



NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER  
SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981  
DEFINITIVE MAP OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE  
(ADDITIONAL LENGTH OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH AT WITCOMBE FARM)  
(PARISH OF GREAT WITCOMBE GLOUCESTERSHIRE) ORDER 2009

The above Order made on *18<sup>th</sup> March* 2009 if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding a length of public footpath in the parish of Great Witcombe, commencing at point A on the Plan annexed to the Order ("the Order Plan") at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference ("OSGR") SO 9064/1520 at its junction with unclassified road number 41143 known as Witcombe Farm Lane south of 2 Hillview Cottages and running in a generally southerly direction for a distance of 65 metres to point B on the Order Plan at OSGR SO 9063/1514 north of Witcombe Farm, continuing in a southerly direction for 140 metres running between the farm buildings to point C on the Order Plan at OSGR SO 9062/1500 and then continuing in a south-westerly direction for a further 70 metres to point D on the Order Plan at OSGR SO 9059/1494 at its junction with public footpath AWG 4 on the eastern side of Witcombe Reservoirs. The footpath is shown by a continuous black line with short bars at intervals on the Order Plan.

Width of Path:

- Points A- B: 6 metres (including verges)
- Points B- C: between 5 and 6 metres wide (including verges)
- Points C- D: between 4.5 and 5 metres (including verges)

A copy of the Order and Order Plan may be seen free of charge during normal office hours at Gloucestershire County Council, Main Reception, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester and Tewkesbury Borough Council, Council Offices, Gloucester Road, Tewkesbury, Gloucestershire GL20 5TT. Copies of the Order and Order Plan may be obtained free of charge.

Any representations about or objections to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Law and Administration, Quayside House, Quay Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TZ by not later than *7<sup>th</sup> May* 2009. Please state the ground on which it is made. (Please quote reference JPM/43903).

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucestershire County Council instead of submitting the

Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment may confirm the Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which are duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
