The Claimant Count is a measure of the number of people who are unemployed and claiming benefits. From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, this was based on the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead.

To reflect this change, the Claimant Count has been expanded to include people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance plus those who claim Universal Credit and who are out of work. For more information about Universal Credit please see the [ONS website](http://www.ons.gov.uk).

INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

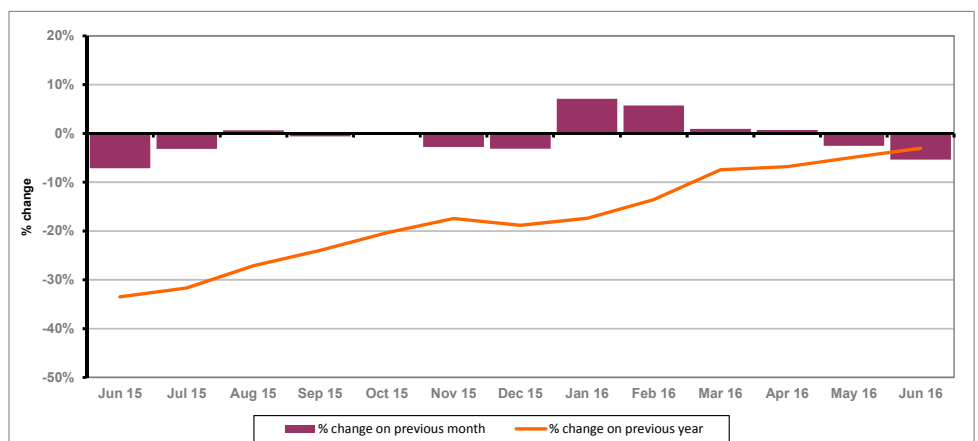
PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.0% in June 2016. This was a 0.1% decrease on the May 2016 figure. The UK and the South West rate also decreased to 1.8% and 1.1% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.1% lower than the South West average of 1.1%, and 0.8% lower than the UK average of 1.8%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in June 2016 decreased by 225 people. The amount of people claiming in June 2016 was 5.4% lower than the number in May 2016. This compares to a 4.8% decrease in the South West and a 3.1% decrease for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 3.0% lower in June 2016 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

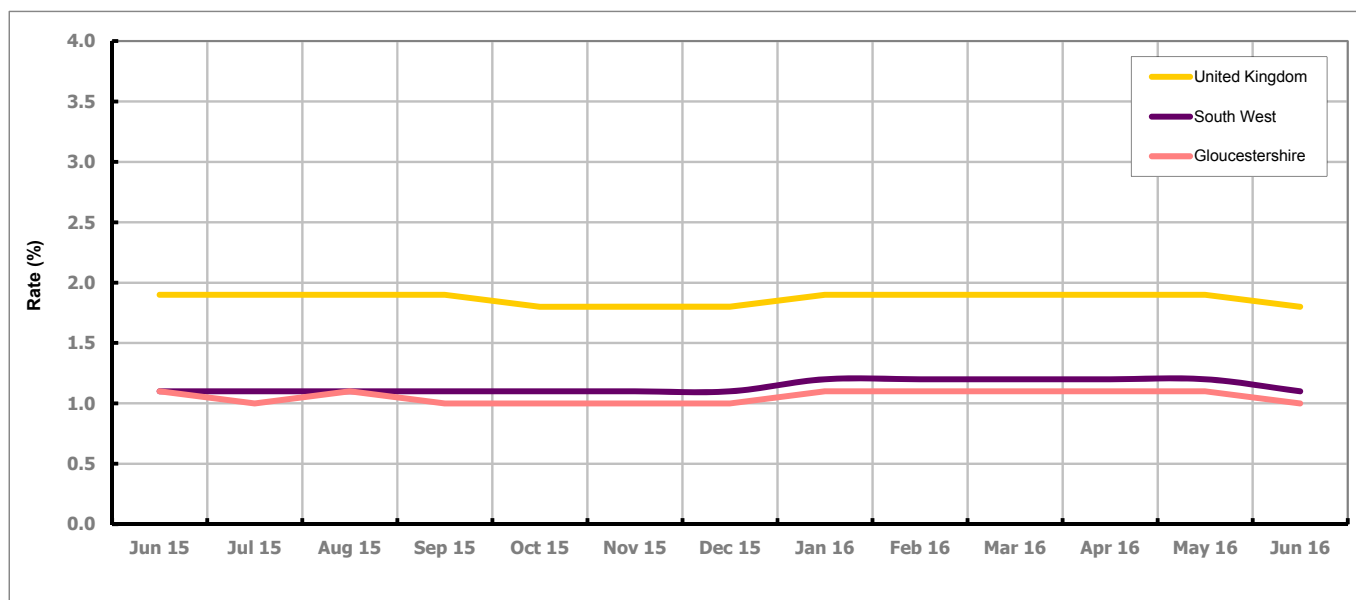


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.0% in June 2016. The Gloucestershire rate has been lower than the South West average since August 2015. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.8% against the UK average.

Table 1 shows that in June 2016, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 5.4% lower than the number in May 2016.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to June 2016 was -0.1%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - June 2016

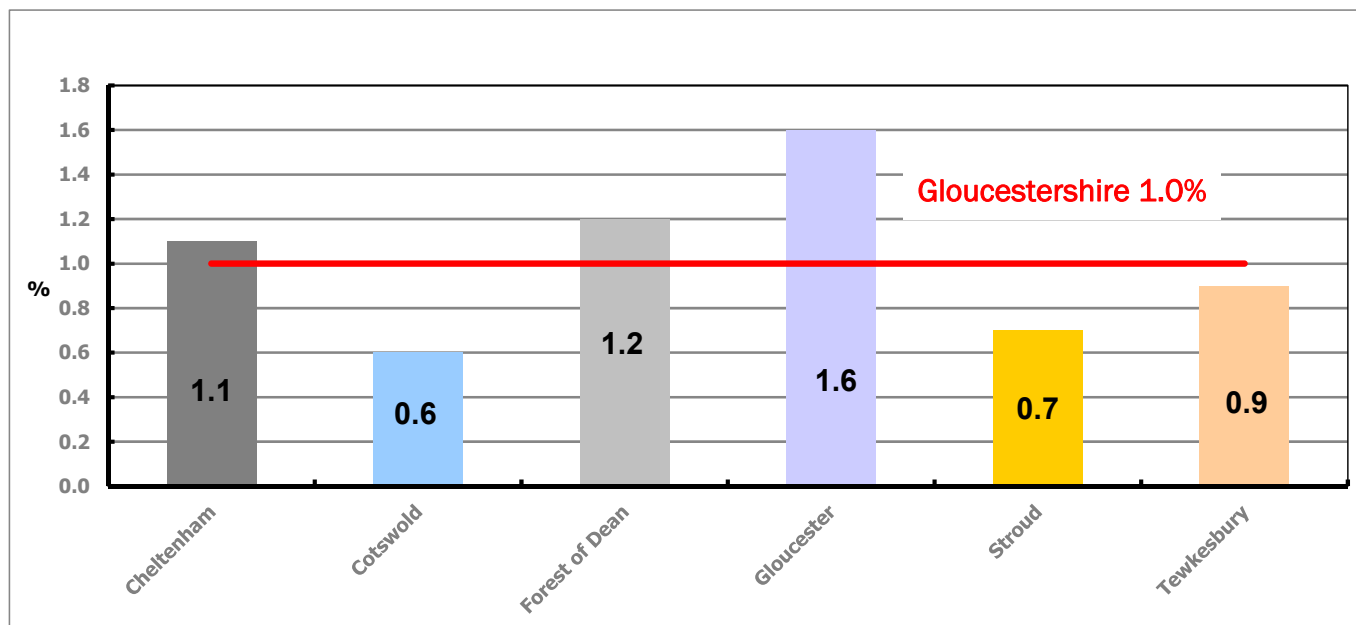

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

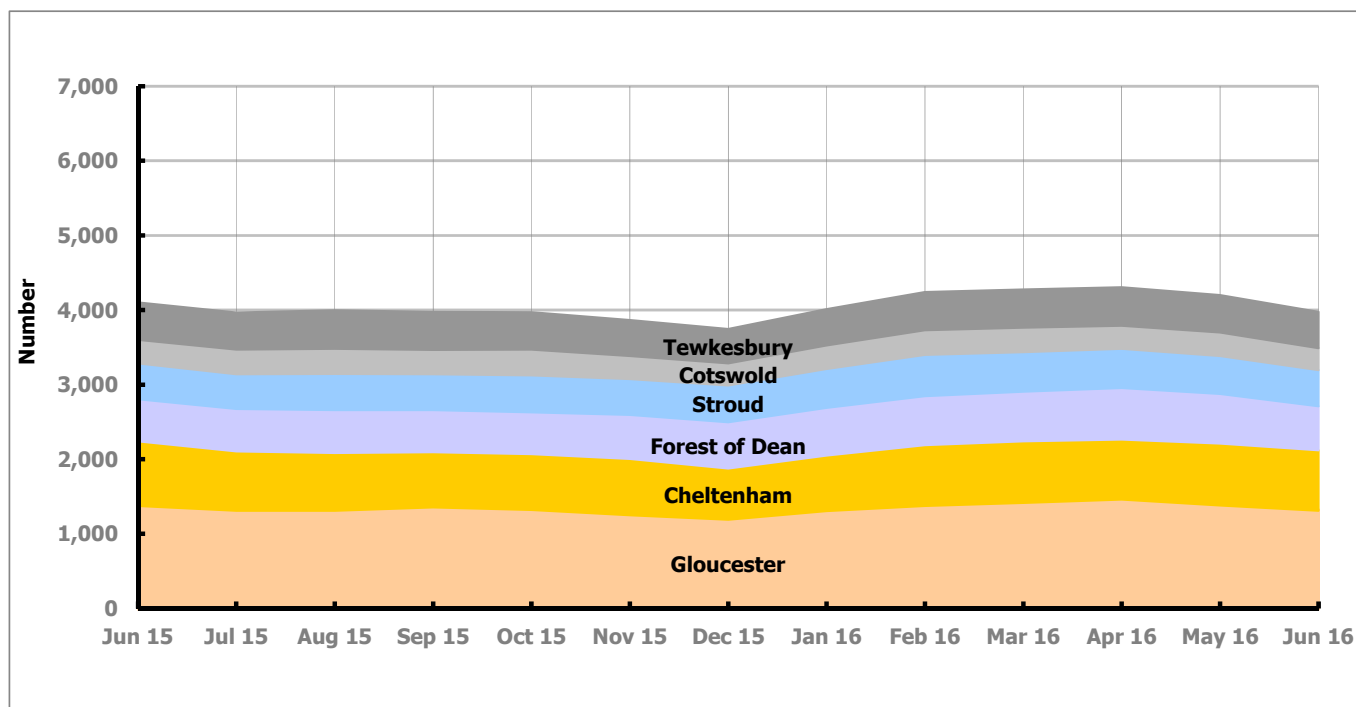

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

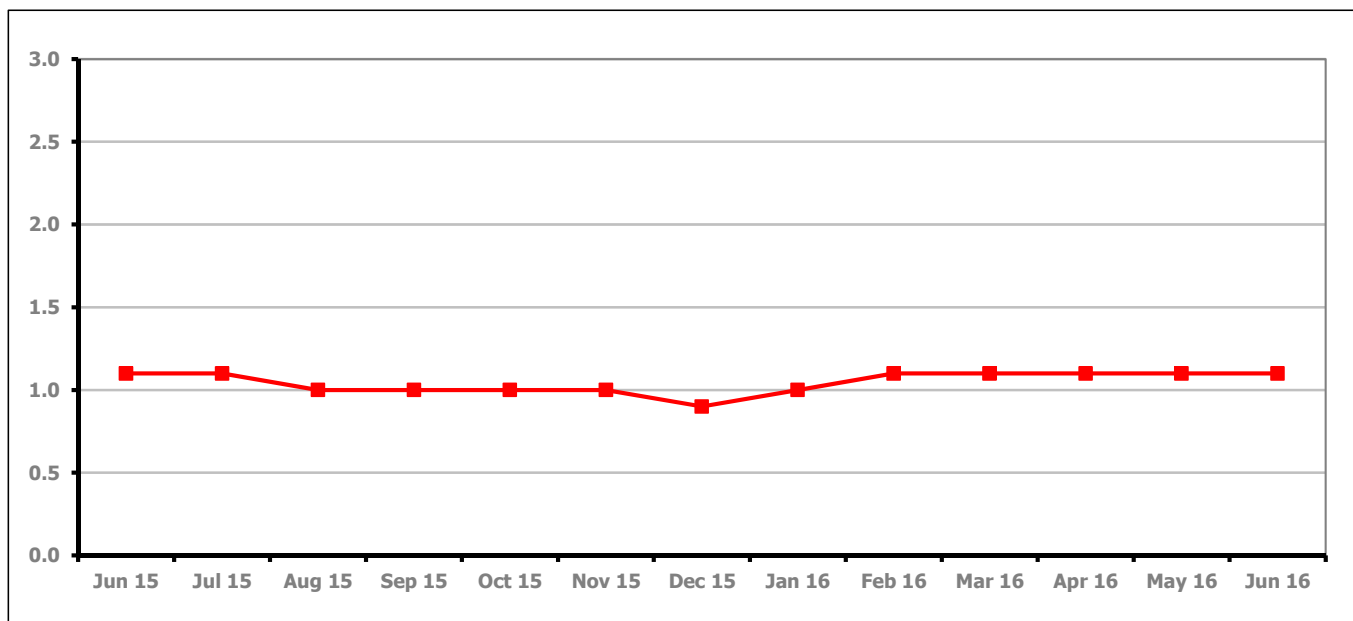


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham stayed the same as last month at 1.1%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

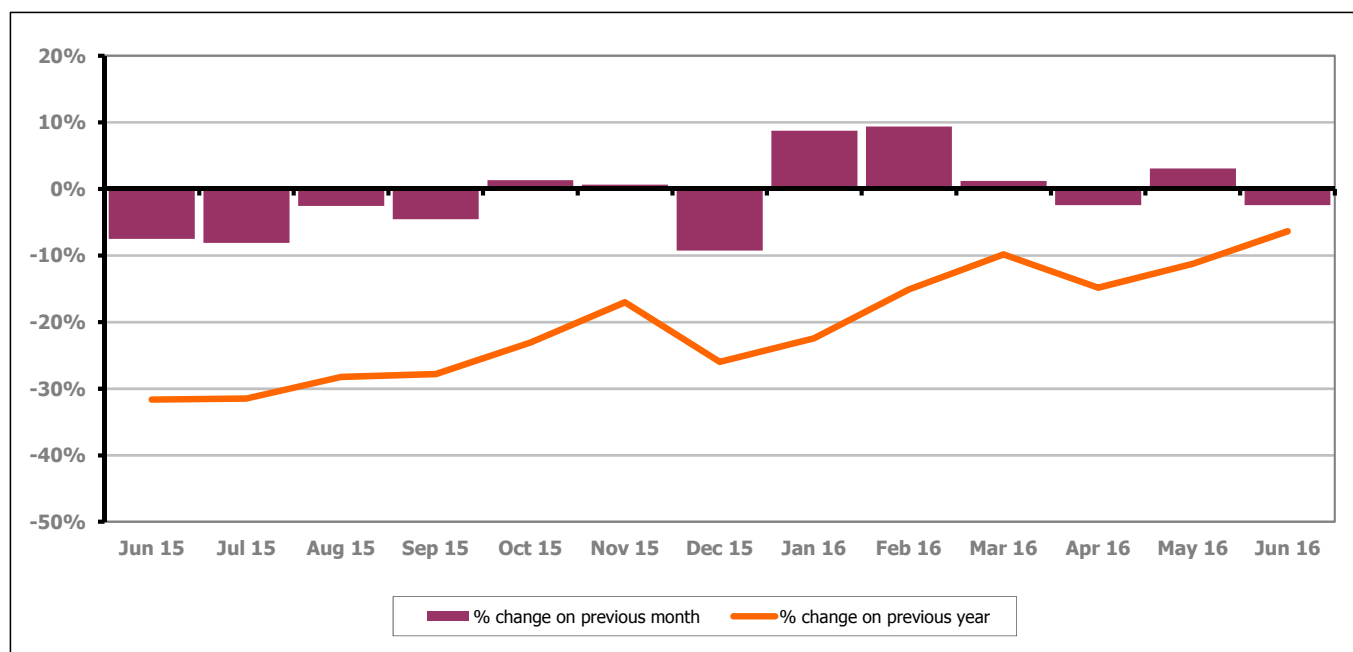


Figure 5 shows the claimant count decreased by 2.4% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased between May and June 2016 to -6.4%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - June 2016

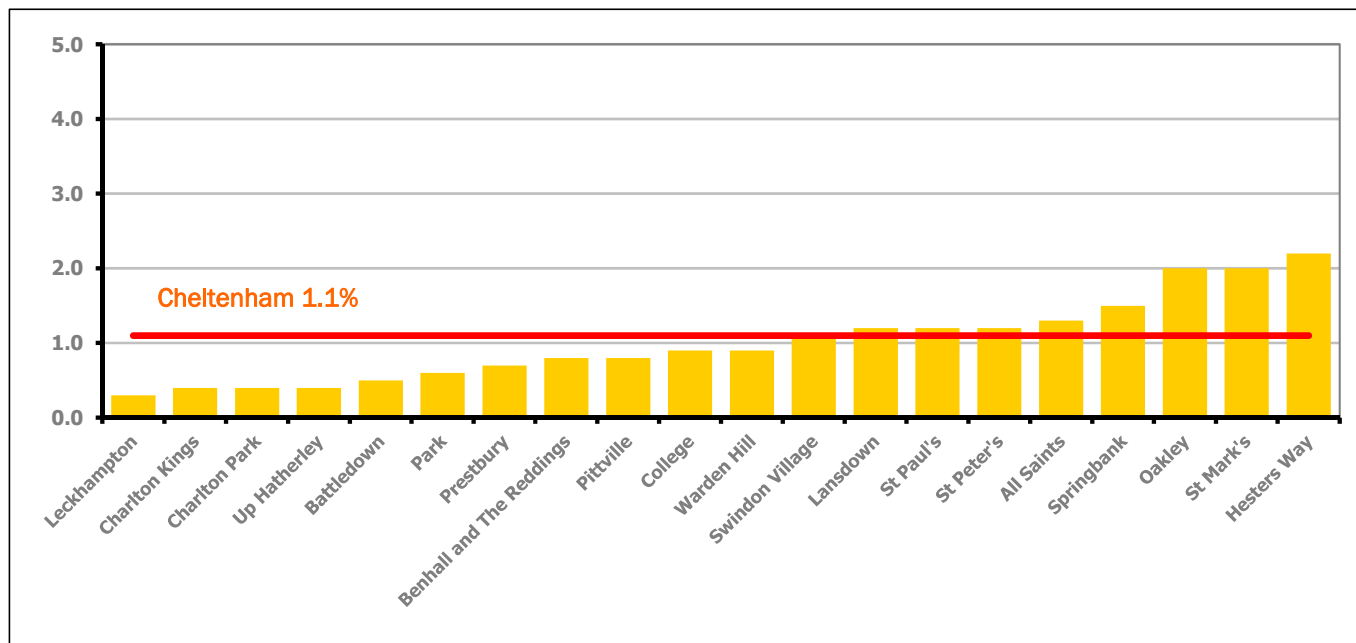

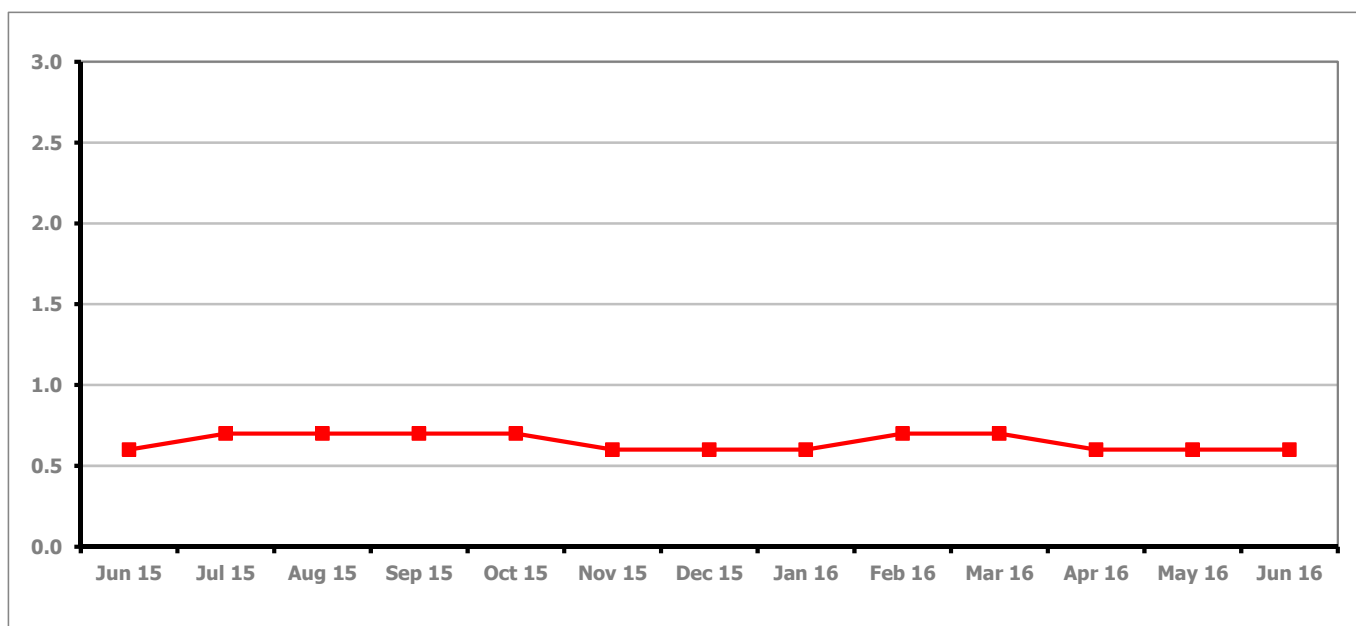

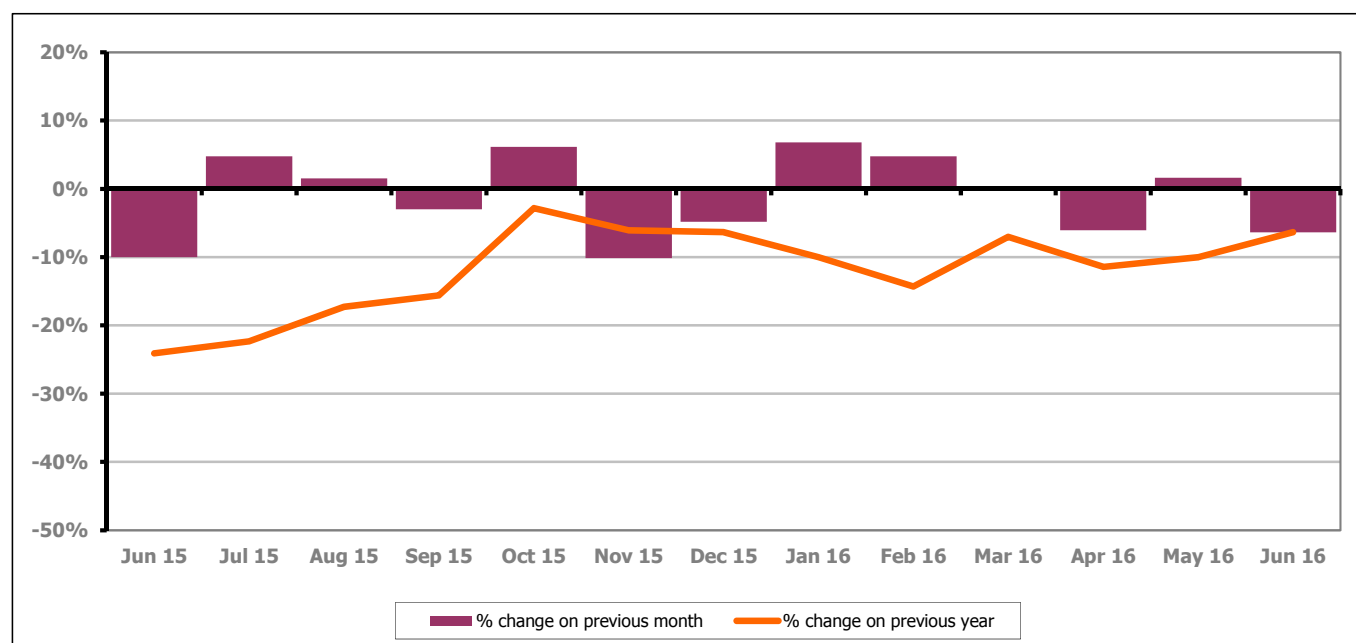
Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - June 2016

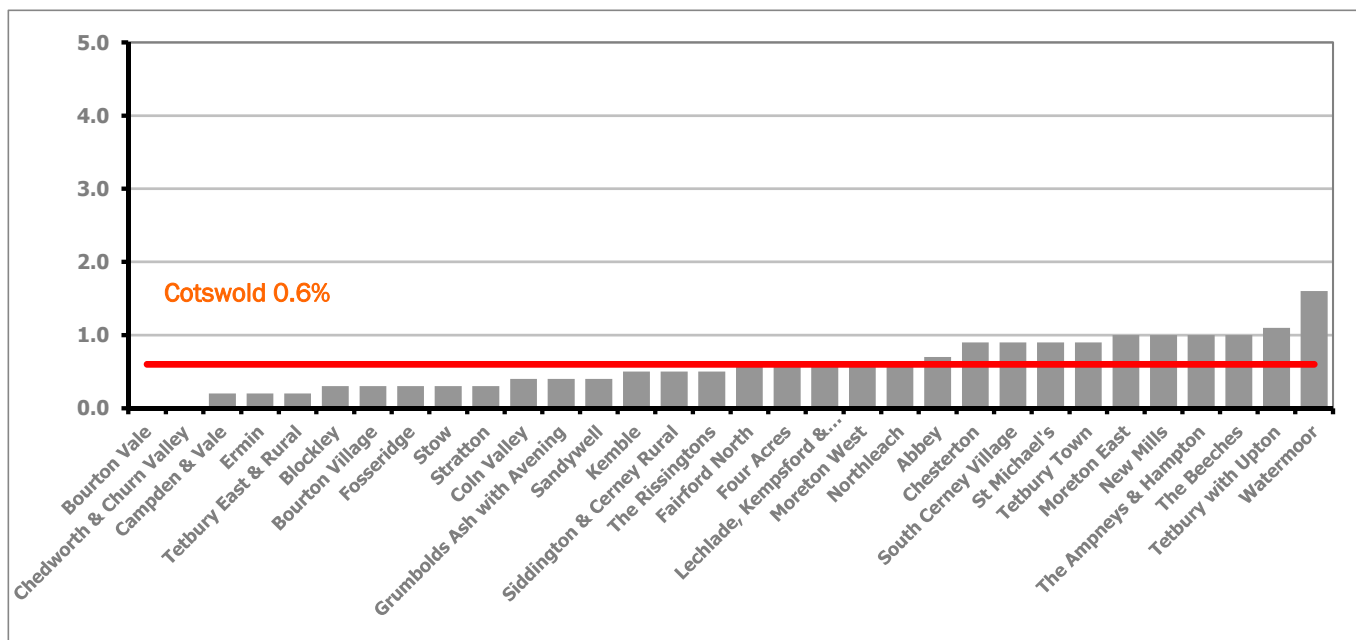
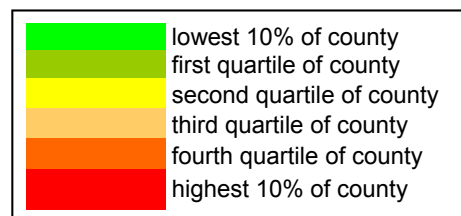

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

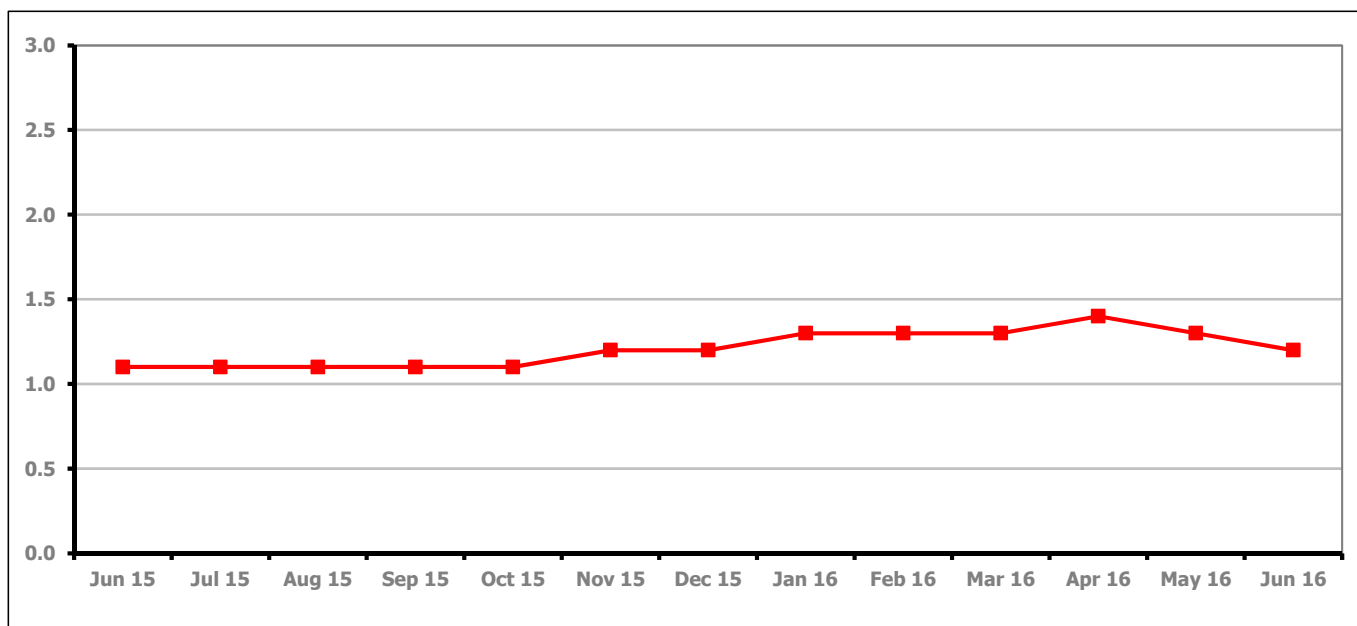


Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean decreased in June 2016 to 1.2%.

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

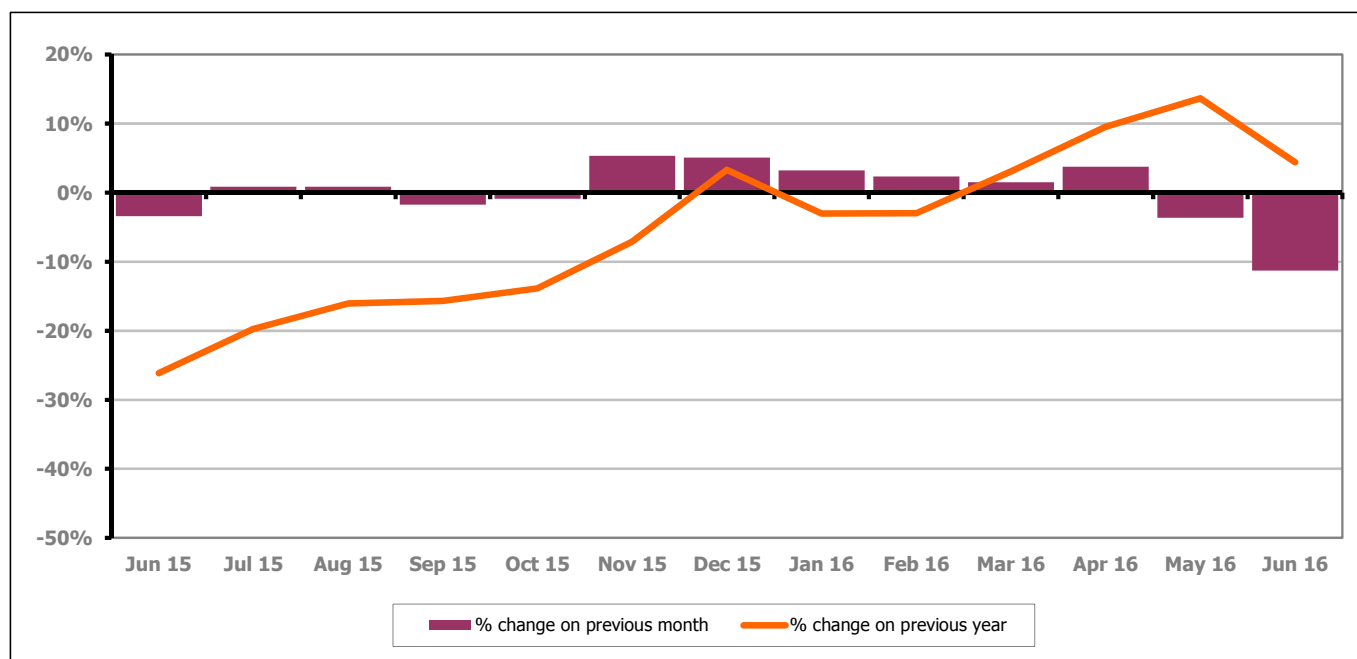

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - June 2016

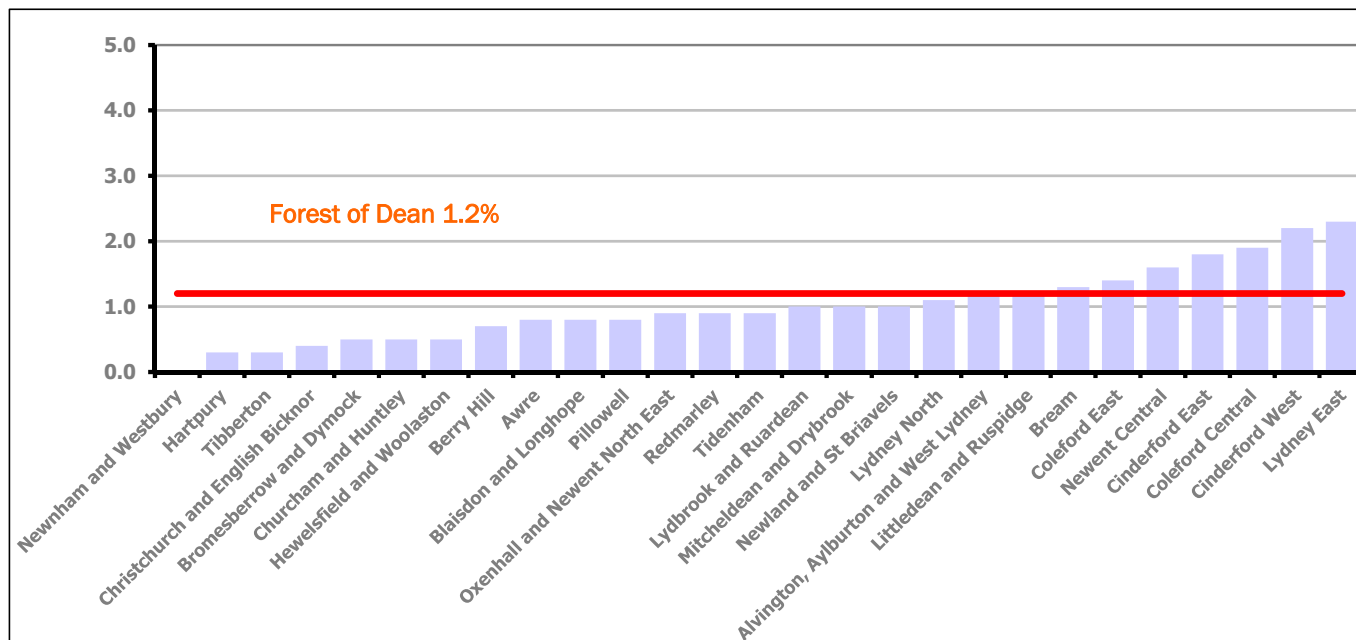
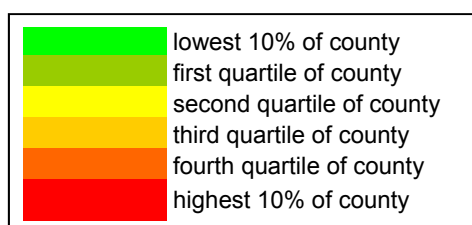


Figure 12 shows the claimant rates for Forest of Dean District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.2%. Seven wards lie above the average.

Figure 13: Gloucester City claimant rate over the last year

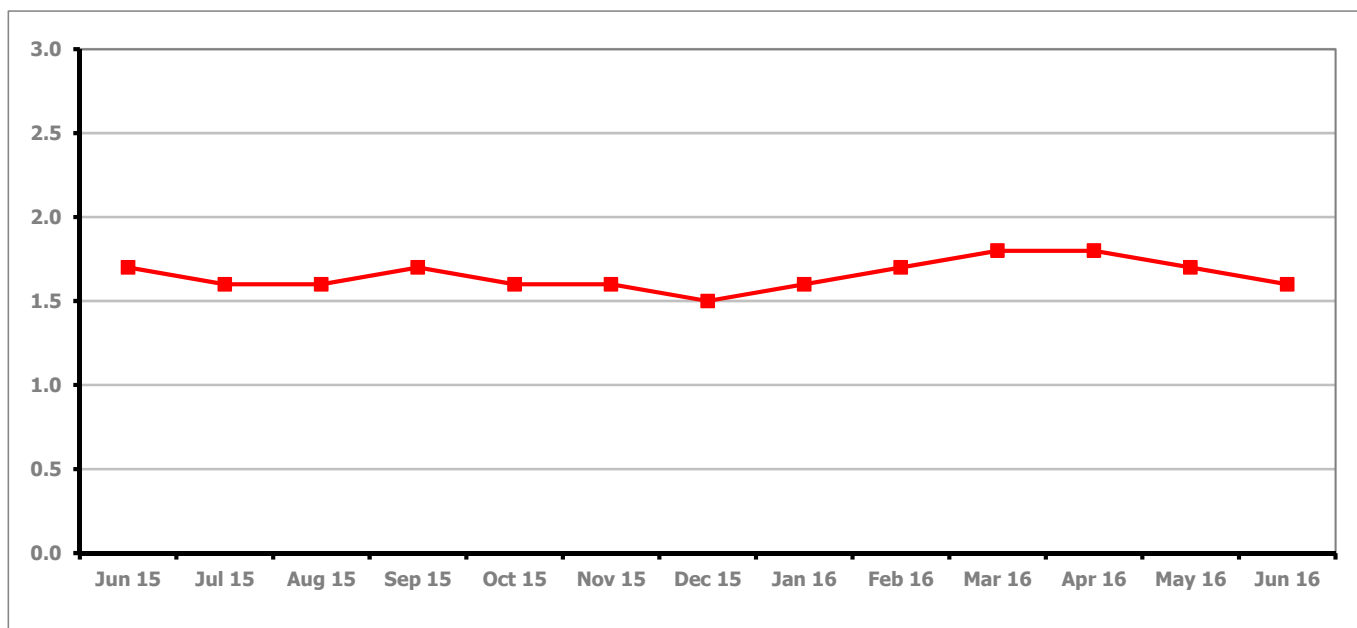

Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

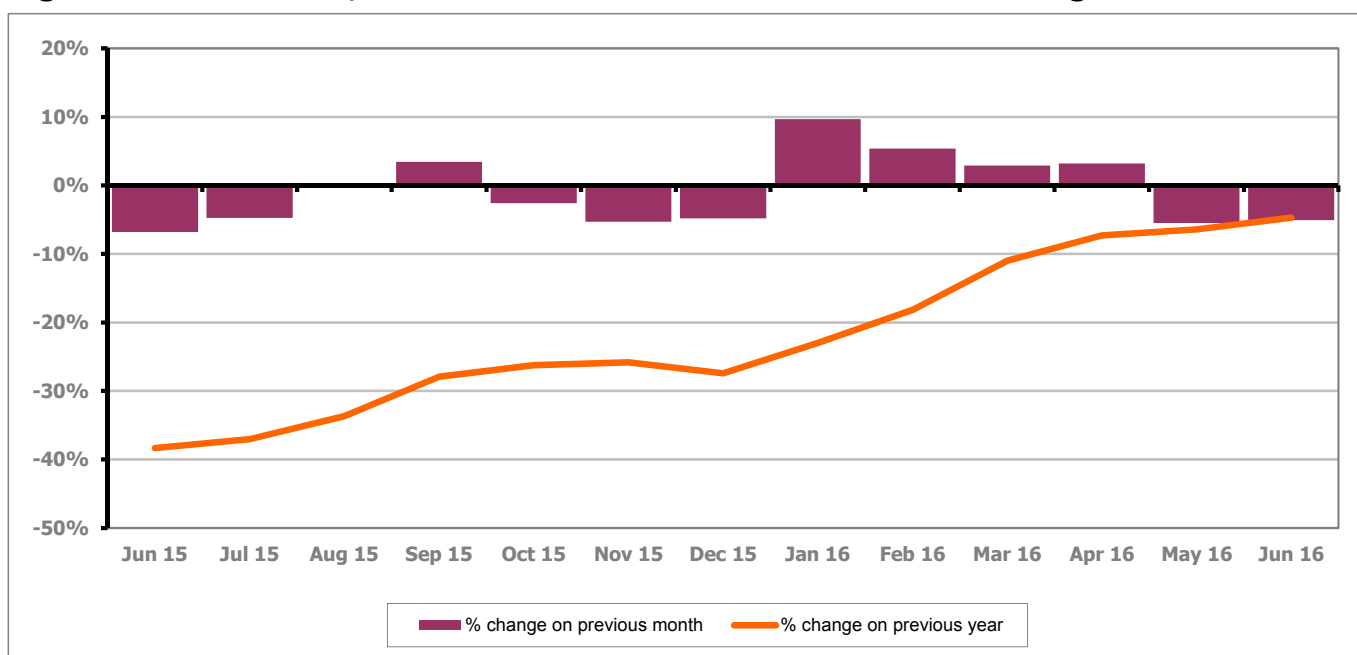

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - June 2016

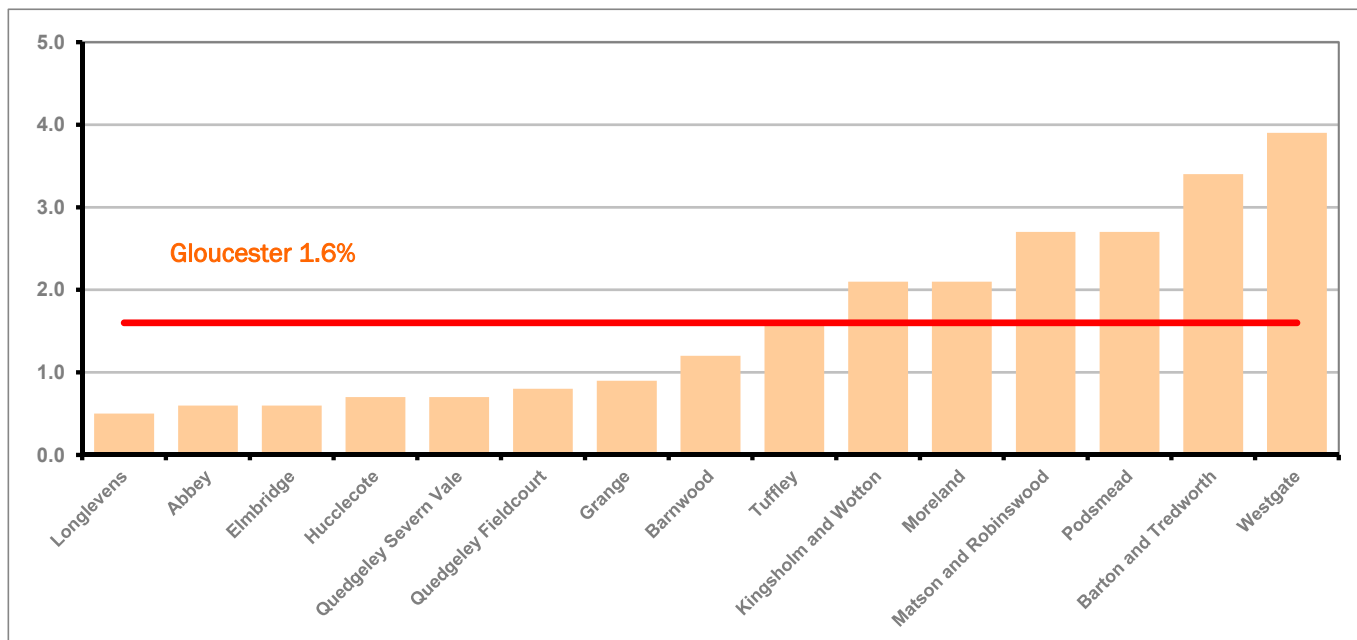
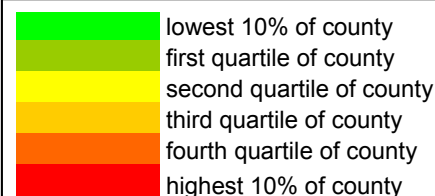

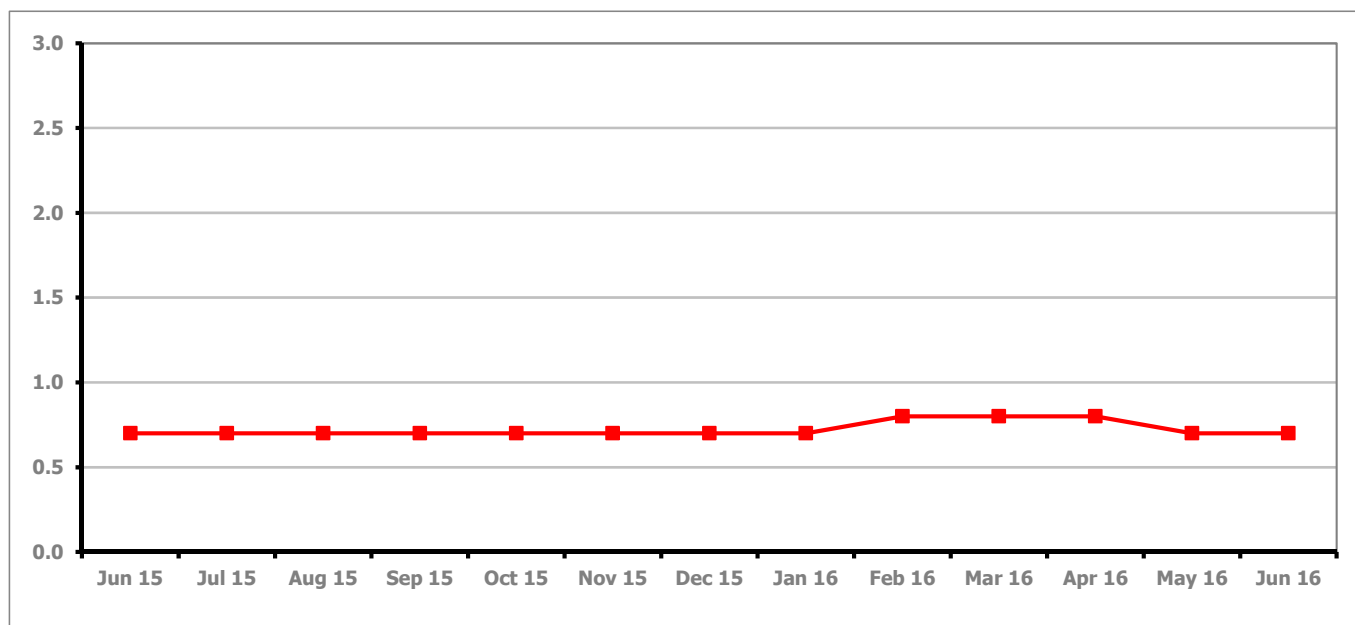

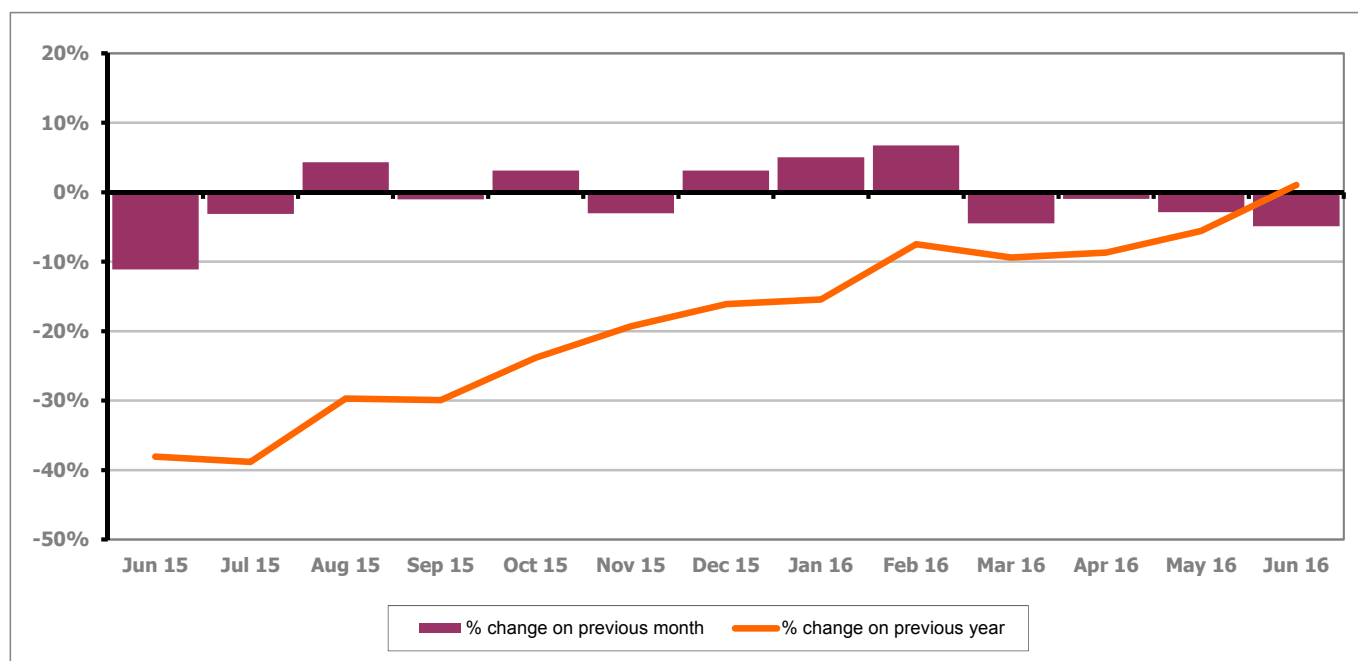
Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - June 2016

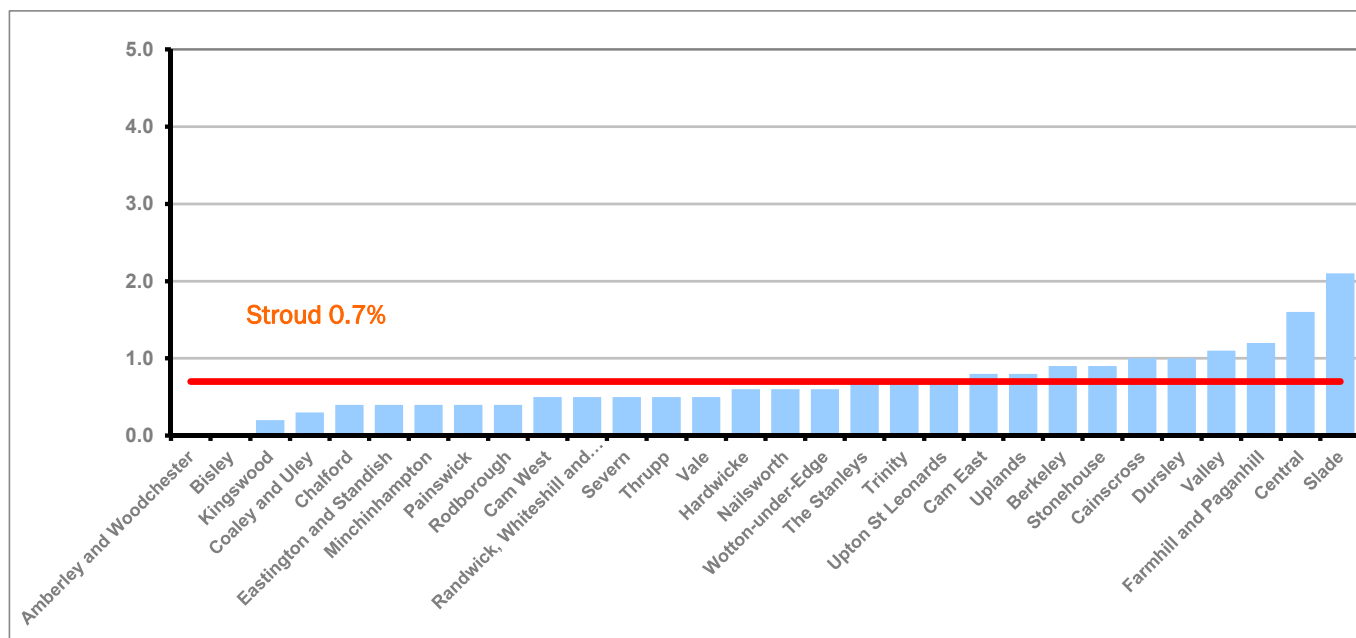
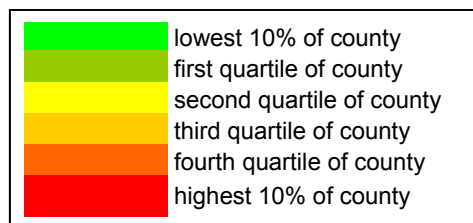

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year

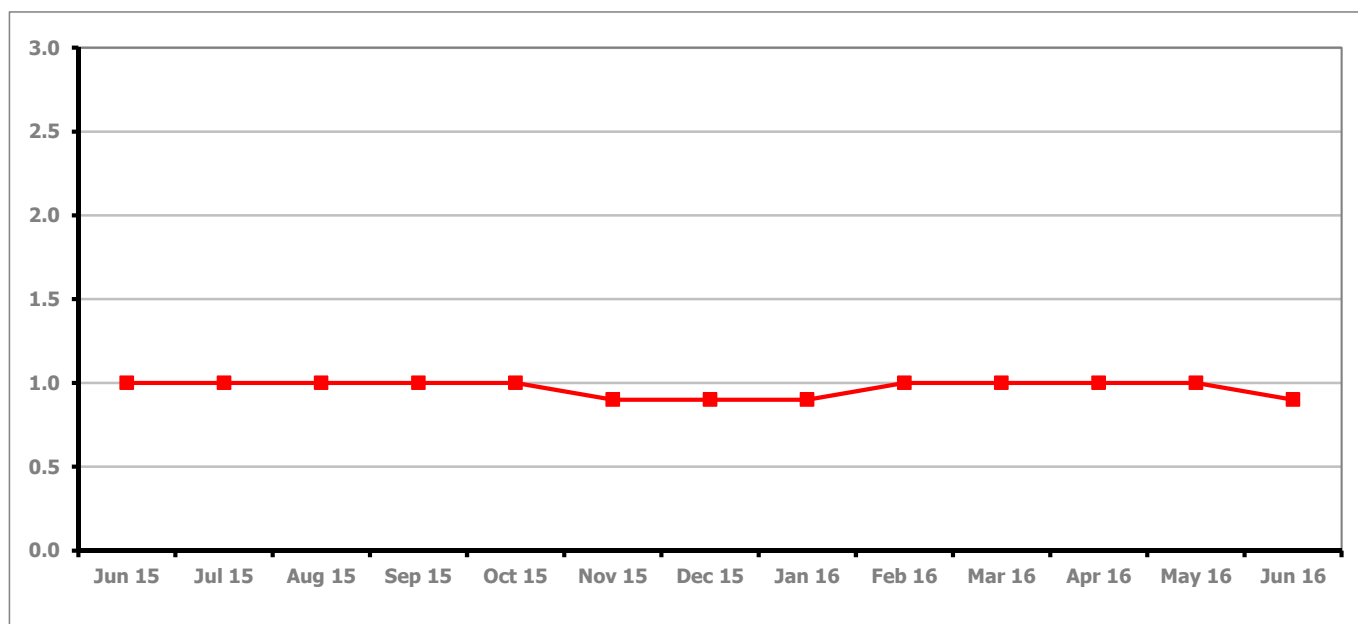


Figure 19 shows the claimant rate for Tewkesbury District decreased in June 2016 to 0.9%.

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

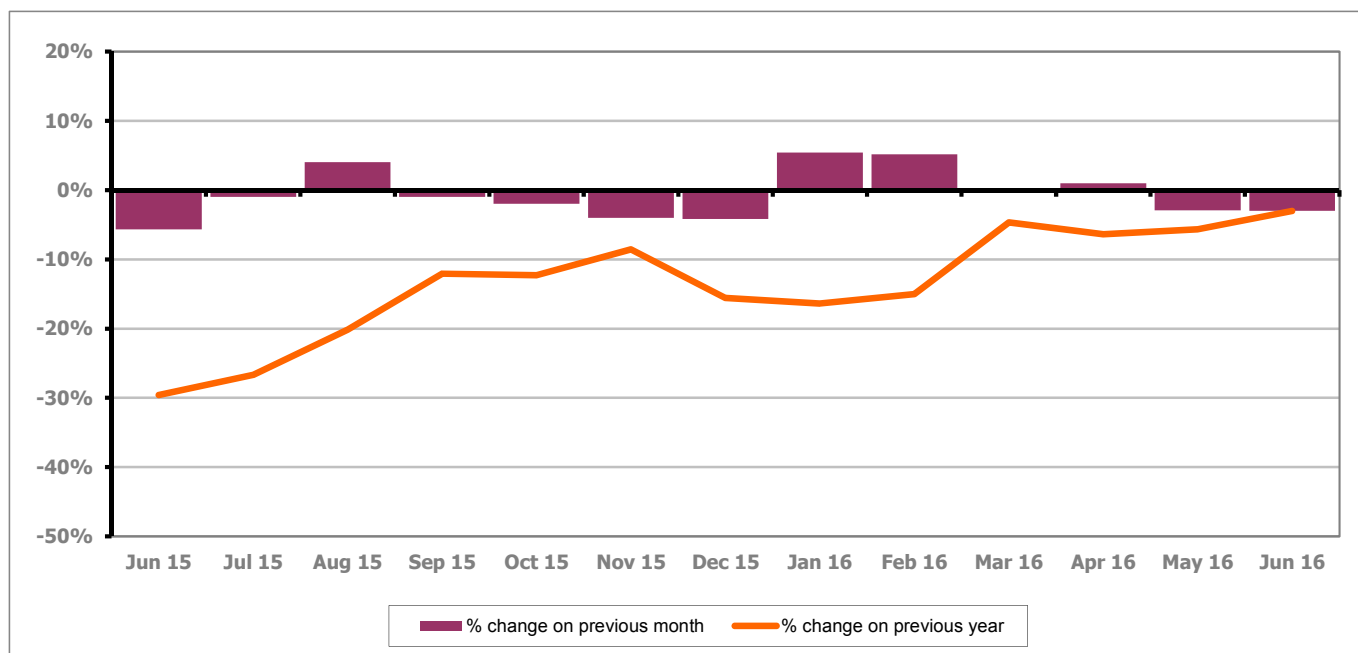

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - June 2016

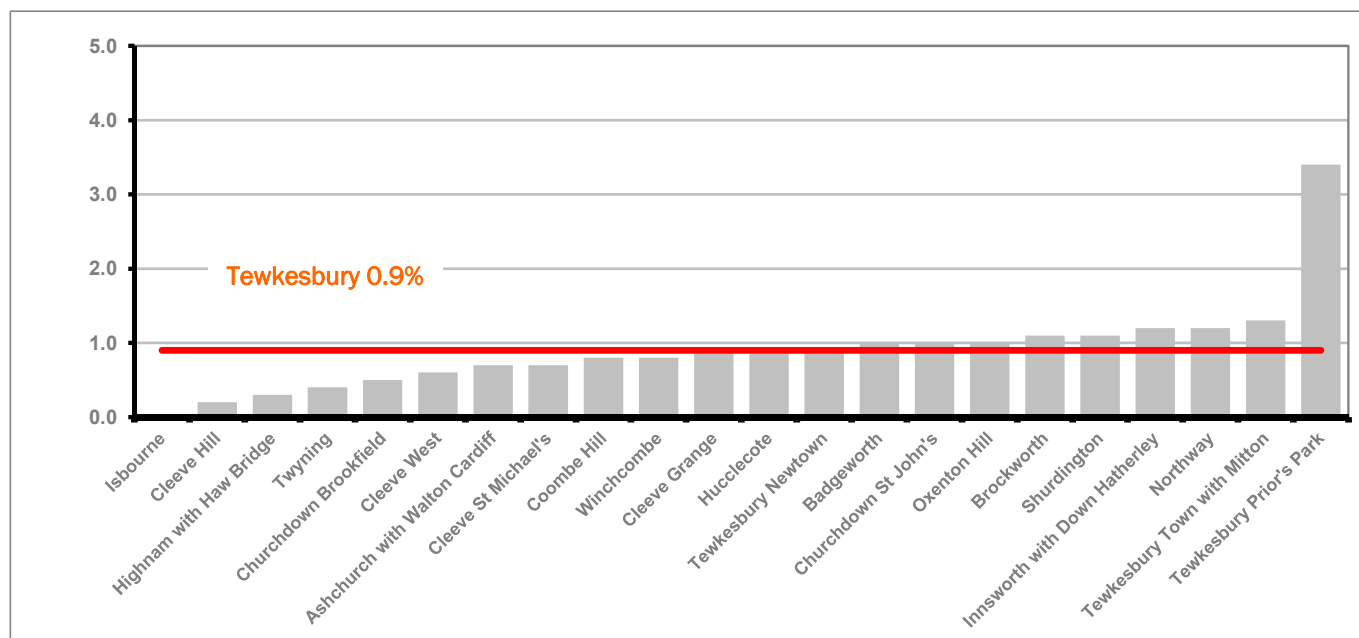

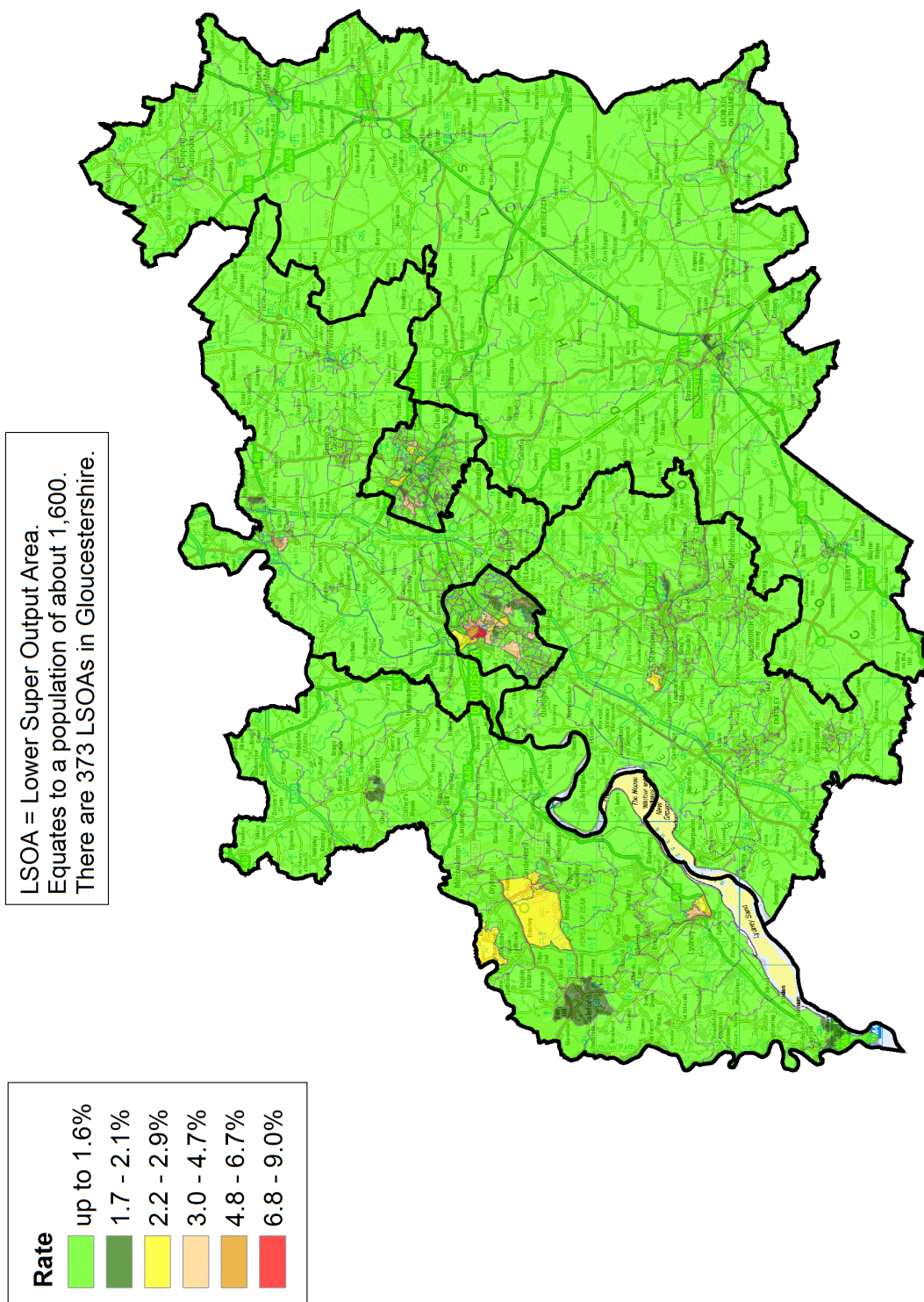

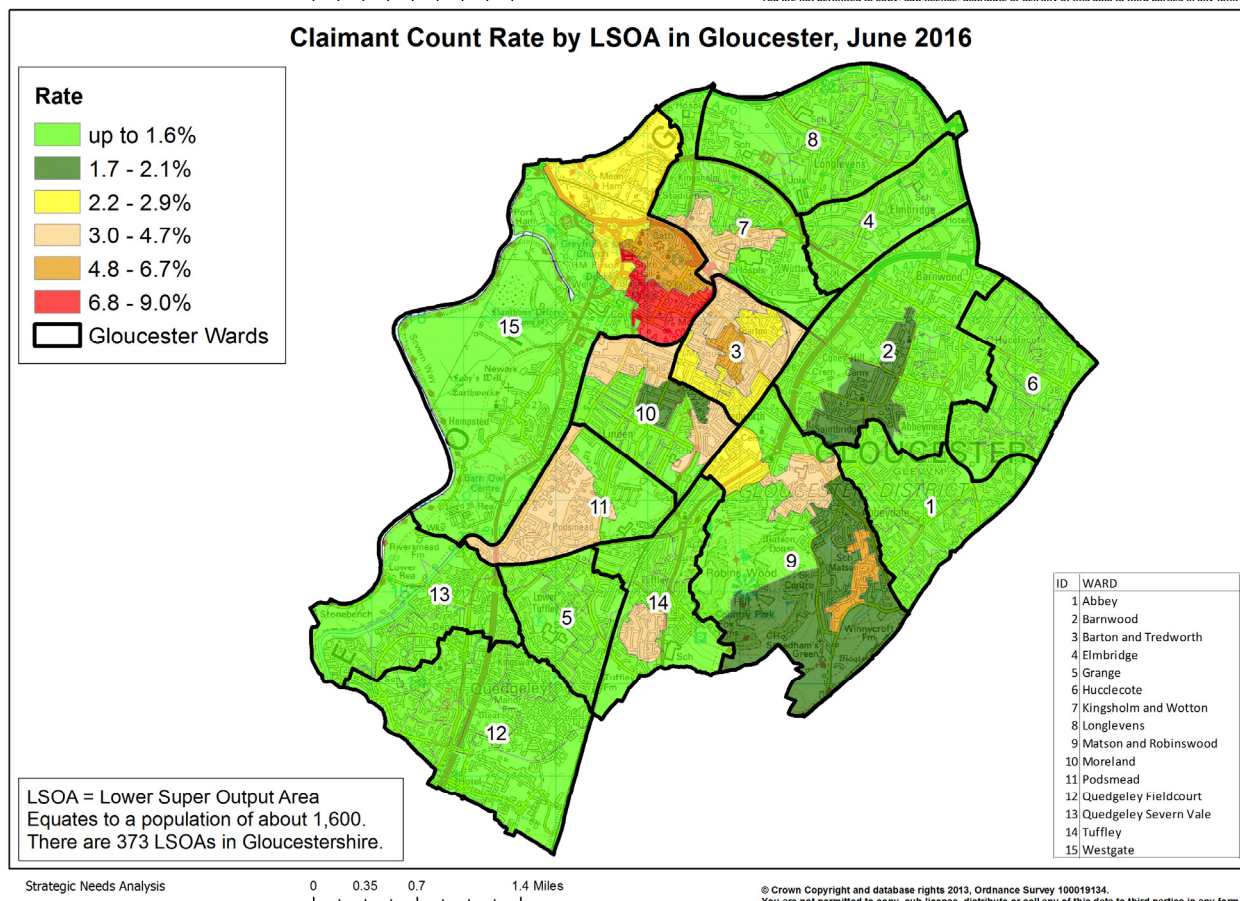
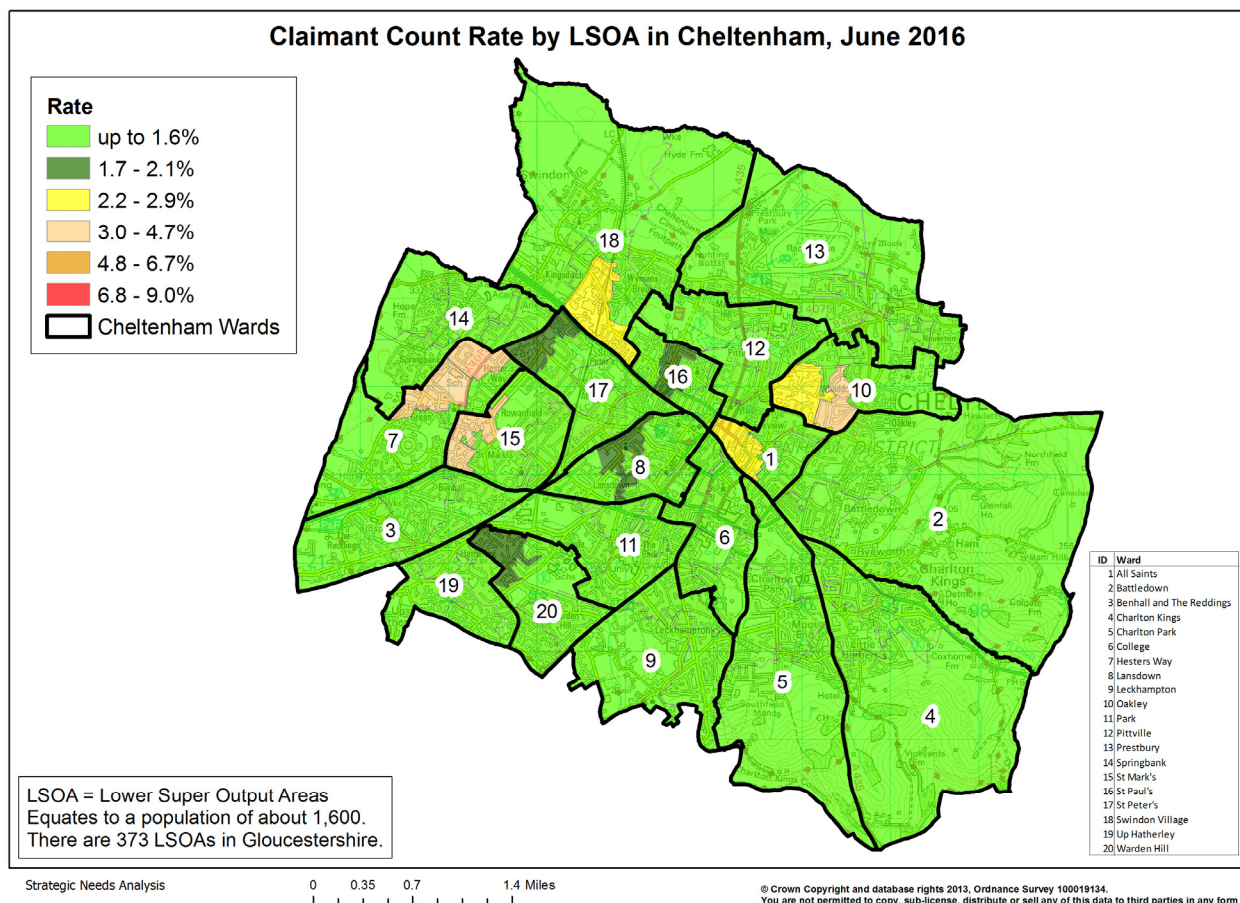

Figure 22: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year

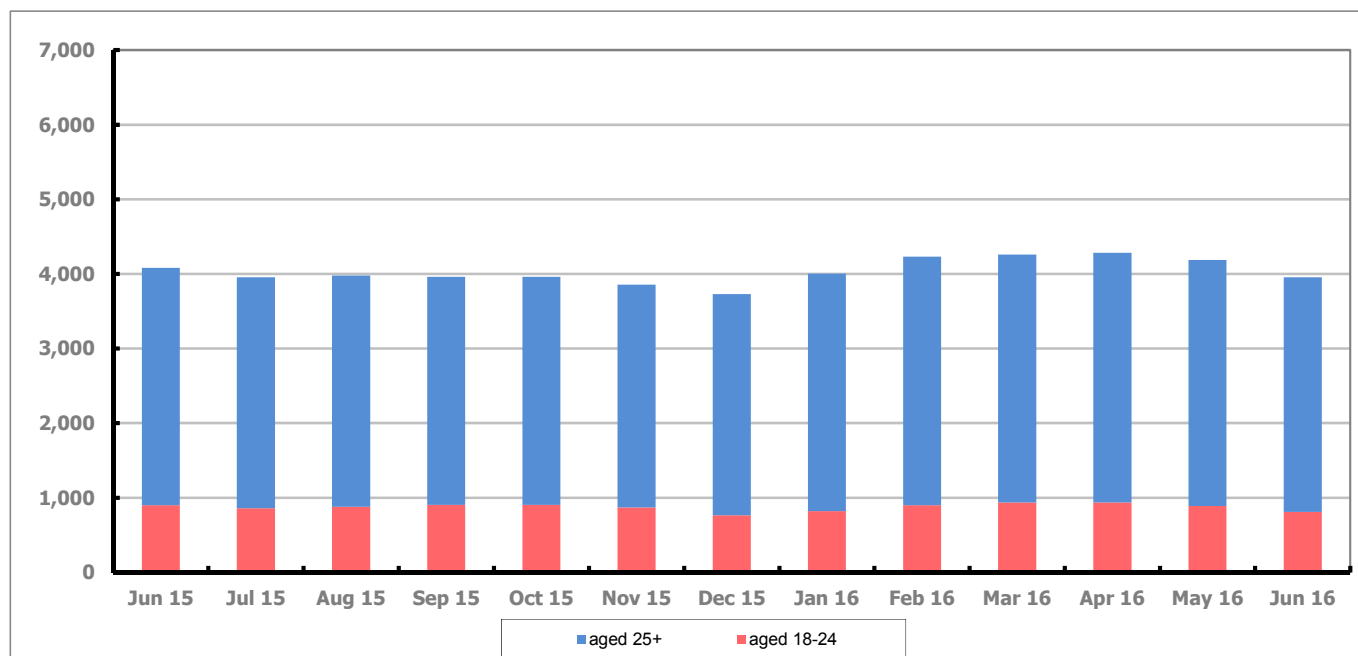

Figure 23: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

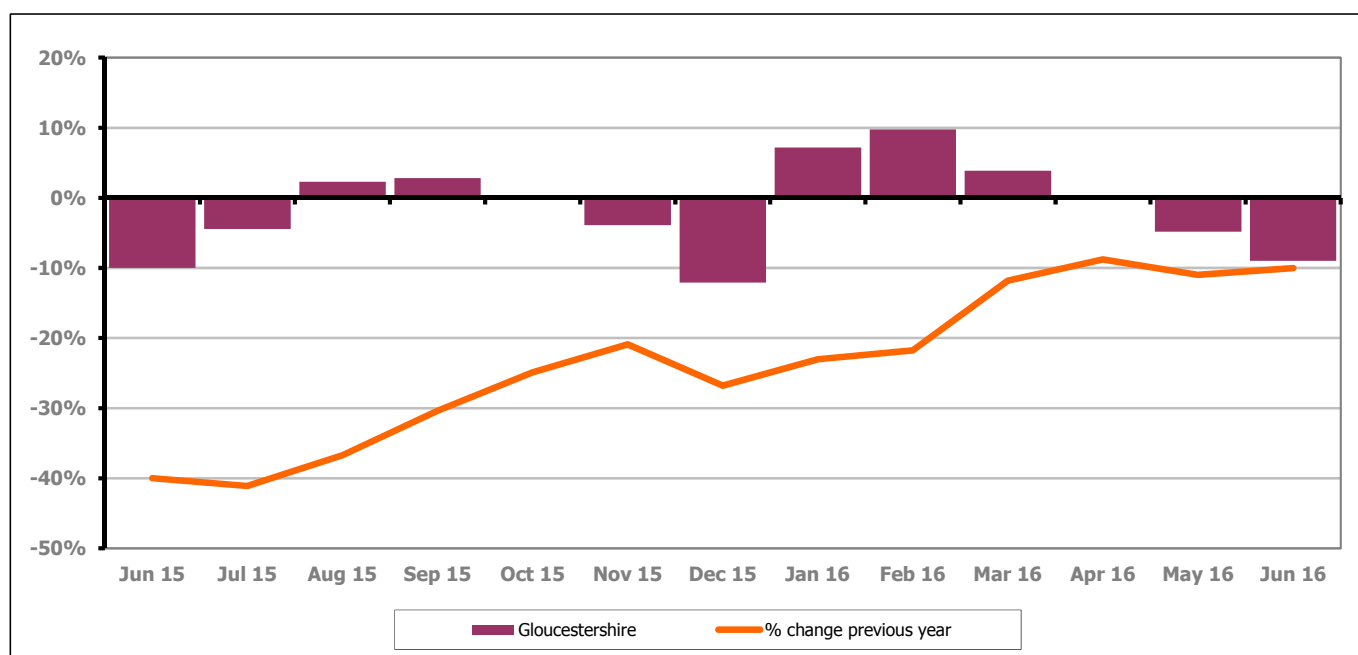


Figure 23 shows the number of young claimants decreased in June 2016 by 9.0% this represented 80 people. Over the last year the number of young claimants fell by 10.0% or 90 people.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of June 2016 there were 425 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.21%. The total number of NEET young people decreased by 2 in June 2016 compared to May 2016, one district saw an increase in their figure, four of the districts saw a decrease in their figure and one district figure stayed the same.
