INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.


PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 2.9% in April 2012. This was a decrease of 0.1% on the March 2012 figure. The UK and South West rate also decreased to 4.0% and 2.8% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was 0.1% higher than the South West average of 2.8%, and 1.1% lower than the UK average of 4.0%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in April 2012 decreased by 340 people. The amount of people claiming in April 2012 was -3.1% lower than the number in March 2012. This compares to a -5.3% decrease in the South West and a -3.0% decrease for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has increased. The count was 18.1% higher in April 2012 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

As at the end of April 2012 there were 679 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.9%.

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year




Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.9% in April 2012. The rate remained lower or the same as the South West average, until March 2012, when it grew above the South West rate, it has been persistently lower by approximately 1.1% against the UK average during the same period. The April 2012 rate represented a 0.1% decrease on March 2012.

Table 1 shows that in April 2012, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was -3.1% lower than the number in March 2012.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to April 2012 was +1.5%. This is 0.8% higher than the UK average and 0.9% higher than the South West average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - April 2012



Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts



Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year




Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham remained the same as last month at 3.3%

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change




Figure 5 shows the claimant count decreased by -0.6% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased in April 2012 compared to March 2012 to +27.1%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - April 2012







Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - April 2012







Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - April 2012







Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - April 2012







Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - April 2012







Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change









PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

As at the end of April 2012 there were 679 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.9%. The total number of NEET decreased by 5 young people in April 2012 compared to March 2012. 2 districts saw an increase, 1 stayed the same and 3 saw a decrease in their NEET figure.
