INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.


PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.8% in May 2014. This was a decrease of 0.1% on the April 2014 figure. The UK and South West rate also decreased to 2.7% and 1.7% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate is 0.1% above the South West average of 1.7%, and 0.9% lower than the UK average of 2.7%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in May 2014 decreased by 453 people. The amount of people claiming in May 2014 was 6.3% lower than the number in April 2014. This compares to a 6.6% decrease in the South West and a 4.6% decrease for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 30.8% lower in May 2014 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

At the end of May 2014 there were 485 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.80%.

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.8% in May 2014. With the exception of December 2013, the rate has been slightly higher than the South West average. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.9% against the UK average. The May 2014 rate represented a 0.1% decrease on April 2014.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to May 2014 was -1.9%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - May 2014




Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for May 2014 in Gloucestershire. Between April 2014 and May 2014 the rate in all districts declined.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts




Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count by district over the past year. The number of claimants has decreased over the last year, with the exception of January and February when there was an increase.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham decreased in May 2014 to 1.9%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - May 2014







Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - May 2014







Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - May 2014







Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - May 2014





Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 3.0%. Six wards lie above the average.




Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - May 2014




Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year



Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - May 2014









Figure 22: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year



Figure 23: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year



Figure 24: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 24 shows the number of young claimants decreased in May 2014 by 6.3% this represented 115 people. Over the last year the number of young claimants fell by 32.2% or 810 people.

Figure 25: Duration of claim in the 18-24 year age group




Figure 25 shows the proportion of 18-24 year olds claiming for less than six months decreased from 70.1% of 18-24 year old claimants in April to 68.7% in May. During the same period those claiming for more than six months increased from 29.9% to 31.3%.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of May 2014 there were 485 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.80%. The total number of NEET decreased by 73 young people in May 2014 compared to April 2014. All districts saw a decrease in their NEET figures.
