

# **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**

## **Gloucestershire County Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2014<sup>5</sup>**

Gloucestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 33 and 35 and under Parts I and III of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("the 1984 Act") and under Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order:

### **PART I GENERAL**

#### **Citation and commencement**

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 2014<sup>5</sup> and may be cited as "The Gloucestershire County Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2014".

## **Interpretation**

### 2. In this Order:-

**“Council”** means Gloucestershire County Council or any of its employees, duly appointed servants or agents.

**“civil enforcement officer” (CEO)** has the same meaning as Section 76 of the 2004 Act.

**“charge”** means any fee charged for using a parking place as specified in Column 8 of Schedule 1 of this Order.

**“charging hours”** means the periods specified for each parking place during which a charge applies, as set out in Column 7 of Schedule 1 of this Order.

**“charge up”** means deriving electrical motive power for an electric vehicle from apparatus provided by the Council .

**“charge up fee”** means a payment set by the Council for the use of any apparatus provided by the Council for ‘charging up’ Electric Vehicles.

**“disabled person’s badge”** has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended)

**“disabled person’s vehicle”** has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986 (as amended)

**“disabled person’s parking disc”** has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 which is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun

**“driver”** in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place

**“electric vehicle”** means a vehicle with a traction battery that is either partially or fully propelled by an electric machine and for the purpose of this order, refers to a vehicle for which electrical motive power is derived from a source external to the vehicle and that can be charged from the UK electricity grid.

**"enactment"** means any enactment, whether public general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment

**"Heavy commercial vehicle"** has the same meaning as given in Section 138 of the 1984 Act.

**"loading area"** means the part of the parking place where permitted vehicles can wait whilst loading or unloading of items from the vehicle is actively being undertaken and designated by notice or surface markings displayed in the parking place.

**"medical practitioner"** means has the same meaning as within the meaning of the Medical Act 1983 (as amended)

**"motor vehicle"** has the same meaning as given in Section 136 of the 1984 Act

**"motorcycle"** has the same meaning as that in Section 136 of the 1984 Act

**"National Health Service (NHS)"** means the National Health Service or any of its employees, duly appointed servants or agents.

**"owner"** in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used. In determining who was the owner of a vehicle at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994

**"parent and child bay"** means an area of a parking place indicated by a sign or marking for the leaving of a vehicle of a specified class, where the adult is accompanied by a child under the age of 14 and that child is less than 1.35m in height

**"parking bay"** means the area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle of a class specified and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or signed or otherwise indicated by signs in the parking place

**"parking device"** has the meaning assigned to it by Section 35 (3B) of the 1984 Act.

**“parking place”** means the area of land defined in Column 1 of Schedule 1 and hereto shown on the plans in Schedule 2 provided by the Council under section 32(1) of the 1984 Act for use as a parking place

**“pay and display ticket machine”** means an apparatus provided by the Council for issuing a pay and display ticket

**“pay and display ticket”** means a type of parking device issued by a pay and display ticket machine relevant to the parking place in which a vehicle has been left.

**“pedal cycle”** means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle, or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the 1984 Act(9);

**“penalty charge”** means a charge set by the Council in accordance with the provisions of Section 77 and Schedule 9 of the 2004 Act and Regulations made thereunder and in accordance with any guidance given by the Secretary of State

**“penalty charge notice (PCN)”** means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 of the 2004 Act and Regulations made thereunder

**“parking permit”** means a current and valid payment evidenced by a parking device issued by the Council as described in Table 1 of the Terms and Conditions set out in Schedule 3 of this Order and used in accordance with those terms and conditions of use.

**“parking permit holder”** means the person responsible for a vehicle for which there is a parking device to indicate a valid and current parking permit, waiver or voucher.

**“permitted hours”** means the periods specified for each parking place during which waiting by vehicles of a specific class is permitted as specified in Column 4 of Schedule 1 of this Order

**“restricted hours”** means the periods specified for each parking place during which waiting by vehicles of a specific class is restricted as specified in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Order.

**“utility organisation”** has the same meaning as Statutory Undertaker as defined in the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (S98.6).

**“vehicle”** means for the purpose of this order, a motor vehicle or pedal cycle.

**“waiver”** means a current and valid payment evidenced by parking device issued by the Council for the purpose of permitting a specified vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a parking bay where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited

**“voucher”** means a current and valid payment evidenced by a parking device issued by the Council for the purpose of permitting a specified vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a parking bay where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited

### **General**

3. Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article shall, unless the context requires otherwise, be construed as a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order.
4. Any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order.

**Designation and use of parking places**

6.

- (1) The areas of land shown edged in red on the plans in Schedule 2 (the plans) may be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to those parking places set out in Schedule 1.
- (2) No person shall permit any vehicle other than a vehicle permitted by the provisions of this Order to be left in a parking place without the consent of the Council.
- (3) Where by notice or surface markings displayed in the parking place, a parking bay is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or for a permitted vehicles to be left in a specified location, a driver of a vehicle shall not permit a permitted vehicle to wait in that parking bay unless:
  - (a) it is of the said permitted class of vehicle; and
  - (b) it is parked wholly within the parking bay allocated to for that specified class, or in a position as directed by a CEO.
- (4) Where there is evidence of a Parking Bay in a Parking Place, then the Driver of a Vehicle shall ensure that their Vehicle is parked wholly within it.
- (5) Where there is no Parking Bay in evidence within a Parking Place, then a vehicle which in the opinion of a CEO is causing an obstruction may be issued with a PCN.
- (6) Nothing in this article shall restrict the power of the Council with or without prior notice to close a Parking Place or part thereof on a temporary or permanent basis.

Disabled Persons Vehicles

- (7) Where by notice or surface markings displayed in the parking place, a parking bay is described as available for Disabled Persons Vehicles, no person shall permit any permitted vehicle to stop or wait or load or remain in the said parking bay unless it is a Disabled Persons Vehicle which shall display a valid Disabled Persons Badge and Disabled Persons Disc, and the vehicle immediately before or after the act of parking is about to be driven or used by the person to whom the badge has been issued;

Parent & Child Vehicles

- (8) Where by notice or surface markings displayed in the parking place, a parking bay is described as available for 'Parent & Child' vehicles, no person shall permit any permitted vehicle to stop or wait or load or remain in the said bay unless the vehicle is parked in accordance with other restrictions as appropriate and where the adult is accompanied by a child under the age of 14 years and that child is less than 1.35m in height;

Electric Vehicles

- (9) Where by notice or surface markings displayed in the parking place, a parking bay is described as for Electric Vehicles, any permitted vehicle parked in the same must pay the appropriate Parking Charge and "charge up fee" (if any) as the Council may determine from time to time.
- (10) Only a permitted Electric Vehicle may park in a Parking Bay reserved for such a vehicle, and it must be using the Parking Bay for active "charge-up" of the same.

Display of disabled persons badge and pay & display tickets

- (11) For the purpose of this order a permitted Vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:
- i. A valid Disabled Persons Badge in the relevant position when,

- (a). In the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that the front of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; with the expiry date showing, and
  - (b). In the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the said badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the front of the said badge is legible from outside the vehicle; with the expiry date showing.
- ii. A disabled Persons Parking Disc in the relevant position when;
  - (a). in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle and
  - (b). in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the said disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the quarter period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- iii. A pay and display ticket in the relevant position when;
  - (a). In the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the ticket is exhibited thereon so that the front of the ticket is legible from outside the vehicle; with all the information on the ticket showing, and
  - (b). In the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the said ticket is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the Vehicle so that the front of the said ticket is legible from outside the vehicle; with all the information on the ticket showing.



**Prohibition or Restriction of use of Parking Places**

7. Save as provided in Article 8 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle:-
- (1) to stop or wait or load in the parking places shown on the plans in Schedule Two outside the permitted hours described in Column 4 of Schedule 1;
  - (2) to stop or wait or load on areas as designated by appropriate signs and lines within specified parking places shown on the plans where stopping or waiting or loading is not allowed;
  - (3) to wait or remain during restricted hours:
    - (a) for a period longer than the maximum period of waiting specified for that parking place described in Column 6 of Schedule 1; or
    - (b) without a valid parking permit applicable to the use of the parking place;
  - (4) to wait or remain during charging hours without making payment evidenced by a current and valid parking device for that parking place. If that parking device is a pay and display ticket, it must be displayed in accordance with Article 6 (11). All other parking devices must be readily available for inspection by apparatus provided by the Council;
  - (5) to wait or remain during charging hours a vehicle that has been transferred an unexpired pay and display ticket from another vehicle;
  - (6) to again be left in a parking place, limited waiting area or limited loading area until after the expiration of the time shown in Column 6 of Schedule 1 when a vehicle is permitted to return to the same parking place, limited waiting area or limited loading area;
  - (7) to use any part of the parking place or any vehicle left in a parking place in breach of the Terms and Conditions set out in Schedule 3 of this Order.
  - (8) to enter the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leave the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated by signs erected or surface markings laid out.

### **Exemptions**

8. The following vehicles are exempt from any Prohibition or Restriction as set out in Article 7 of this Order:
- (1) a vehicle, necessarily required for use in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
    - (a) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (b) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction on the areas of parking as shown within the plans in Schedule 2 of this Order; and
    - (c) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land within the parking places shown on the plans in Schedule 2 of this Order, for any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line by a utility organisation while attending to their apparatus;
  - (2) a vehicle in the service of the Council being necessarily used in connection with deliveries and collections, maintenance and parking enforcement, waste collection or cleansing activities;
  - (3) a vehicle which is:
    - (a) required by law to stop; or
    - (b) obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident; or
    - (c) prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside their control; or
    - (d) caused or permitted to stop or wait upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or a CEO;
  - (4) a vehicle being used for:
    - (a) fire brigade, ambulance or police responding to an emergency; or
    - (b) attending an emergency by a medical practitioner, in which cases the Council may require evidence to show that there was a genuine emergency; or
    - (c) naval, military or air force or visiting forces if at the time they are being used or appropriated by such forces;
  - (5) a vehicle that is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from that vehicle;

- (6) a Disabled Persons Vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge and Disabled Persons Disc may wait for a period of three hours (or other time period as displayed in the parking place) and thereafter the Driver of said Disabled Persons Vehicle shall be subject to the General Prohibitions described in Article 8, including any parking charges that apply.
- (7) a vehicle that has a waiver issued by the Council;
- (8) a pedal cycle parked in any area set aside for use of pedal cycles at any time;

### **Contravention of the Provisions of this Order**

- 9. If a vehicle is parked in a parking place in contravention of or in non-compliance with any Article in this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a Penalty Charge shall be payable by the owner and a PCN may be issued by a CEO in accordance with the requirement of the 2004 Act.
- 10. Payment of the Penalty Charge to the Council shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions as stated on the PCN.
- 11. The particulars given in the PCN attached to a permitted vehicle in accordance with this Article shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to the failure to pay the Penalty Charge.
- 12. Where a PCN has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provision of this order, no person other than a person authorised by the Council or the Driver or a person authorised by the Driver shall remove the PCN for the Vehicle.

**Power to suspend use of parking places**

13. (1) A Police Constable in uniform may direct the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof for no longer than twenty-four hours whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic, promoting its safety or other emergency.
- (2) Upon written application on a form approved by the Council and upon payment of the appropriate fee the Council may direct that the use of a parking place or any part thereof be suspended whenever it considers such suspension reasonably necessary.
- (3) Nothing in this Article restricts in any way the discretion afforded to the Council to stipulate such conditions to or grant such exemptions for any suspension directed in accordance with Article 13(2) as it considers reasonably necessary. Notwithstanding the foregoing the exemptions provided for in Articles 8 (3) and (4) will apply in respect of a suspended parking place.
- (4) Where the Council directs that the use of a parking place or any part thereof be suspended in accordance with Article 13(2), the Council will place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof, traffic signs indicating that vehicles are prohibited from stopping or waiting or loading thereon.
- (5) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any suspended parking place or any part thereof:
- (a) during such period as any suspension directed in accordance with this Article is in force in respect of that parking place or any part thereof; and
  - (b) whilst they are in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof traffic signs placed in accordance with Article 13(4) or placed by the police.
- (6) Where a person contravenes Article 13(5), that person shall incur a PCN.

**Scope of Order**

14. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by the Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act or by or under any other enactment.

## **SCHEDULE 3 – Car Park Terms & Conditions**

### **GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL CAR PARKS – TERMS & CONDITIONS**

1. Any person, who parks in a Council owned car park, agrees to pay any advertised charges in full, unless they hold a current and valid parking permit for that car park.
2. The following activities are expressly prohibited from being carried out by users or their agents within the confines of the car park save as where exemptions are specifically described in this order;
  - a. towing, tailoring, or lifting of the vehicle
  - b. any work of repair, refurbishment, or improvement
  - c. filling or discharging of fuel tanks
  - d. charging of batteries, except electric vehicle charge up.
  - e. selling, letting, or hiring of vehicles or any part or parts thereof, whether by way of trade or privately with the exception of authorised and registered car club use
  - f. washing, cleaning or valeting
  - g. charging or emptying of vehicle fuel tanks
  - h. storage of any petrol diesel or lubricating oil other than that in the tank or the engine of the vehicle.
3. Valid disabled person's badge holders must display prominently their blue badge if they are parking in a marked disabled bay. The named person whose photograph appears on the disabled person's badge displayed in a vehicle must be either a driver or passenger in the car at the time of parking.
4. Vehicles may only park in the bay in which they are entitled i.e. vehicles may not park in motorcycle bays.
5. Persons may be required to leave the car park either orally or in writing by the Council. In the event that a person fails to remove themselves from the car park immediately

upon being requested to do so by an employee or contractor appointed by the Council, the Council reserves the right to summon the Police to remove the said user.

6. All users are advised to ensure that portable belongings are removed from the vehicle. Where this is not possible, they should be concealed from sight. The Council shall not be under any duty of supervision and does not guarantee or warrant security of any vehicle, person, or belongings.
7. Users must ensure that all doors and tailgates are locked, and windows, sunroofs, and soft tops are securely closed whilst the vehicle is unattended.
8. All users consent to being filmed by the closed circuit television surveillance system. Recordings of images from the CCTV system may be used in evidence in Court proceedings.
9. Users must obey all signs and comply with all instructions given by car park staff.
10. It must be understood that car parks are potentially hazardous environments containing equipment, services, and materials that may cause injury or death if interfered with by unauthorised persons. Users must not interfere with any equipment and must exercise due caution and prudence when on the premises.
11. Vehicles must be driven and manoeuvred with all due care, attention, and consideration in order to ensure the safety of all users, car park staff, pedestrians, equipment and other vehicles.
12. Users must park the vehicle wholly within marked single parking bays, where provided.
13. The Council does not accept any responsibility for the entry of unauthorised persons onto the car park or for any loss or damage occasioned by such persons.
14. The staff at the car park has the right to perform their daily duties free from verbal or physical abuse from the users of this facility. Any incidents of this nature will be reported to the police and offenders may be prosecuted.
15. The user shall not at any time tow any vehicle into the car park nor shall any repairs, renovations, additions or alterations be carried out to any vehicle whilst it is parked in the car park.

16. Users shall drive carefully and considerately and obey the staff, direction marking, signs and speed limits. After parking users and their passengers shall use the pedestrian walkways and exits as applicable.
17. The user must not run the engine of the car whilst it is within the car park except as necessary for entering or leaving the car park and proceeding to or departing from the parking space for the time being allocated and must not do anything in or on the car park that may cause a nuisance discomfort or annoyance to the Council or any occupant of nearby premises or allow anyone under its control to do so.
18. Upon discovery of an incident within the car park or if the user damages the property of a third party or the Council, users should report it directly to the car park staff on duty or in the absence of car park staff, to the Council's Parking Team on 01452 42 5684. In the case of damage to or theft of or from a vehicle whilst in the car park users are advised to notify their Insurers and the police promptly.
19. The car park may not be used for advertising, trading, camping, cooking, sleeping, washing or servicing vehicles unless agreed in advance with the Council. It is forbidden to erect any tent, booth or other structure without written consent from the Council.
20. The Council reserves the right to or require the vehicle owner to move the vehicle within the car park as deemed necessary by the Council in order to prevent obstruction, satisfy operational needs, facilitate works and ensure safety or where it is necessary to close all or part of the car park, the Council may remove the vehicle.
21. Failure to comply with any of the above conditions will result in the owner of the vehicle in question incurring a penalty charge..
22. Contraventions include, but are not limited to:
  - a) failure to park wholly within the marked bays;
  - b) Parking a vehicles for longer than the permitted maximum stay;
  - c) Parking a vehicle and failing to pay the appropriate parking charge;
  - d) parking in a bay reserved for designated users without a valid parking permit for that bay;
  - e) parking in such a position to cause an obstruction;
  - f) parking a vehicle which exceeds the maximum height and/or weight and/or length limits permitted in the area.
