INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Economic section of the County Council Chief Executive's Support Unit Research Team. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.

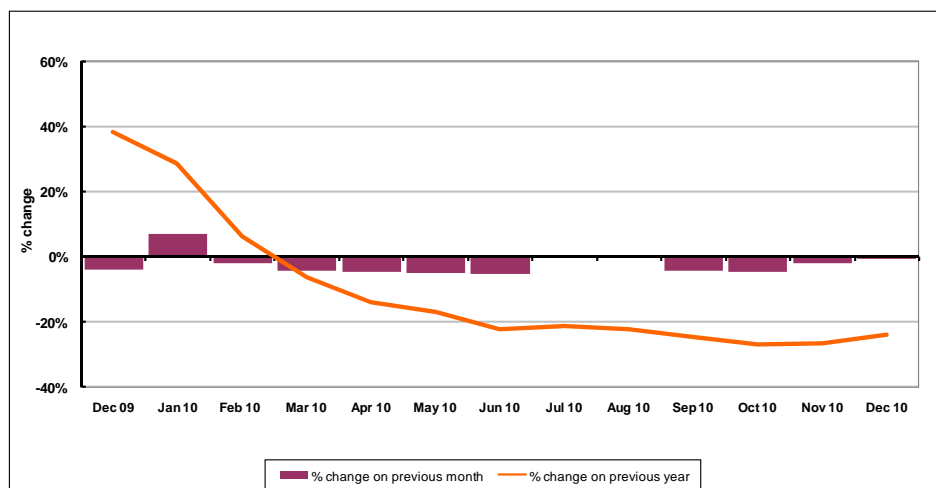
PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 2.3% in December 2010. This was the same as the November 2010 figure. The UK and South West rate also remained the same as last month at 3.5%, and 2.4% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate remains 0.1% lower than the South West average of 2.4%, and 1.2% lower than the UK average of 3.5%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in December 2010 decreased by 61 people. The amount of people claiming in December 2010 was 0.7% lower than the number in November 2010. This compares to a 1.2% increase in the South West and a 0.8% increase for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased. The count was 24.1% lower in December 2010 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

As at the end of December 2010 there were 568 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.2%.

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

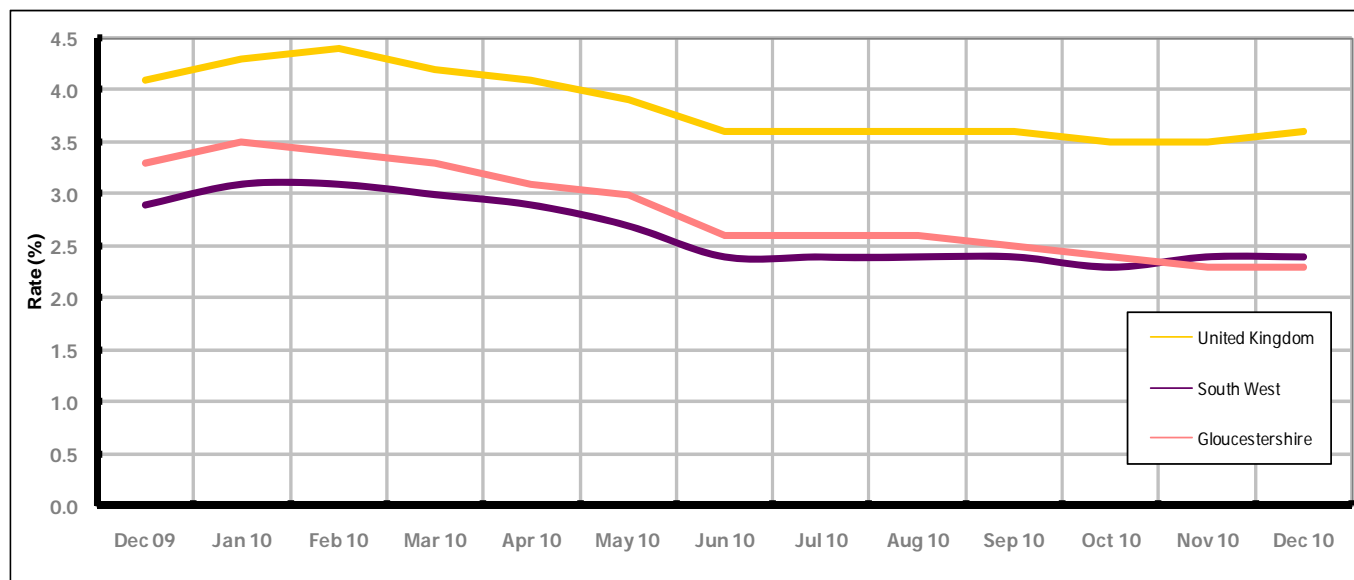


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.3% in December 2010. The rate remained higher than the South West average, until November 2010, when it fell below the South West rate, it has been persistently lower by approximately 1.2% against the UK average during the same period. The December 2010 rate remained the same as November 2010.

Table 1 shows that in December 2010, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 0.7% lower than the number in November 2010.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to December 2010 was - 2.0%. This is 1.8% lower than the UK average and 2.3% lower than the South West average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - December 2010

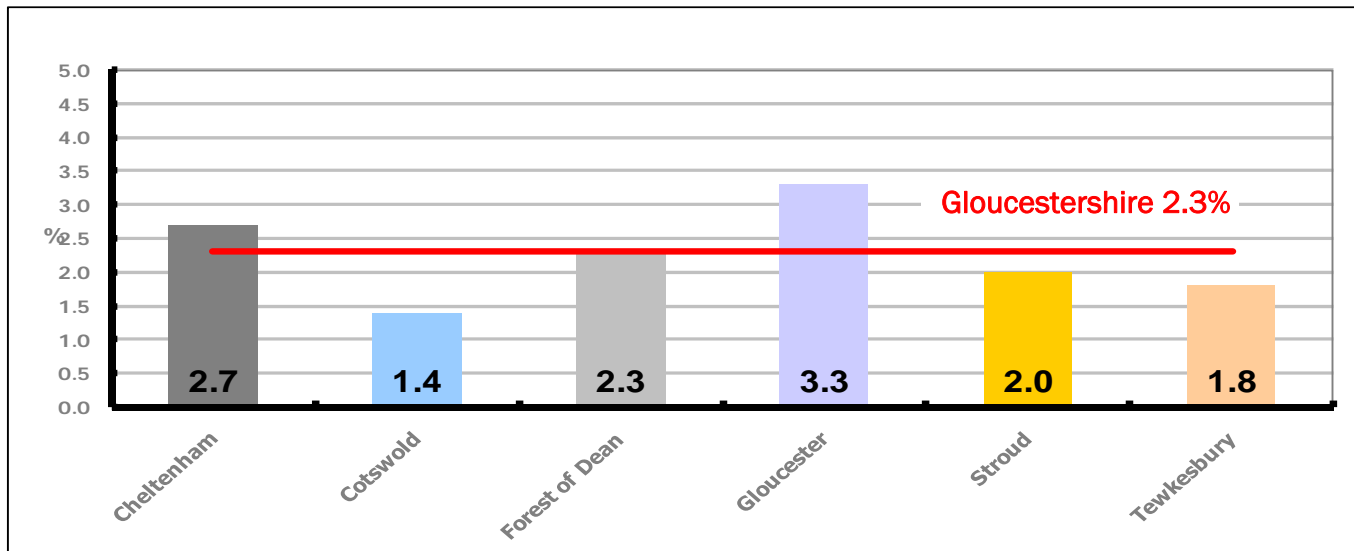

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

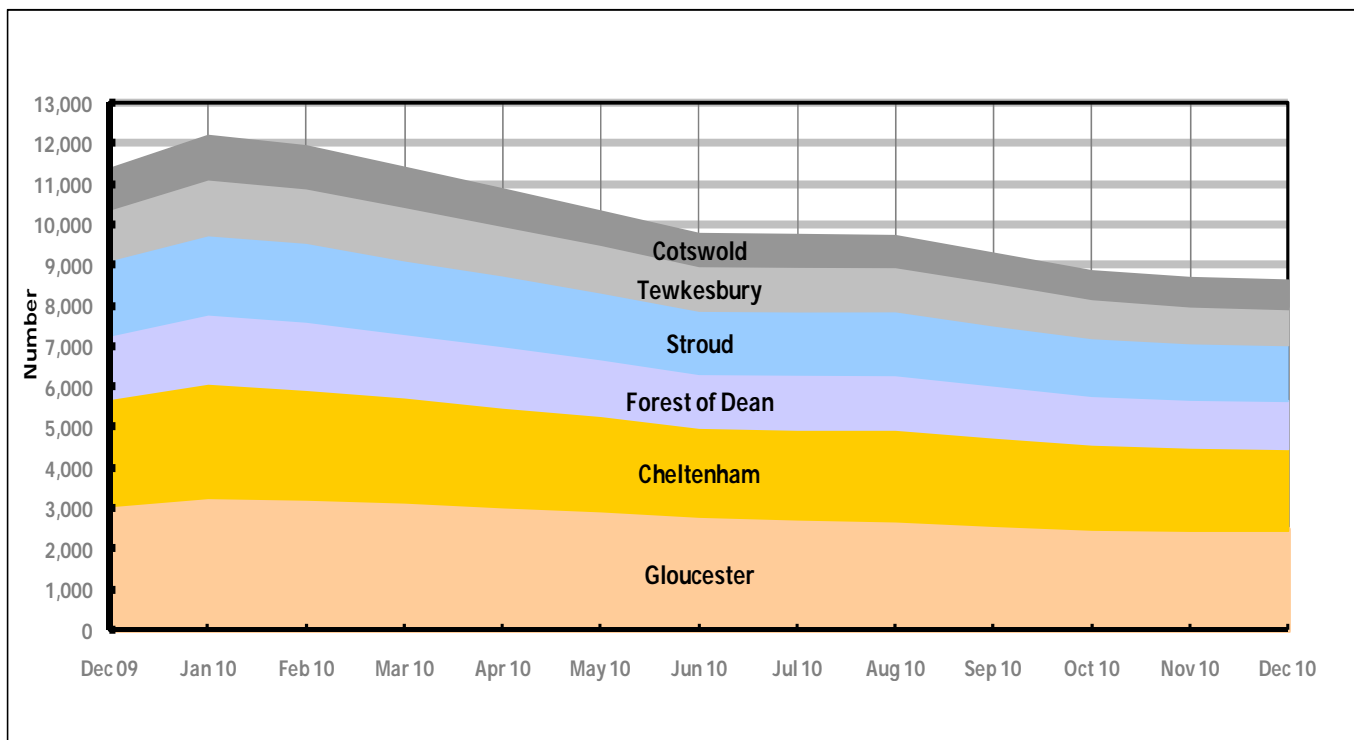

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

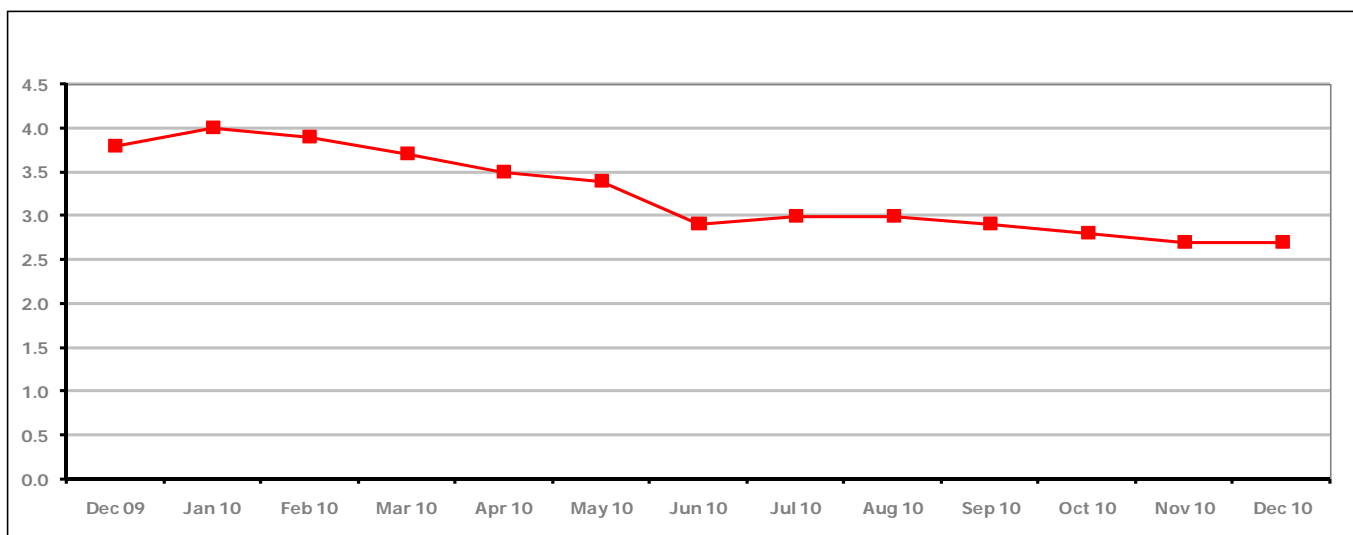


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham remained the same as last month at 2.7%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

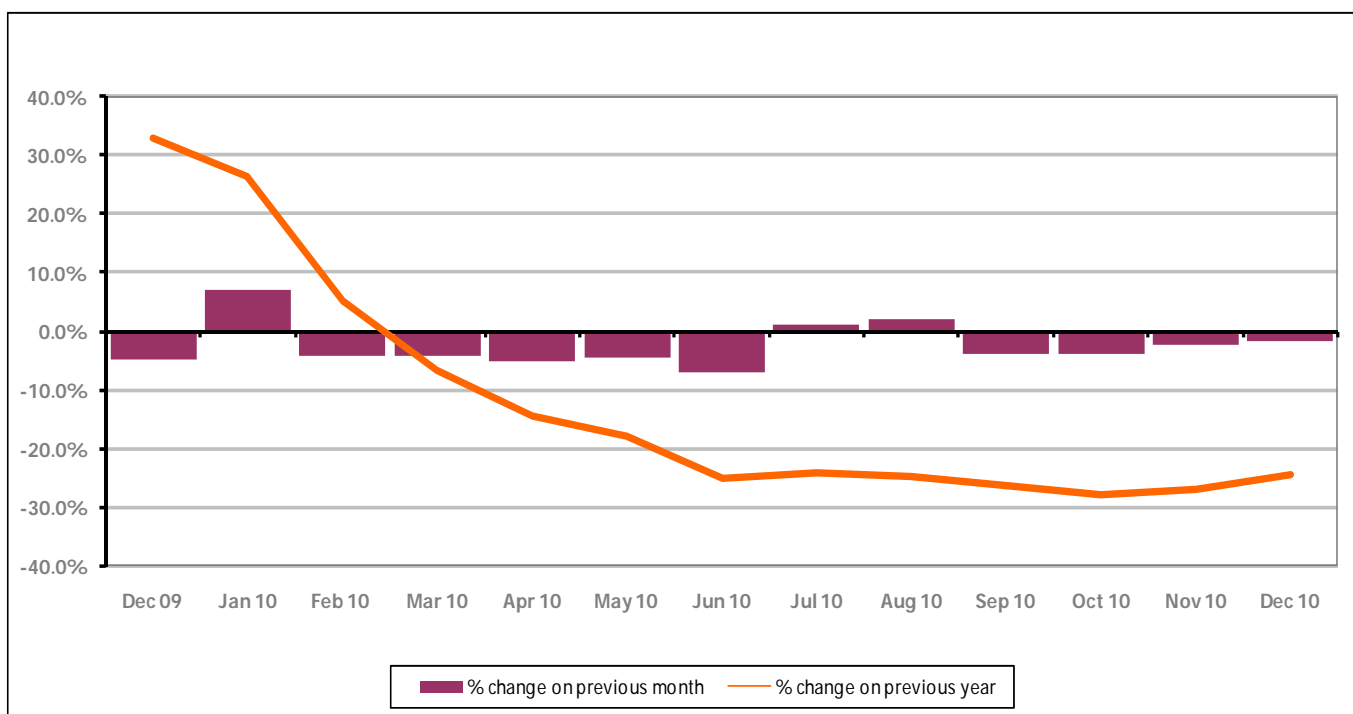


Figure 5 shows the claimant count decreased by -1.7% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased in December 2010 compared to November 2010 to -24.5%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - December 2010

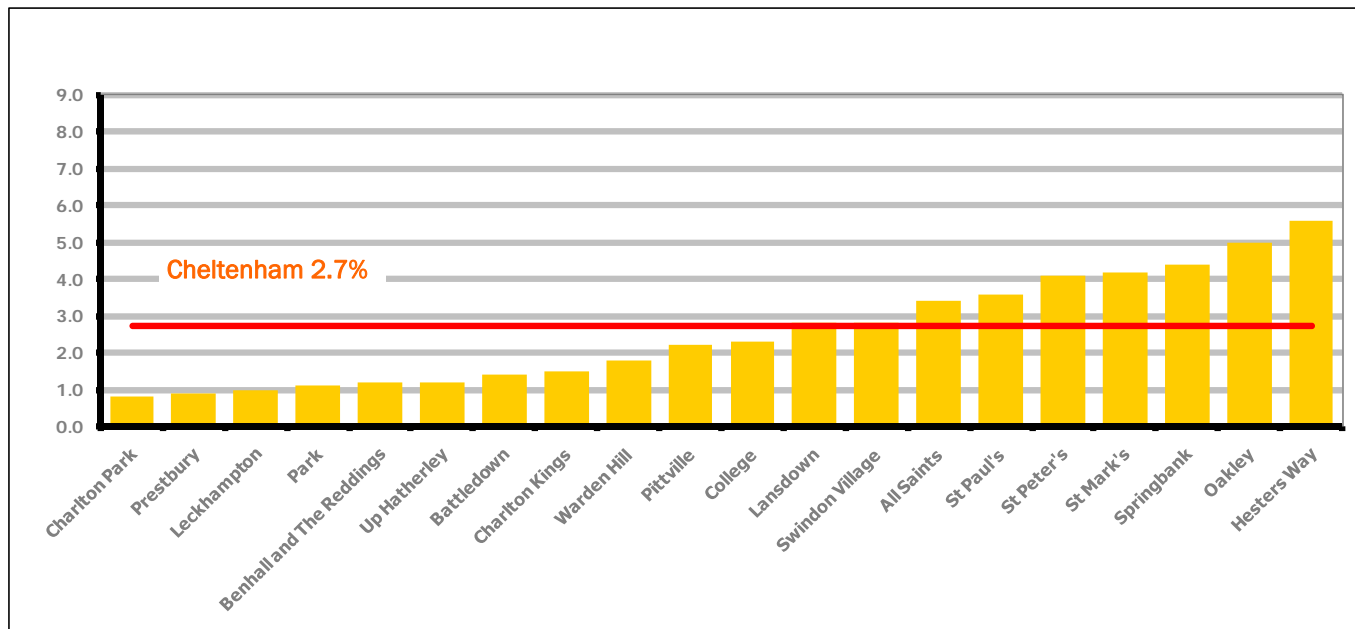
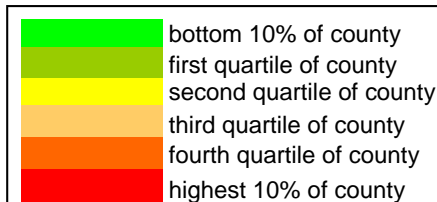

Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year

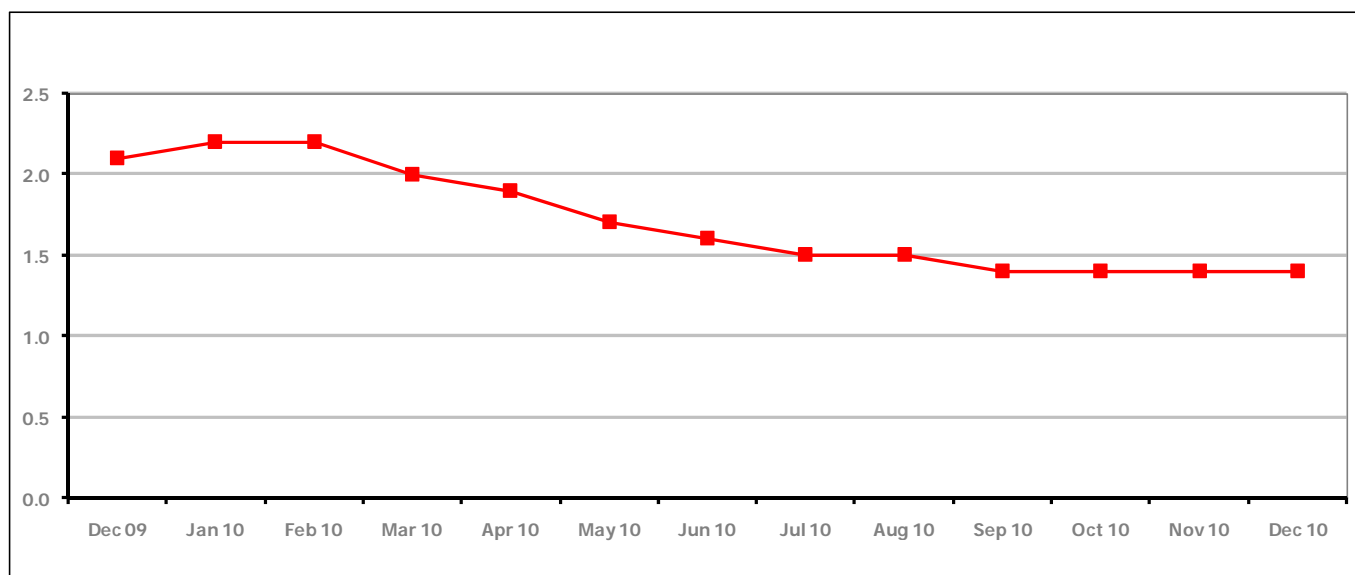


Figure 7 shows the claimant rate in Cotswold District remained the same as the last three months at 1.4%.

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

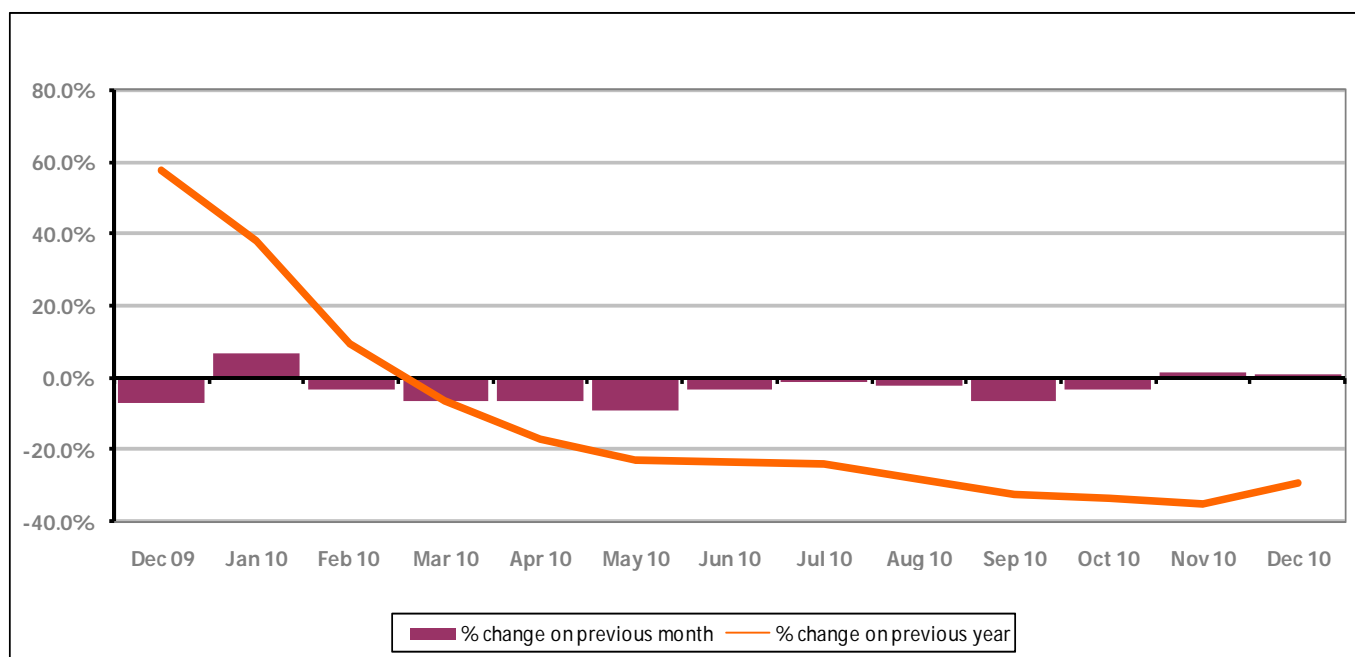


Figure 8 shows the claimant count increased by 1.1% since November 2010. The change on the previous year has increased from November 2010 to December 2010 to -29.4%.

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - December 2010

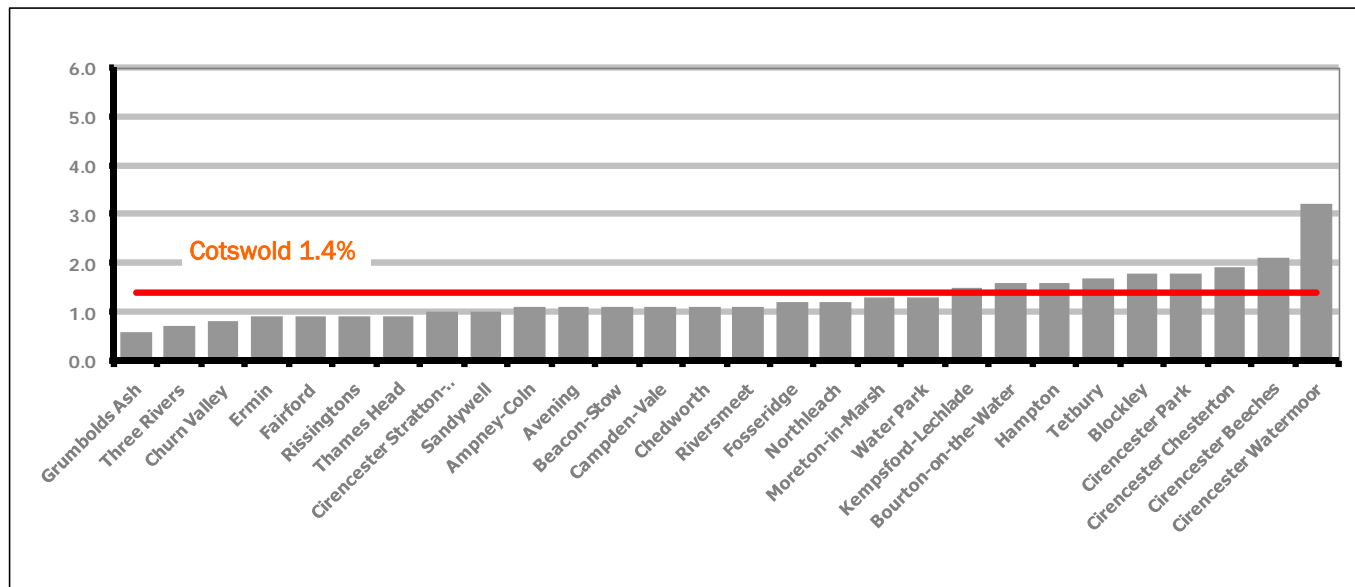
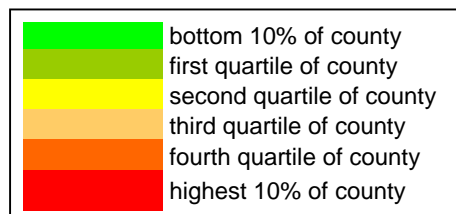


Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.4%. Nine wards lie above the average.

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

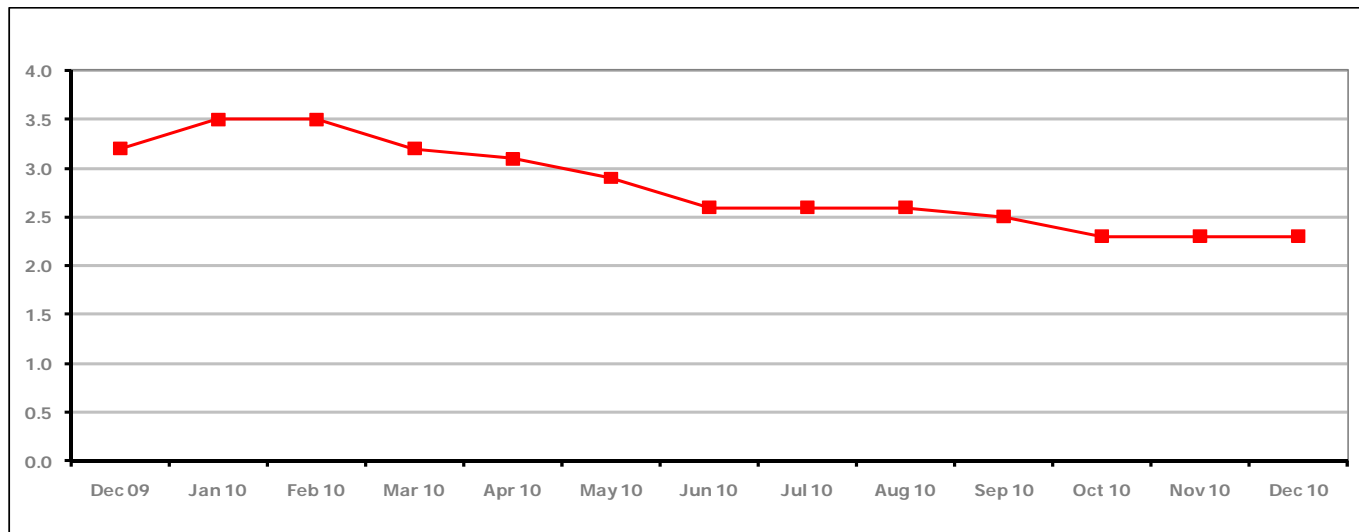

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

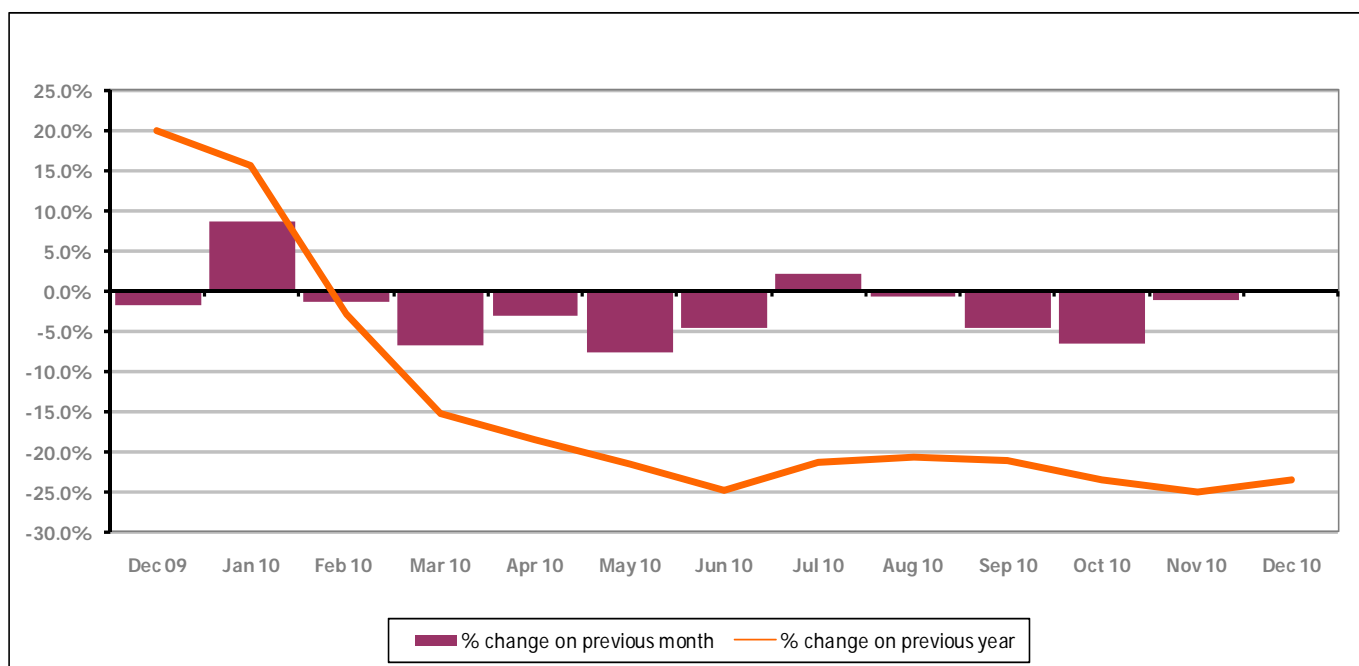


Figure 11 shows the claimant count increased by 0.2% since November 2010. The change on the previous year increased between November and December 2010 to -23.5%.

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - December 2010

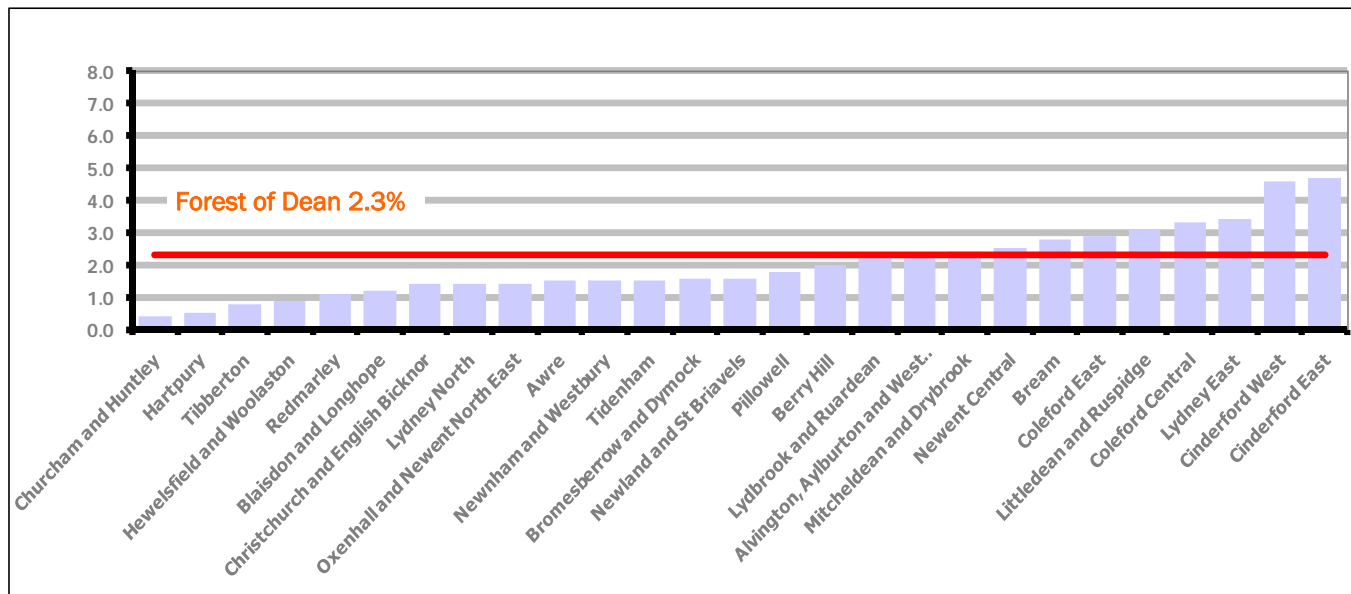

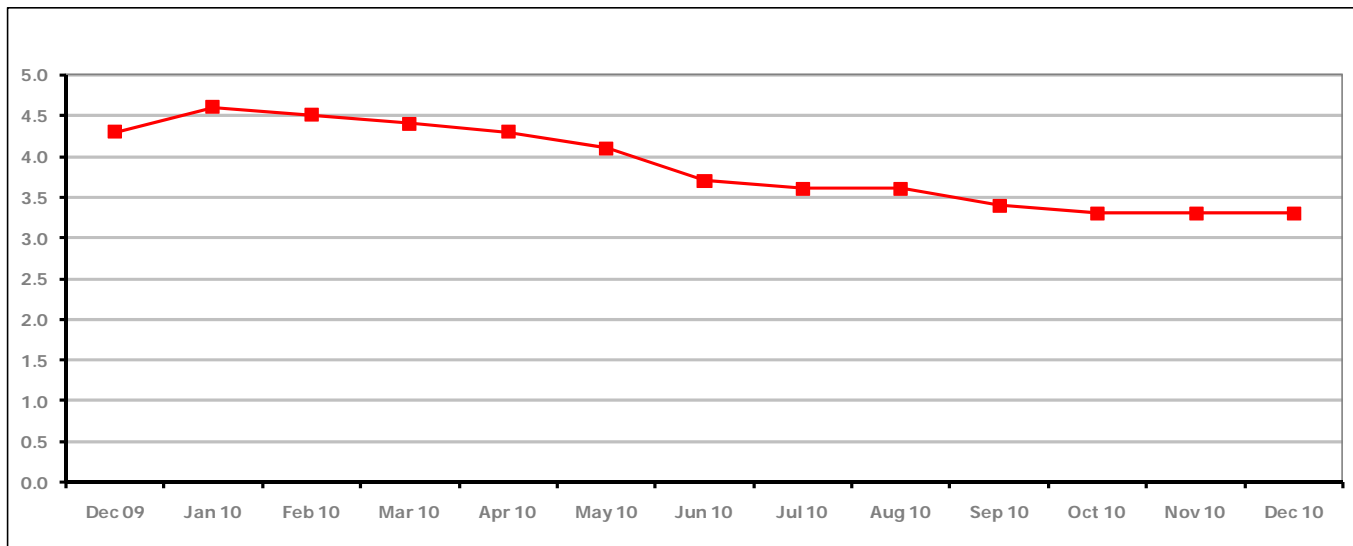

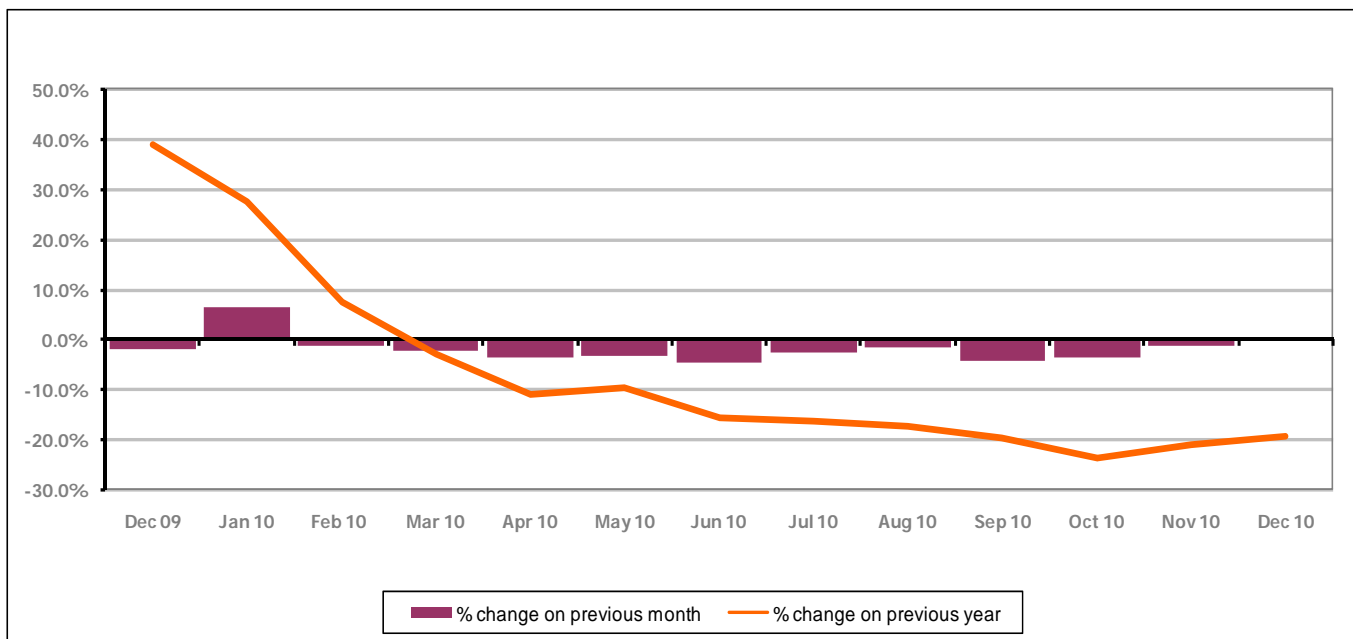
Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - December 2010

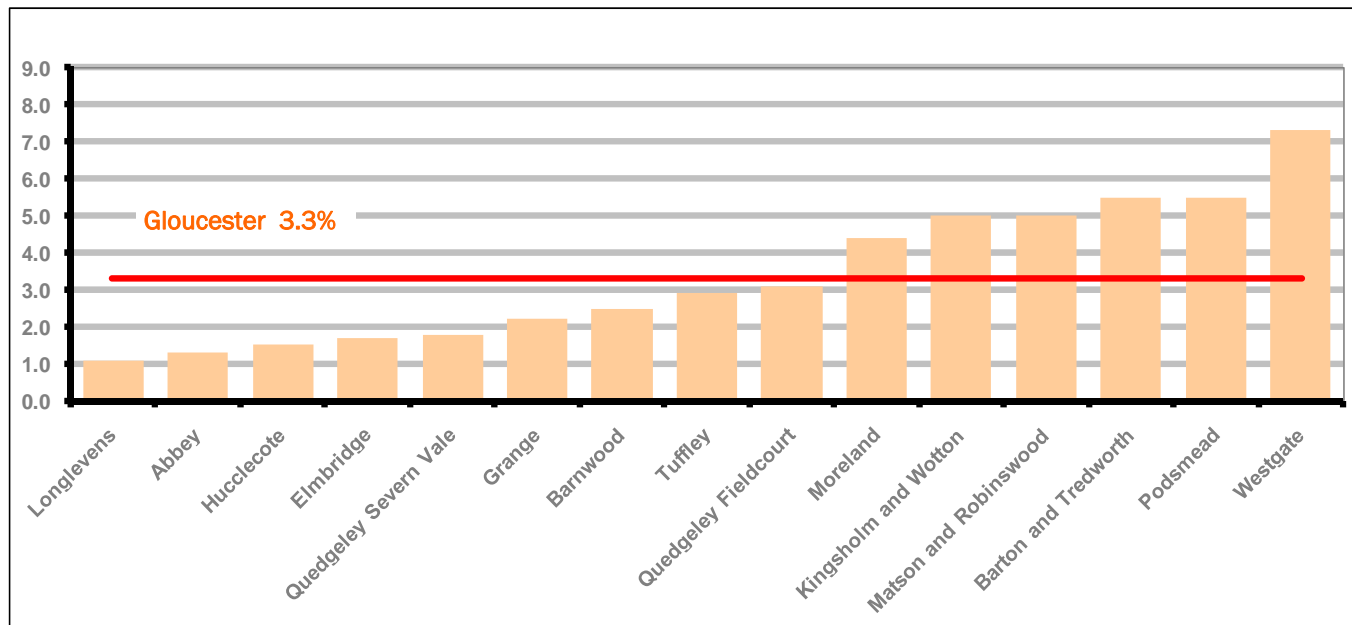
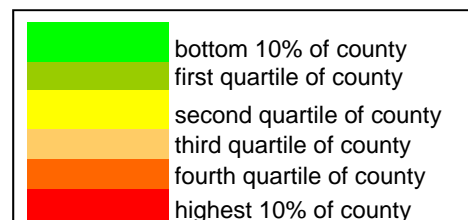


Figure 15 shows the claimant rates for Gloucester City district wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the City of 3.3%. Six wards lie above the average.

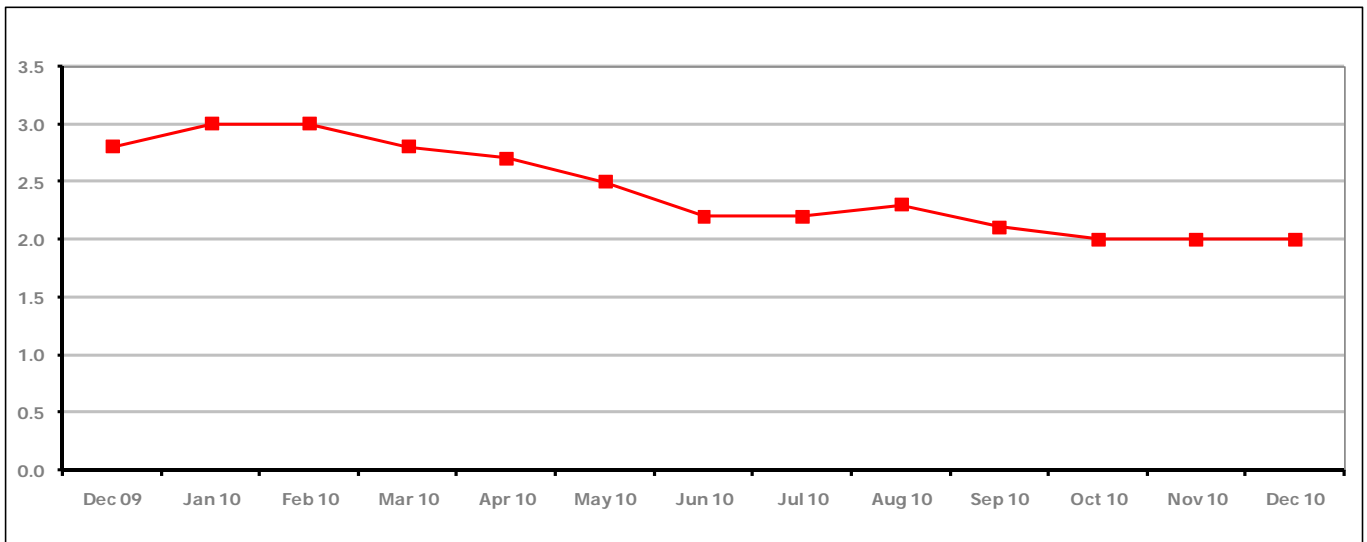

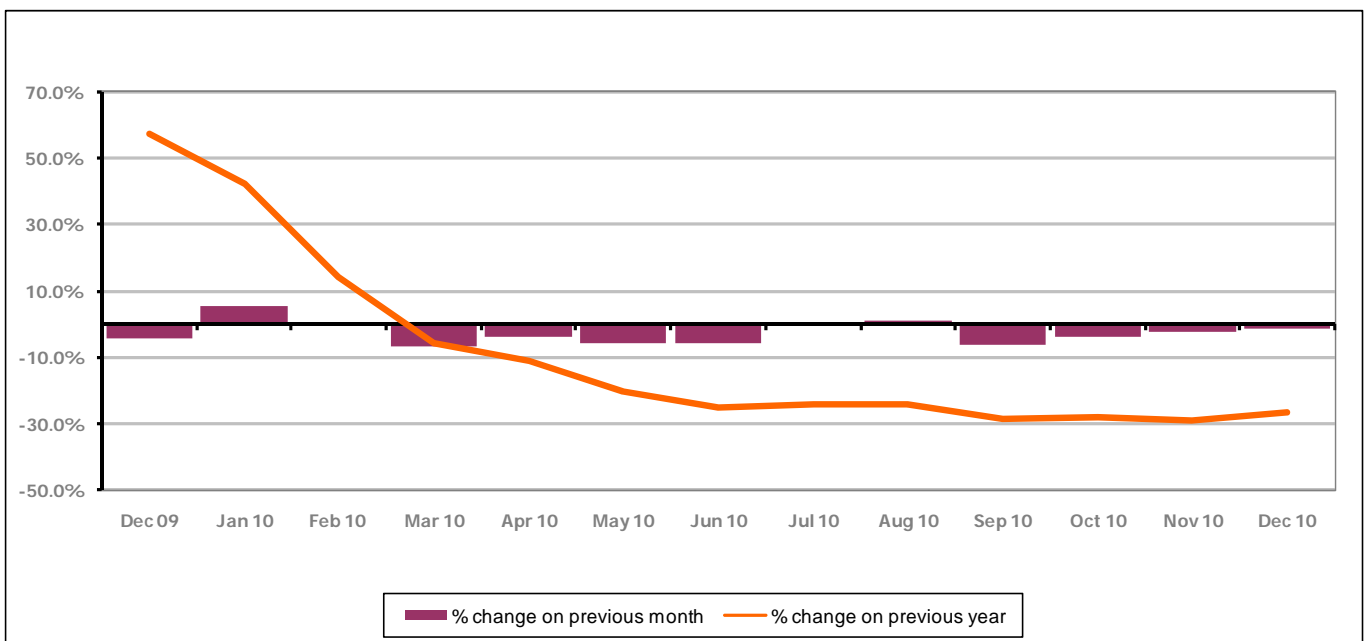
Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - December 2010

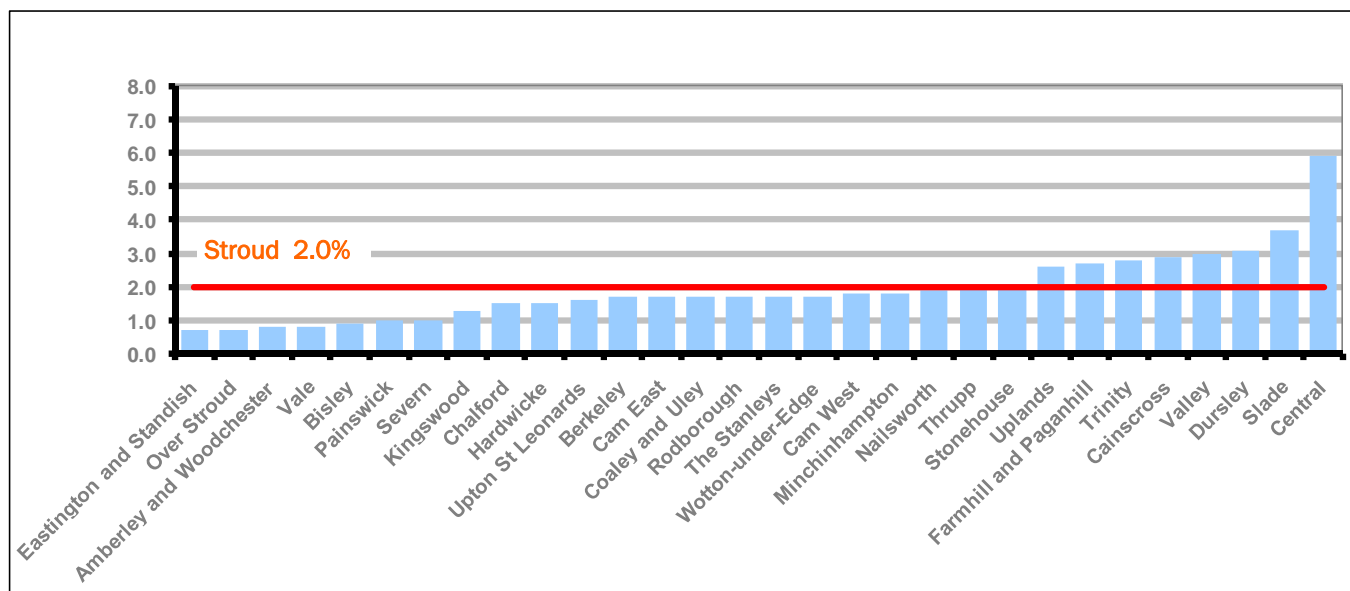
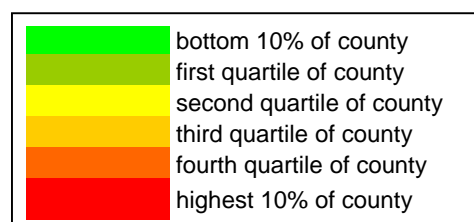

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year

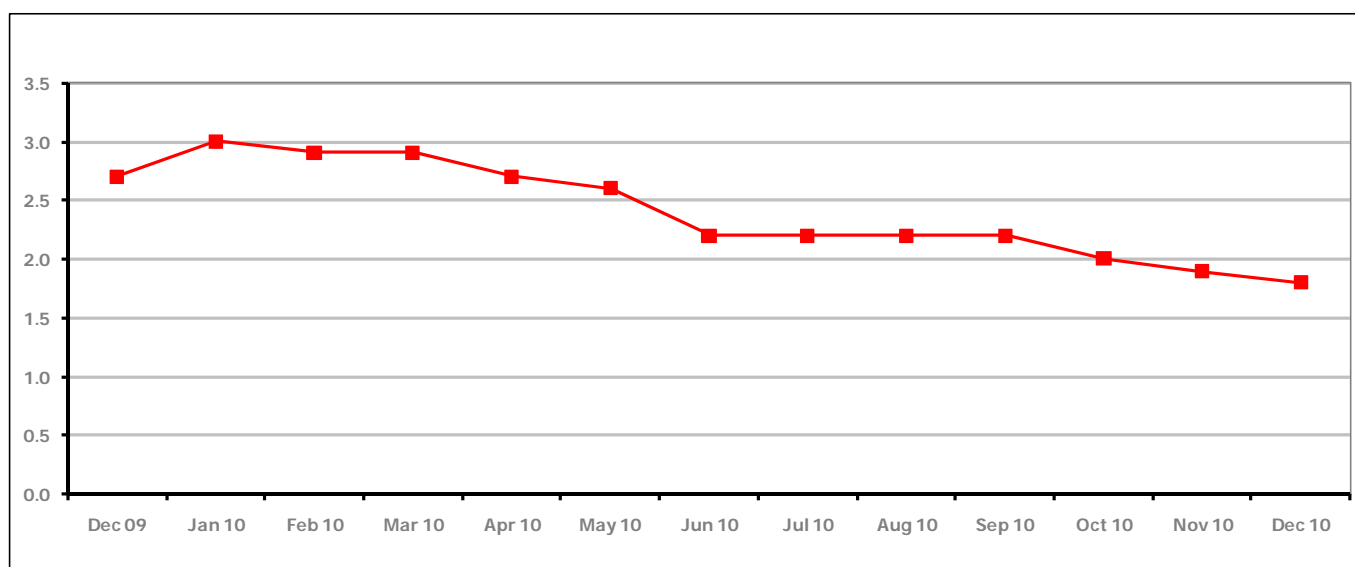

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

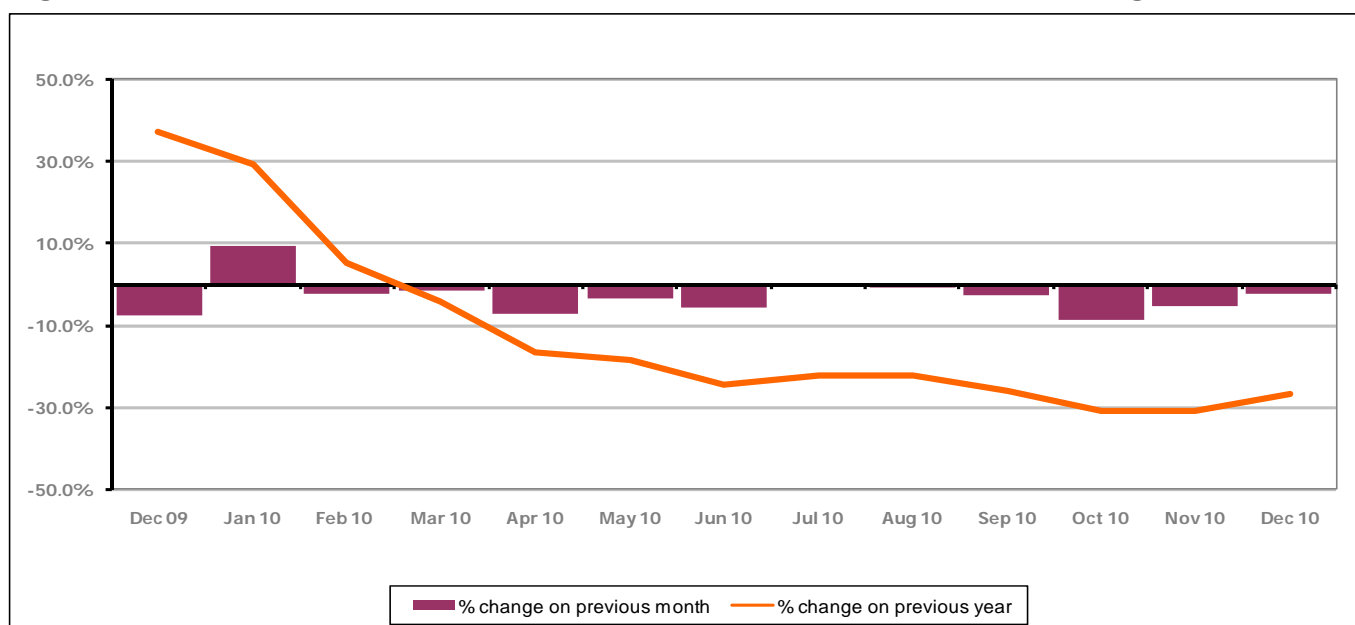

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - December 2010

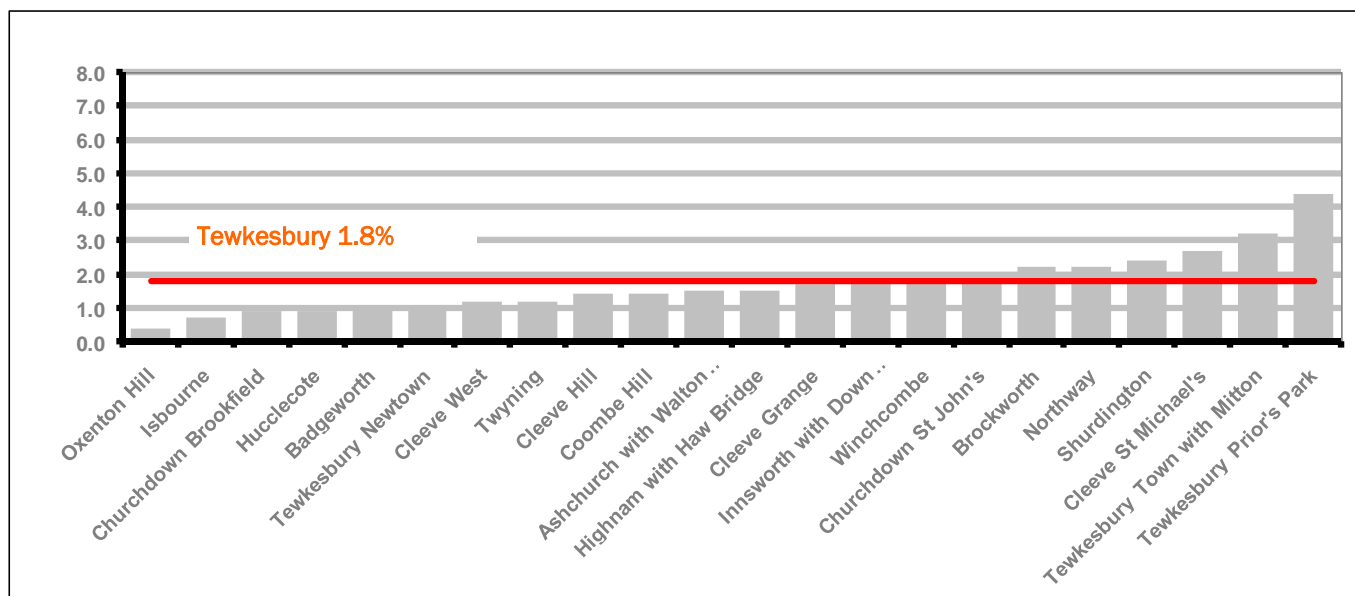
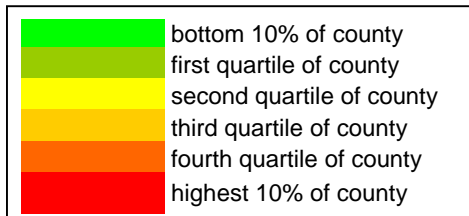

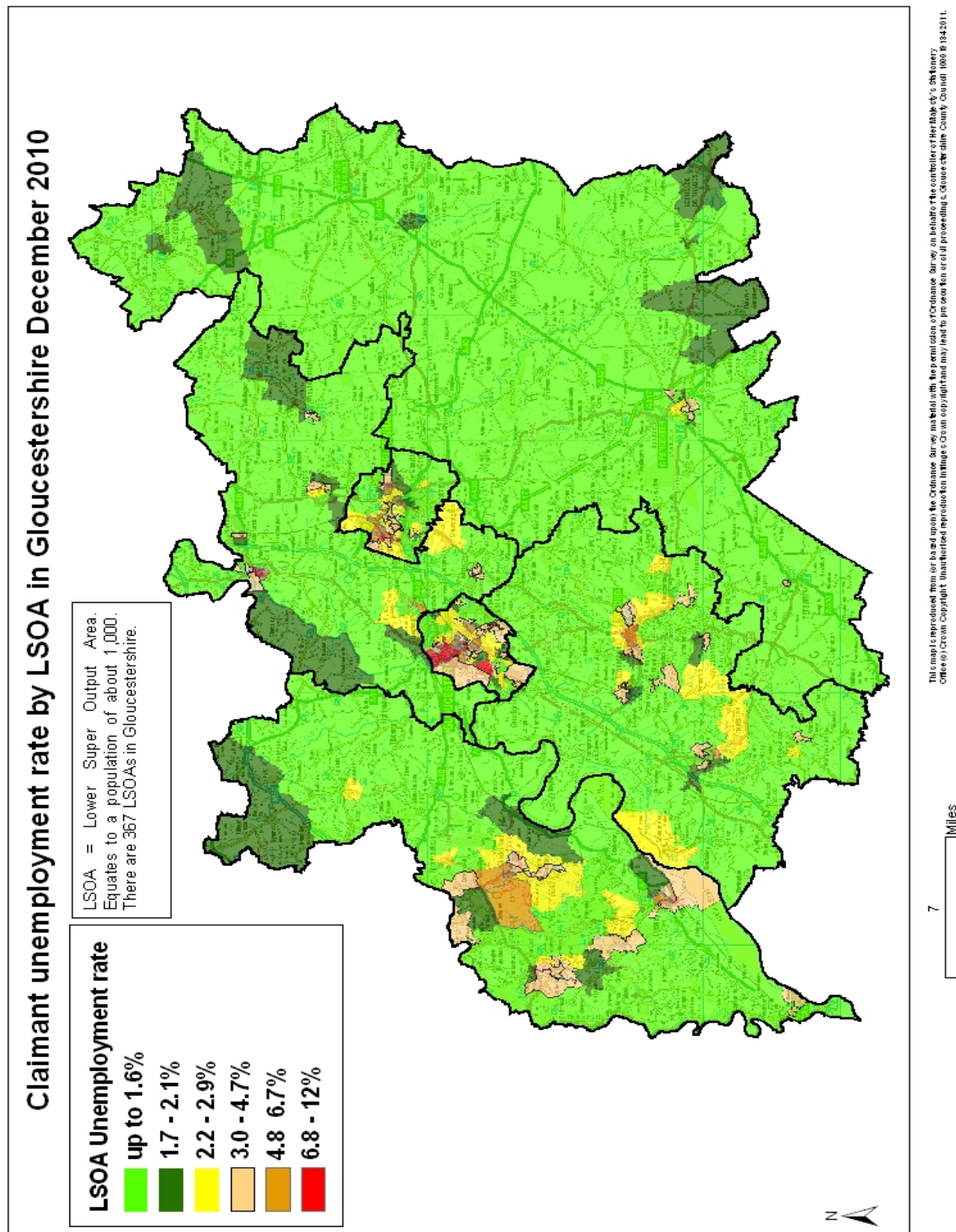

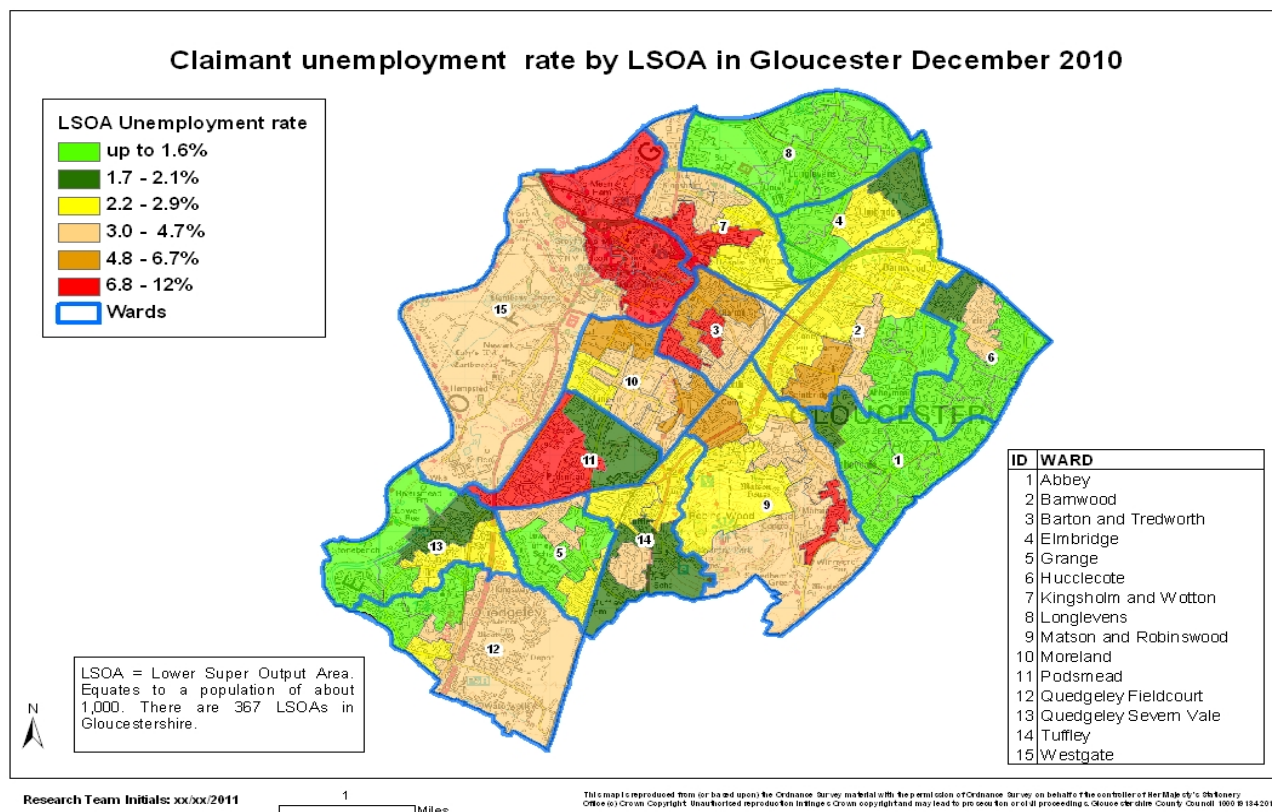
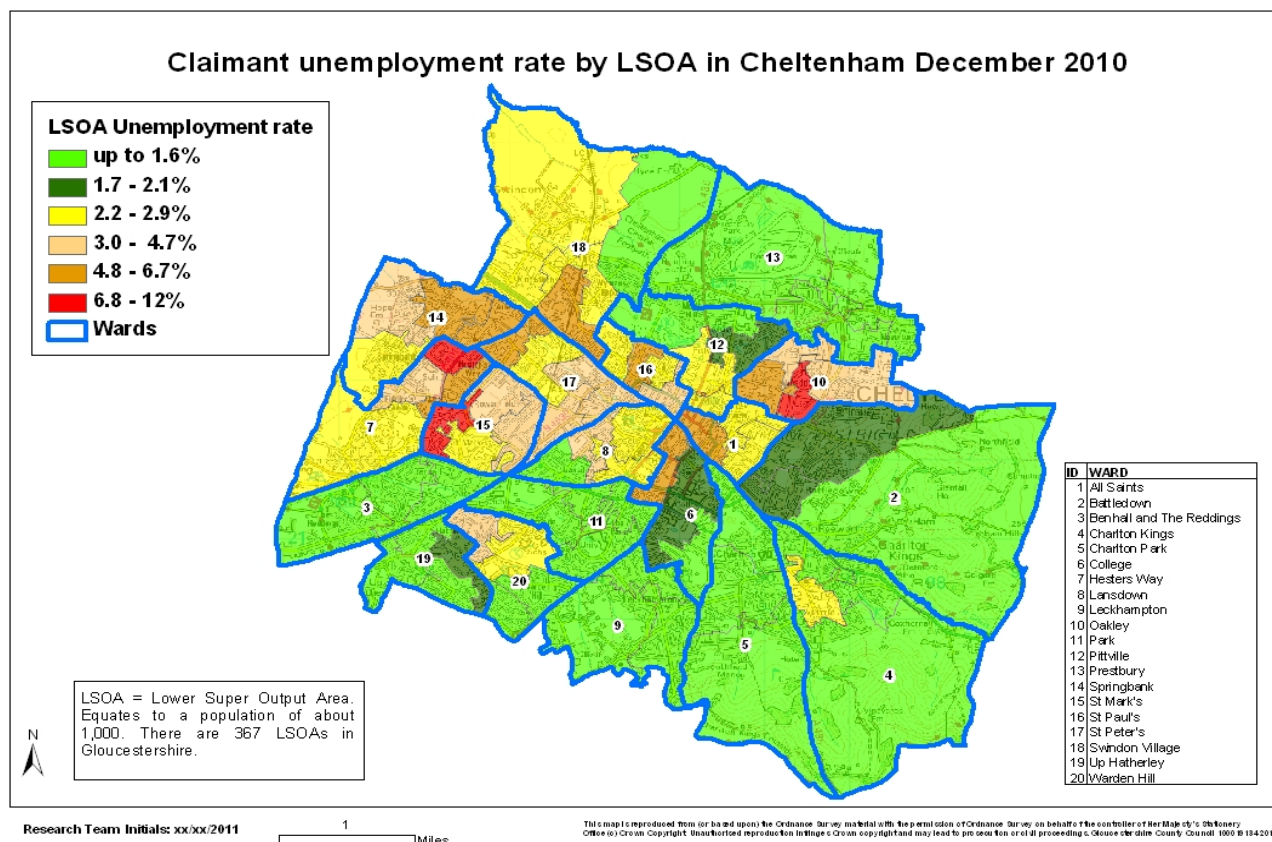

PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

As at the end of December 2010 there were 568 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.2%. The total number of NEET fell by 37 young people in December 2010 compared to November 2010. 4 Districts saw a decrease in their NEET figure, 1 saw an increase and 1 stayed the same.
