

Dear Dolly,

Many thanks for letter also thank Mother for parcel received quite safe. It was not squashed this time. You will be quite assured that I shall enjoy all the contents of the parcel sent me. I received two other parcels from someone else at the same time so am fairly full up for the time being. Please remember me to Mr Trot when you see him again and thank him for the tobacco. I am very pleased to hear that Dad is better again I only hope he will remain so. I am also pleased to hear that you are also better than before. I am in the Best of Health at present. I received a letter from Rosie yesterday. I think this is all I can say for the present. Now close with fondest love to you and all at home.
