

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) (VARIOUS ROADS, CHELTENHAM TRANSPORT PLAN PHASE 4)
EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2018

NOTICE is hereby given that Gloucestershire County Council made an Experimental Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to experimentally prohibit any Vehicle from proceeding along part or parts of the lengths of roads described in the Schedule below with exemptions:

THE SCHEDULE
Prohibition of Driving

Road Name / Number	Extent
Clarence Street C9012	From the east side of Cheltenham House underground car park access to its junction with Clarence Parade
Clarence Street A46	From its junction with Clarence Parade to a point approximately 14m Northeast of the centre point of its junction with Imperial Circus
Pittville Street 490298	Between its junctions with Albion Street and High Street
High Street 491045	Between its junctions with Pittville Street and Promenade / Colonnade
Promenade / Colonnade 491046	Between its junctions with High Street and Imperial Circus
Imperial Circus 490491	Between its junctions with Promenade / Colonnade and Clarence Street
Clarence Parade A46	Between its junctions with Crescent Terrace and Clarence Street

The lengths of roads fall within the Lansdown & Park, All Saints & Oakley and Charlton Park & College Wards in the Borough of Cheltenham in the County of Gloucestershire.


A copy of the Experimental Order which comes into effect on 28th June 2018 together with the relevant plans, statement of reasons and other documents may be inspected during normal office hours at Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TG, Cheltenham Borough Council, Municipal Offices, Promenade, Cheltenham, GL50 9SA and Cheltenham Library, Clarence Street, Cheltenham, GL50 3JT or can be viewed at www.goucestershire.gov.uk/ctp.

The Experimental Order is Experimental and may continue in force for a period of up to 18 months expiring on 28th December 2019. In due course the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the Experimental Order should continue in force indefinitely.

Within 6 months of coming into force of the Experimental Order any person may object to its indefinite continuation. Any such representation should be sent in writing to the Head of Legal Services, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TG or via the Portal found at www.goucestershire.gov.uk/ctp-phase4 not later than 7th January 2019 stating the grounds on which it is made (please quote reference HBL/64805).
