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Please note: the ward and LSOA boundaries used in this report have been updated. This means figures for these areas are not comparable with those reported in previous bulletins.

INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.

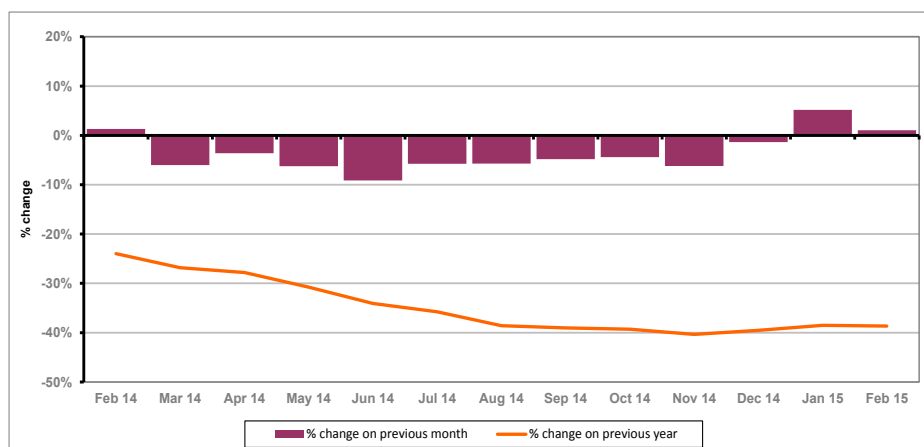
PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 1.3% in February 2015. This was the same as the January 2015 figure. The South West and UK rate remained the same as the previous month at 1.3% and 2.1% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate was the same as the South West average of 1.3%, and 0.8% lower than the UK average of 2.1%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in February 2015 increased by 51 people. The amount of people claiming in February 2015 was 1.1% higher than the number in January 2015. This compares to a 1.7% increase in the South West and a 0.6% increase for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 38.7% lower in February 2015 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

At the end of February 2015 there were 532 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.64%.

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

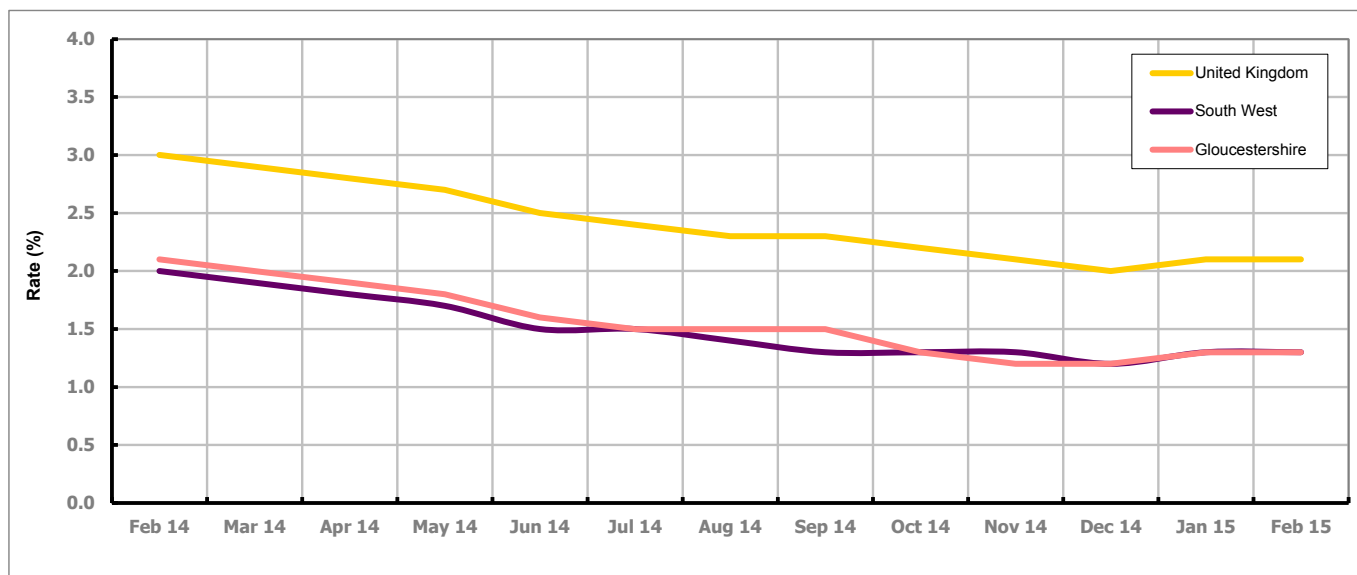


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 1.3% in February 2015. Between February and September 2014 the Gloucestershire rate was generally higher than the South West, it has been the same as the South West average since October 2014. It has been persistently lower by approximately 0.8% against the UK average. The February 2015 rate remained the same as January 2015.

Table 1 shows that in February 2015, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 1.1% higher than the number in January 2015.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to February 2015 was -1.0%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - February 2015

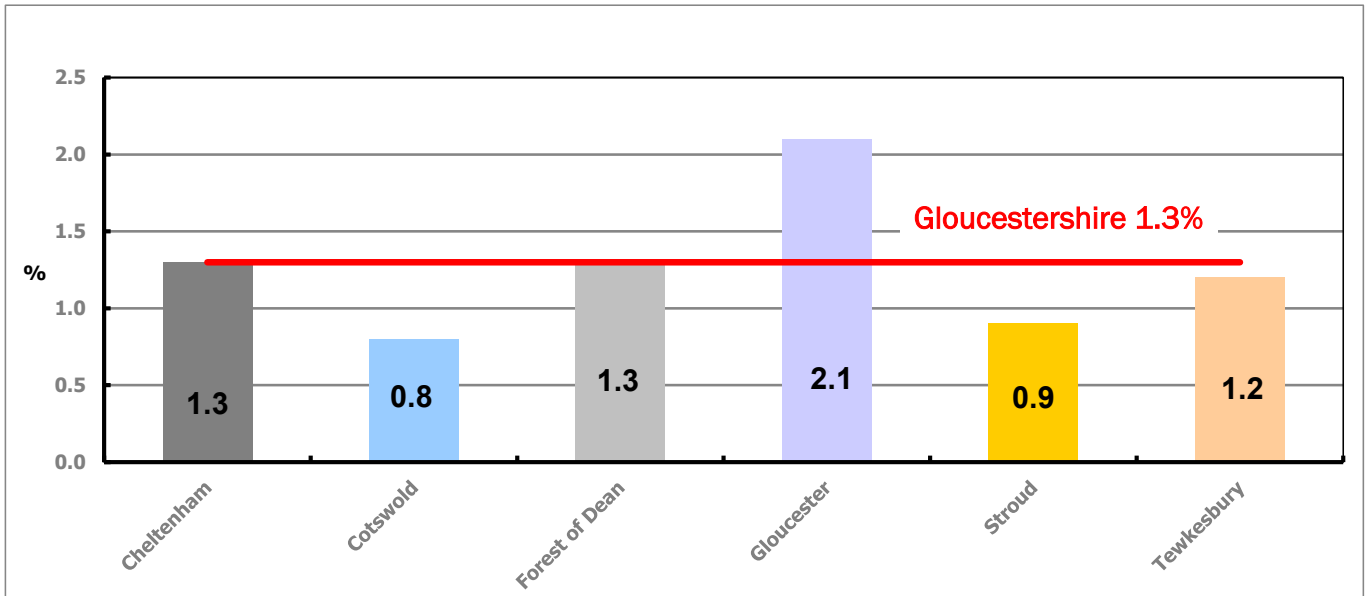


Figure 2 shows the claimant rate for February 2015 in Gloucestershire. Between January 2015 and February 2015, the rate in Gloucester and Stroud decreased, while the rate in Cotswold, Forest of Dean and Tewkesbury increased, and the rate in Cheltenham remained the same.

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

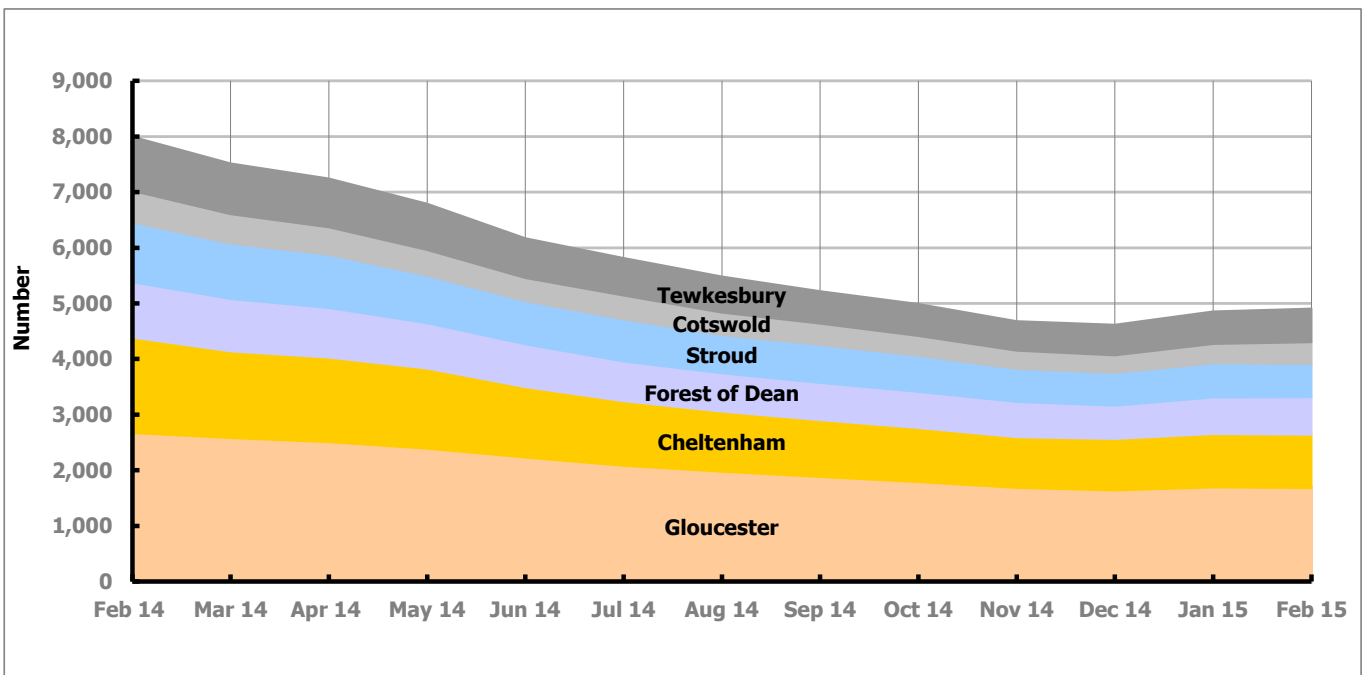


Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count by district over the past year. The number of claimants has decreased over the last year, with the exception of January and February 2015 when there was an increase.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

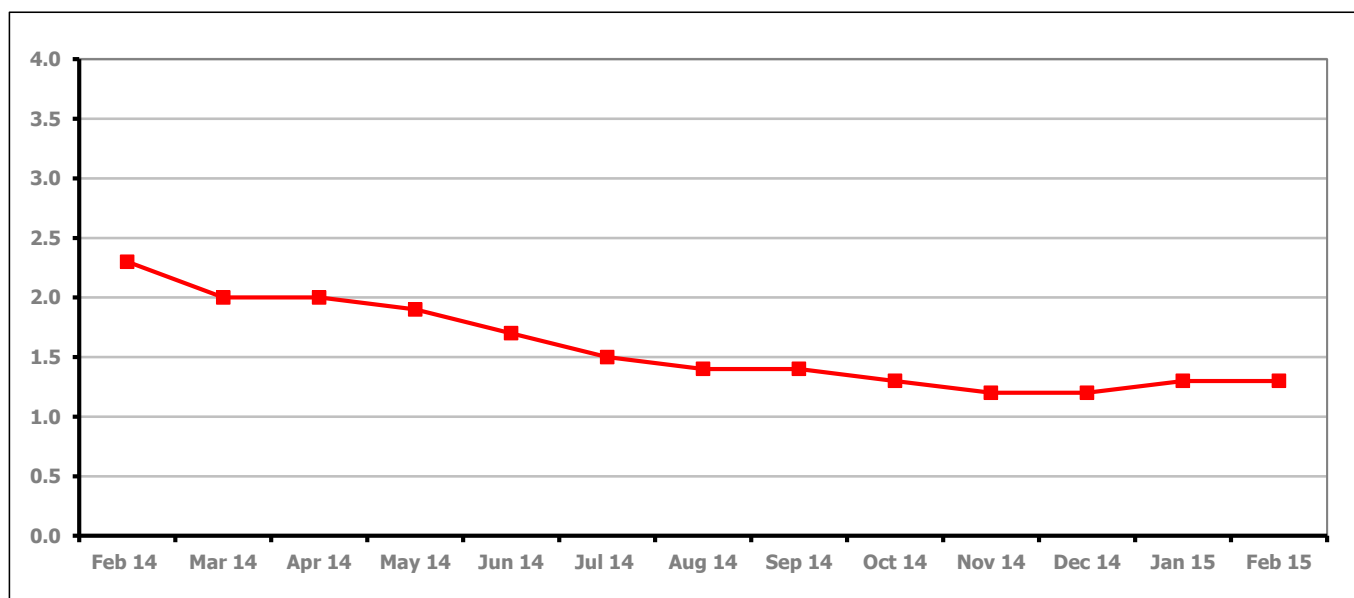


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham remained the same as last month at 1.3%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

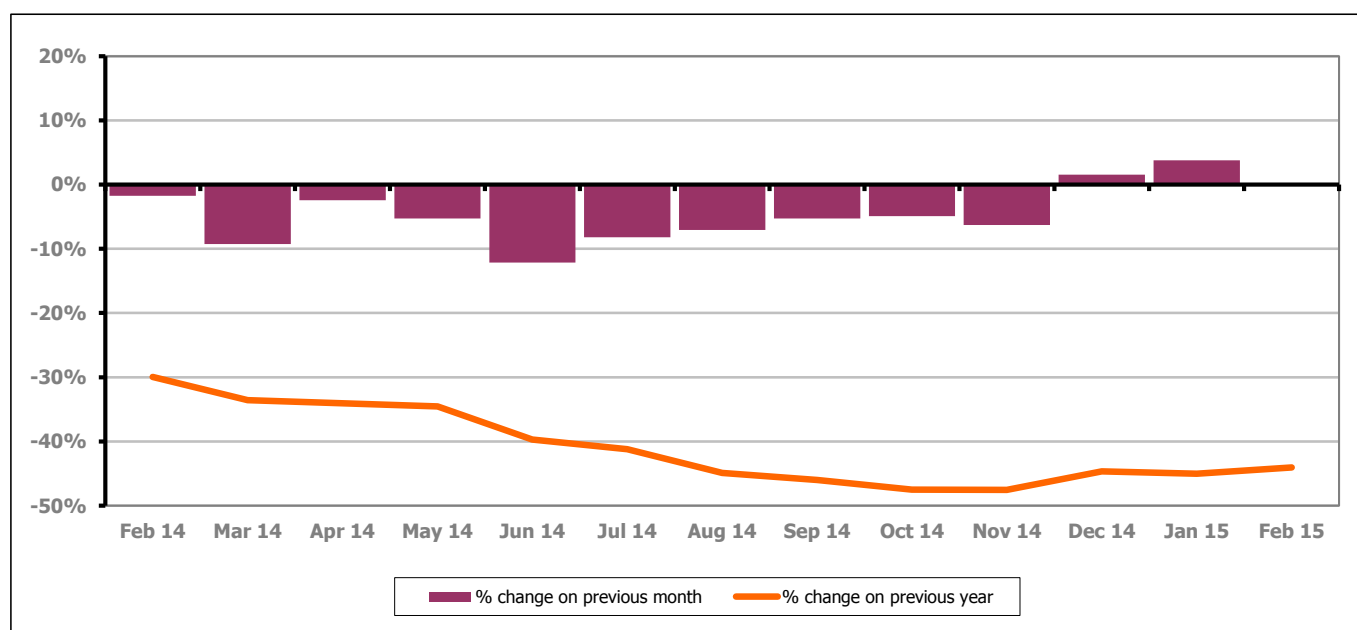


Figure 5 shows the claimant count remained the same as last month. The change on the previous year has increased between January and February 2015 to -44.1%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - February 2015

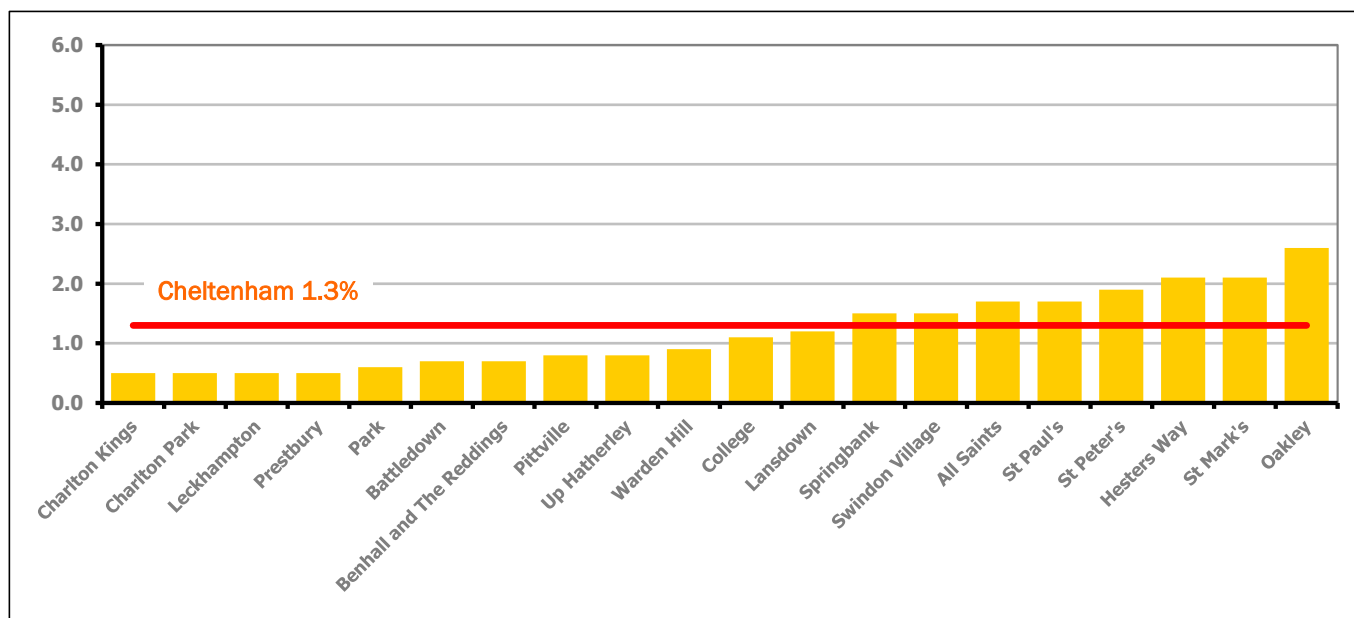

Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year

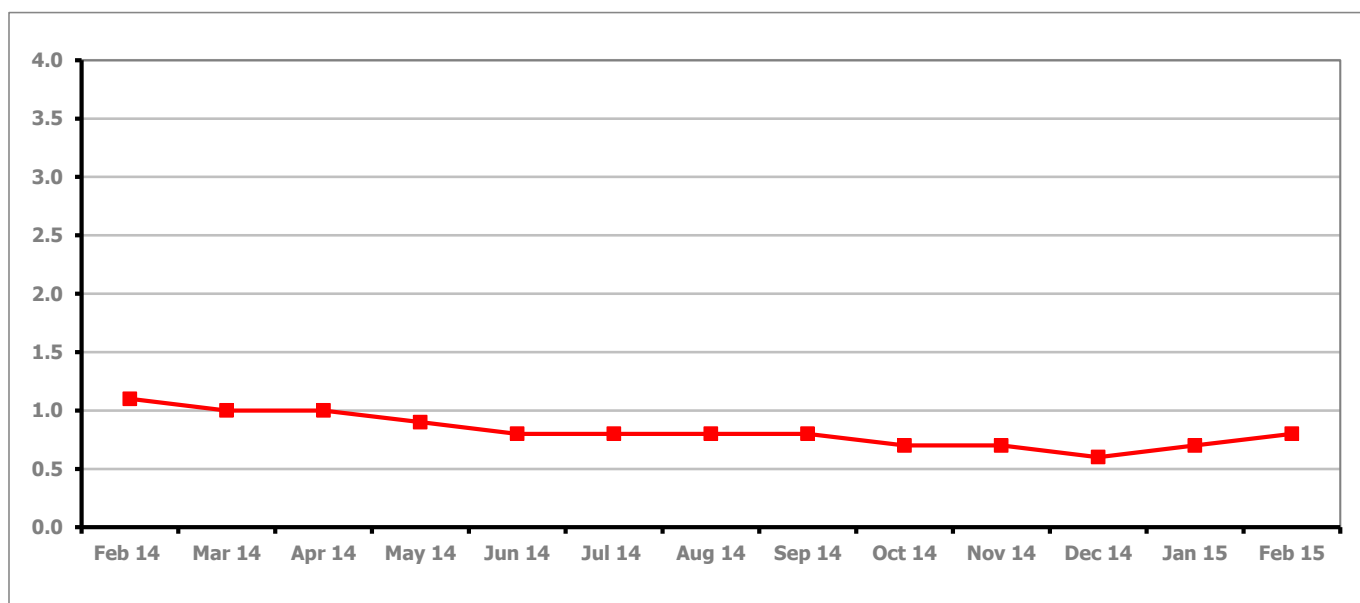


Figure 7 shows the claimant rate in Cotswold District increased in February 2015 to 0.8%.

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

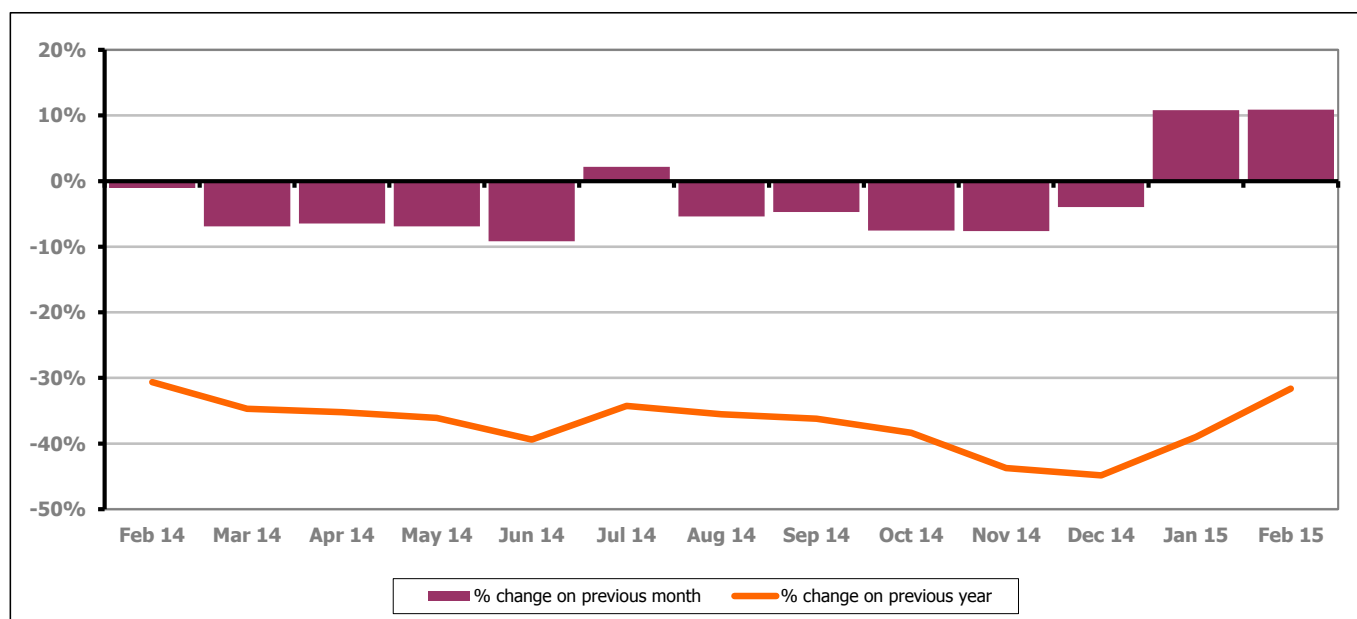


Figure 8 shows the claimant count increased by 10.9% since January 2015. The change on the previous year has increased between January and February 2015 to -31.6%.

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - February 2015

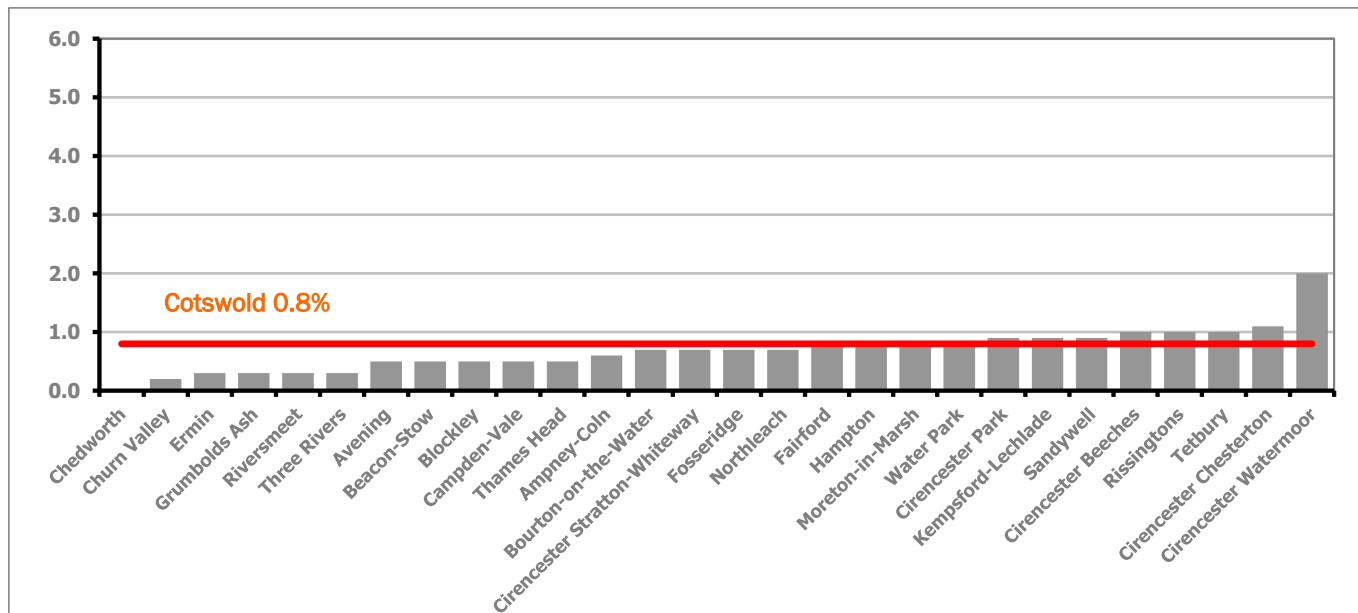
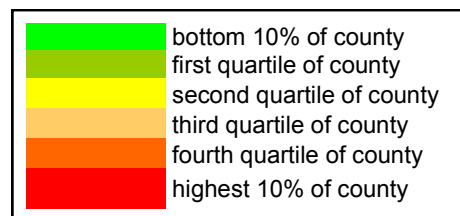


Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 0.8%. Eight wards lie above the average.

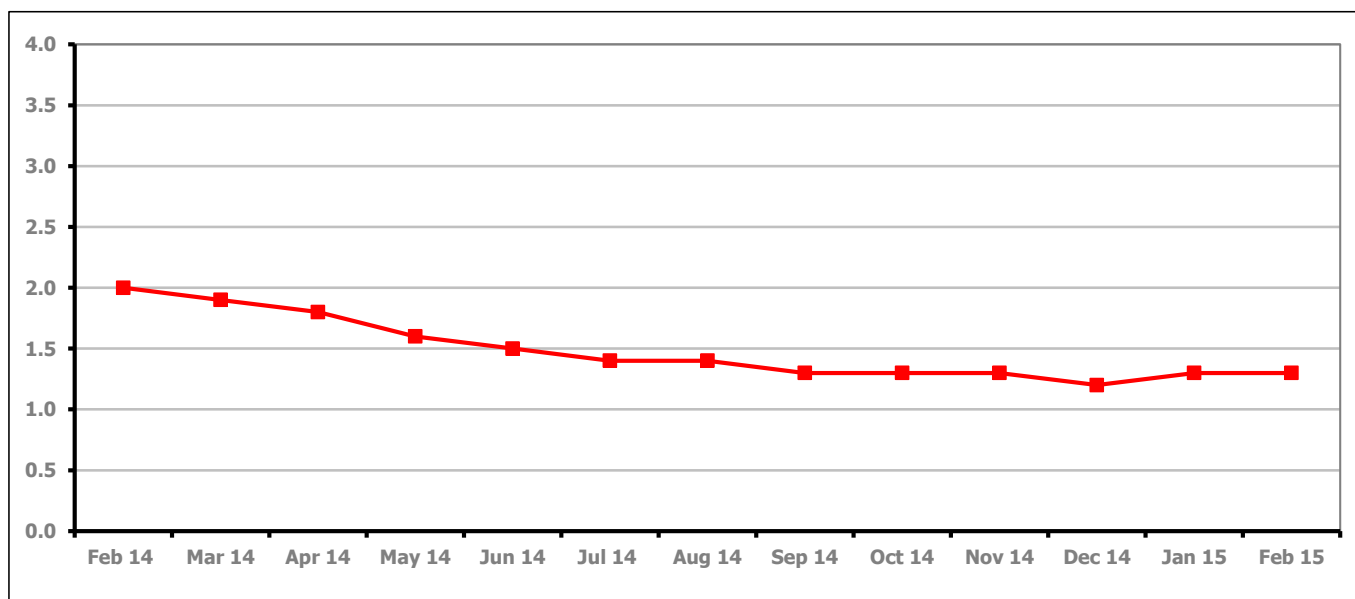

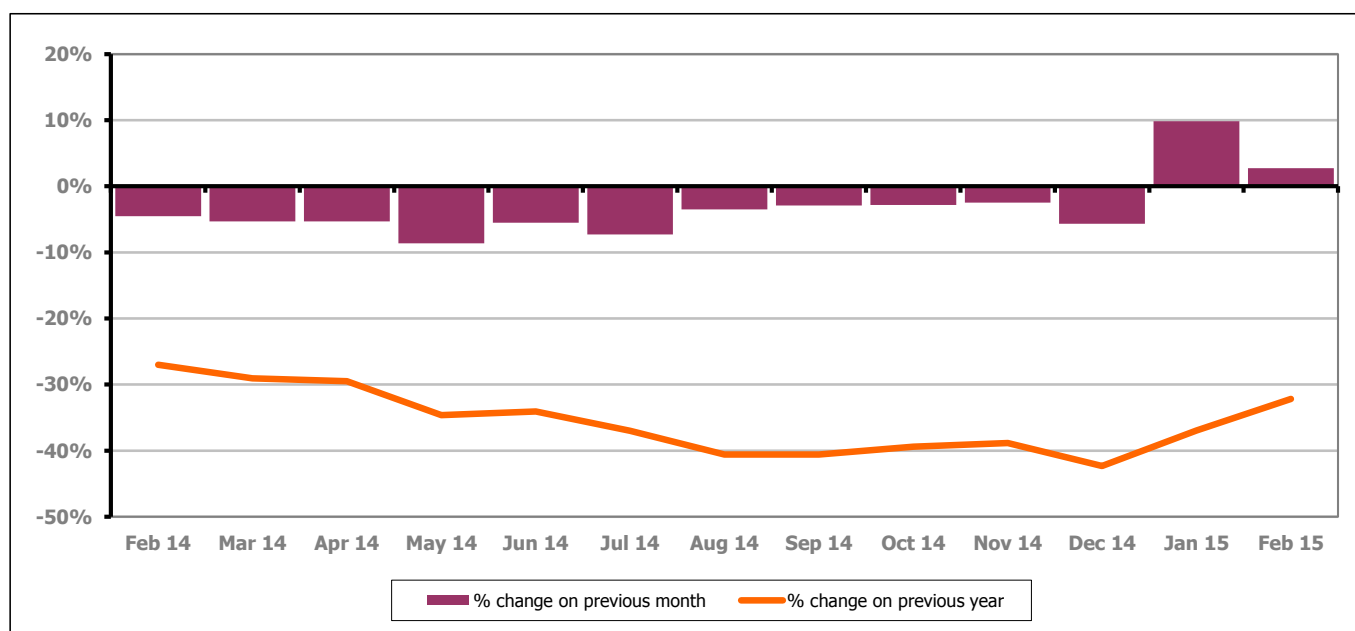
Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - February 2015

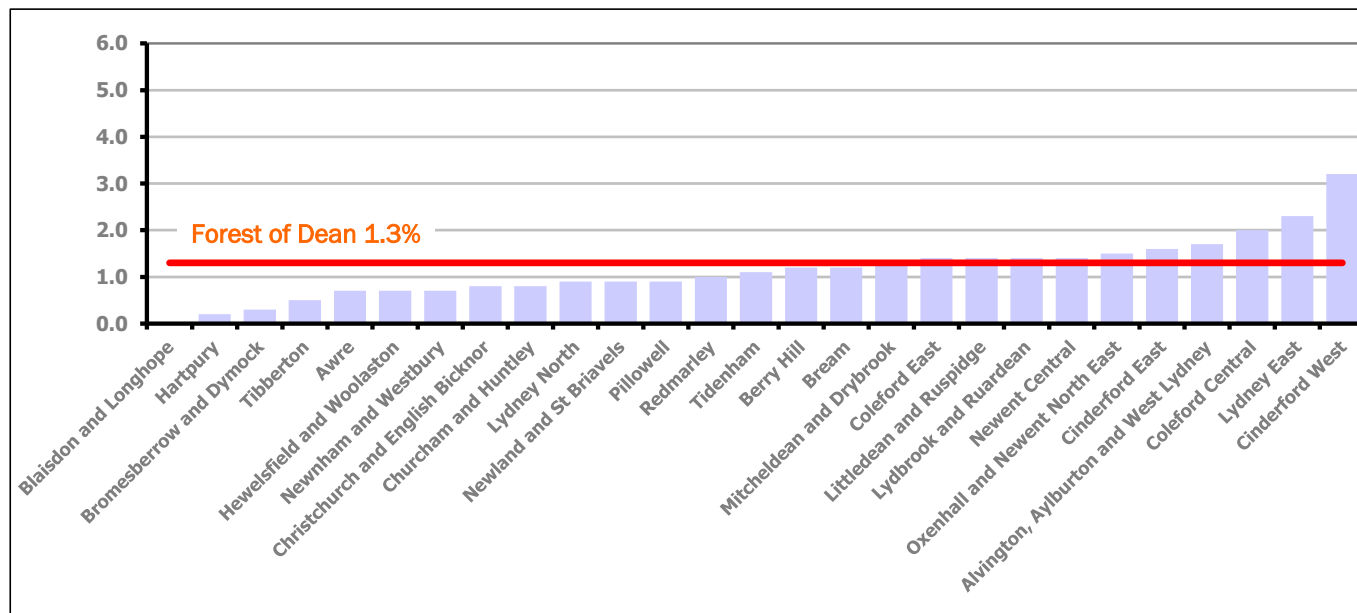
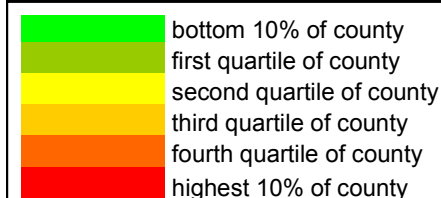


Figure 12 shows the claimant rates for Forest of Dean District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.3%. Ten wards lie above the average.

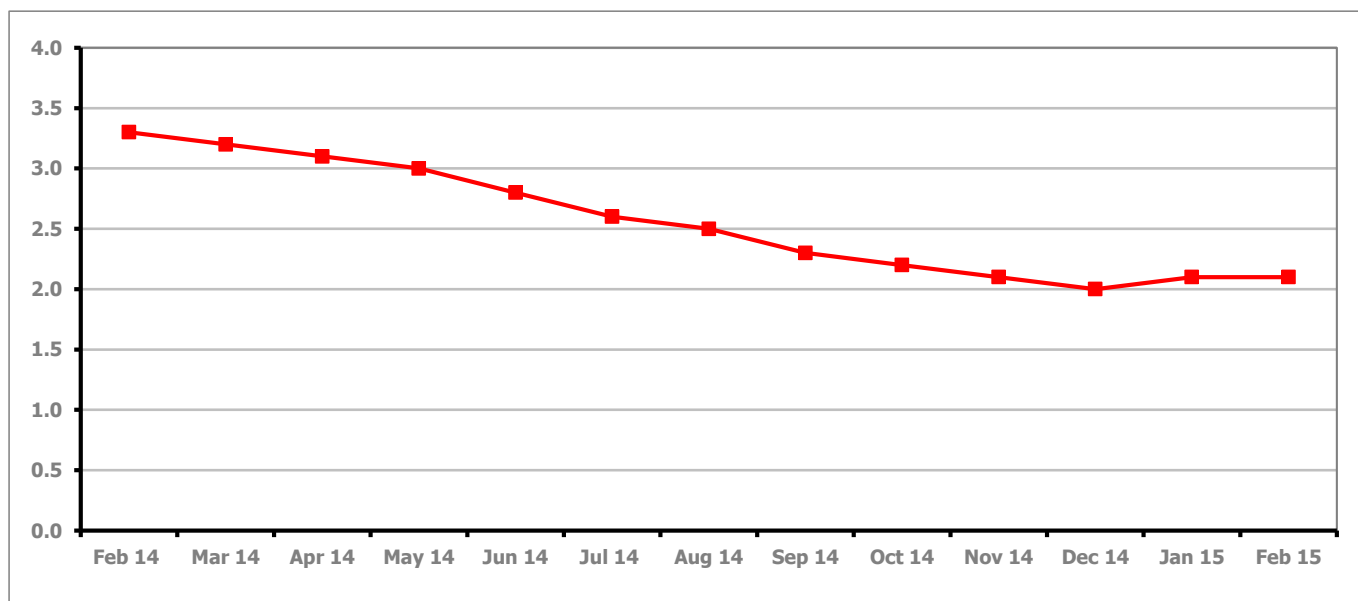

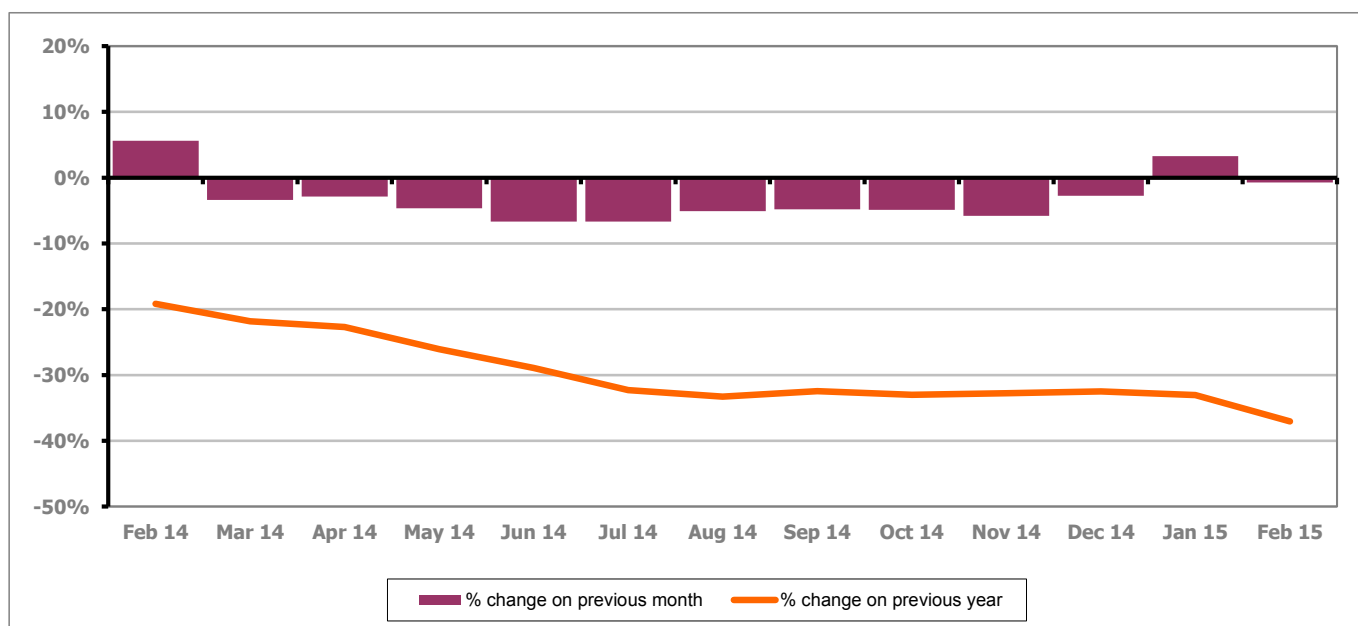
Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - February 2015

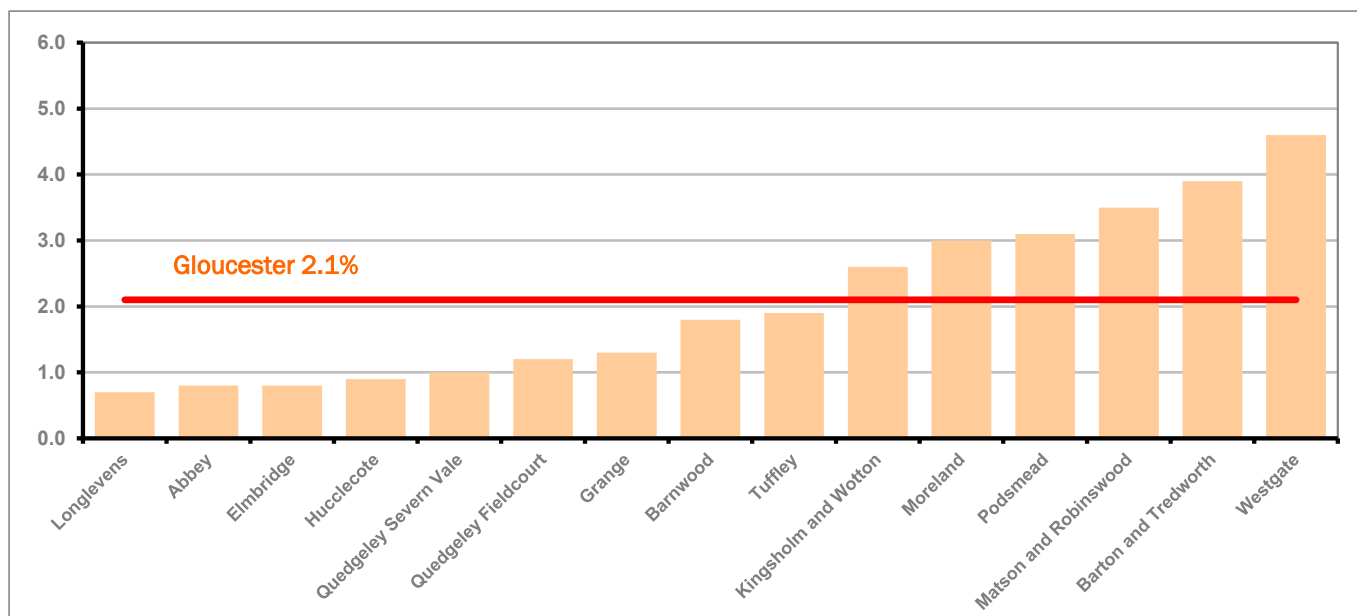


Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 2.1%. Six wards lie above the average.

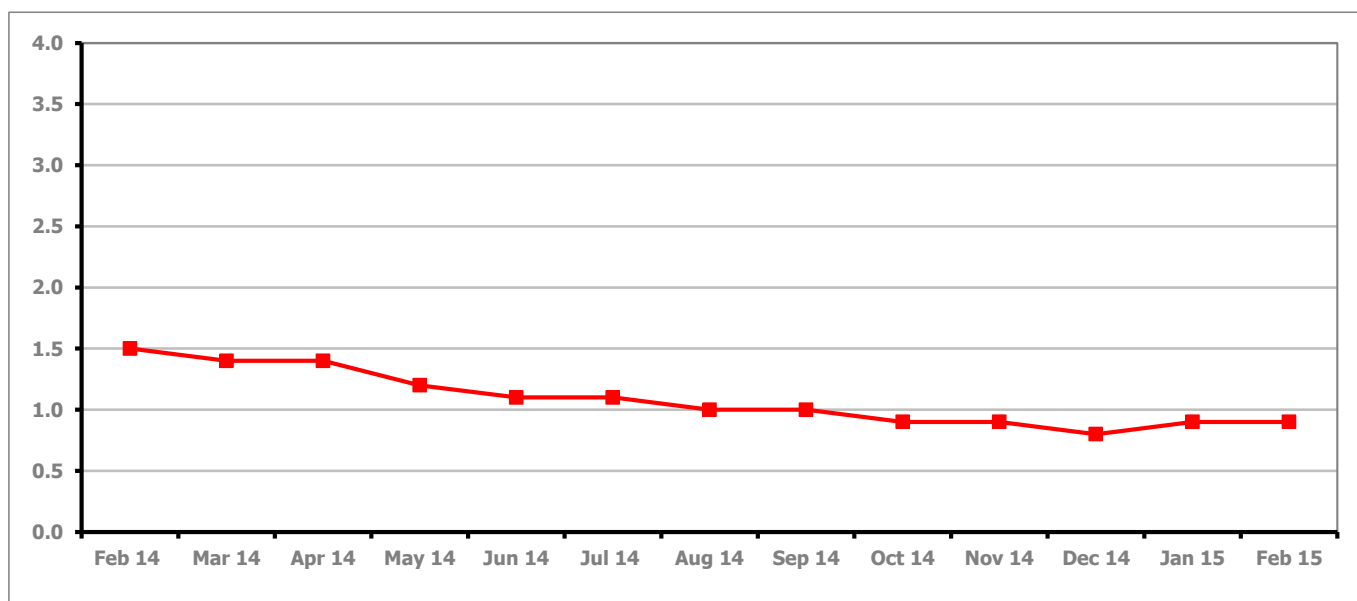

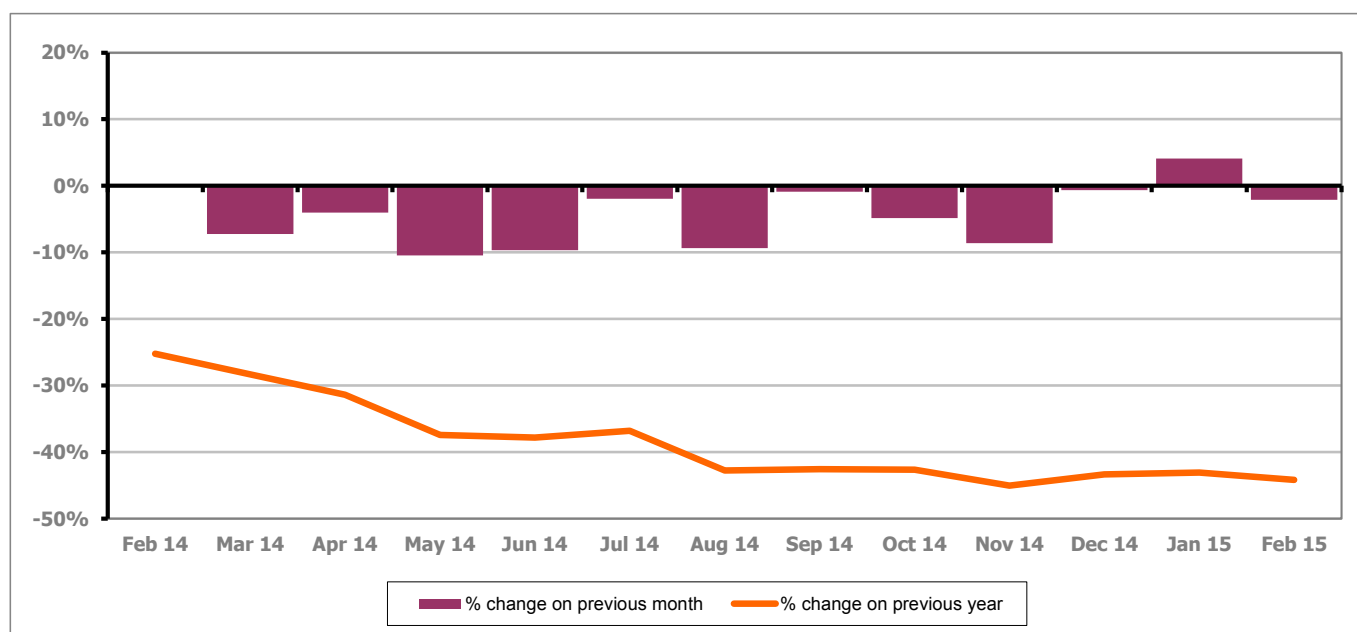
Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - February 2015

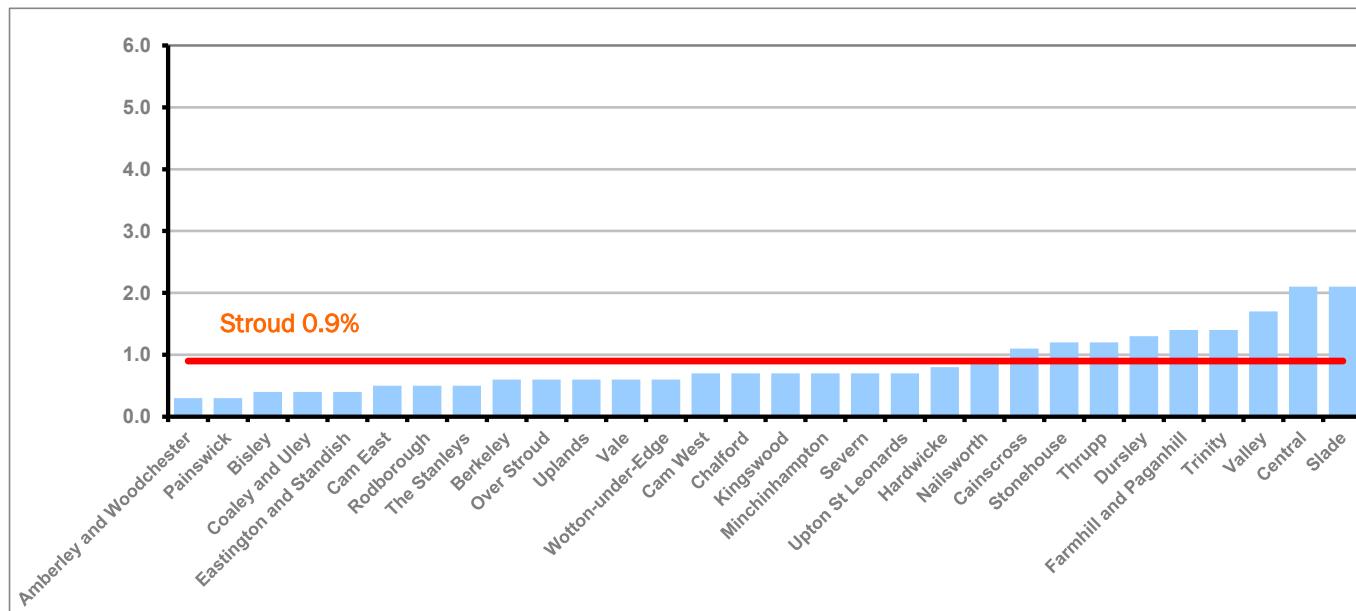
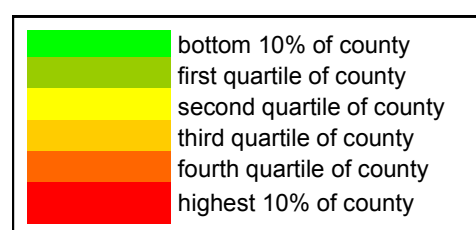

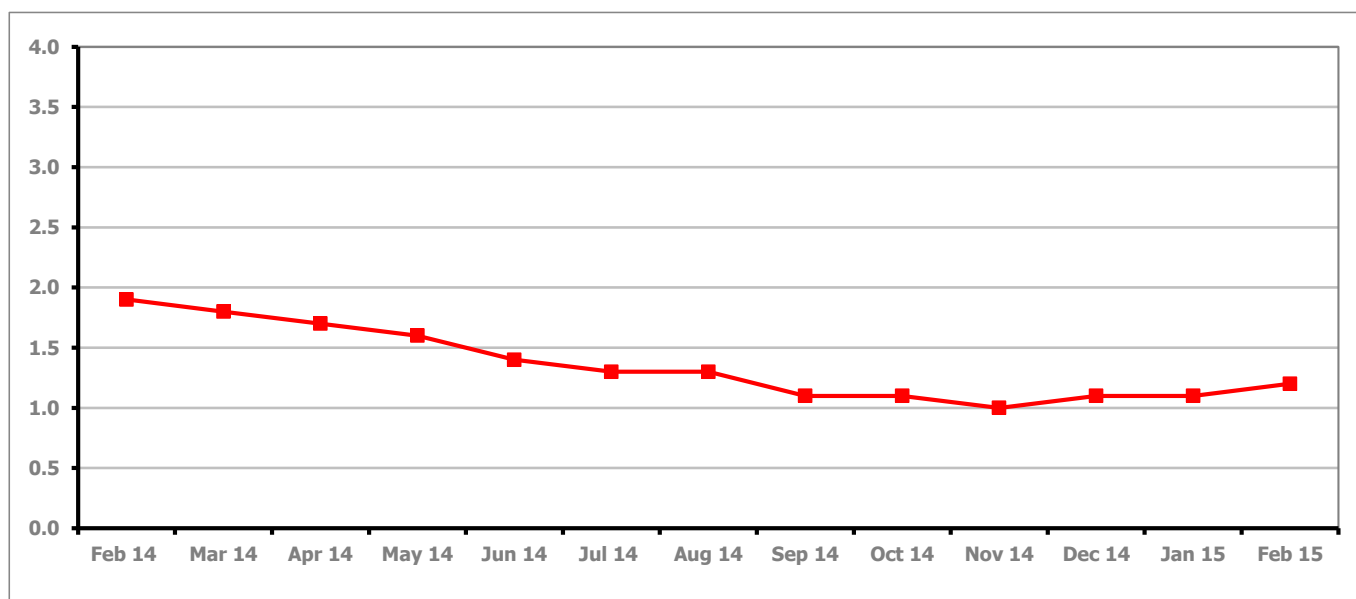

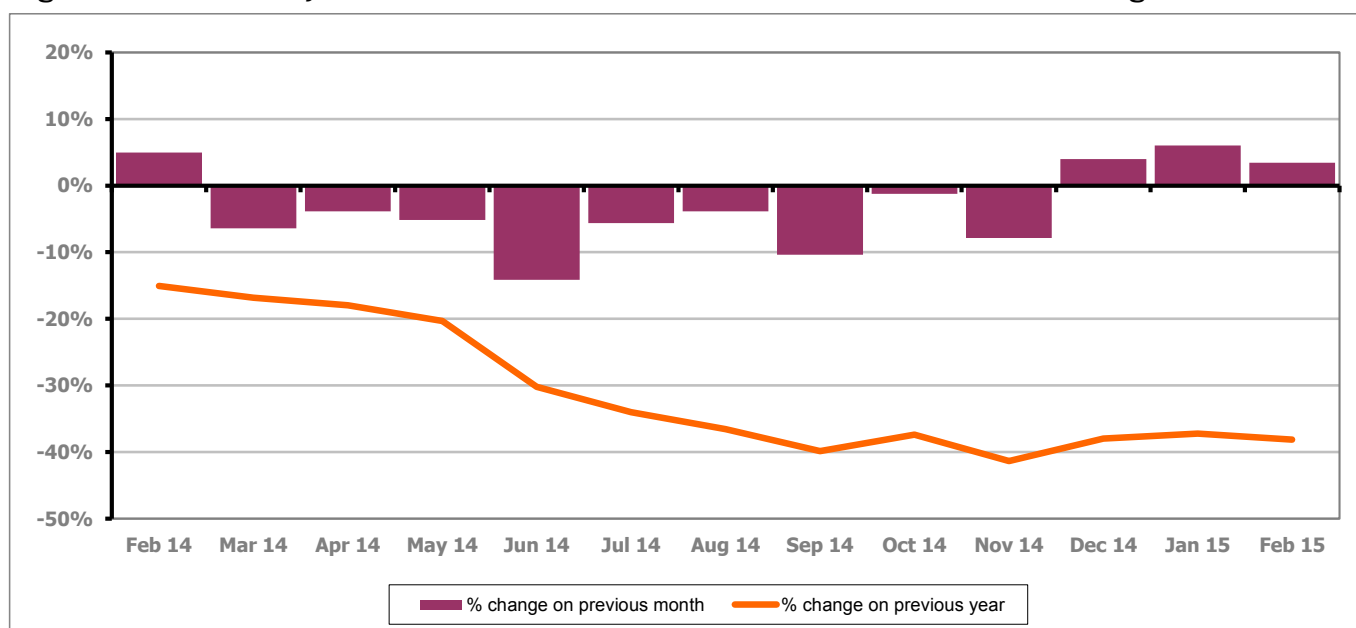
Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - February 2015

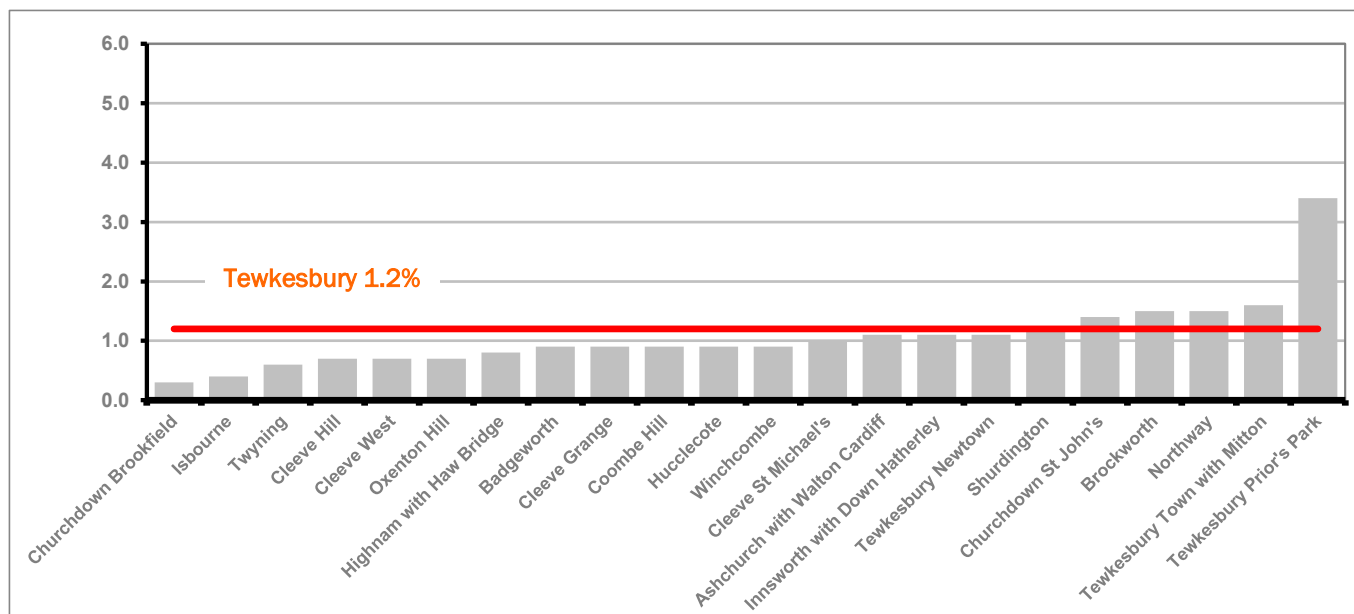

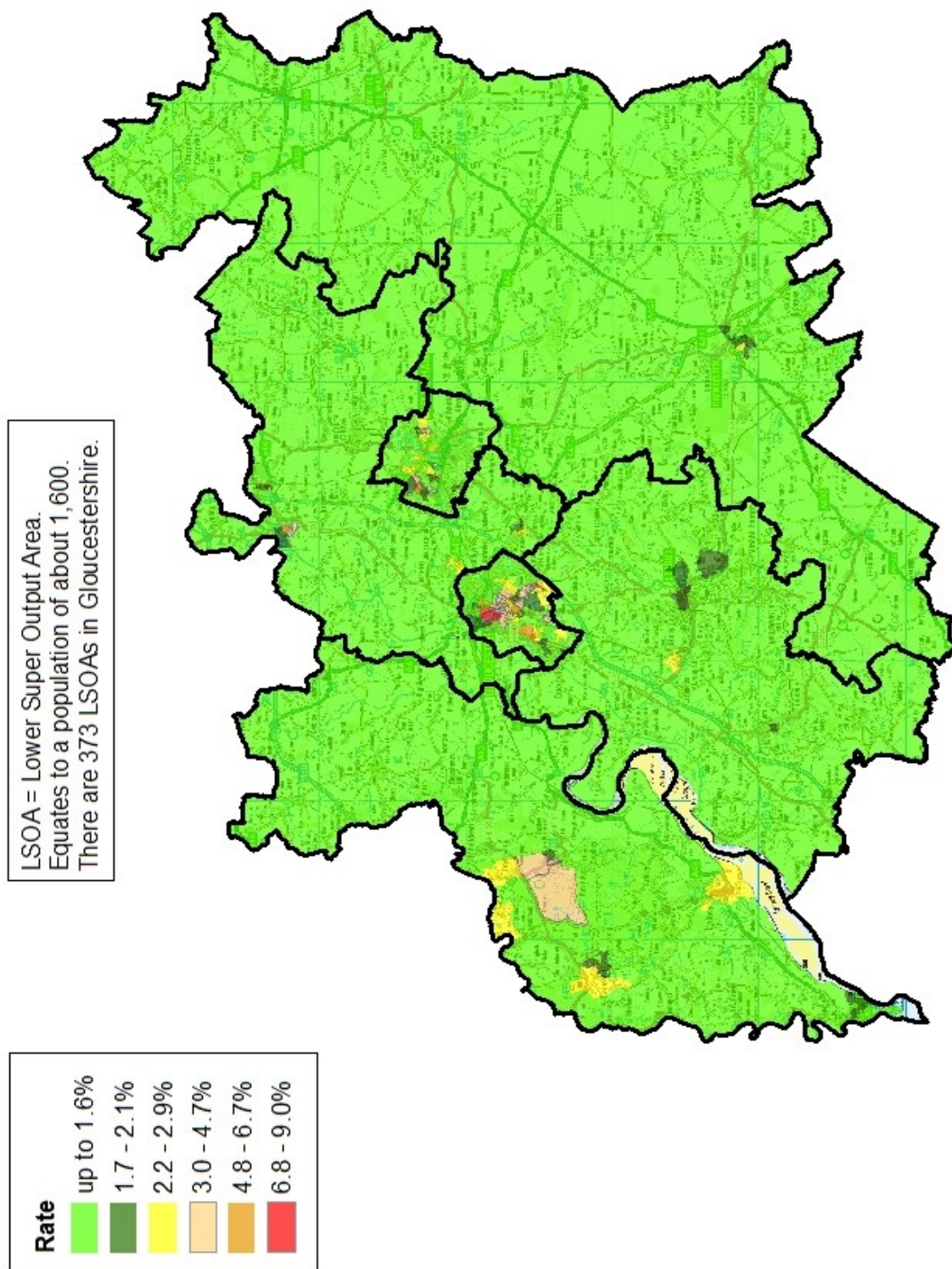

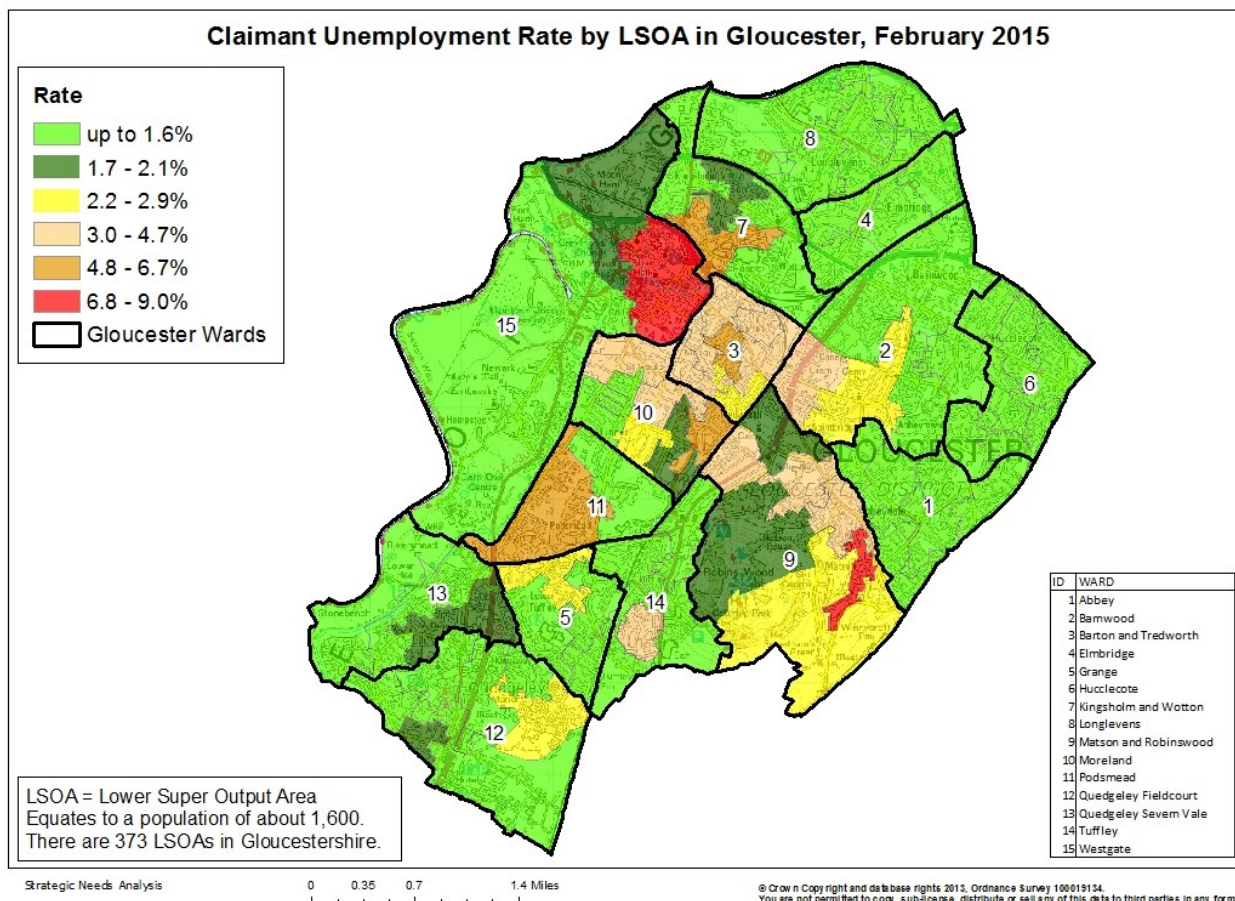
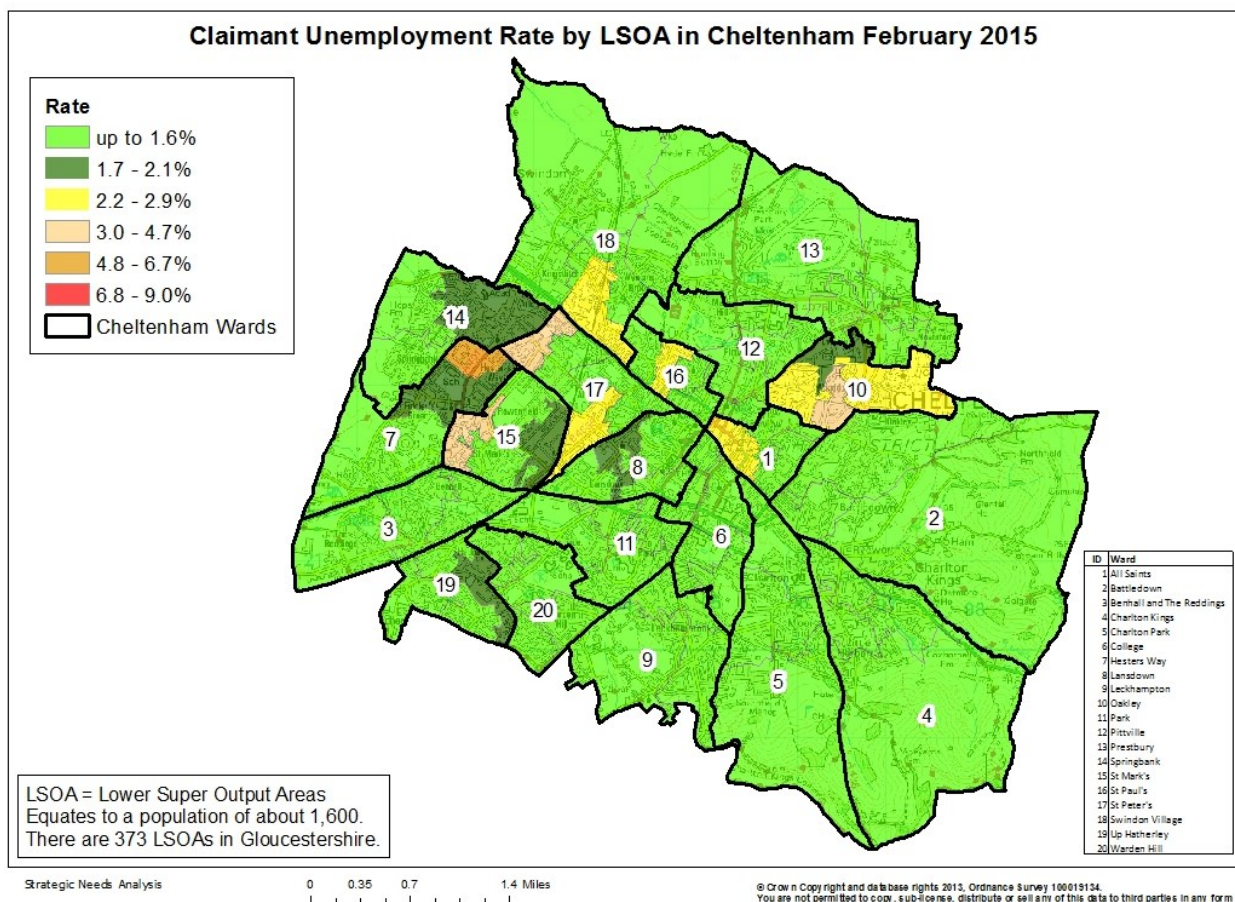

Youth Claimant Rate and Claimant Count

The claimant rate for young people is higher than for the working age (16-64) population with 2.3% of 18-24 year olds in Gloucestershire claiming Job Seekers Allowance (1.3% for working age).

Figure 22: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

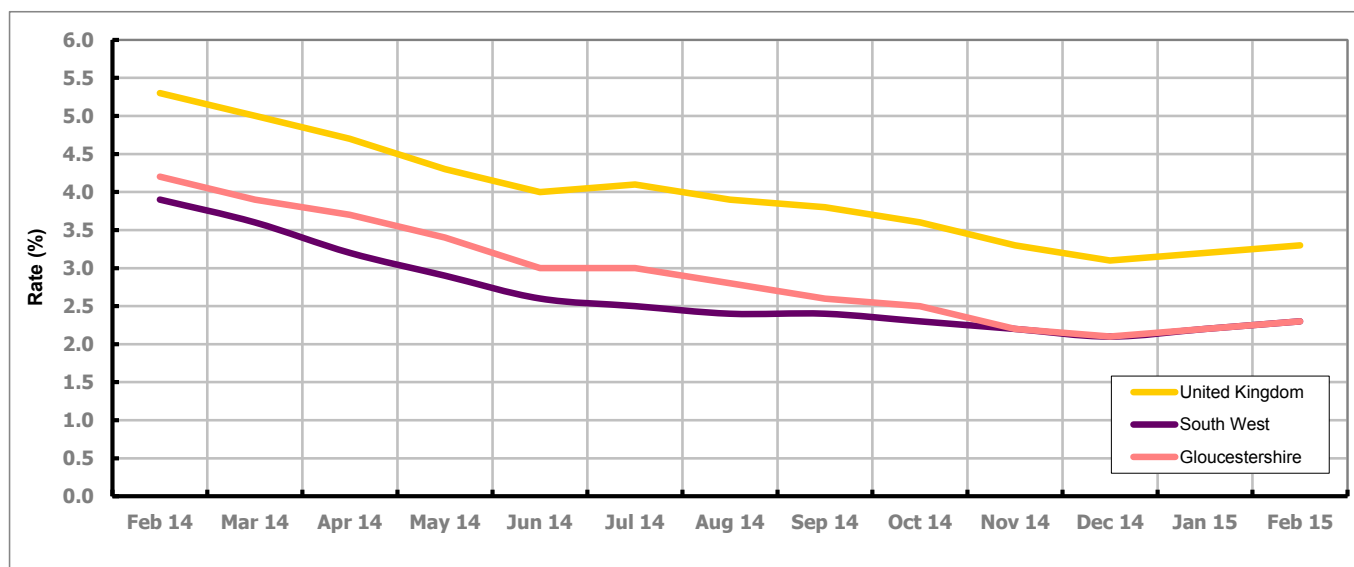


Figure 22 shows Gloucestershire's 18-24 claimant rate is the same as the South West average of 2.3%, but 1.0% lower than the UK average of 3.3%

Figure 23: Claimant Count for Gloucestershire over the past year

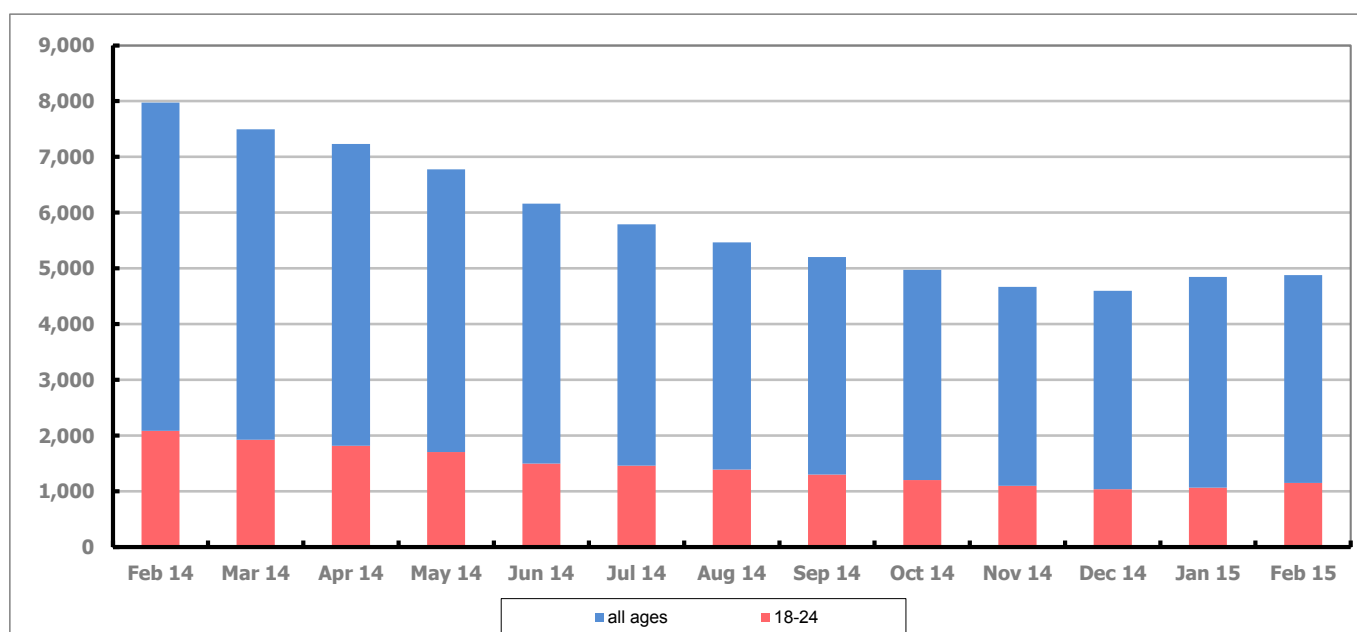


Figure 23 shows that in February 2015, 1,150 people aged 18-24 were claiming Job Seekers Allowance in Gloucestershire, this represents 23.5% of total working age claimants.

Figure 24: Youth Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

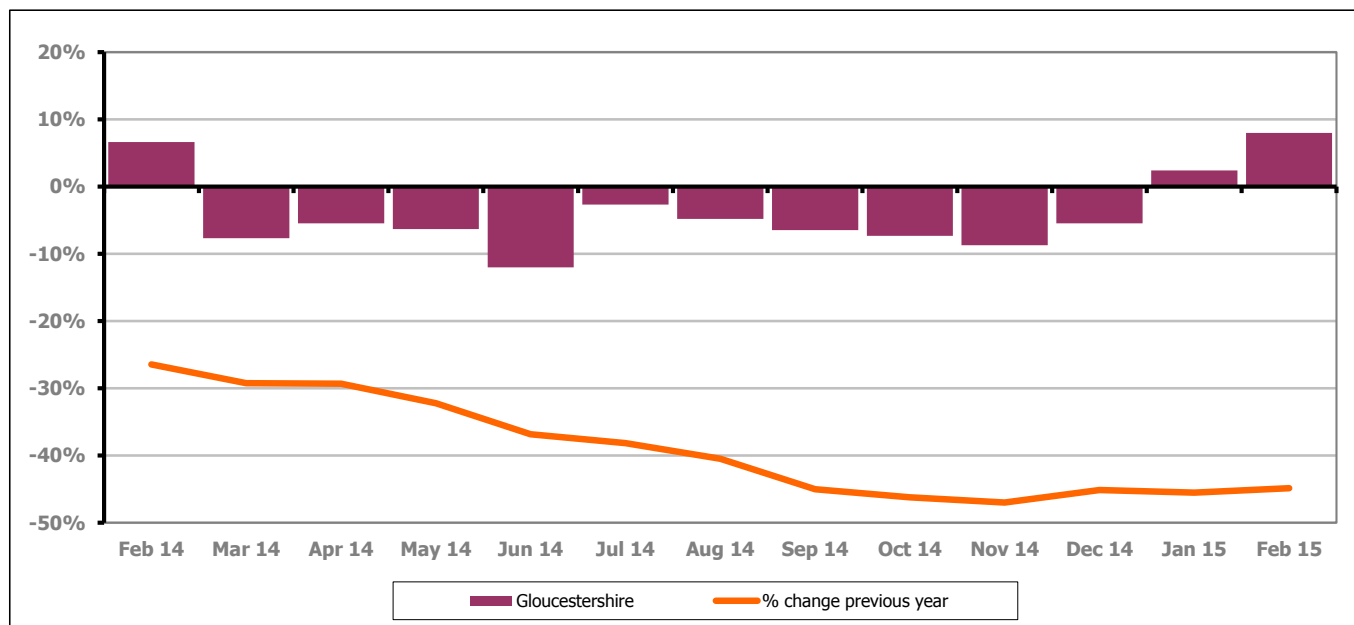


Figure 24 shows the number of young claimants increased in February 2015 by 8.0% this represented 85 people. Over the last year the number of young claimants fell by 44.8% or 935 people.

Figure 25: Duration of claim in the 18-24 year age group

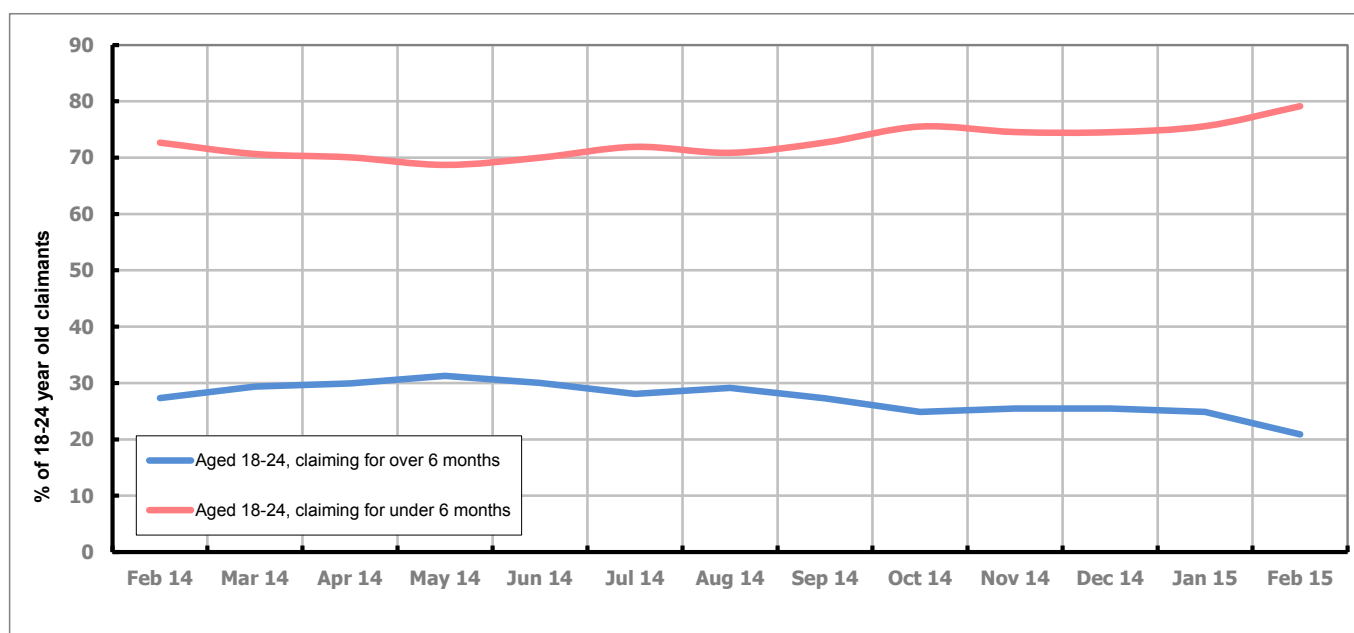


Figure 25 shows the proportion of 18-24 year olds claiming for less than six months increased from 75.6% of 18-24 year old claimants in January to 79.1% in February 2015. During the same period those claiming for more then six months decreased from 24.9% to 20.9%.

PART 7: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Gloucestershire Youth Support Team on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Gloucestershire Youth Support Team is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of February 2015 there were 532 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.64%. The total number of NEET decreased by 37 young people in February 2015 compared to January 2015. Five districts saw a decrease in their NEET figures and one district stayed the same.
