INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and Great Britain/United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function.

From 1996 until the recent introduction of Universal Credit, unemployment data was based on the number of people claiming Job Seekers Allowance. However, since its introduction some unemployment benefit claimants will be claiming Universal Credit instead. For more information about Universal Credit please see the [ONS website](#).

To reflect this change the Unemployment Bulletin will include two measures:

- Estimated Claimant Count* - combines claimants of Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit Claimants who are not in work. This information is included in Part 1 of the unemployment bulletin and provides the broadest measure of unemployment at a County and District level.
- Job Seekers Allowance claimants only - this information is included in Parts 2 - 7 of the unemployment bulletin. It gives a narrower estimate of unemployment, and is the only measure available at ward level and that can be broken down by age.

Statistics about Job Seeker's Allowance claimants are sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk) and Universal Credit statistics are provided by the Department for Work and Pensions.

PART 1: Summary - Estimated Claimant Count*

The estimated claimant rate* in Gloucestershire was 1.1% in July 2015. This was the same as the June 2015 figure. The GB and South West rate also remained the same at 1.9% and 1.1% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was the same as the South West average of 1.1%, and 0.8% lower than the GB average of 1.1%.

The estimated claimant count* in Gloucestershire in July 2015 decreased by 110 people. The amount of people claiming in July 2015 was 2.7% lower than the number in June 2015. This compares to a 0.2% increase in the South West and a 0.4% increase for GB.

Between June 2015 and July 2015 the estimated claimant rate* in Cotswold and the Forest of Dean increased, while the rate in the remaining districts stayed the same.


PART 2: Summary - Job Seekers Allowance

The Jobseekers Allowance claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.0% in July 2015. This was a 0.1% decrease on the June 2015 figure. The UK rate remained the same as the June 2015 at 1.8% whilst the South West rate decreased to 1.0%. Gloucestershire's rate was the same as the South West average of 1.0%, and 0.8% lower than the UK average of 1.8%.

The number of people claiming Job Seekers Allowance in Gloucestershire in July 2015 decreased by 256 people. The amount of people claiming in July 2015 was 6.3% lower than the number in June 2015. This compares to a 1.8% decrease in the South West and a 1.4% decrease for the UK.

The year on year Job Seekers Allowance claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 35.0% lower in July 2015 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

Figure 1: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.0% in July 2015. Between July and September 2014 the Gloucestershire rate was generally higher than the South West. It has been the same as the South West average since December 2014, with the exception of November and March when it was lower and May when it was higher. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.8% against the UK average. The July 2015 rate represented a 0.1% decrease on June 2015.

Table 1 shows that in July 2015, the number of Job Seekers Allowance claimants in Gloucestershire was 6.3% lower than the number in June 2015.

The average change in Job Seekers Allowance claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to July 2015 was -4.2%.

Figure 2: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate (%) across Gloucestershire - July 2015




Figure 2 shows the Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate for July 2015 in Gloucestershire. Between June 2015 and July 2015, the rate in Cheltenham, Forest of Dean, Gloucester, Stroud and Tewkesbury declined, while the rate in Cotswold stayed the same.

Figure 3: Total Job Seekers Allowance claimants over the past year across Districts



Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate in Cheltenham decreased in July 2015 to 1.0%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 6: Job Seekers Allowance Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - July 2015





Figure 8: Cotswold District Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 9: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - July 2015



Figure 10: Forest of Dean District Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate over the last year



Figure 11: Forest of Dean District Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 12: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - July 2015




Figure 13: Gloucester City Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate over the last year



Figure 14: Gloucester City Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 15: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - July 2015




Figure 16: Stroud District Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate over the last year




Figure 16 shows the Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate for Stroud declined in July 2015 to 0.6%.

Figure 17: Stroud District Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 18: Job Seekers Allowance claimant rates across Stroud District wards - July 2015




Figure 19: Tewkesbury District Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate over the last year



Figure 20: Tewkesbury District Job Seekers Allowance claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change



Figure 21: Job Seekers Allowance Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - July 2015








PART 6: Map showing distribution of Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate across Gloucestershire

Figure 22: Youth Job Seekers Allowance claimant rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year



Figure 23: Job Seekers Allowance claimant count for Gloucestershire over the past year



Figure 24: Youth Job Seekers Allowance Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 24 shows the number of young Job Seekers Allowance claimants decreased in July 2015 by 11.5% this represented 100 people. Over the last year the number of young Job Seekers Allowance claimants fell by 47.3% or 690 people.

Figure 25: Duration of claim in the 18-24 year age group




Figure 25 shows the proportion of 18-24 year olds claiming Job Seekers Allowance for less than six months decreased from 73.6% of 18-24 year old claimants in June to 72.1% in July 2015. During the same period those claiming for more than six months increased from 26.4% to 27.9%.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of July 2015 there were 440 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.68%. The total number of NEET young people decreased by 8 in July 2015 compared to June 2015. One district figure stayed the same over the month, two districts had an increase and the other three districts saw a drop in their figures.
