

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (KINGSCOTE)
ORDER 2009

The Gloucestershire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under section 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part II and IV of Schedule 9 of the Act and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of that Schedule hereby make the following Order:

1. (i) This Order shall come into operation on the *3rd November* 2009 and may be cited as the "Gloucestershire County Council, (50 mph Speed Limit) (Kingscote) Order 2009.
- (ii) This Order affects the road detailed in the Schedule annexed hereto within the Parish of Kingscote in the Cotswold District in the County of Gloucestershire.

2. In this Order:-

"Motor Vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on the roads as defined in section 185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

3. No person shall cause or permit any Motor Vehicle to proceed in that length of road described in the Schedule to this Order at a speed exceeding 50 mph.

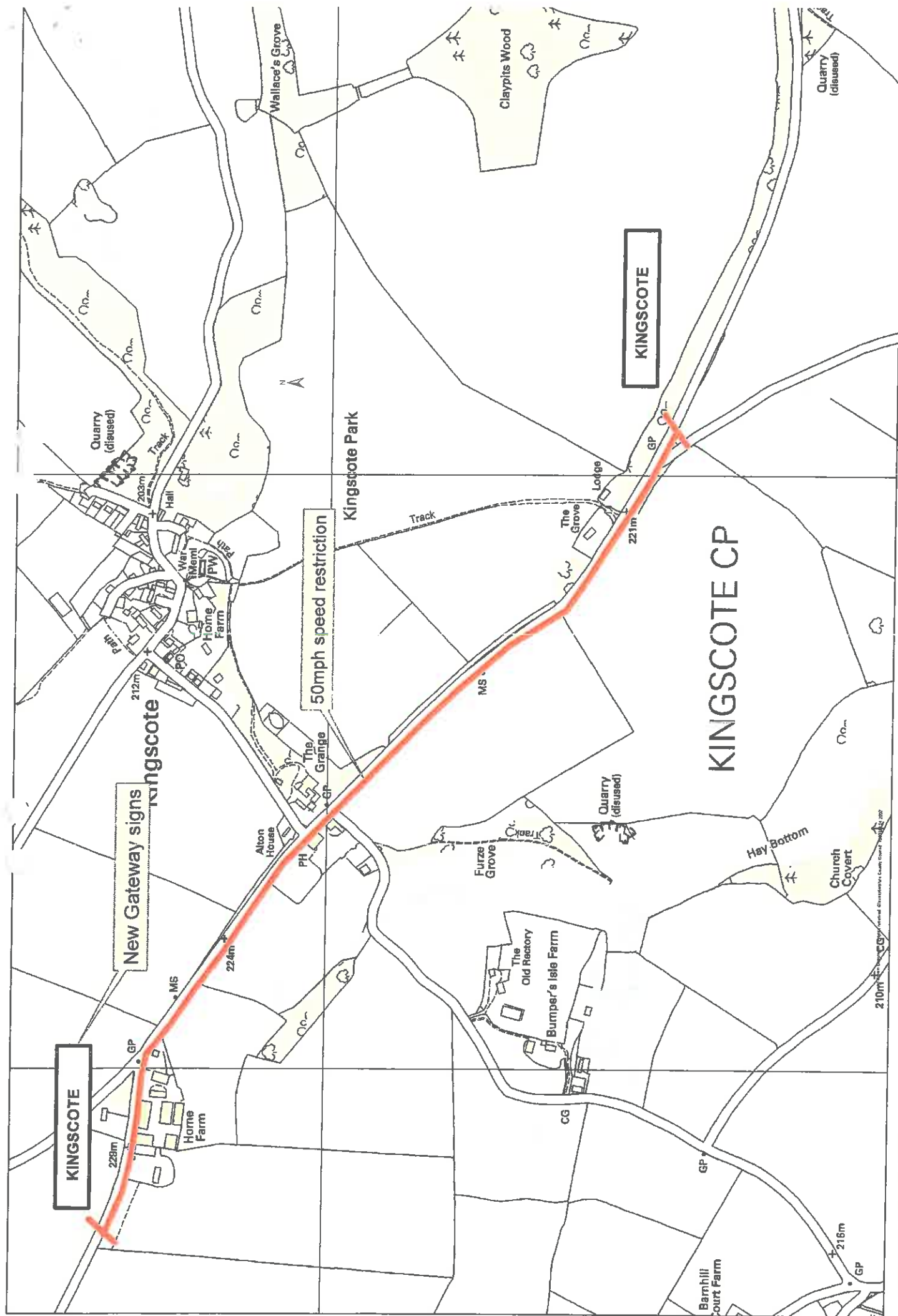
