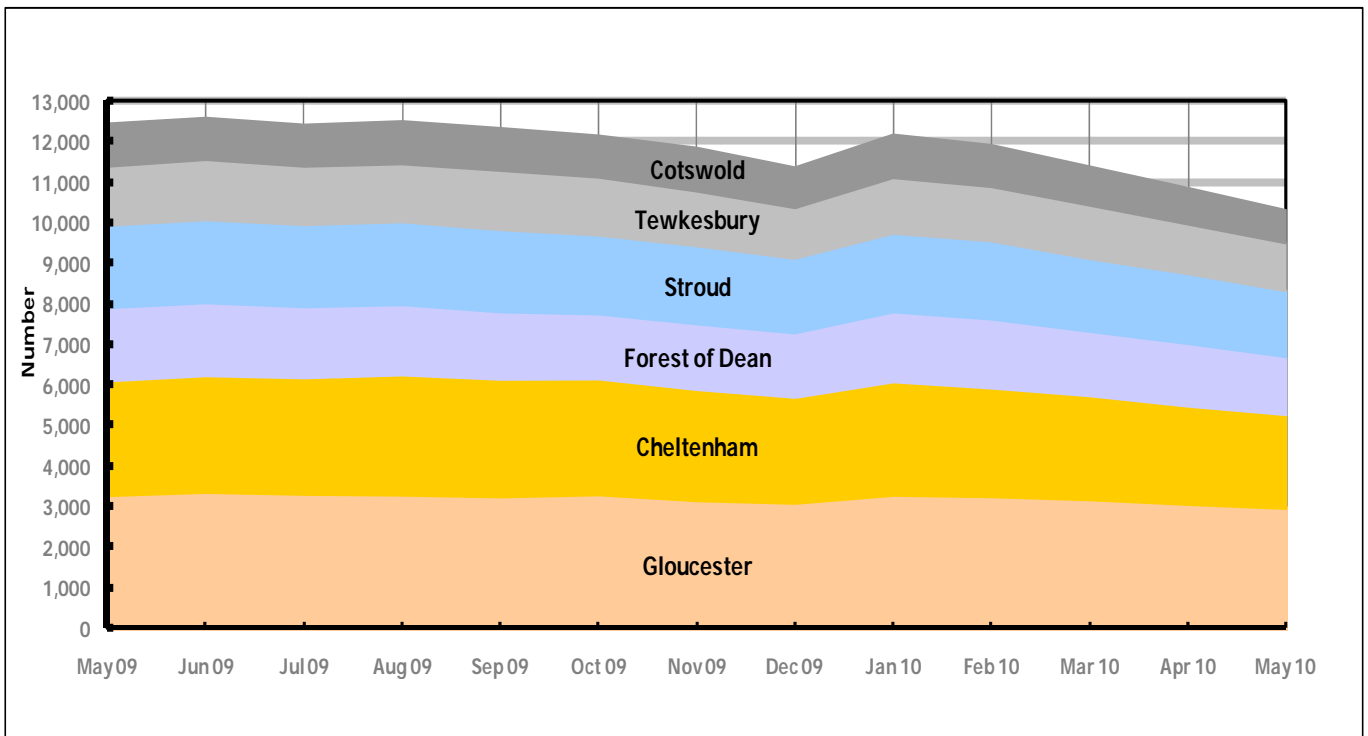

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

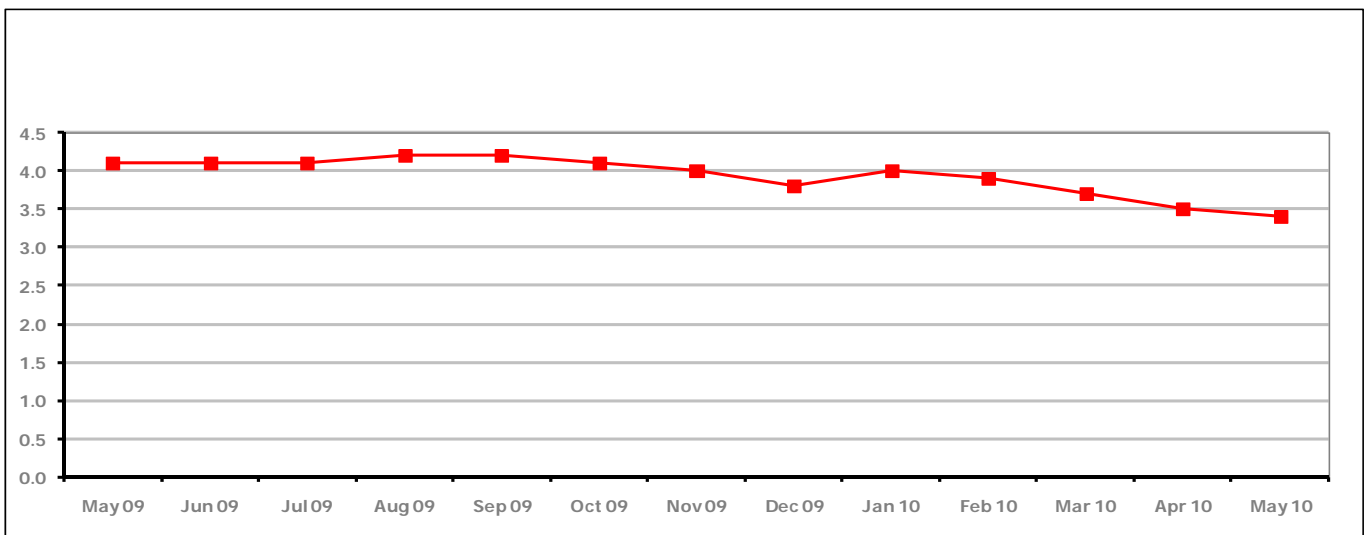


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham decreased in May 2010 to 3.4%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

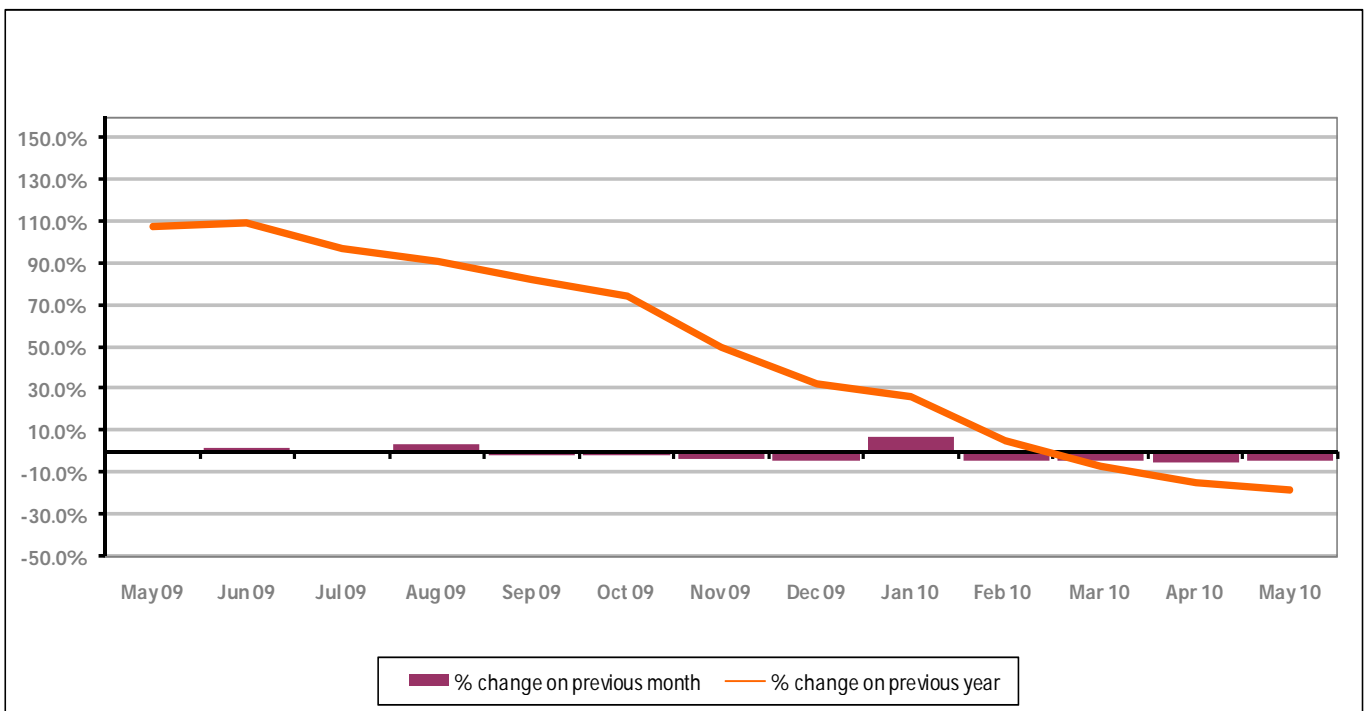

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - May 2010

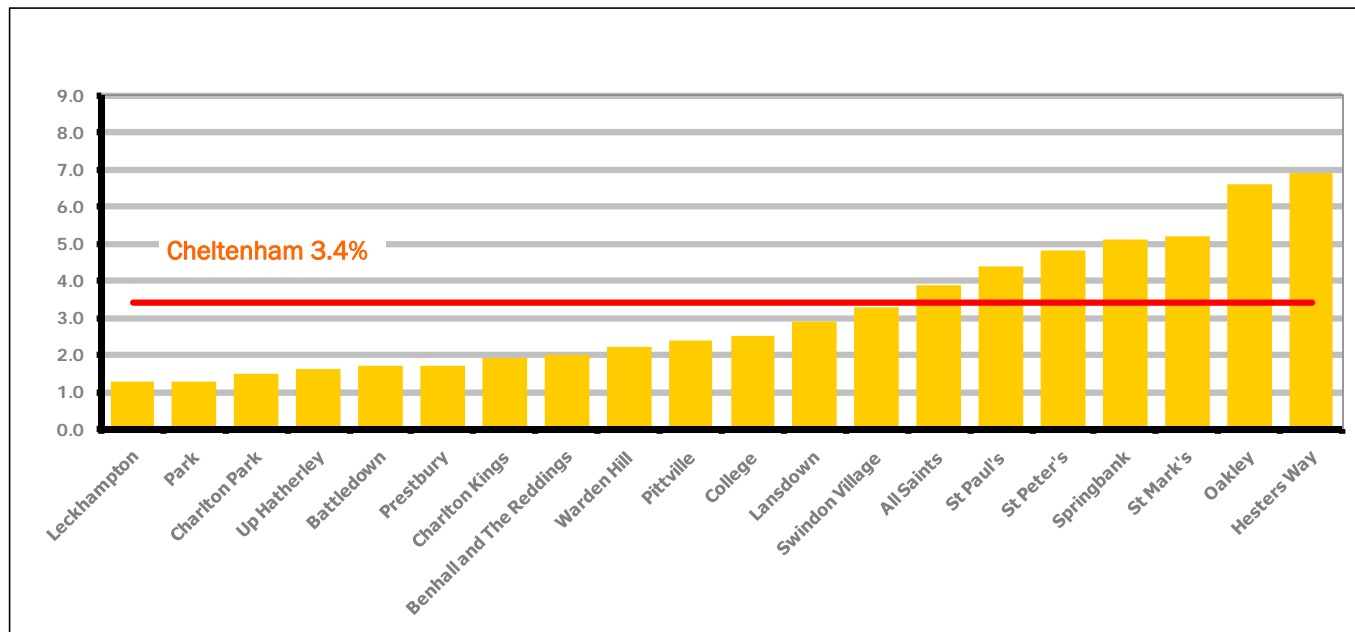
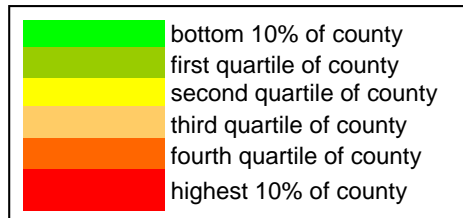

Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year

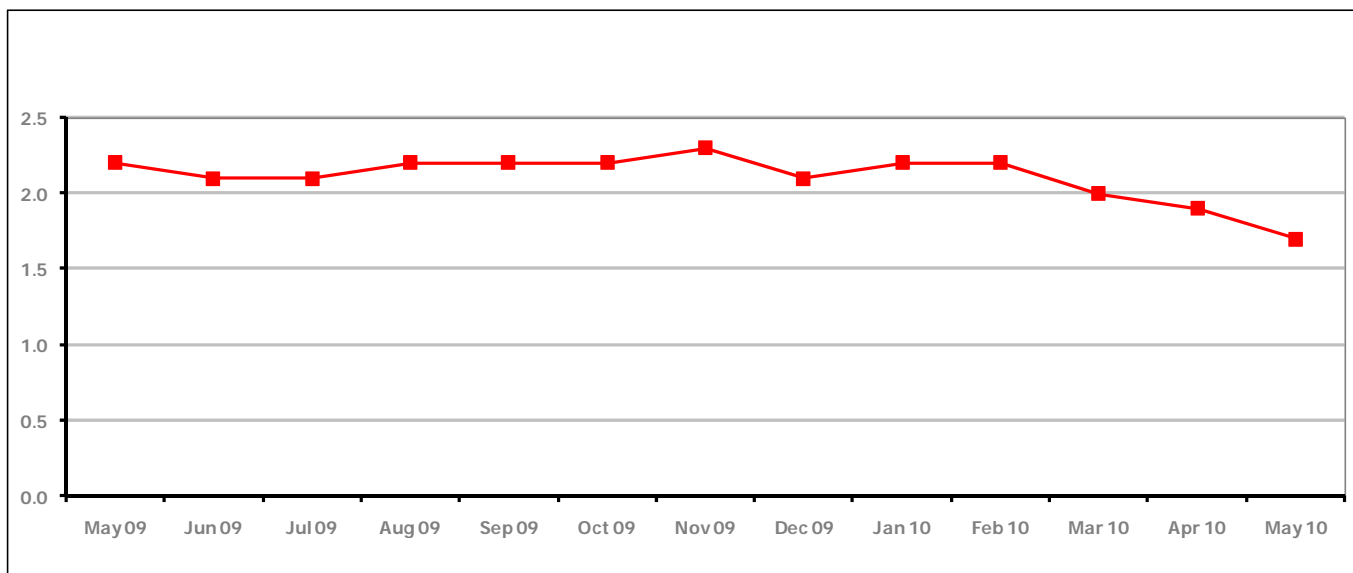


Figure 7 shows the claimant rate in Cotswold District decreased in May 2010 to 1.7%.

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

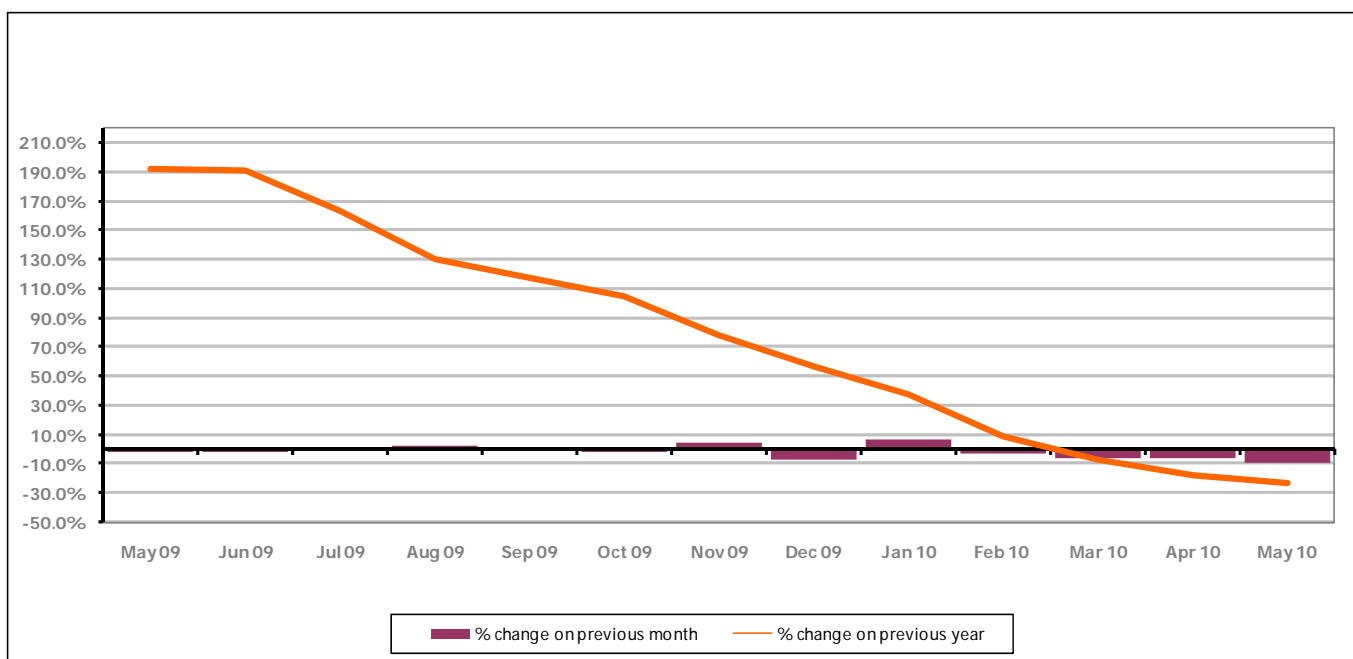


Figure 8 shows the claimant count decreased by 9.3% since April 2010. The change on the previous year has decreased from April 2010 to May 2010 to -22.8%.

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - May 2010

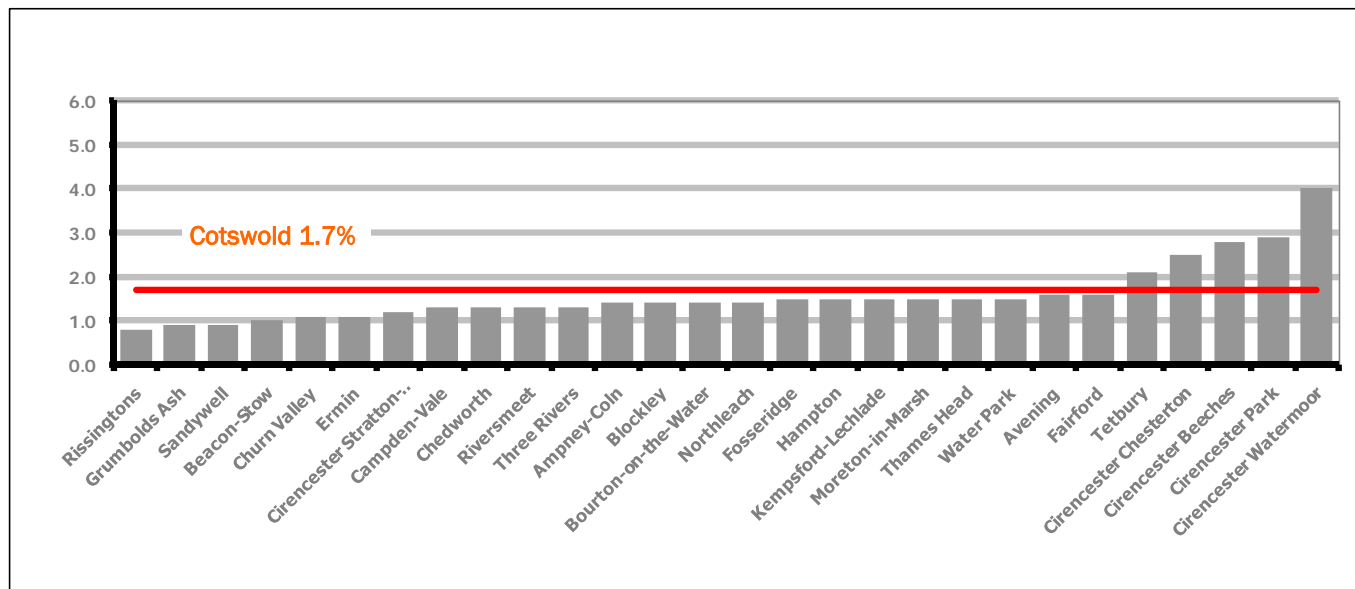
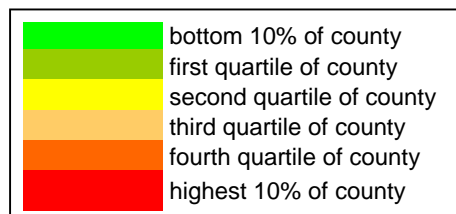


Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.7%. Five wards lie above the average.

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

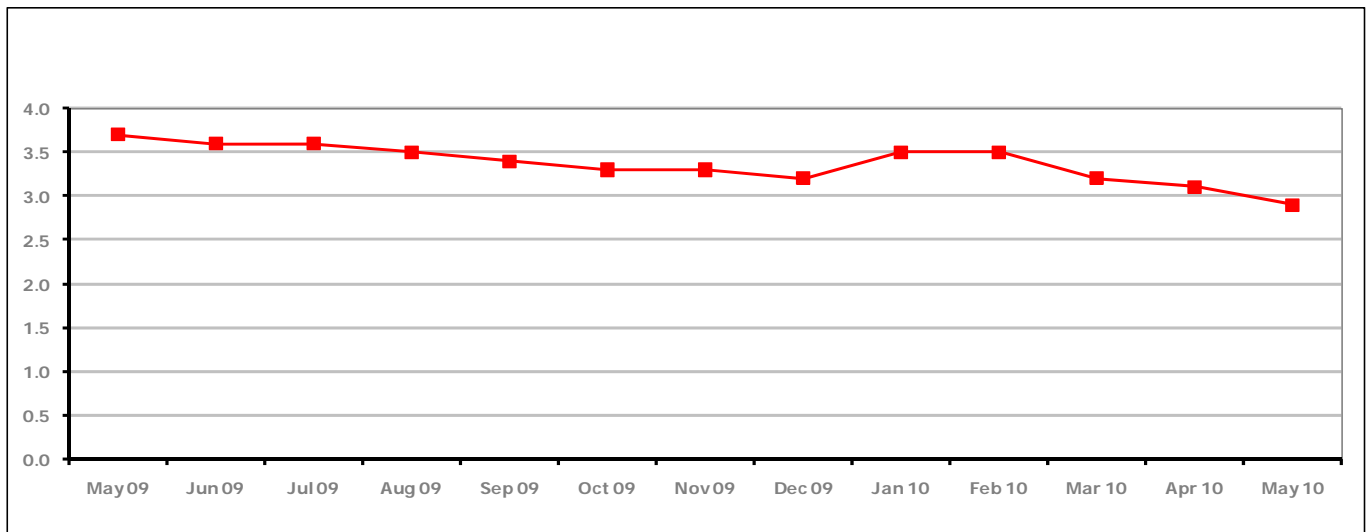

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

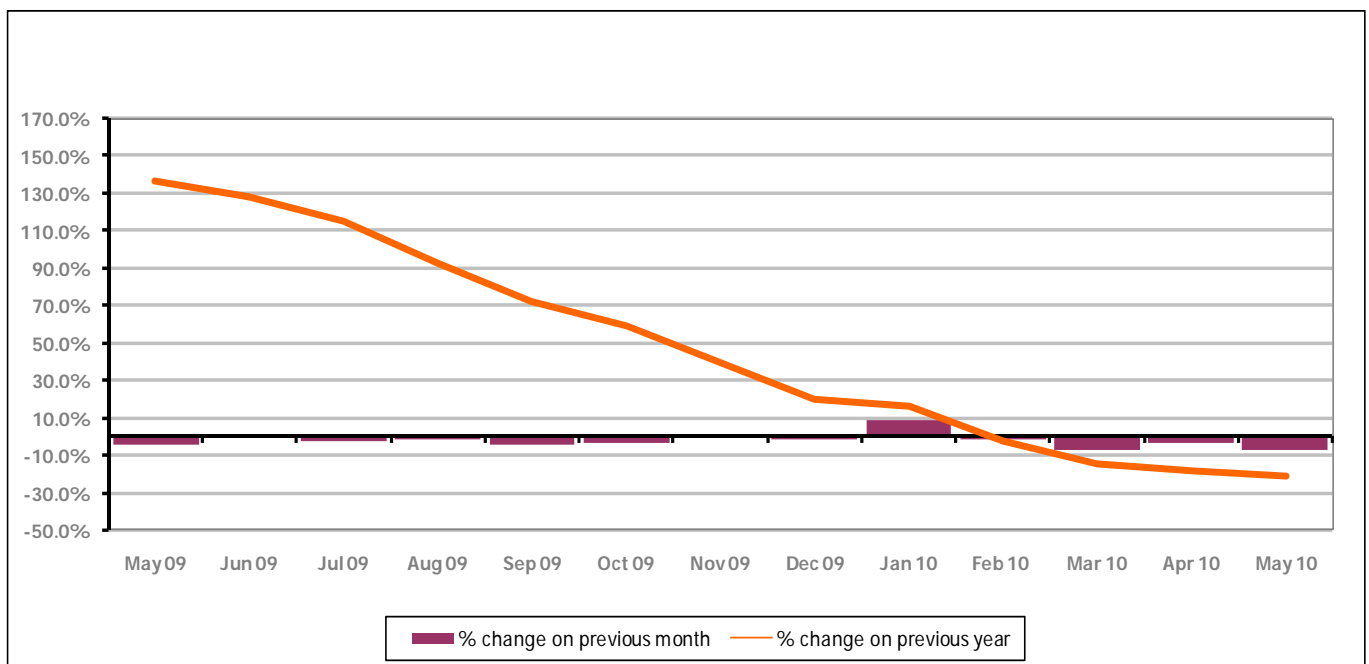


Figure 11 shows the claimant count decreased by 7.6% since April 2010. The change on the previous year decreased between May 2010 and April 2010 to -21.4%.

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - May 2010

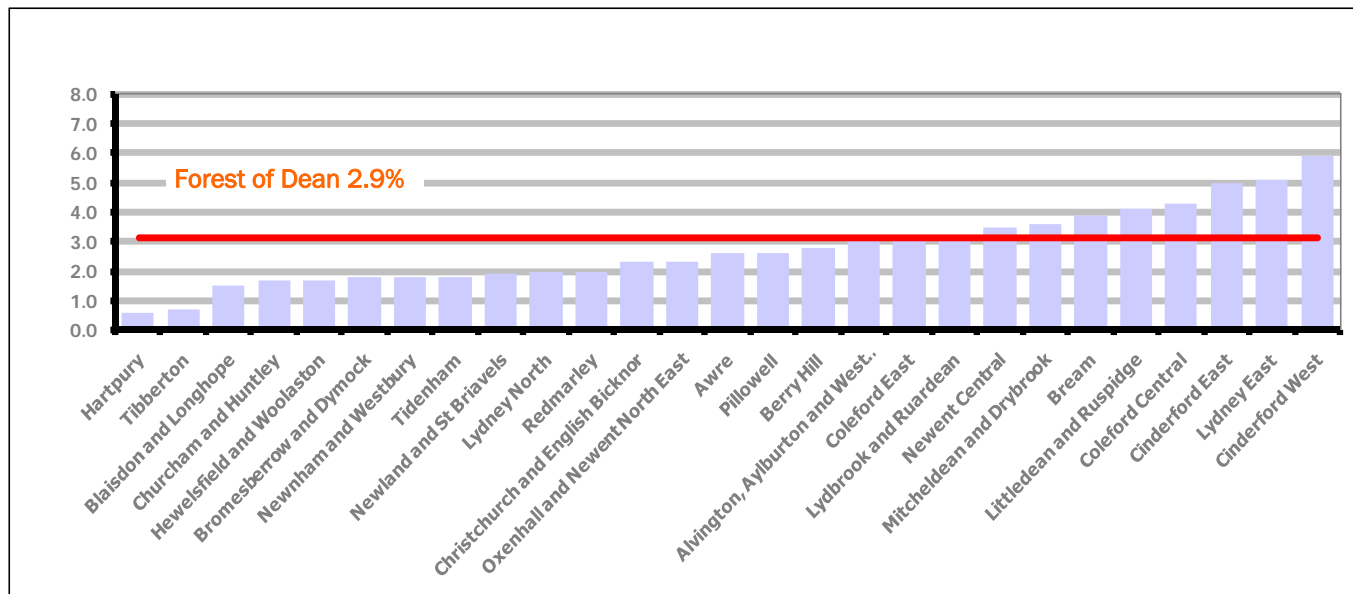


Figure 12 shows the claimant rates for Forest of Dean District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 2.9%. Ten wards lie above the average.

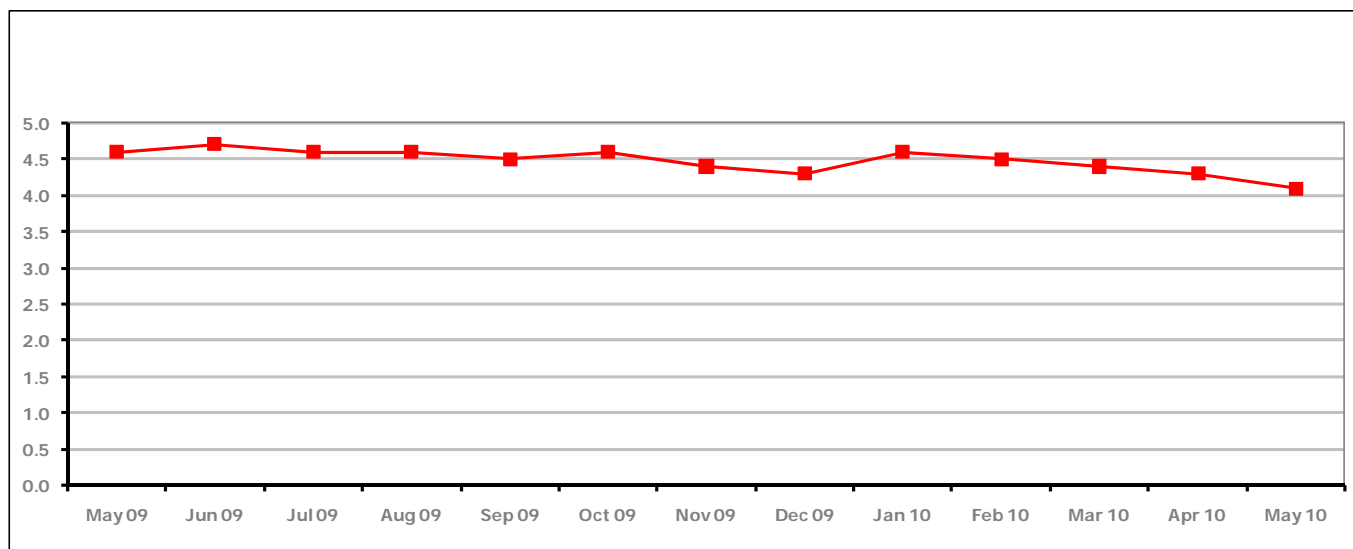

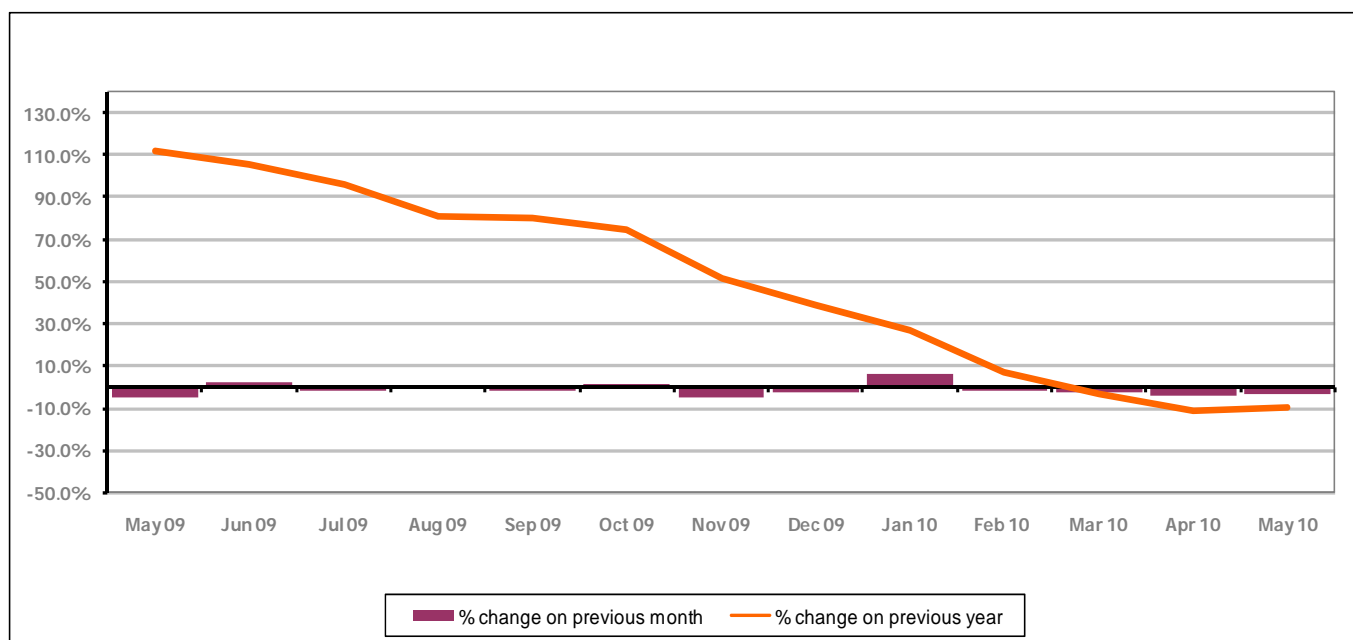
*Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change*

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - May 2010

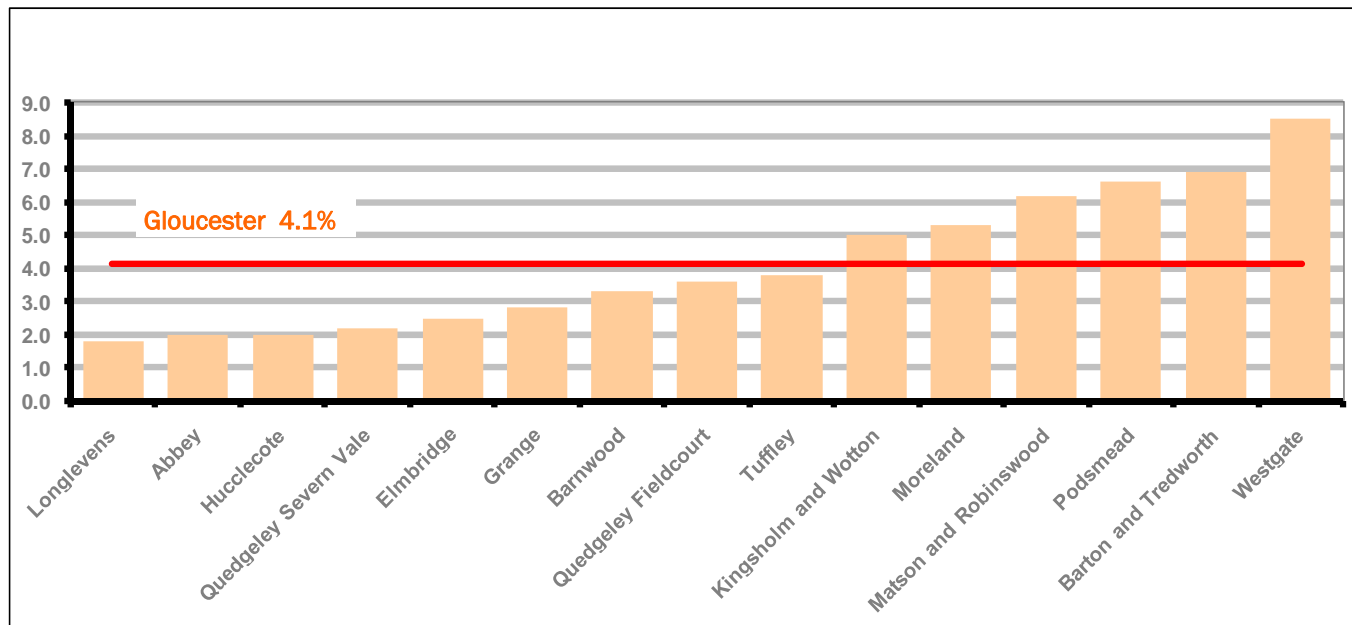
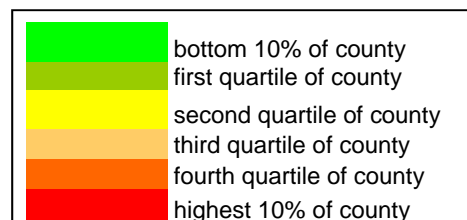


Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 4.1%. Six wards lie above the average.

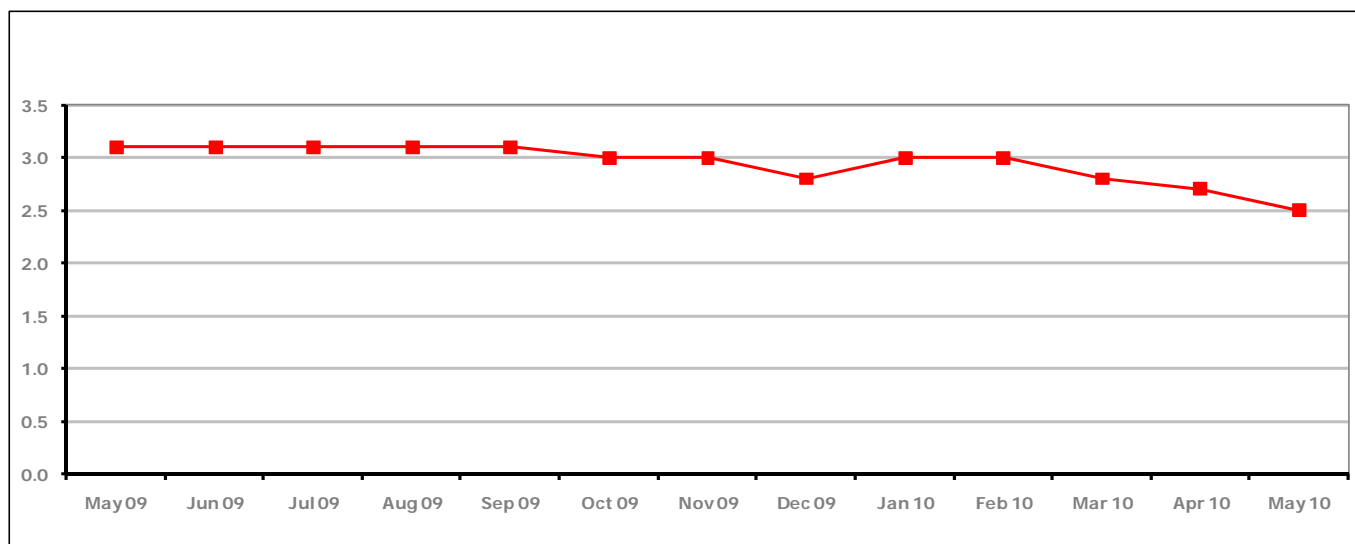

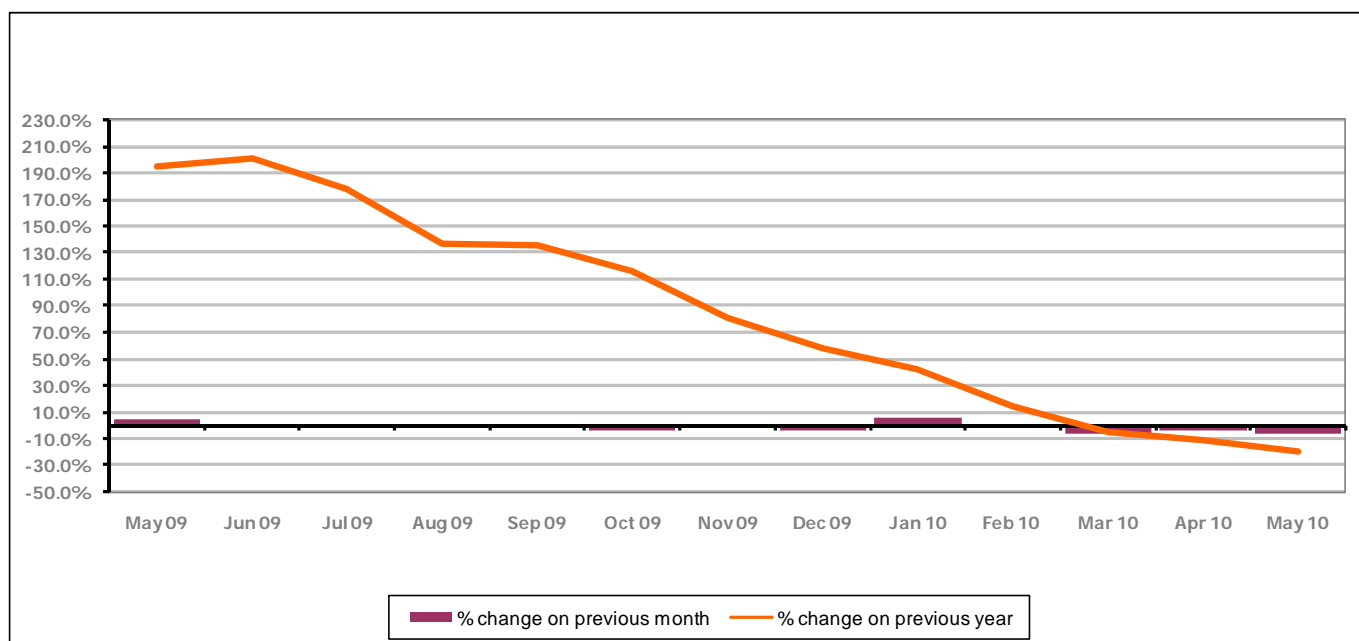
*Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change*

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - May 2010

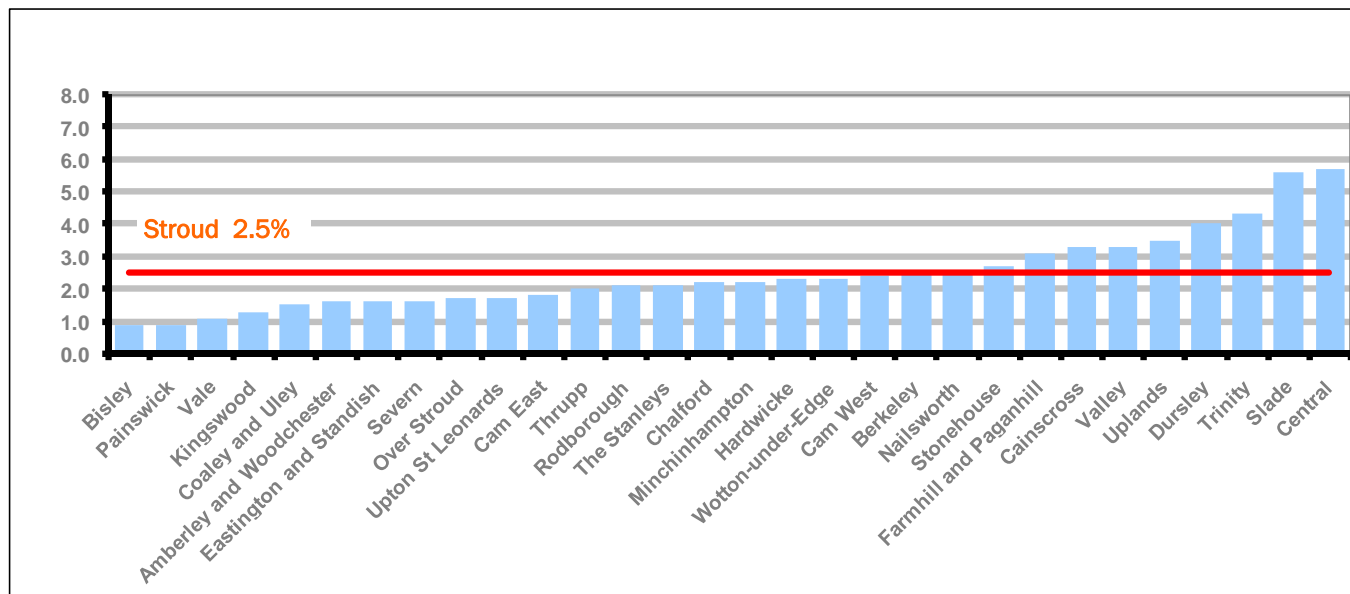
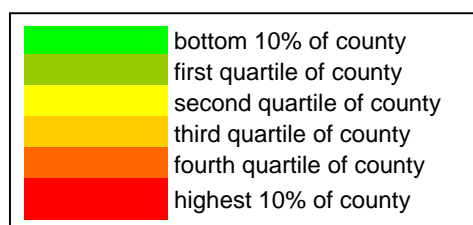

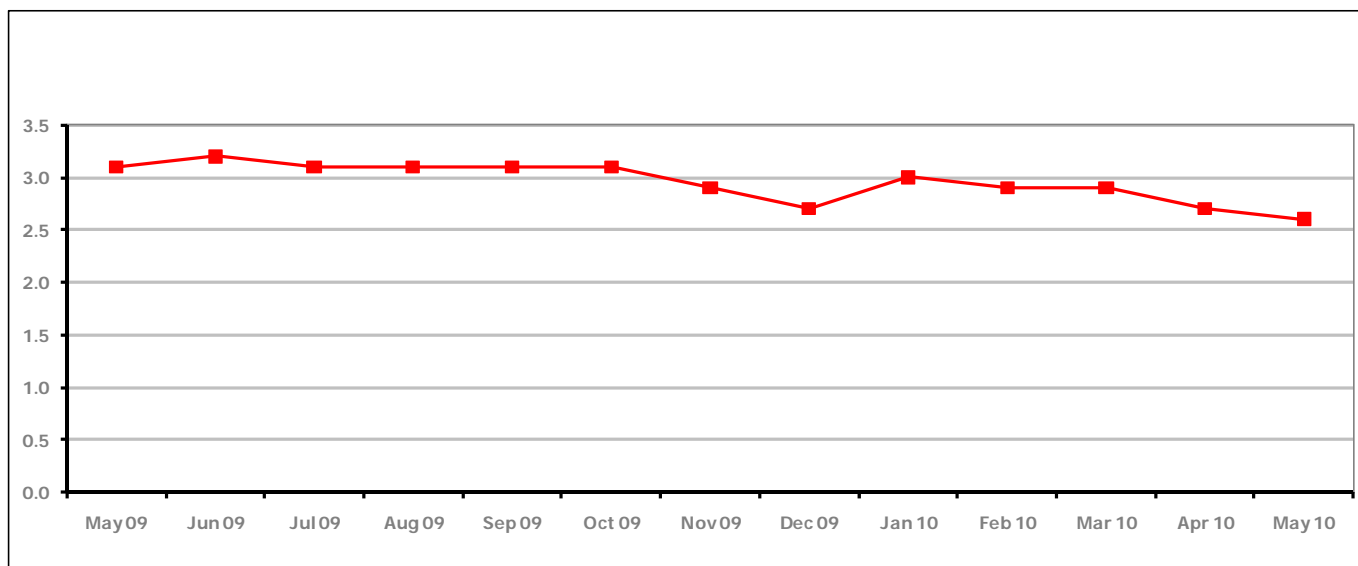

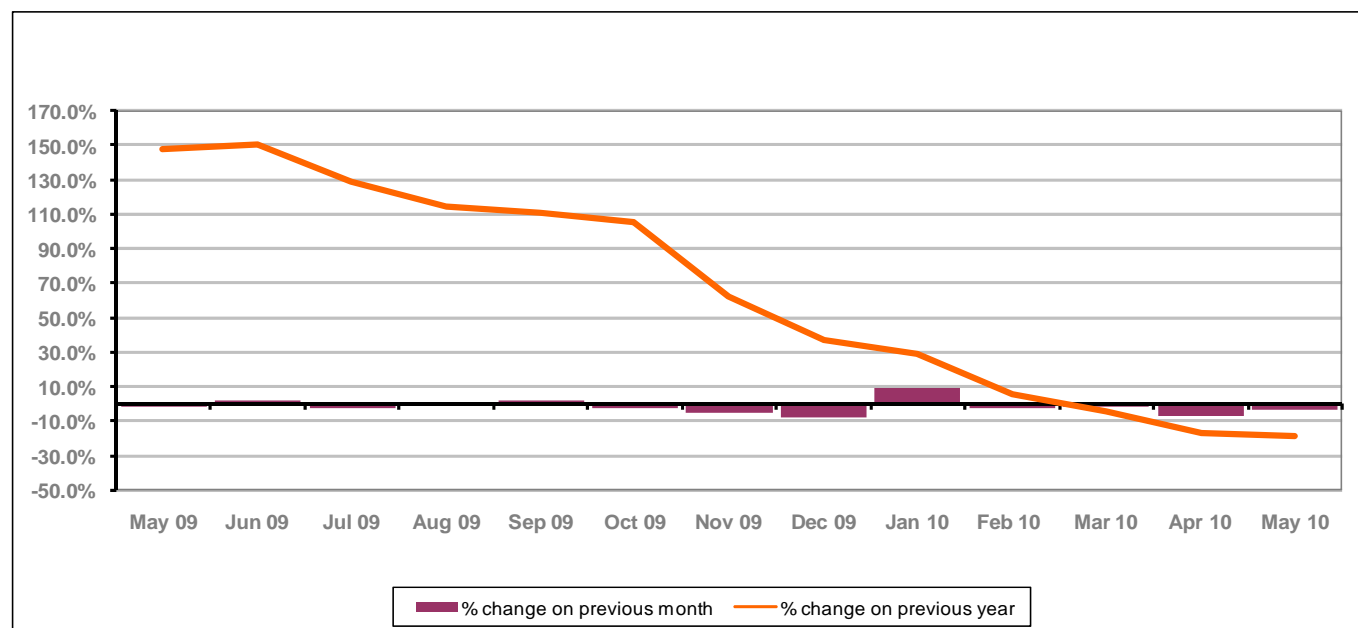
*Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change*

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - May 2010

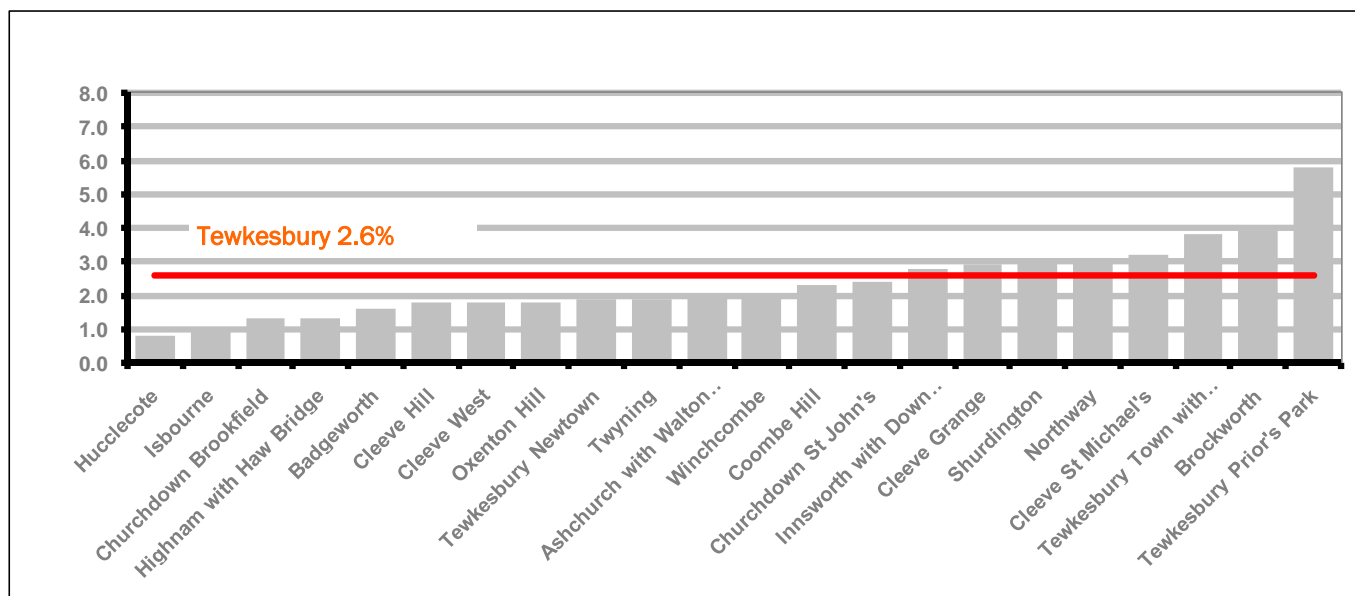
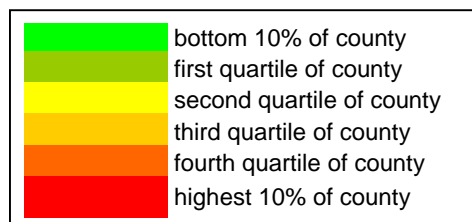


Figure 21 shows the claimant rates in Tewkesbury District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 2.6% and eight wards are above the average.

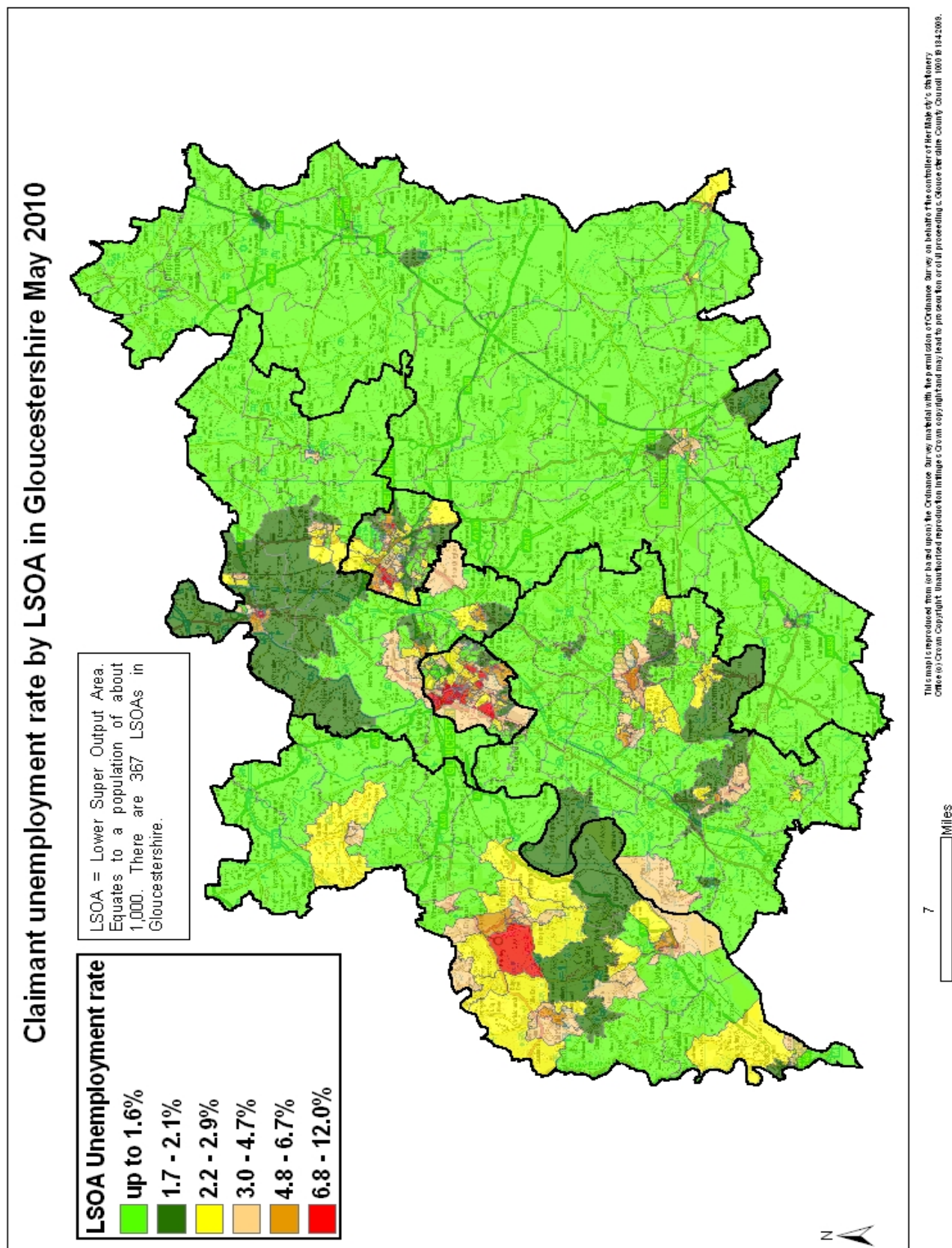

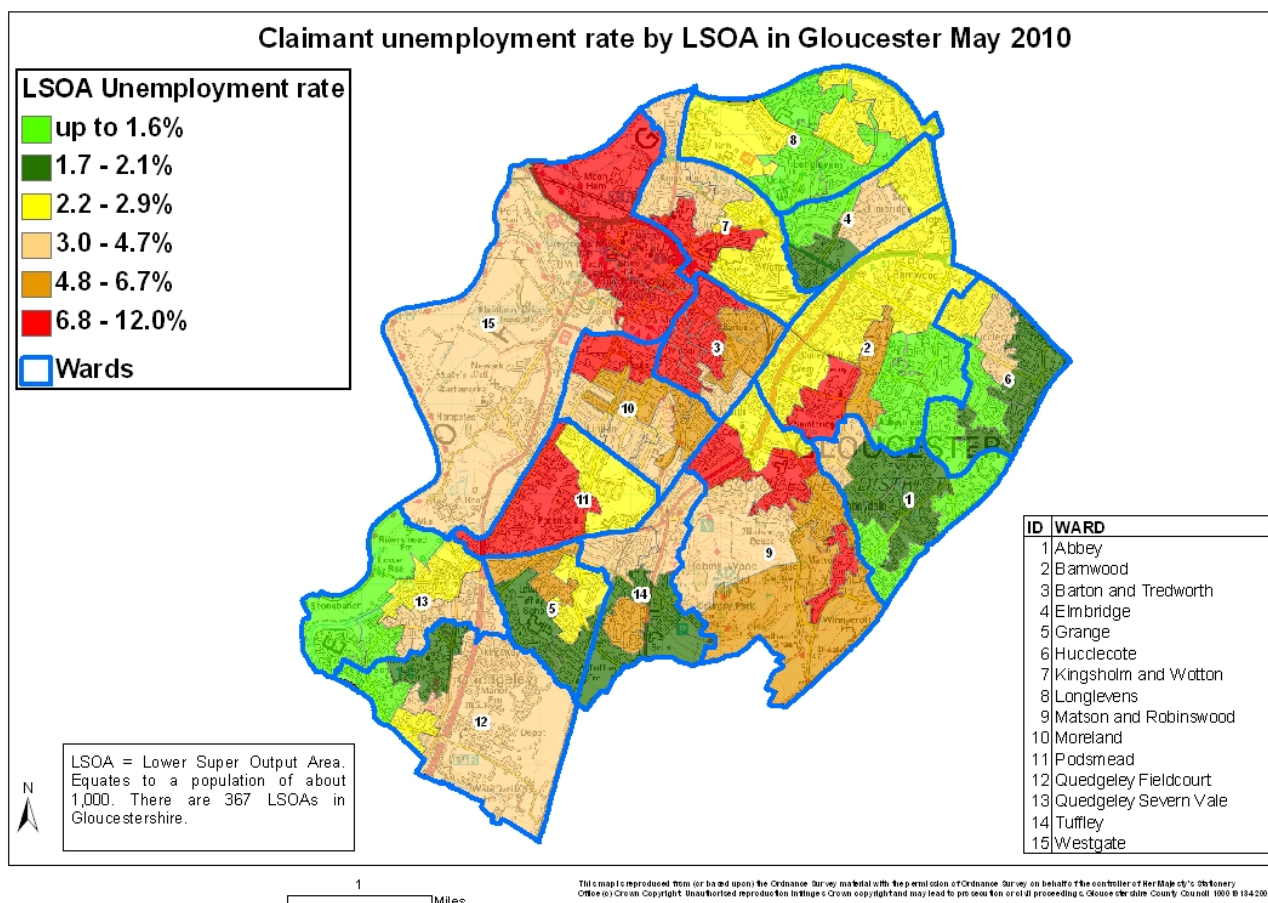
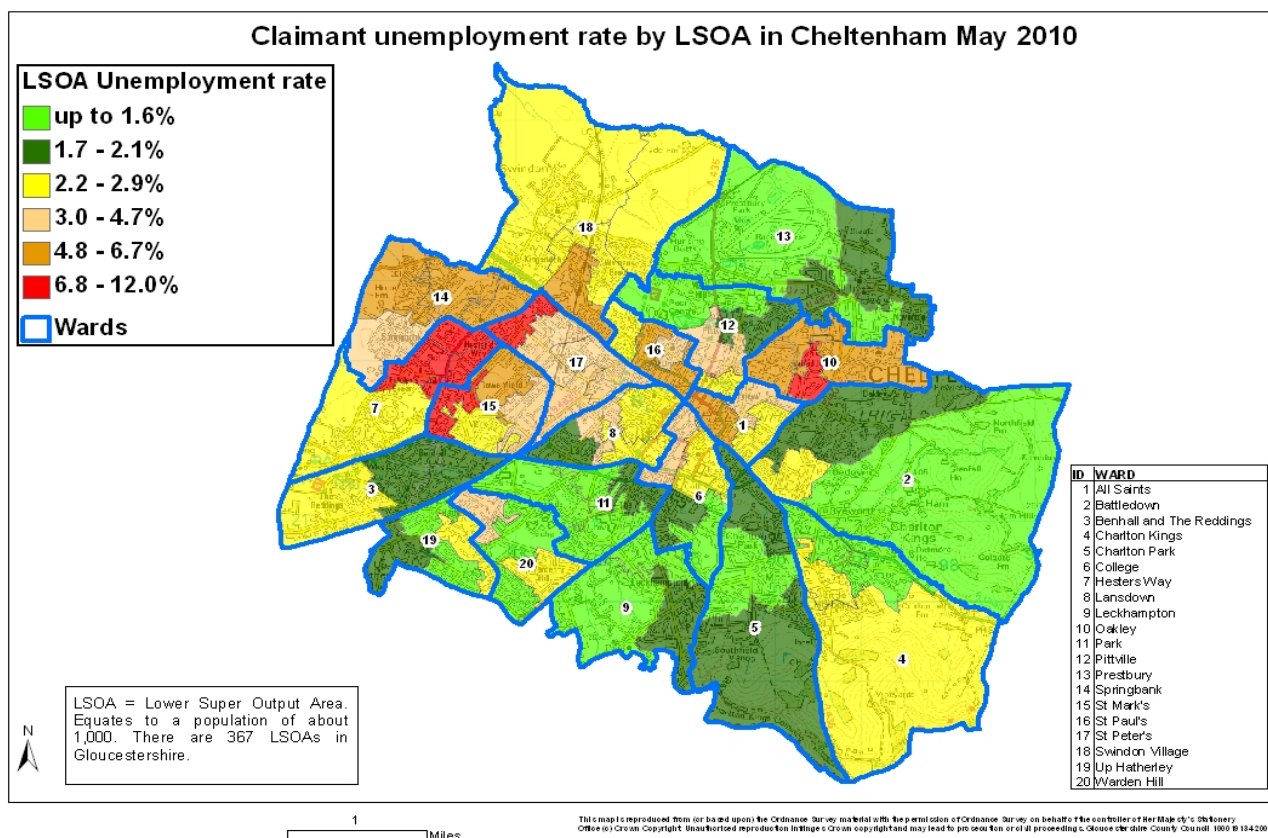

## PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

### Summary

As at the end of May 2010 there were 615 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.2%. The total number of NEET increased by 26 in May 2010 compared to April 2010. Three Area Teams showed an increase in the number of NEET young people, two Teams stayed the same and one Team showed a decrease in numbers.
