## INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Economic section of the County Council Chief Executive's Support Unit Research Team. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis ([www.nomis.co.uk](http://www.nomis.co.uk)).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.

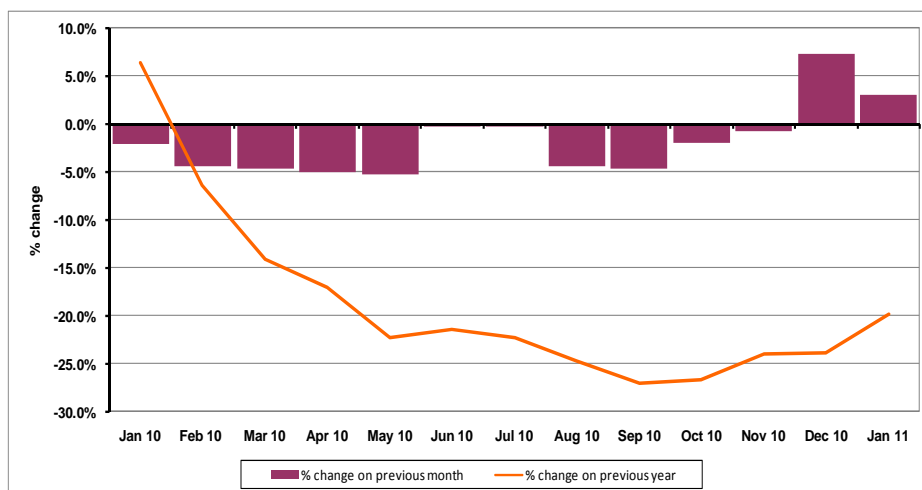
## PART 1: SUMMARY

**The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 2.6% in February 2011.** This was an increase of 0.1% on the January 2011 figure. The UK and South West rate also increased to 3.8%, and 2.7% respectively. Gloucestershire's rate remains 0.1% lower than the South West average of 2.7%, and 1.2% lower than the UK average of 3.8%.

**The claimant count in Gloucestershire in February 2011 increased by 283 people.** The amount of people claiming in February 2011 was 3.0% higher than the number in January 2011. This compares to a 4.1% increase in the South West and a 2.2% increase for the UK.

**The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased.** The count was 19.9% lower in February 2011 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

## YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

As at the end of February 2011 there were 612 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.7%.

### Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

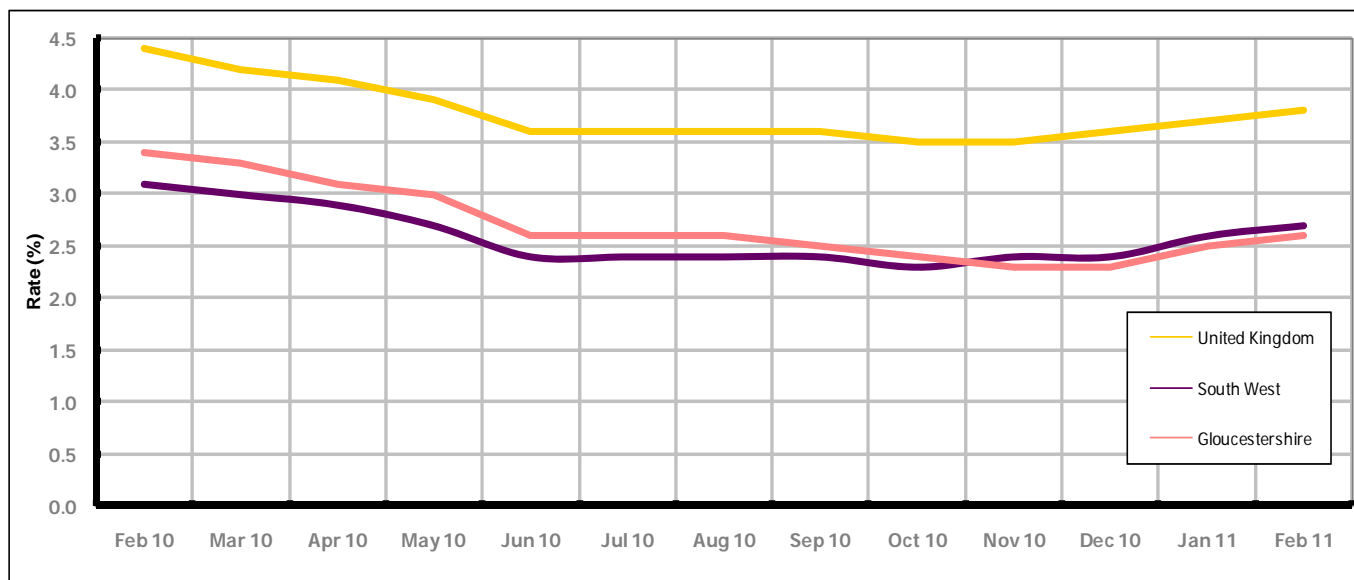


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.6% in February 2011. The rate remained higher than the South West average, until November 2010, when it fell below the South West rate, it has been persistently lower by approximately 1.2% against the UK average during the same period. The February 2011 rate represented a 0.1% increase on January 2011.

Table 1 shows that in February 2011, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 3.0% higher than the number in January 2011.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to February 2011 was + 0.5%. This is 0.6% lower than the UK average and 1.7% lower than the South West average.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - February 2011

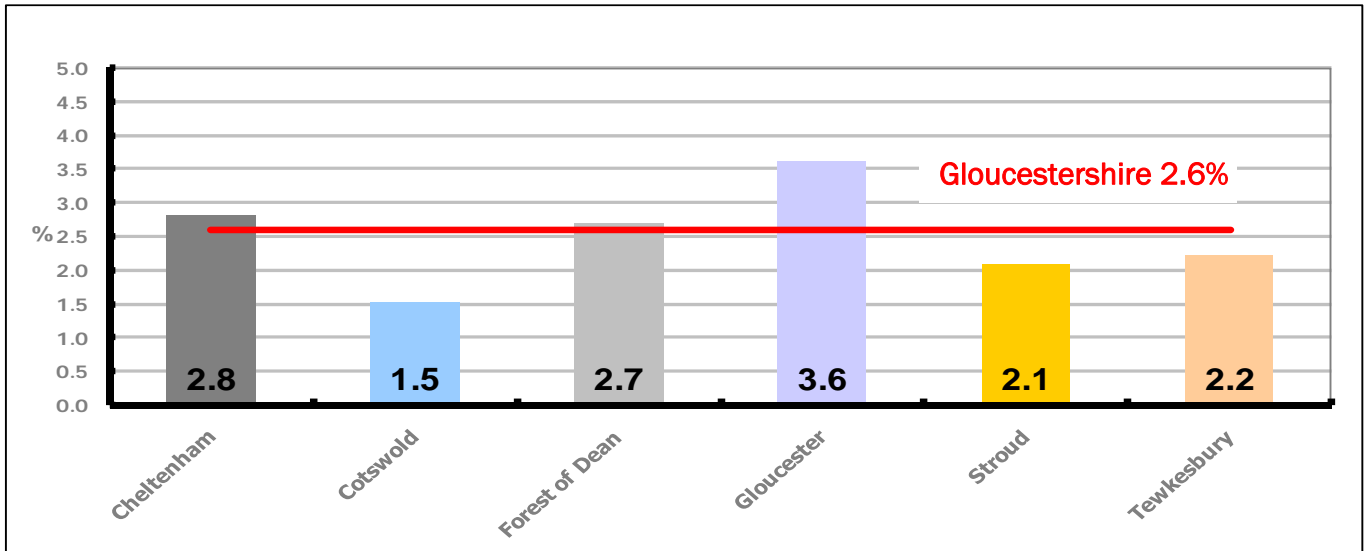

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

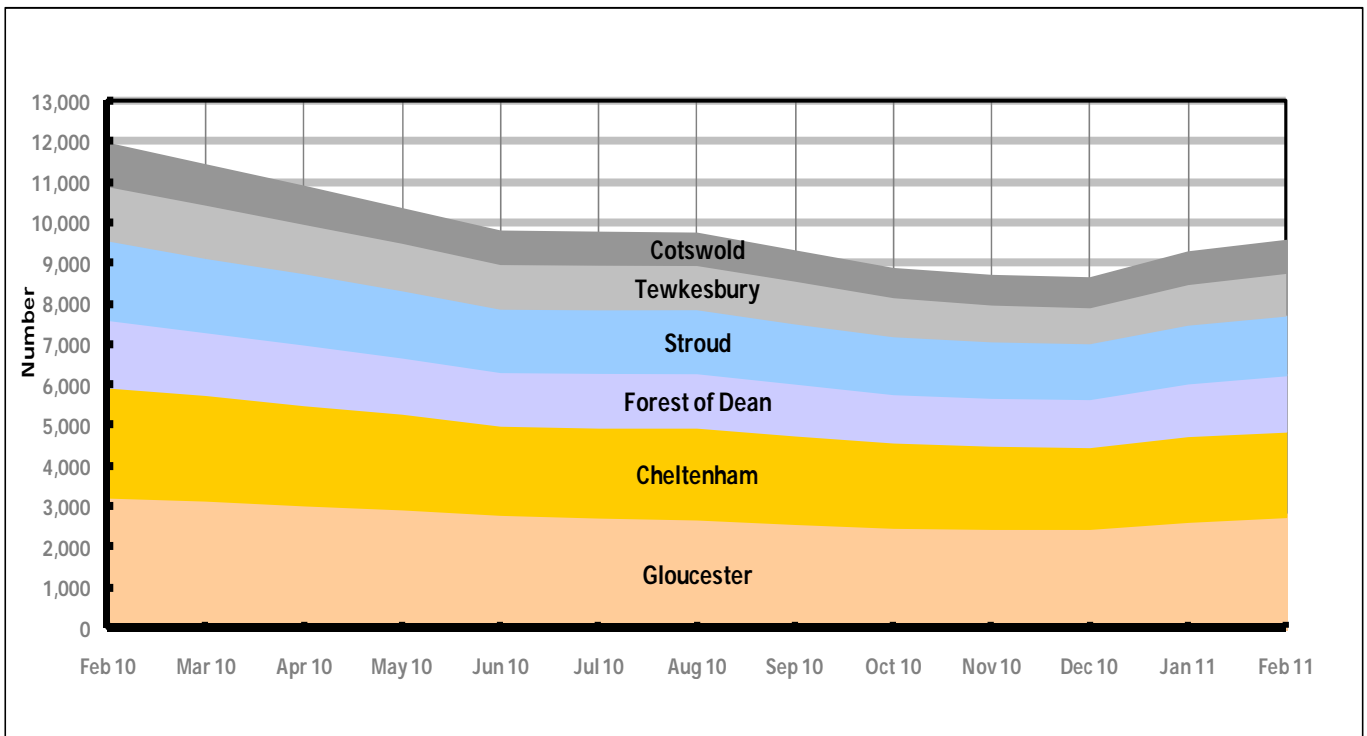

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

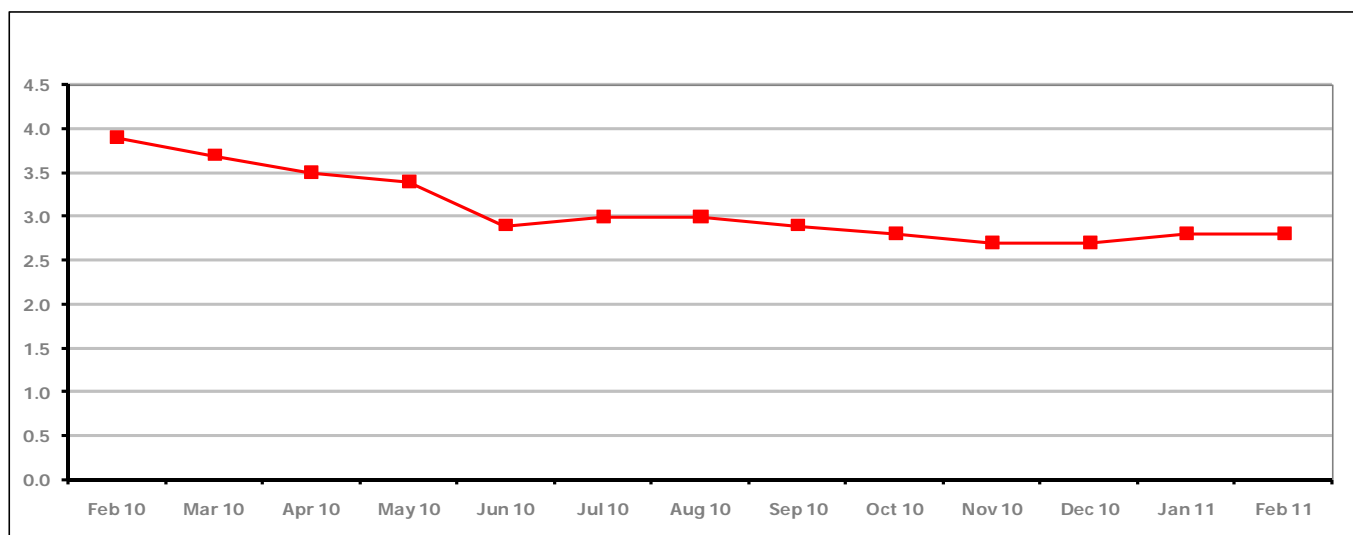


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham remained the same as last month at 2.8%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

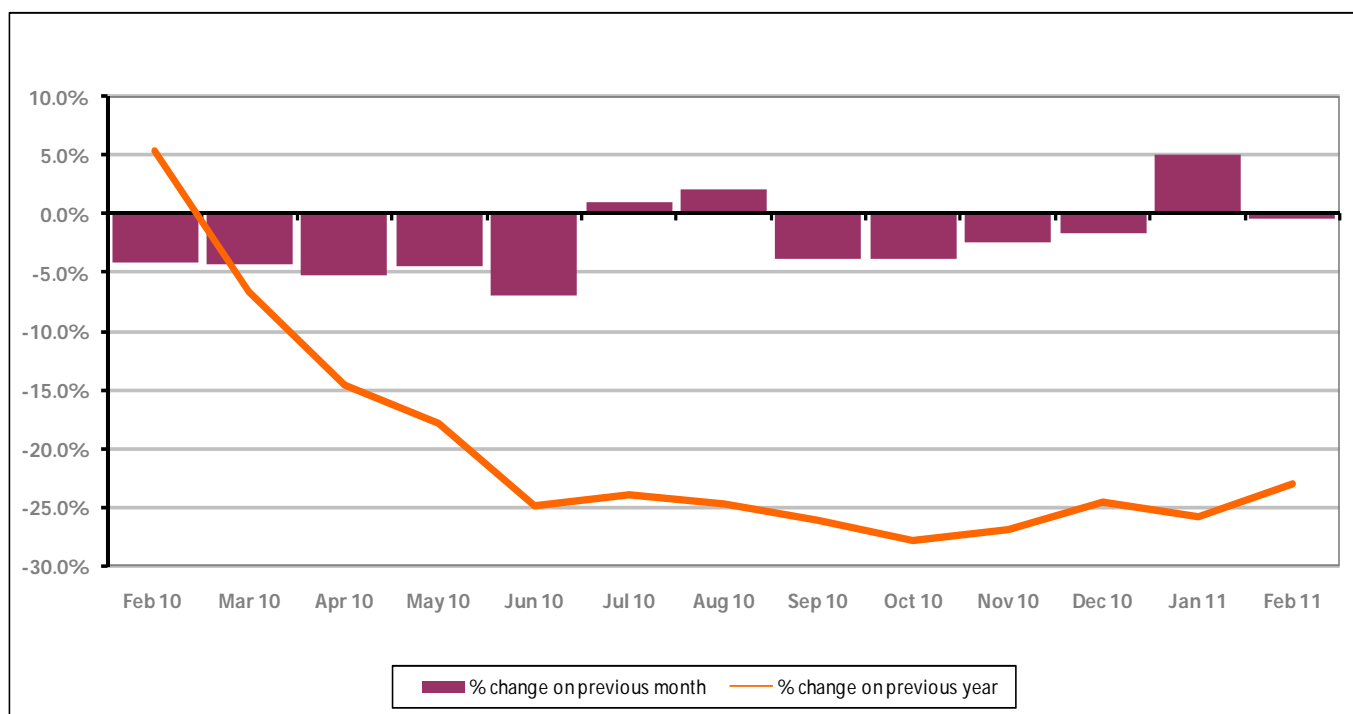


Figure 5 shows the claimant count decreased by -0.4% since last month. The change on the previous year has increased in February 2011 compared to January 2011 to -22.9%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - February 2011

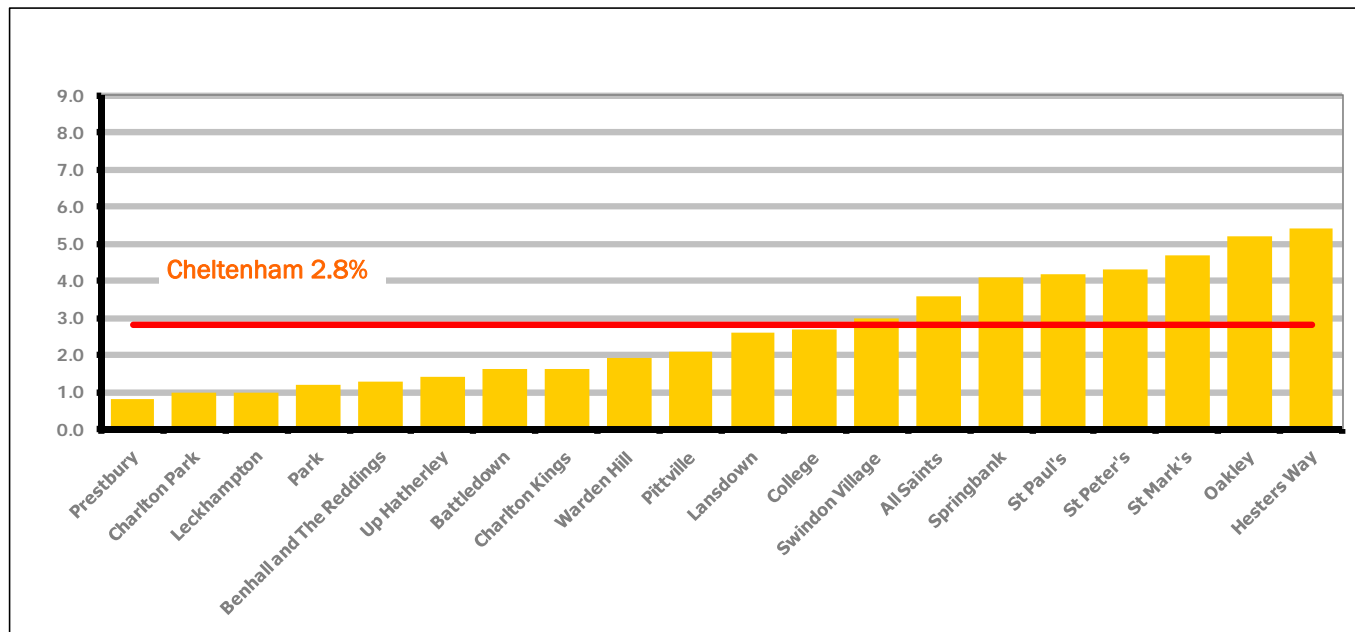
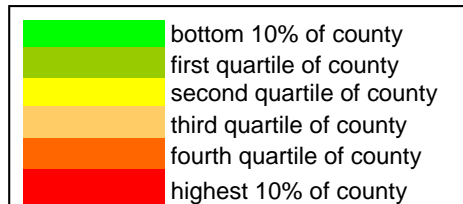

Figure 7: Cotswold District claimant rate over the last year

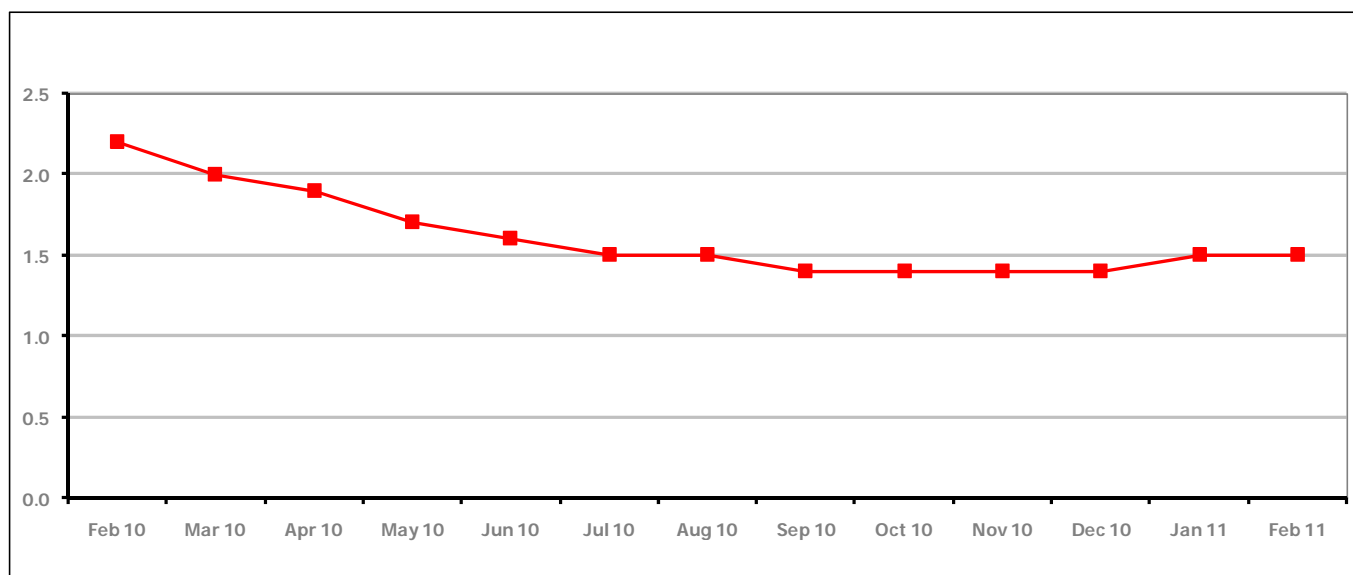

Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

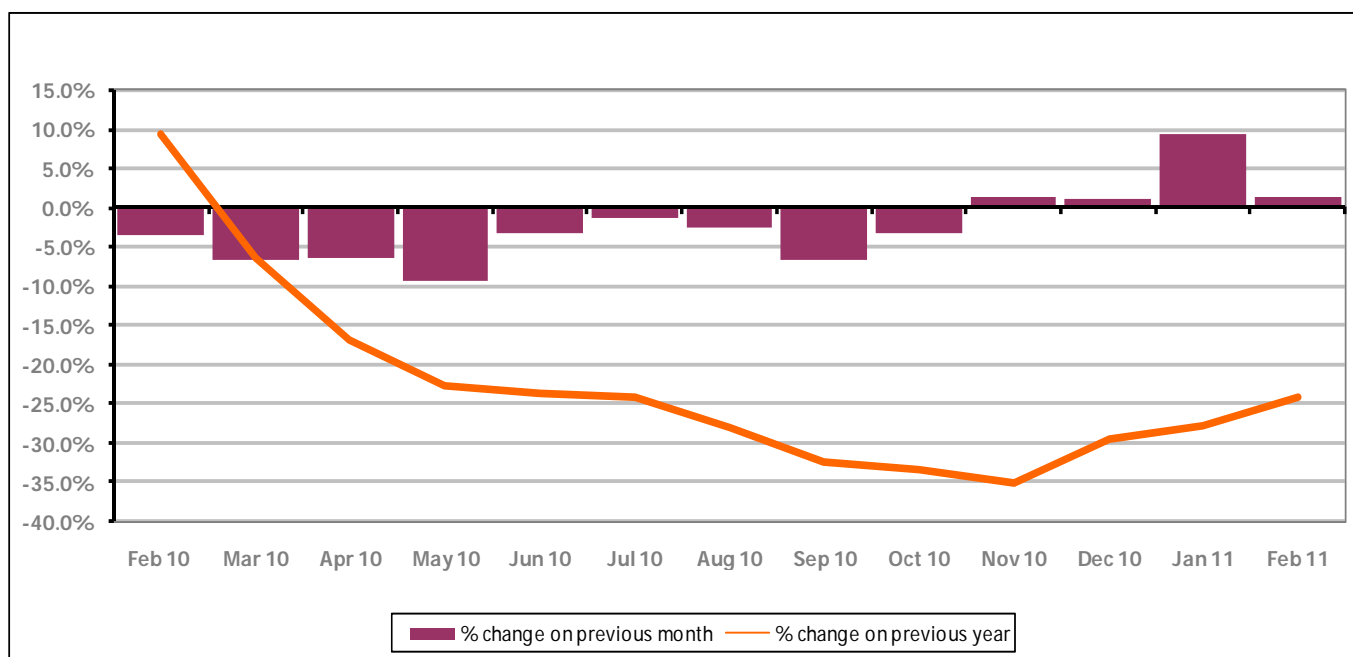


Figure 8 shows the claimant count increased by 1.3% since January 2011. The change on the previous year has increased from January 2011 to February 2011 to -24.3%.

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - February 2011

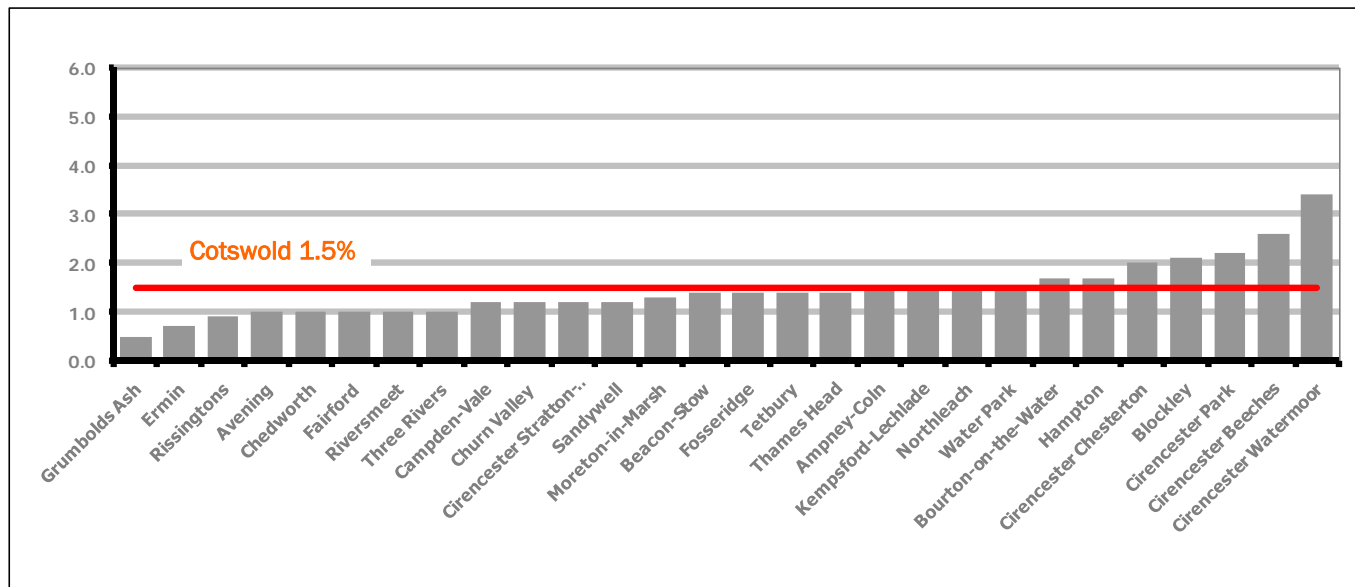
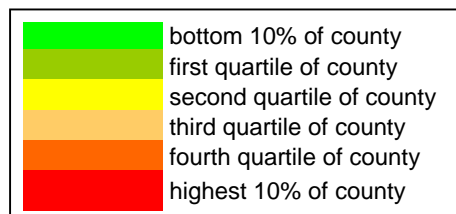

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

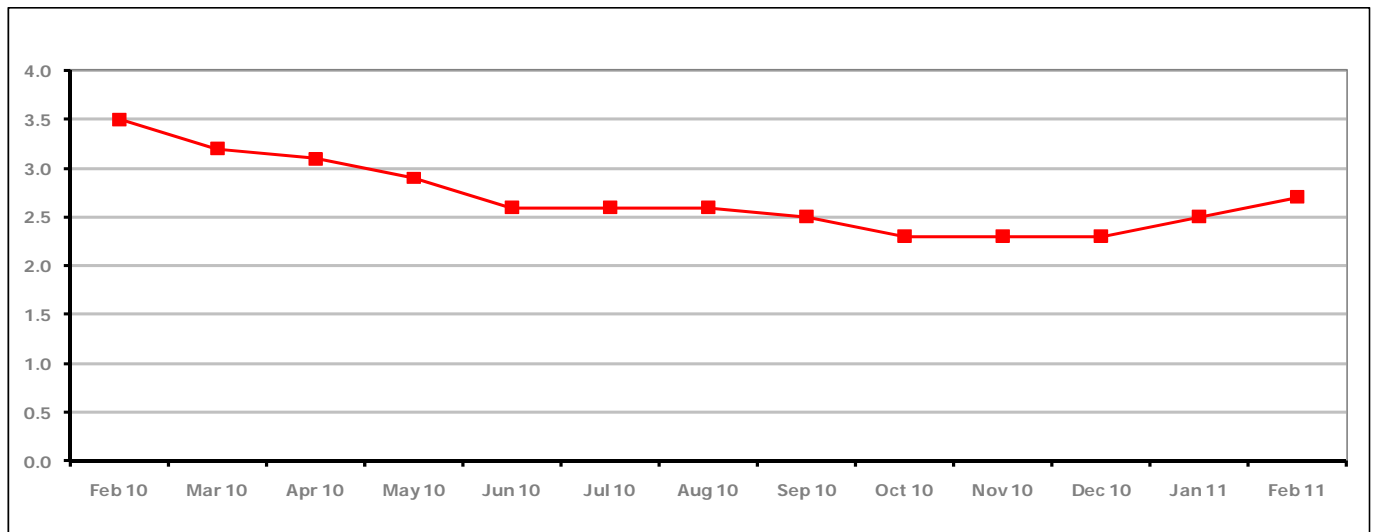

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

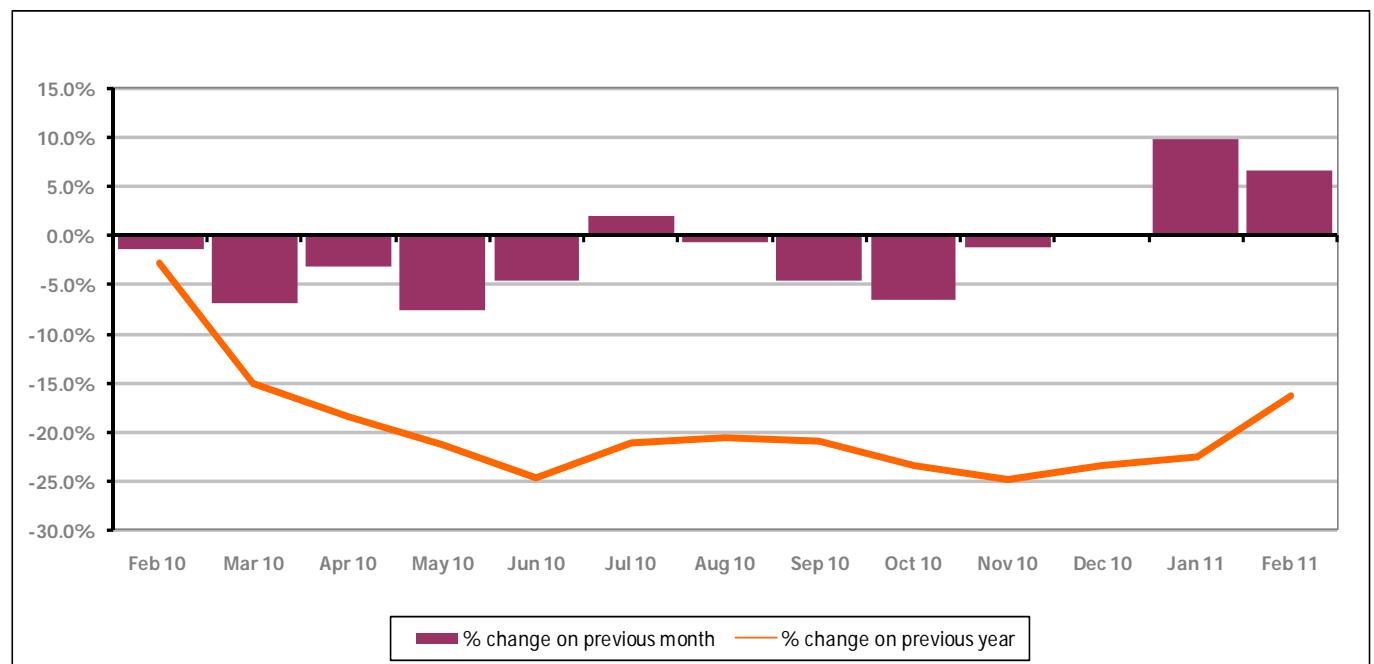

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - February 2011

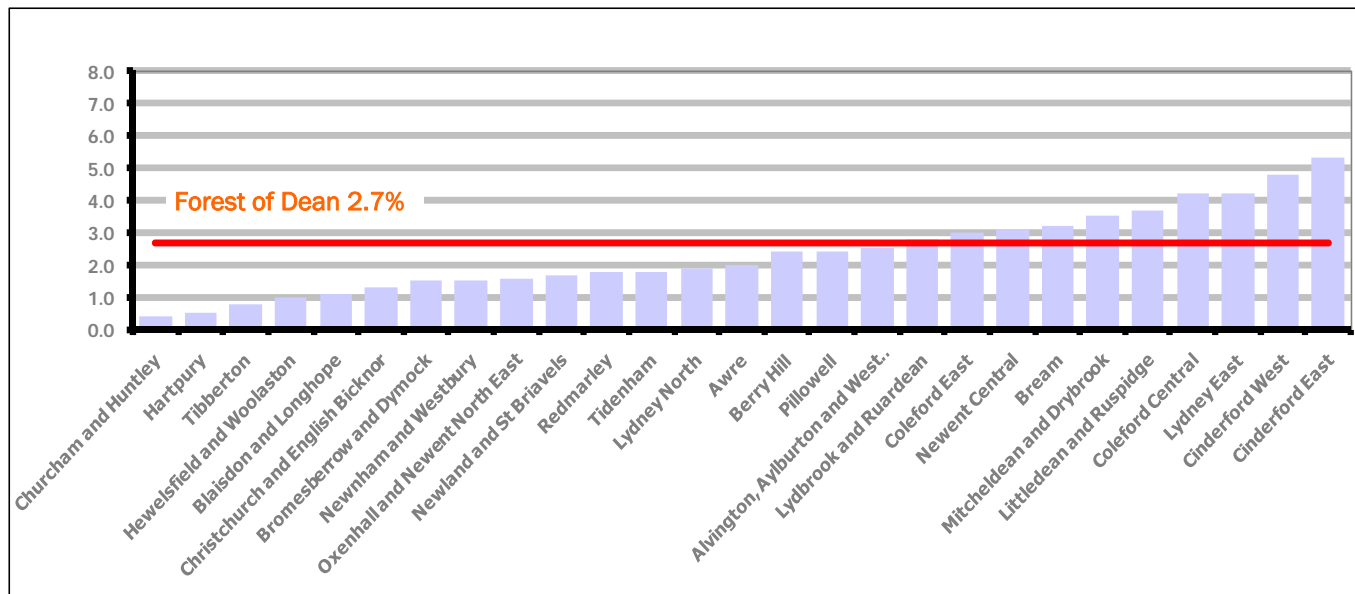

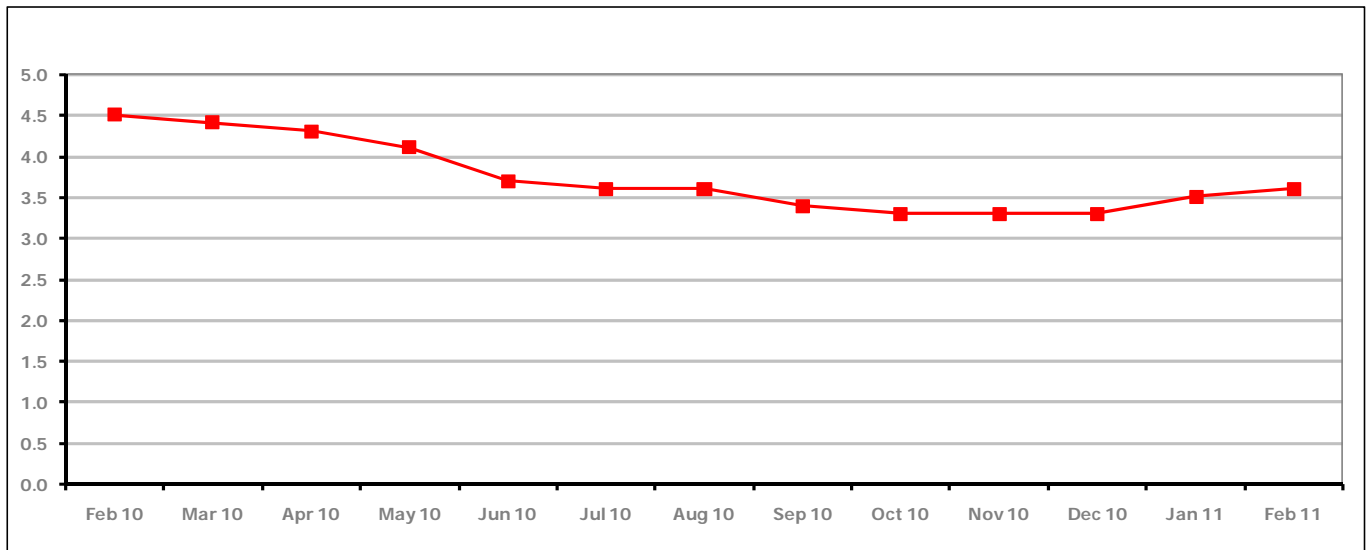

Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

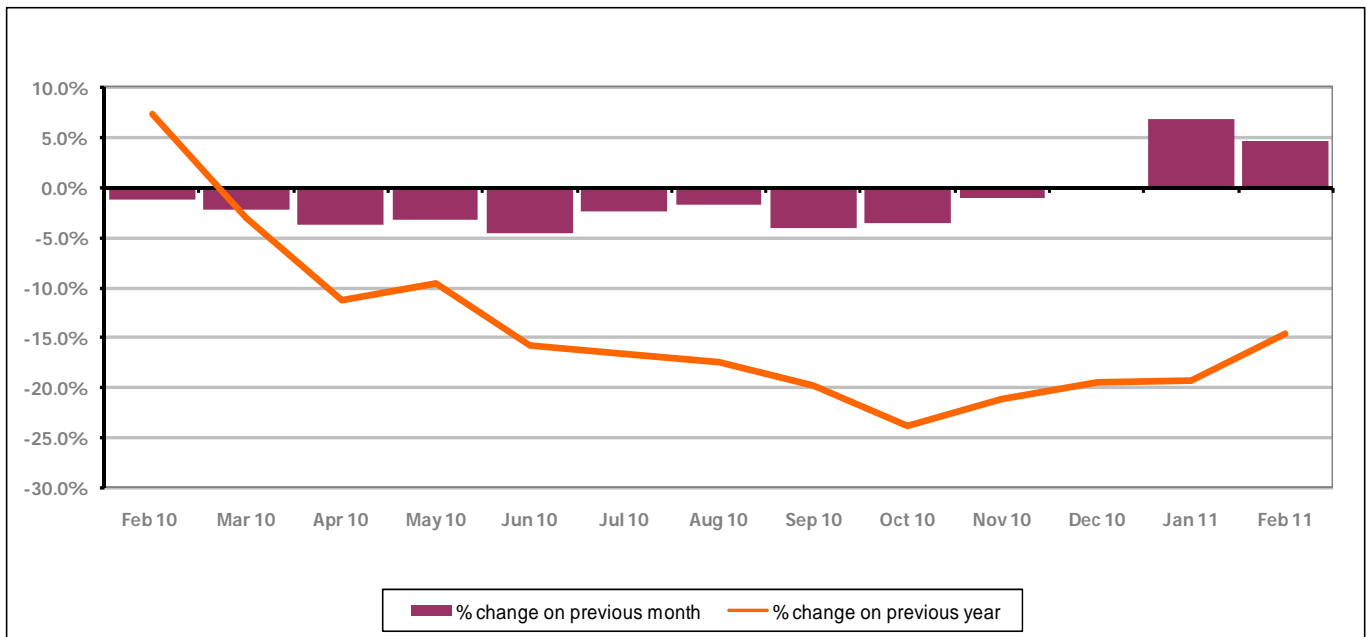

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - February 2011

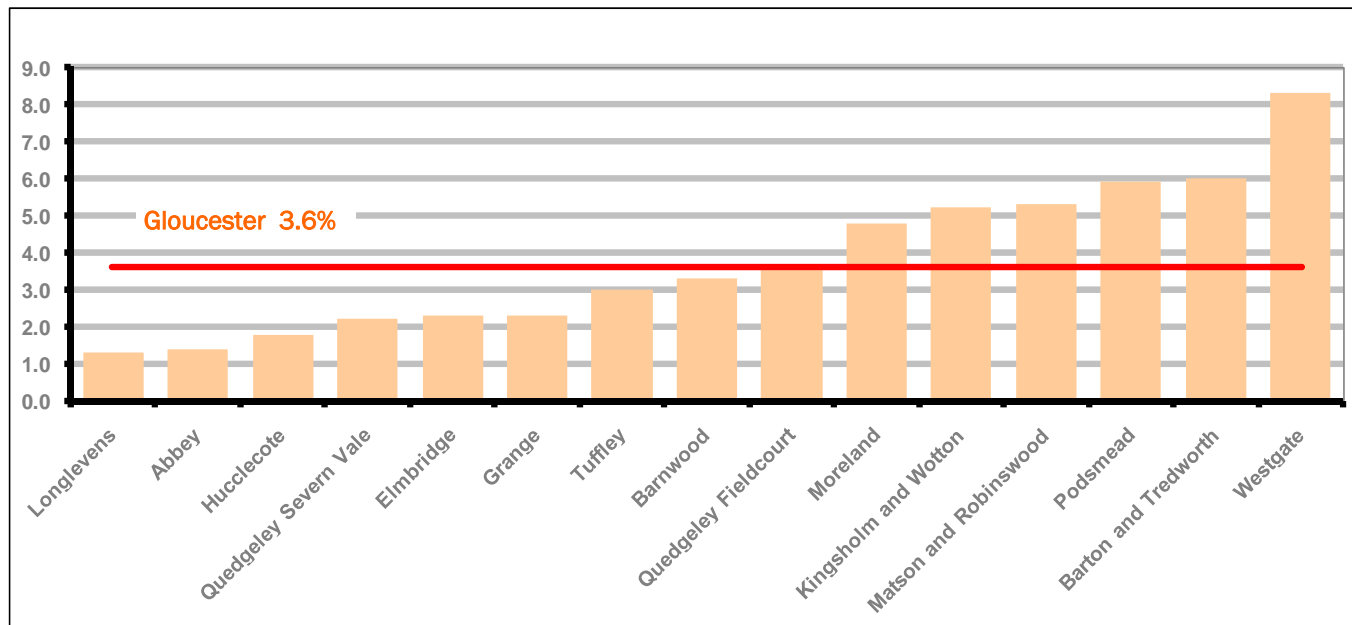
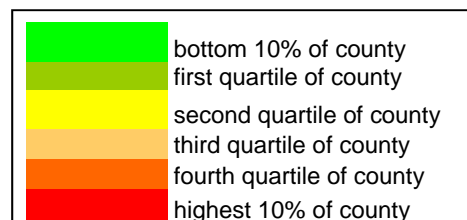

Figure 16: Stroud District claimant rate over the last year

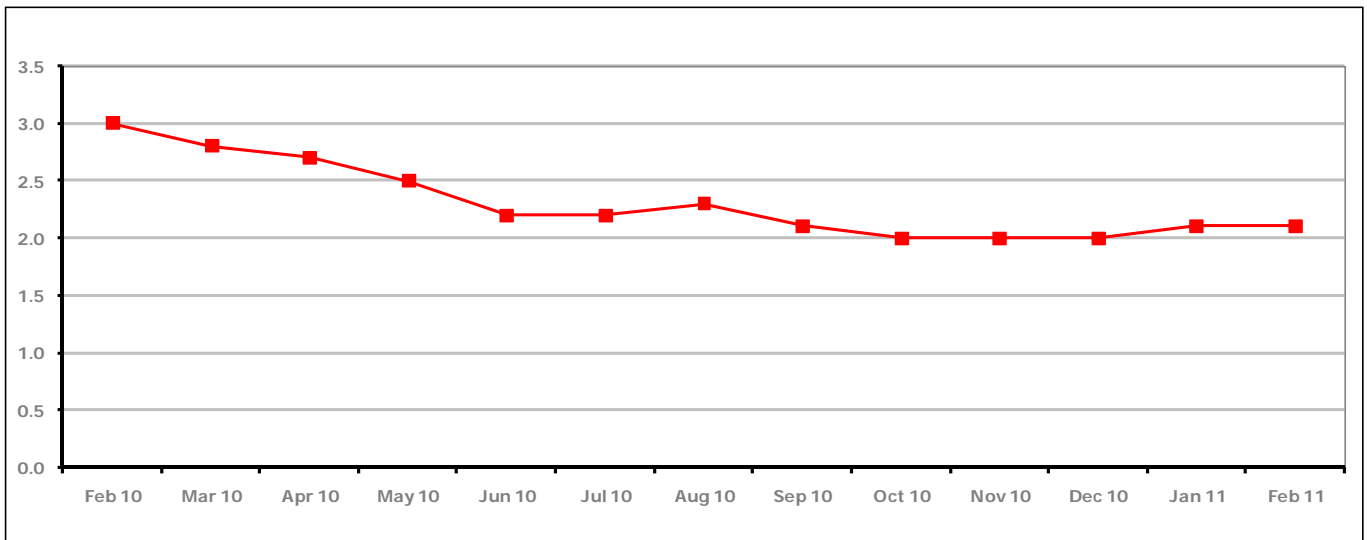

Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

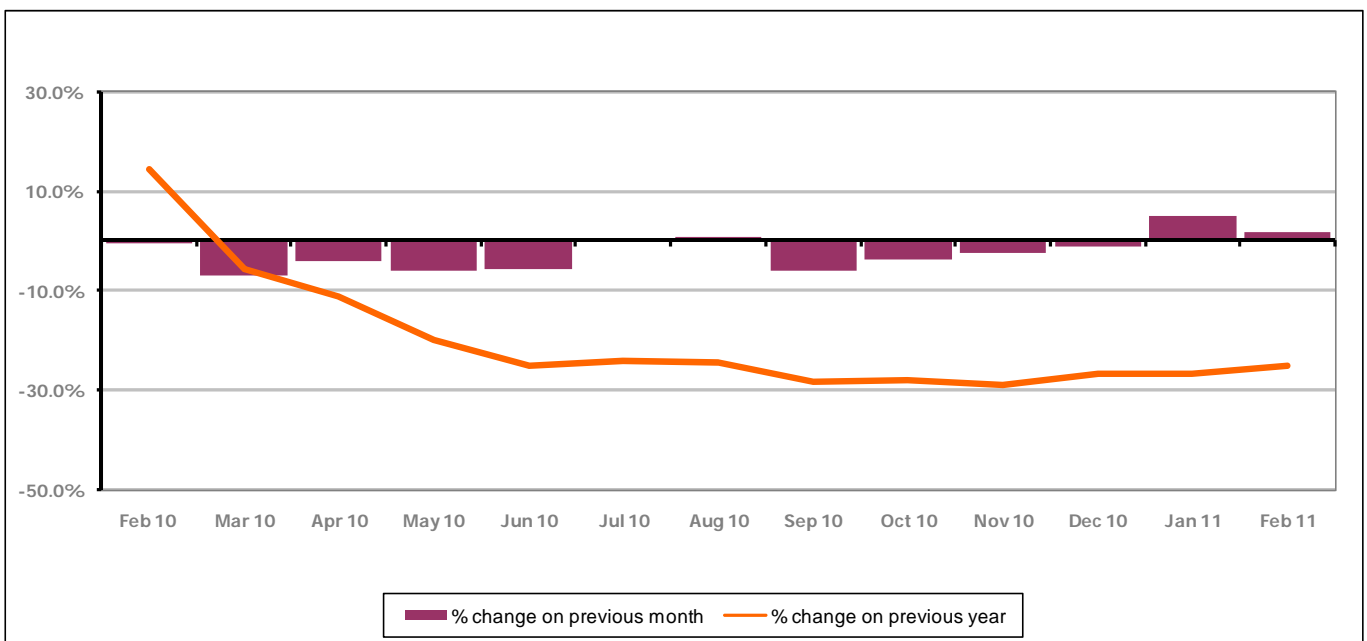

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - February 2011

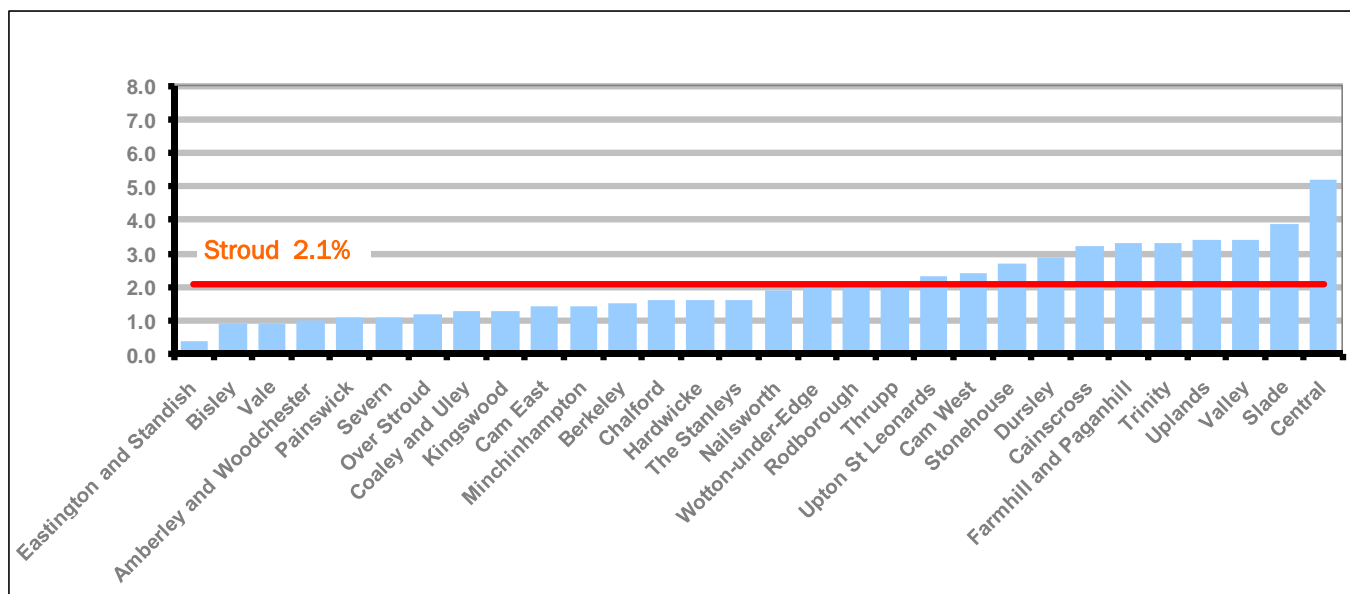
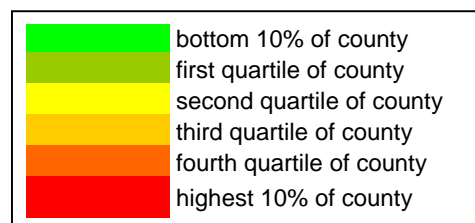

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year

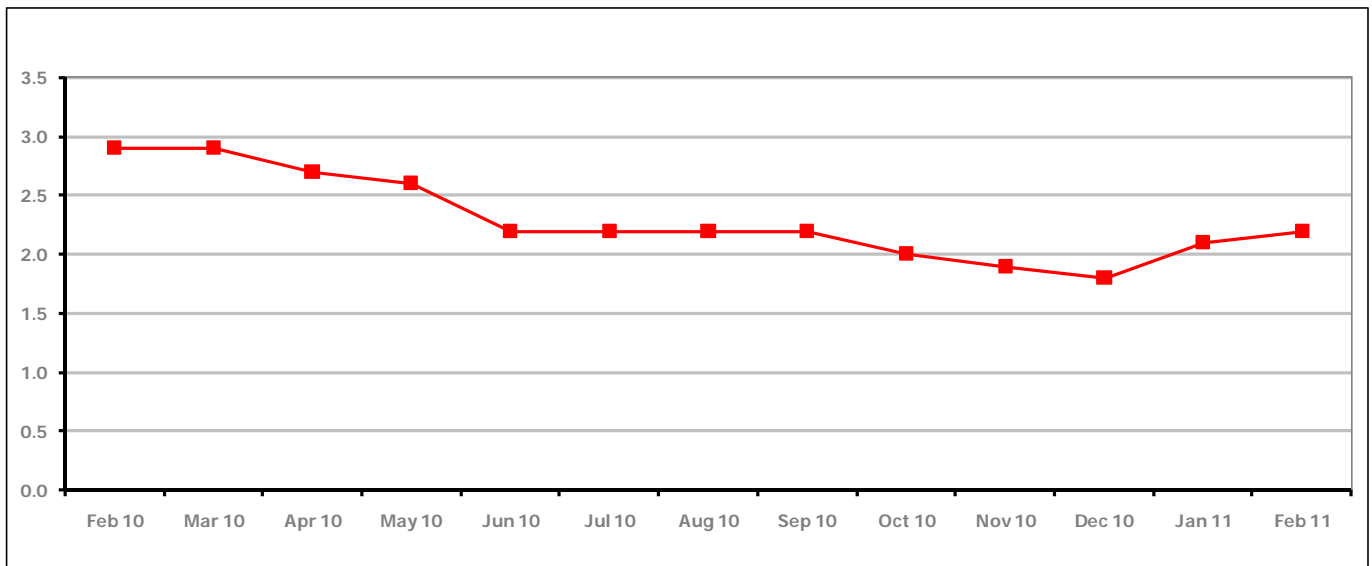

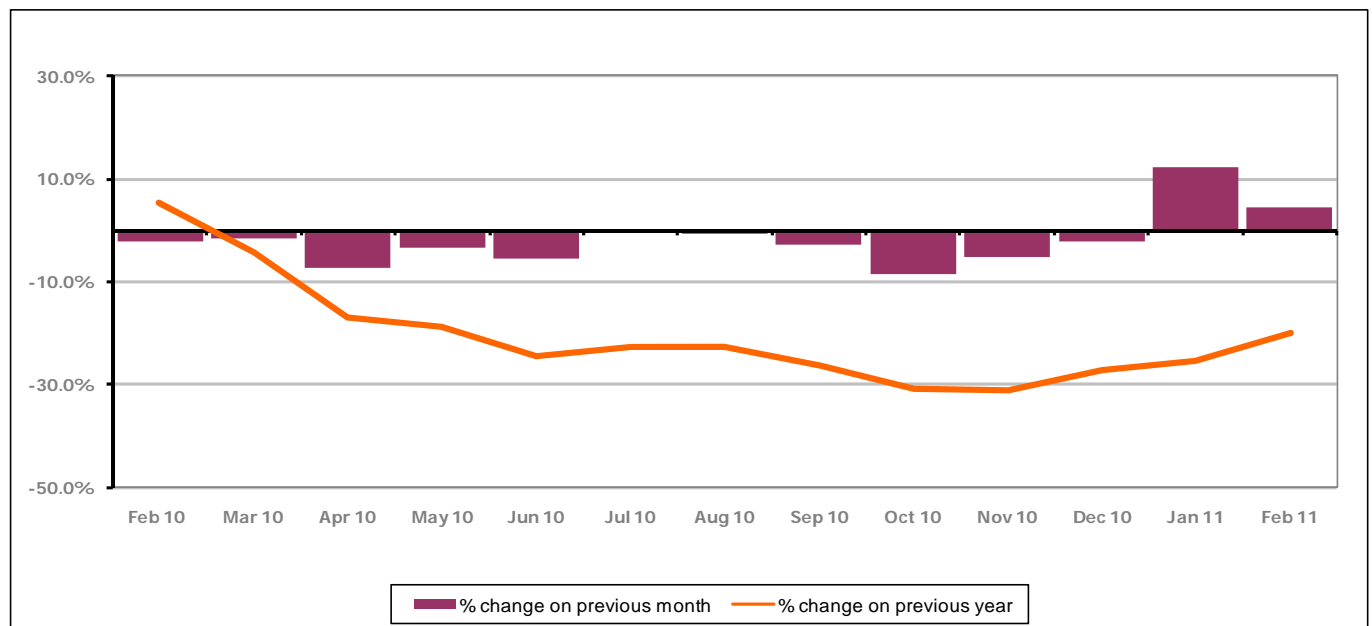

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - February 2011

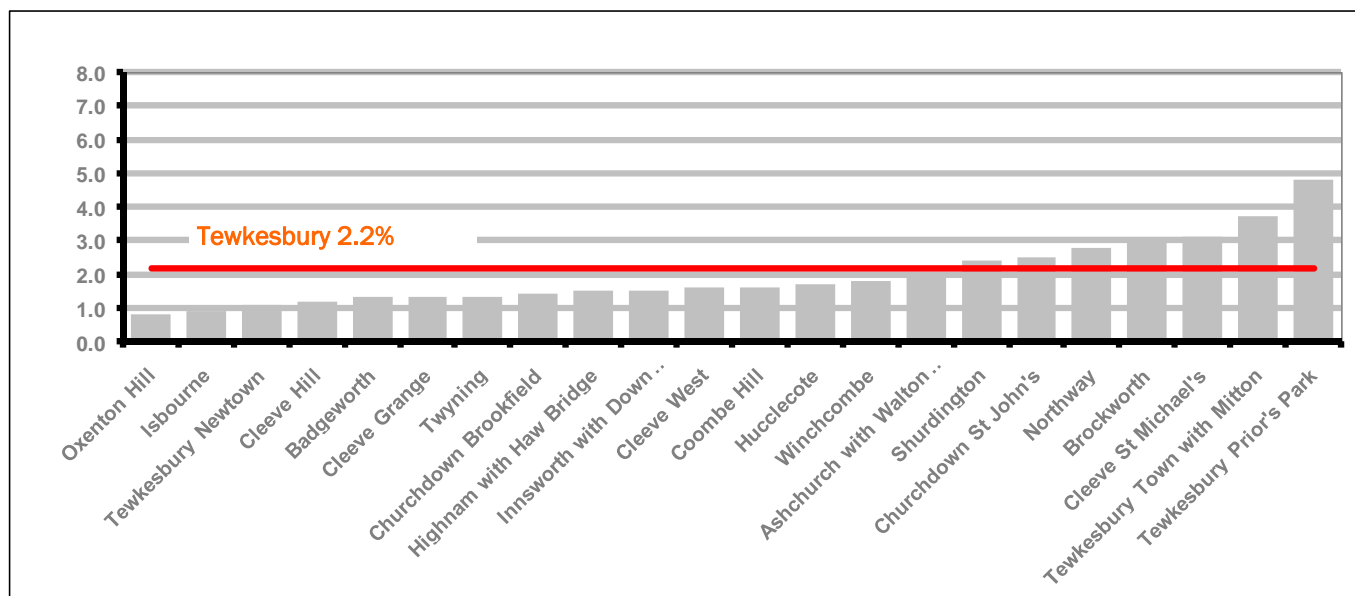
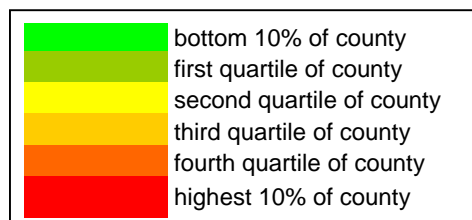

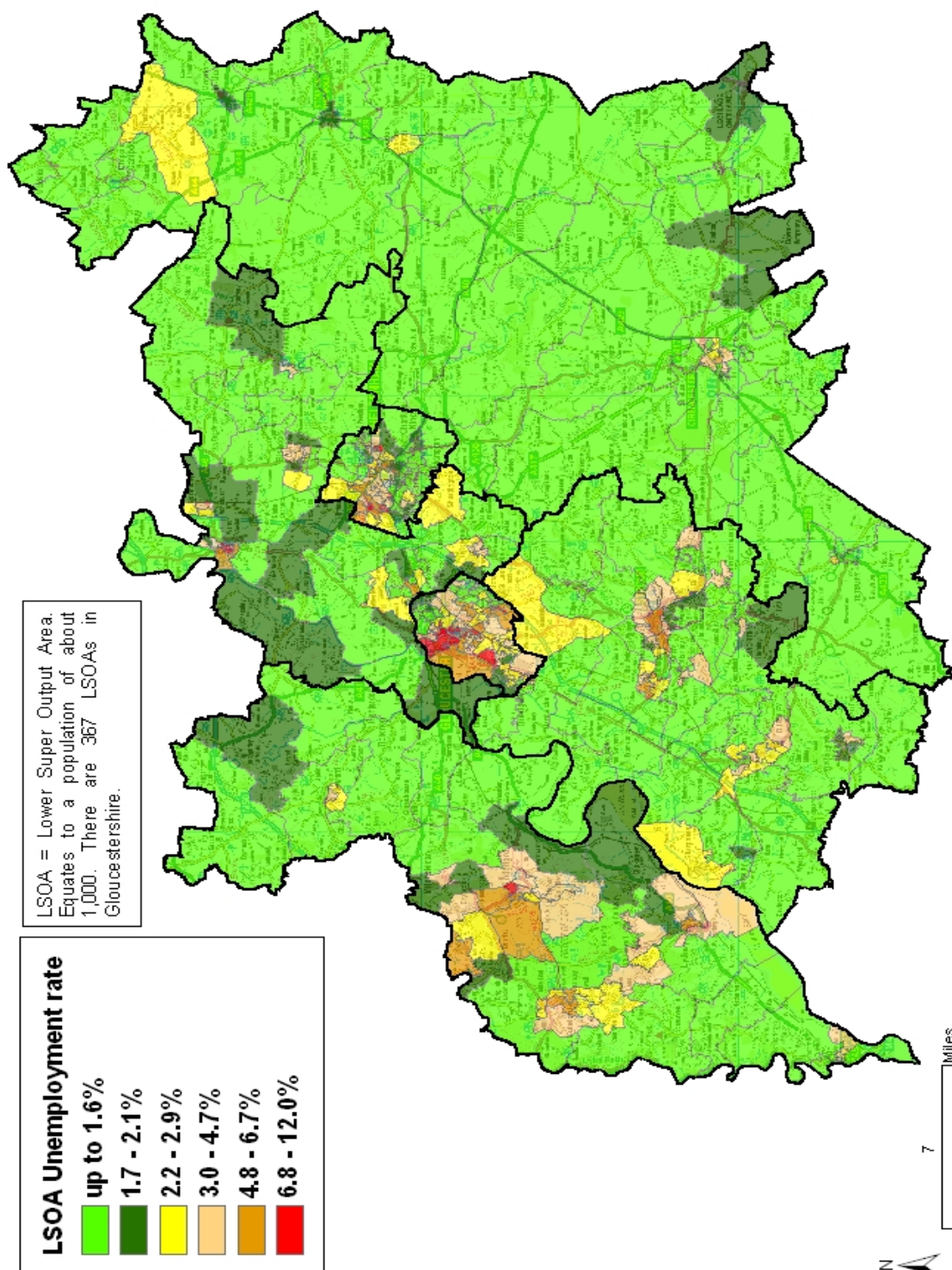

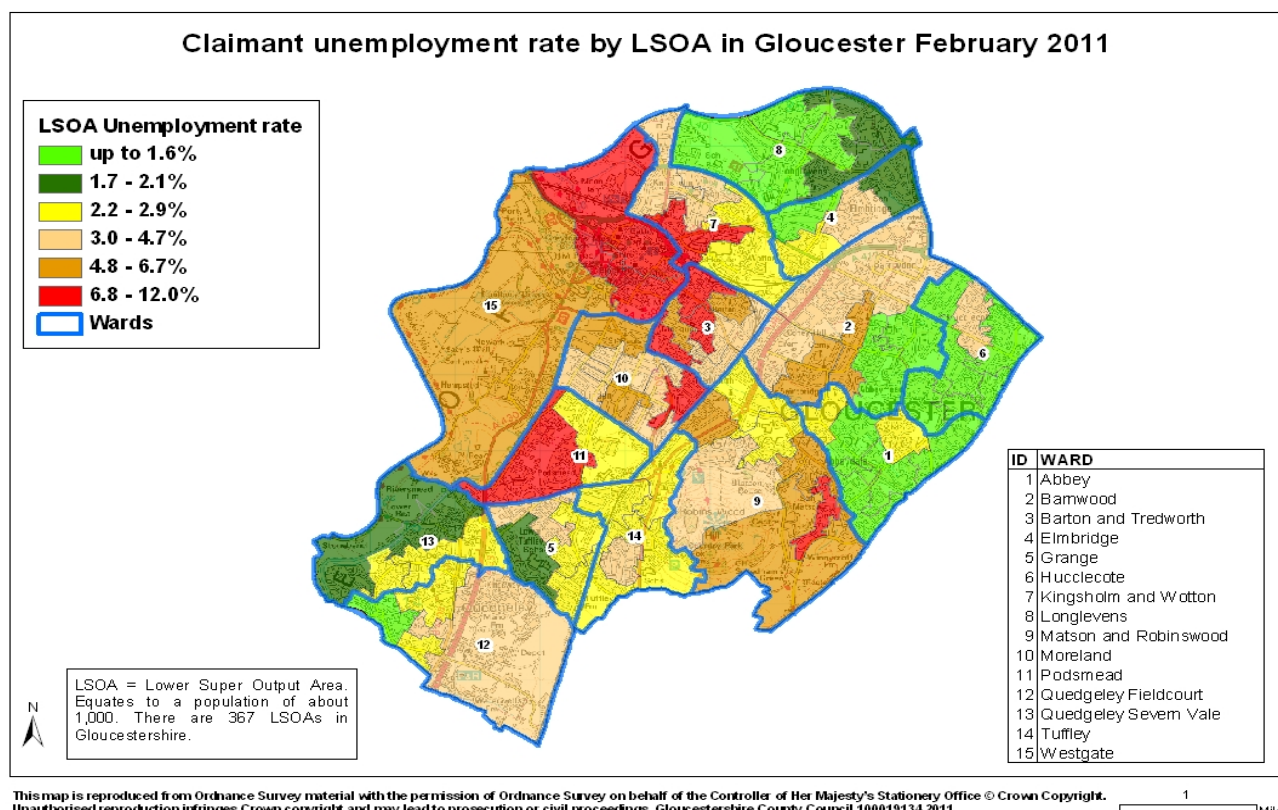
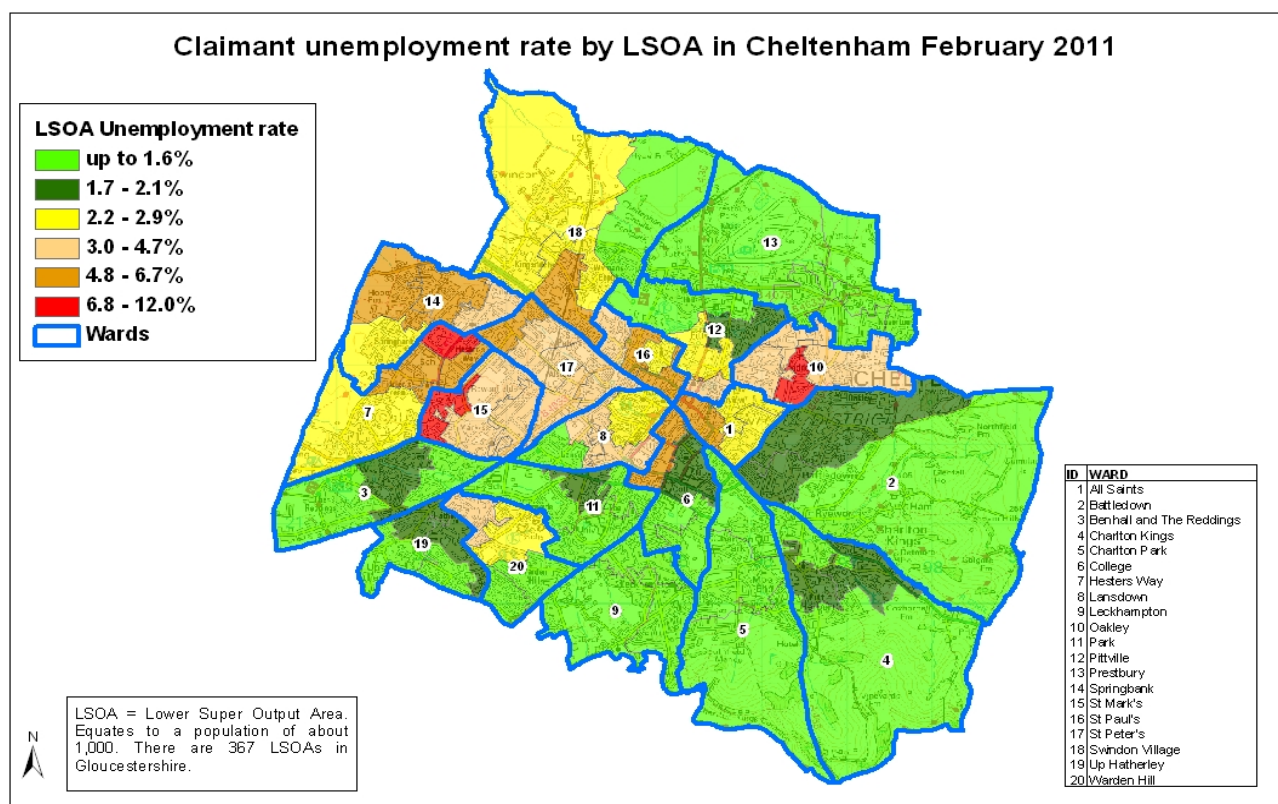

## PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

### Summary

As at the end of February 2011 there were 612 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (\*) 16-18 NEET population of 3.7%. The total number of NEET increased by 57 young people in February 2011 compared to January 2011. 5 Districts saw an increase in their NEET figure and 1 saw a decrease.
