INTRODUCTION

The Unemployment Bulletin provides a monthly update on unemployment data for Gloucestershire, the South West region and the United Kingdom. It is produced by the Strategic Needs Analysis Team in the County Council's Strategy and Challenge function. The data is sourced from the Office for National Statistics via Nomis (www.nomis.co.uk).

The claimant count measures the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefit (currently Job Seeker's allowance). The claimant rate is the number of claimants as a proportion of the working age population.

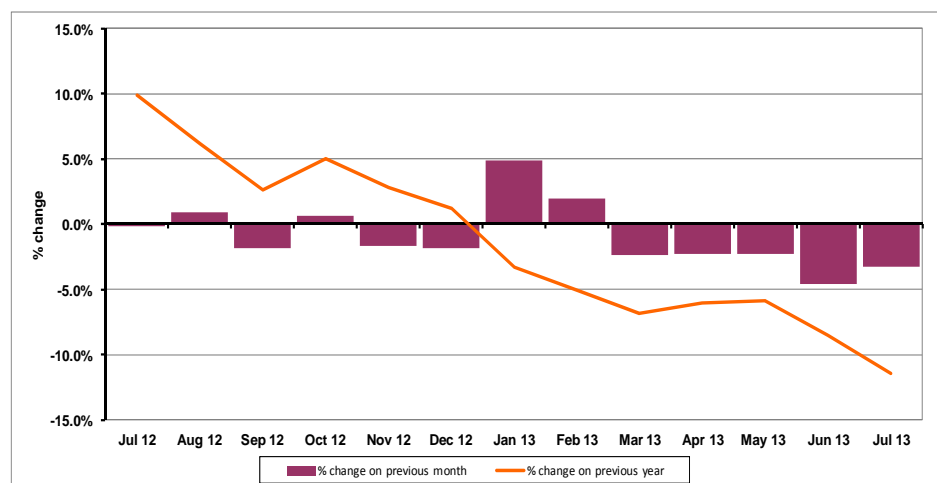
PART 1: SUMMARY

The claimant rate in Gloucestershire was 2.4% in July 2013. This was a decrease of 0.1% on the June 2013 figure. The South West rate decreased to 2.2%, while the UK rate remained the same as last month at 3.5%. Gloucestershire's rate is 0.2% above the South West average of 2.2%, and 1.1% lower than the UK average of 3.5%.

The claimant count in Gloucestershire in July 2013 decreased by 307 people. The amount of people claiming in July 2013 was 3.3% lower than the number in June 2013. This compares to a 2.7% decrease in the South West and a 1.5% decrease for the UK.

The year on year claimant count in Gloucestershire has decreased since last month. The count was 11.4% lower in July 2013 than at the same point in the previous year as shown in the graph below.

At the end of July 2013 there were 580 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.5%.

Claimant Rate

Figure 1: Claimant Rate for Gloucestershire, the South West and UK over the past year

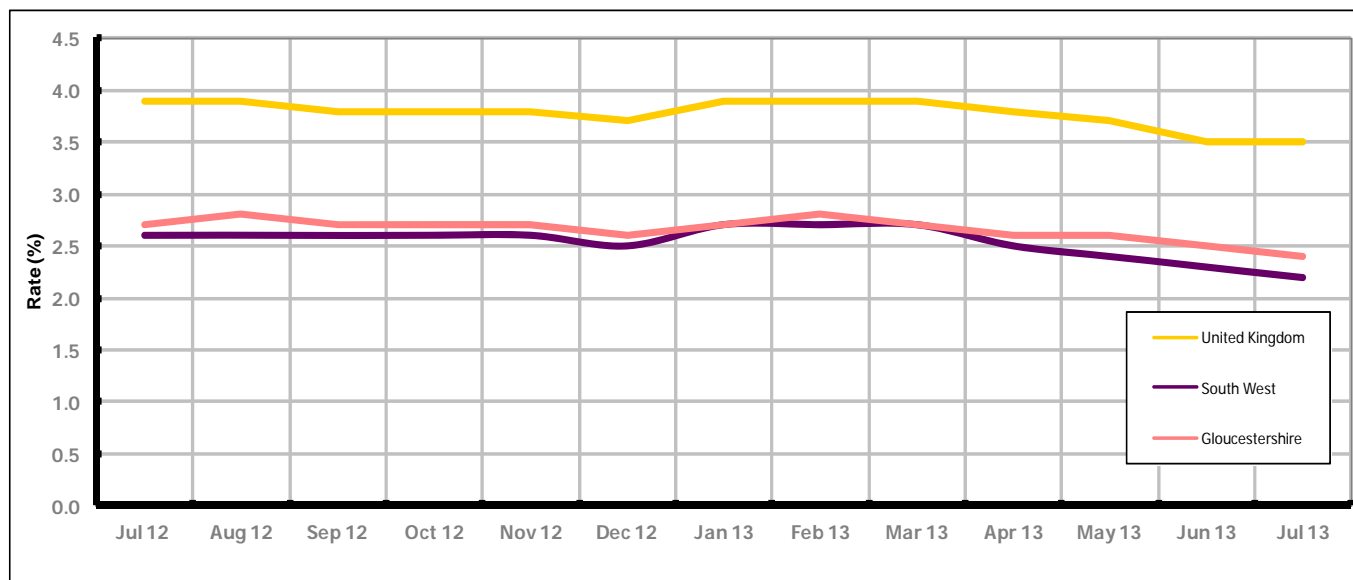


Figure 1 shows the claimant rate for Gloucestershire at 2.4% in July 2013. With the exception of January and March 2013, the rate has been slightly higher than the South West average since March 2012. It has been persistently lower by approximately 1.1% against the UK average during the same period. The July 2013 rate represented a 0.1% decrease on June 2013.

Table 1 shows that in July 2013, the number of claimants in Gloucestershire was 3.3% lower than the number in June 2013.

The average change in claimants in Gloucestershire for the six months to July 2013 was -2.5%.

Figure 2: Claimant Rate (%) across Gloucestershire - July 2013

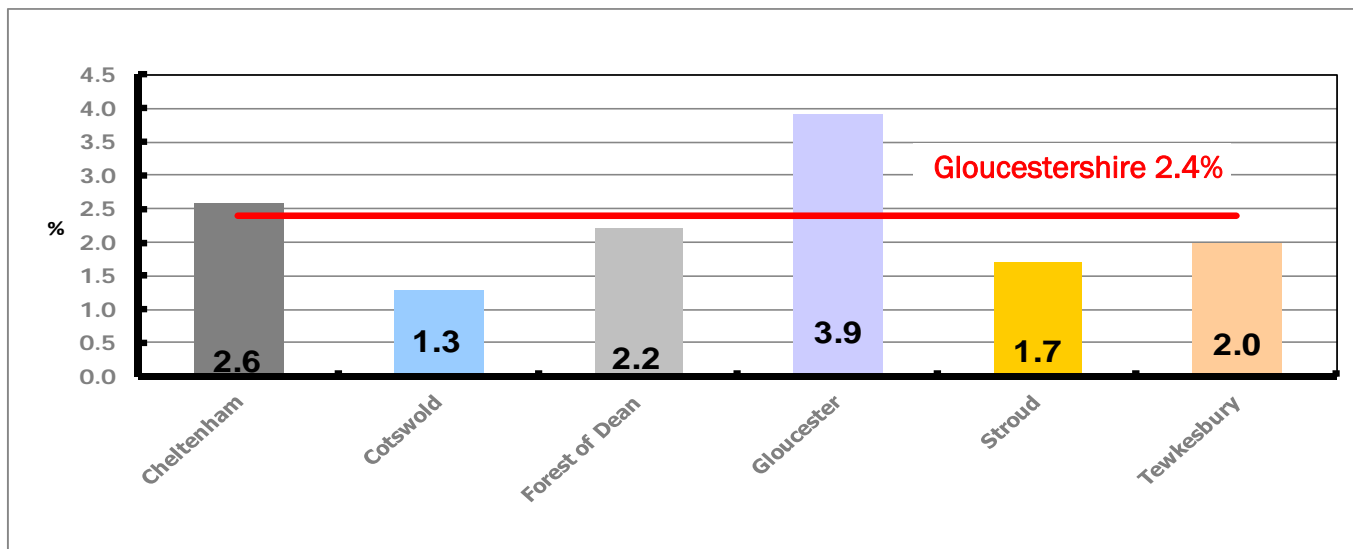

Figure 3: Total claimants over the past year across Gloucestershire Districts

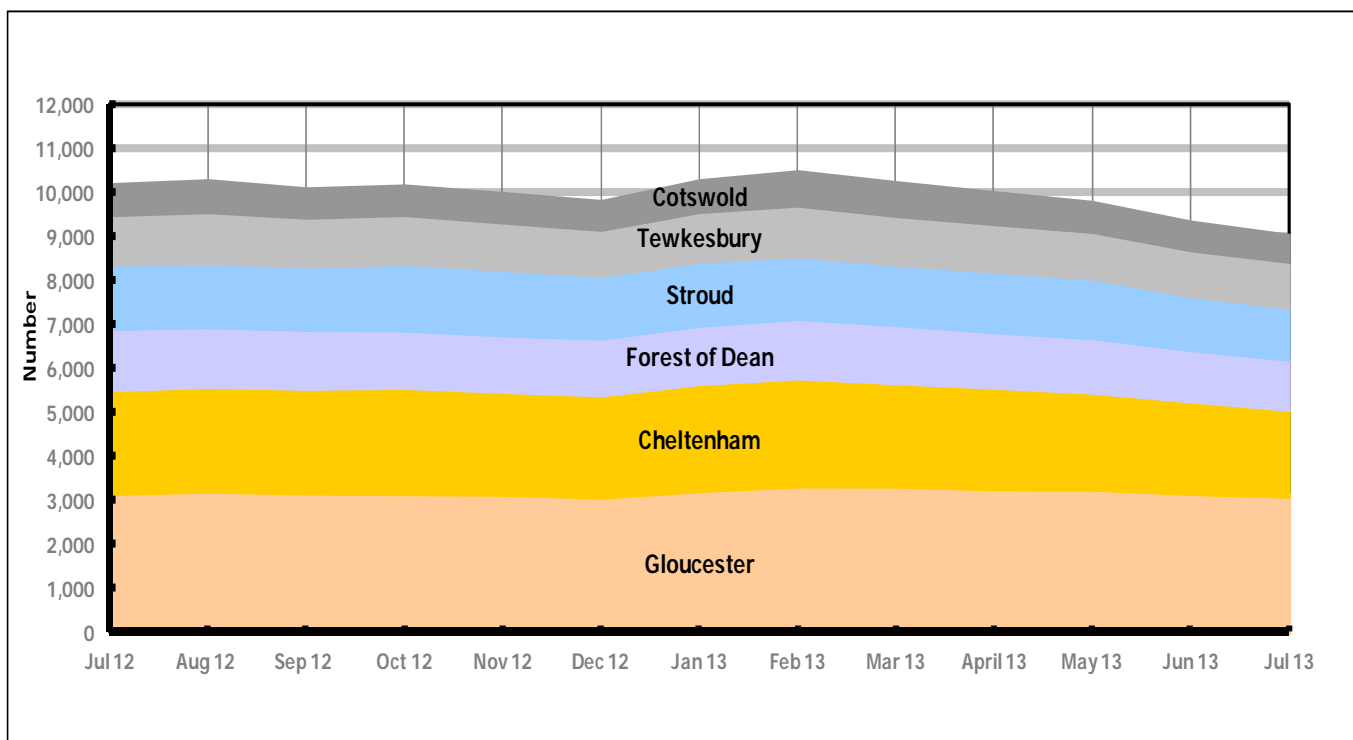


Figure 3 shows the overall claimant count by district over the past year. Since July 2012 the number of claimants has decreased, with the exception of August, October, January and February when they increased.

Figure 4: Cheltenham Borough claimant rate over the last year

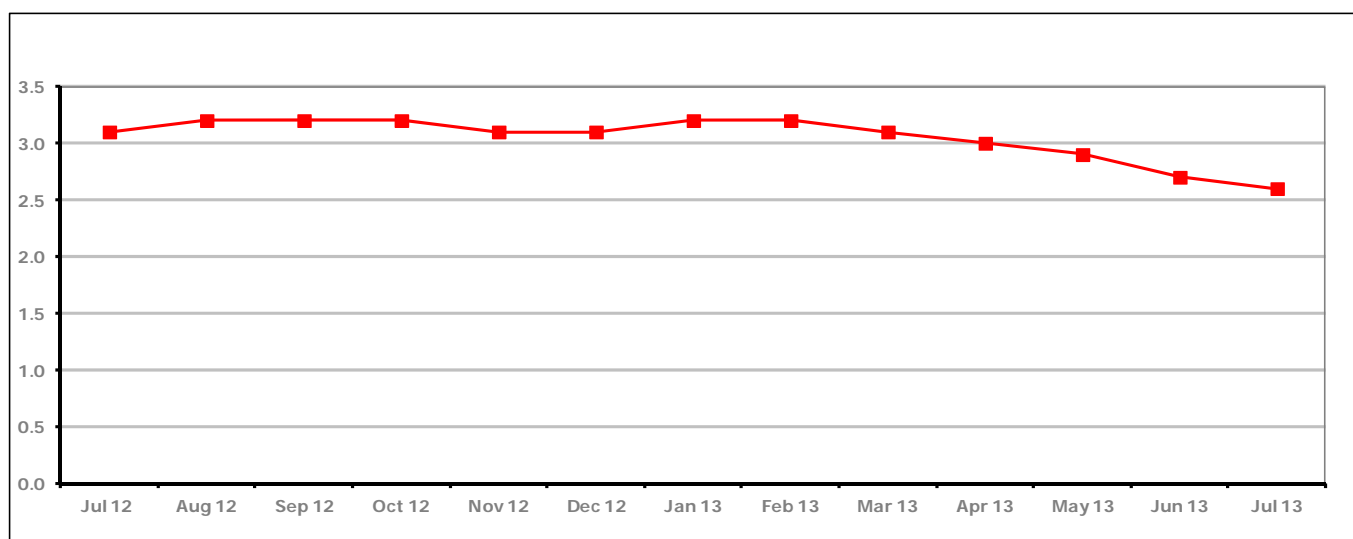


Figure 4 shows the claimant rate in Cheltenham decreased in July 2013 to 2.6%.

Figure 5: Cheltenham Borough claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

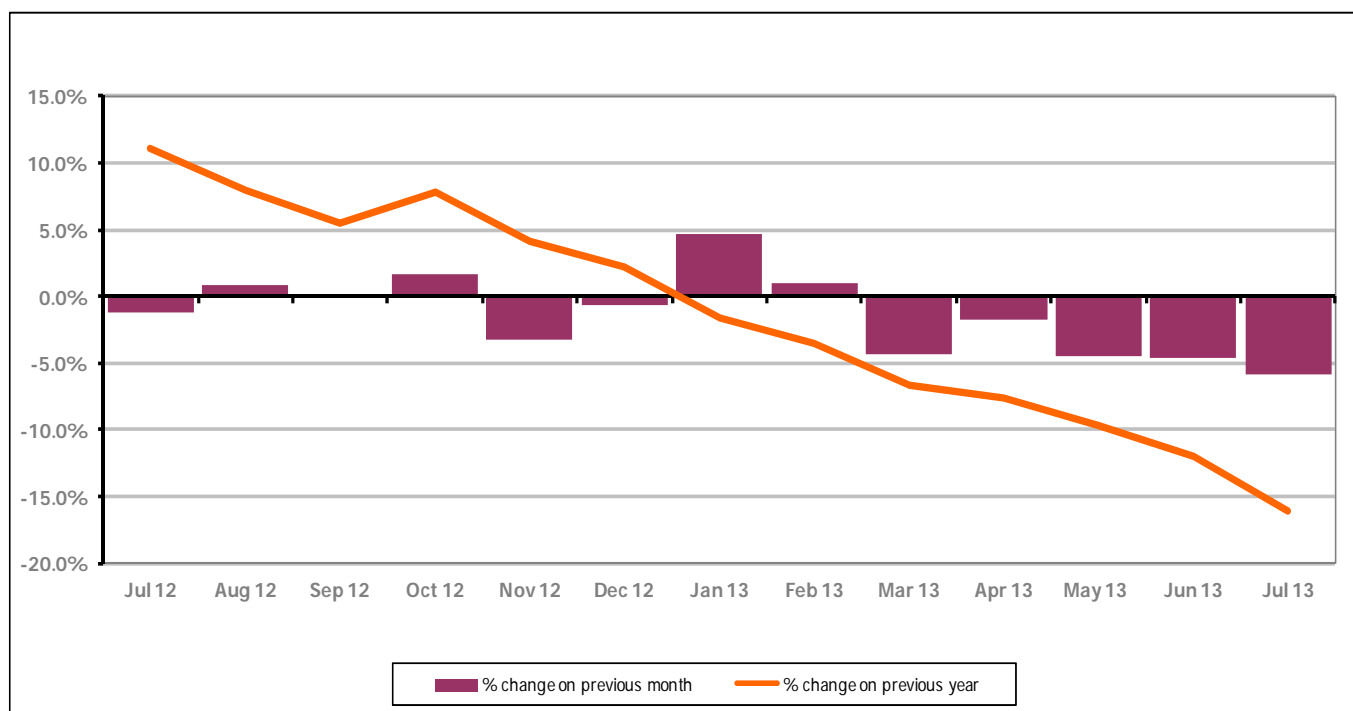


Figure 5 shows the claimant count decreased by -5.9% since last month. The change on the previous year has decreased in July 2013 compared to June 2013 to -16.1%.

Figure 6: Claimant rates across Cheltenham Borough wards - July 2013

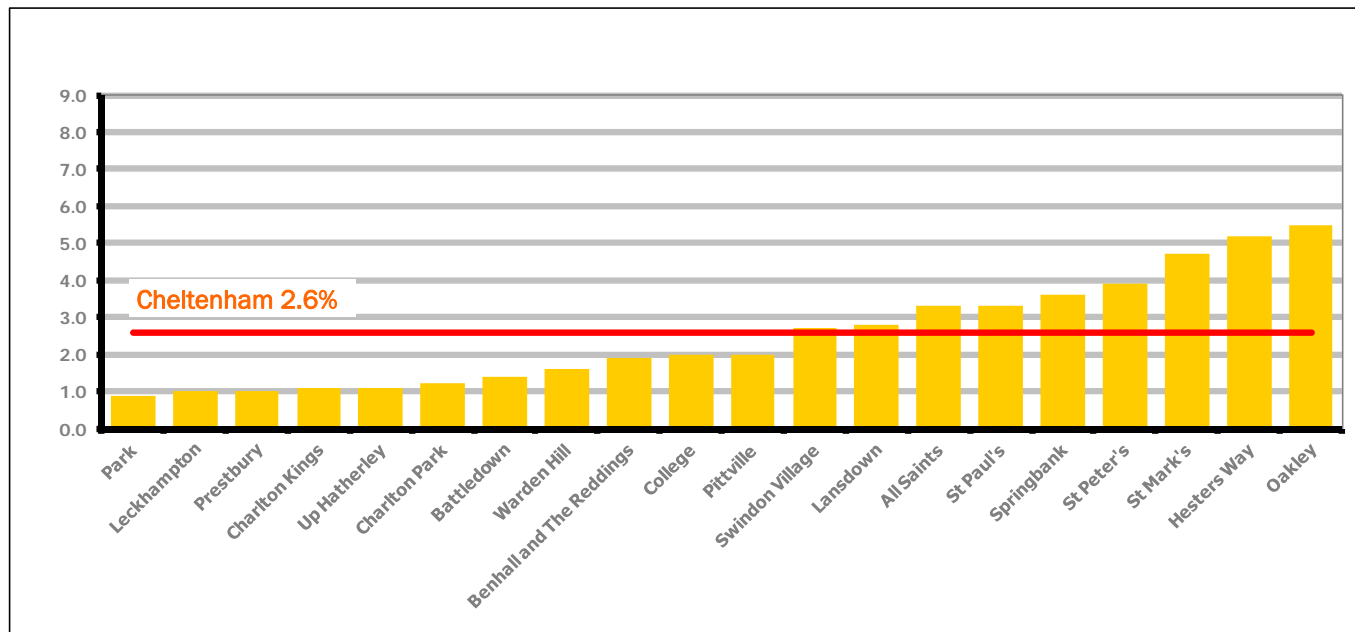
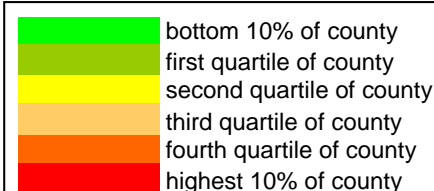

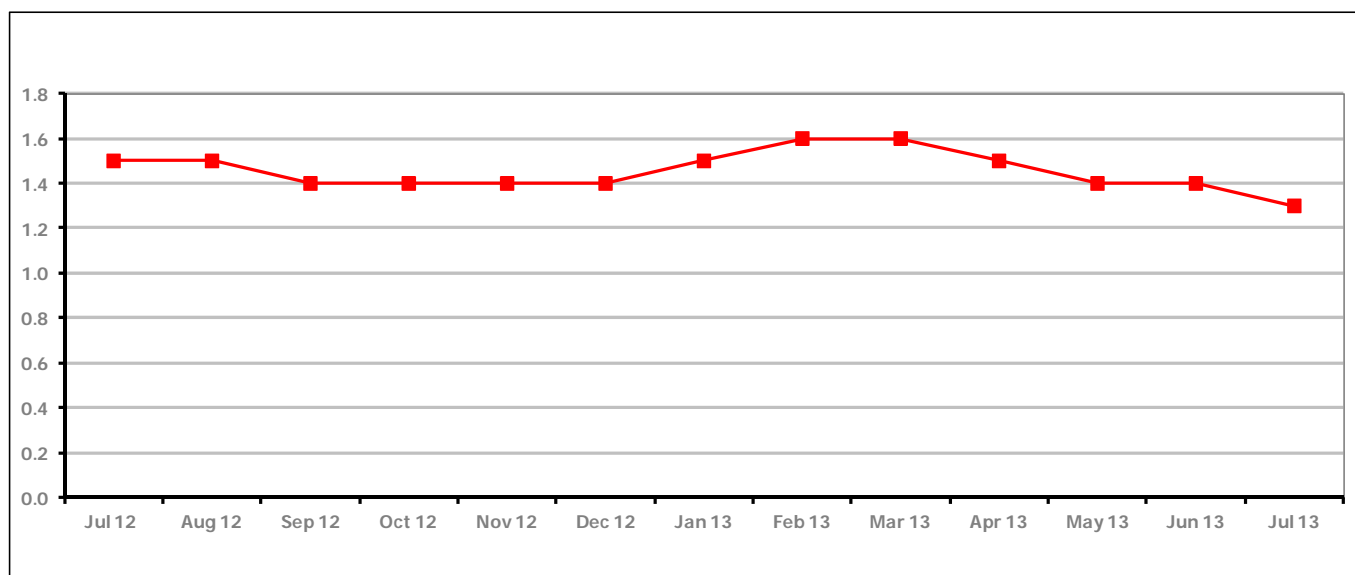

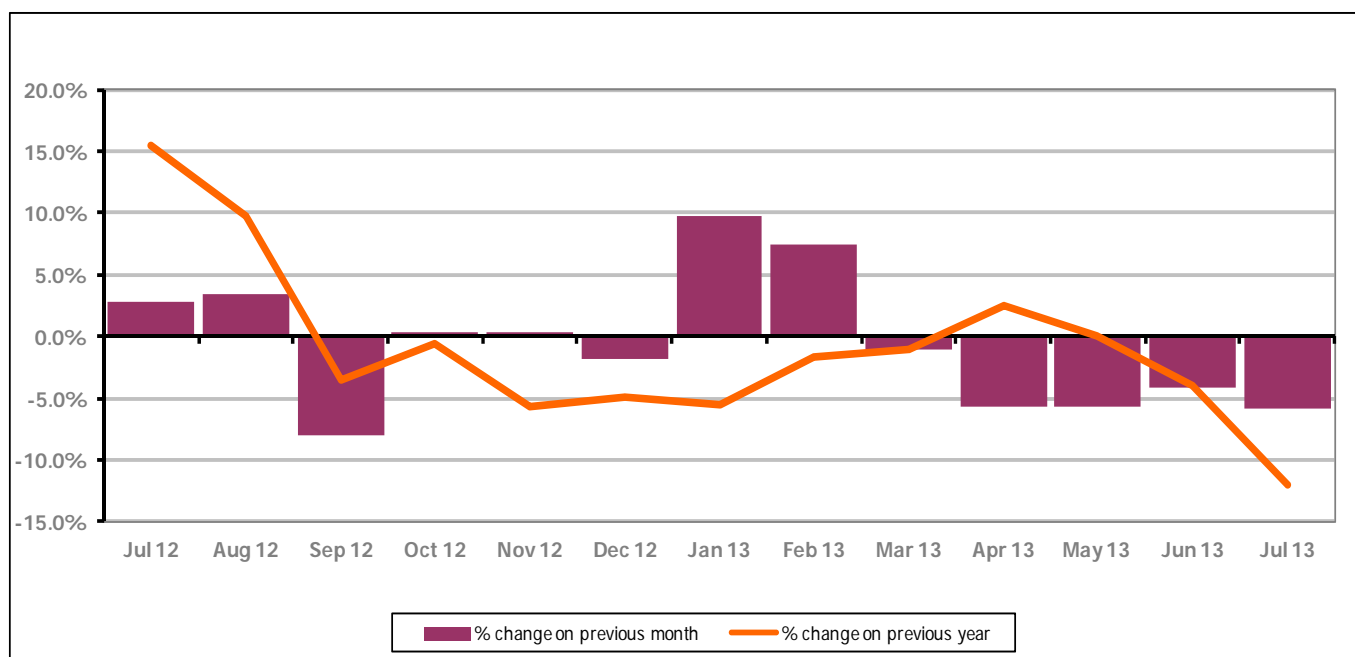
Figure 8: Cotswold District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 9: Claimant rates across Cotswold District wards - July 2013

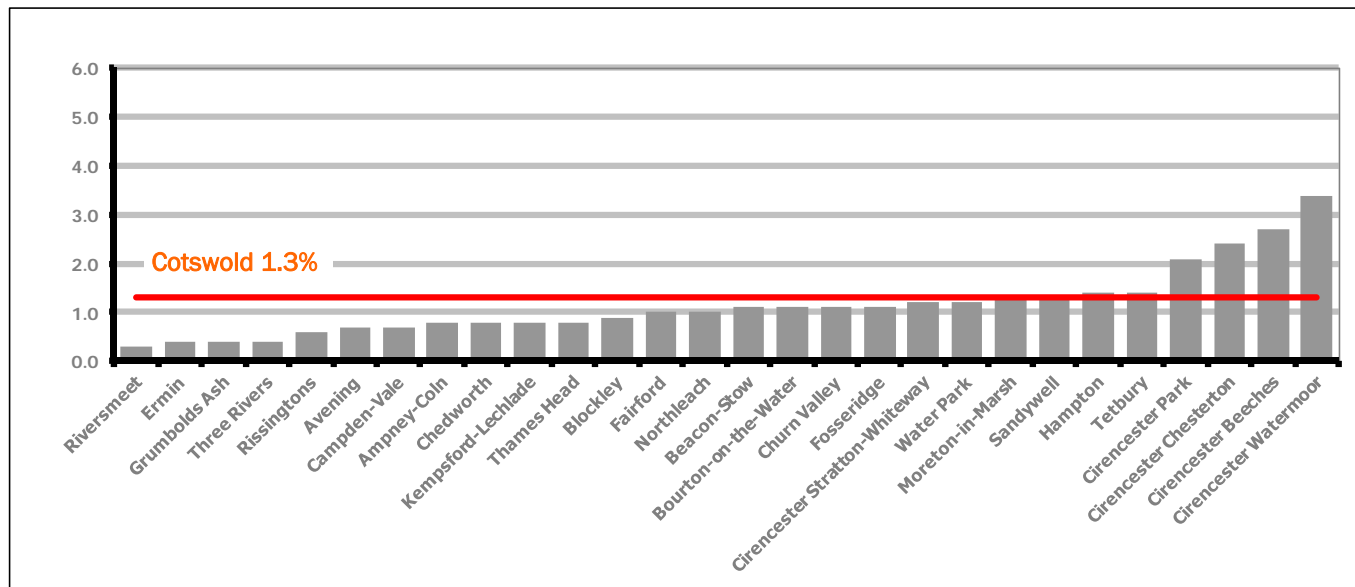


Figure 9 shows the claimant rates for Cotswold District wards. The red line represents the average claimant rate across the District of 1.3%. Six wards lie above the average.

Figure 10: Forest of Dean District claimant rate over the last year

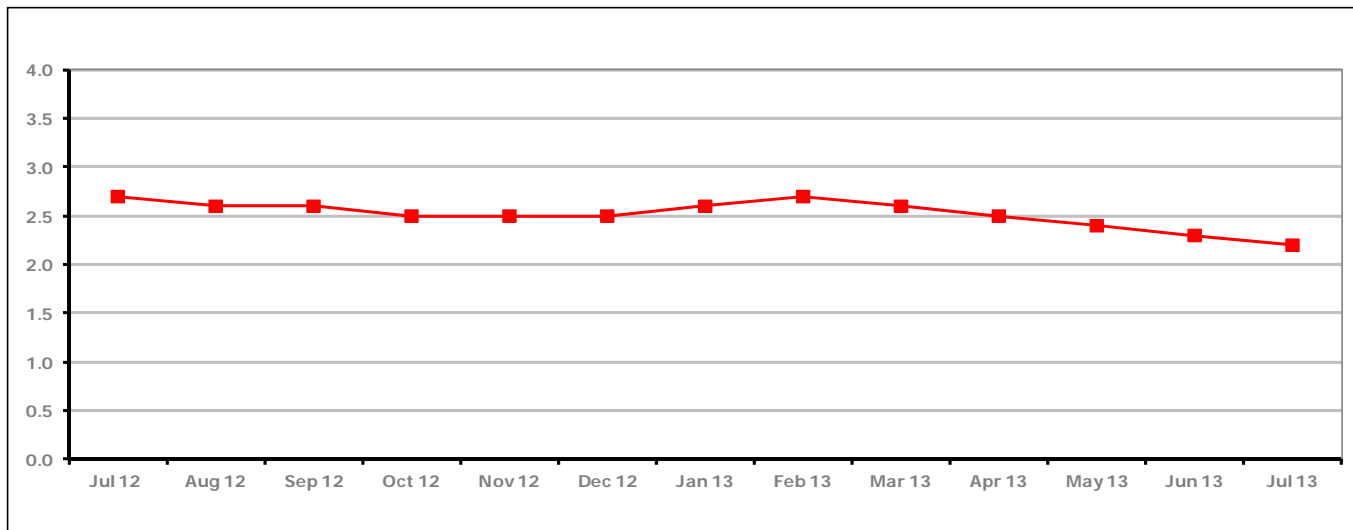


Figure 10 shows the claimant rate in the Forest of Dean decreased in July 2013 to 2.2%.

Figure 11: Forest of Dean District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

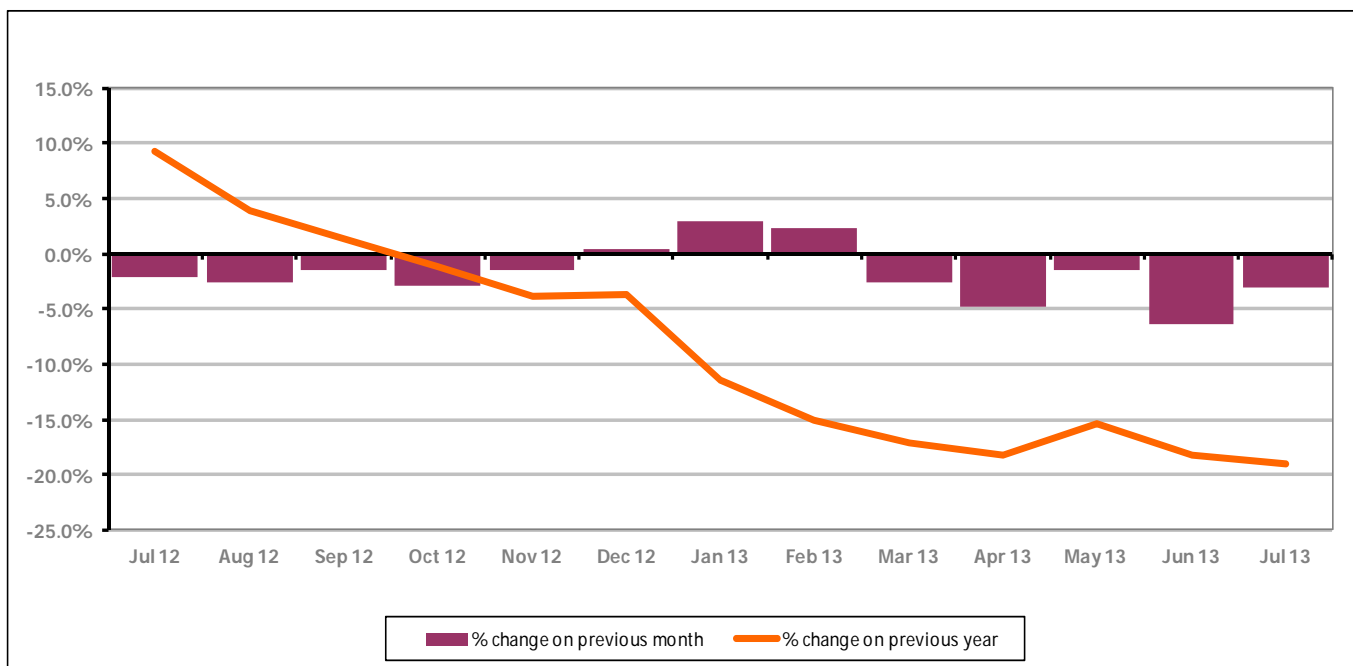

Figure 12: Claimant rates across Forest of Dean District wards - July 2013

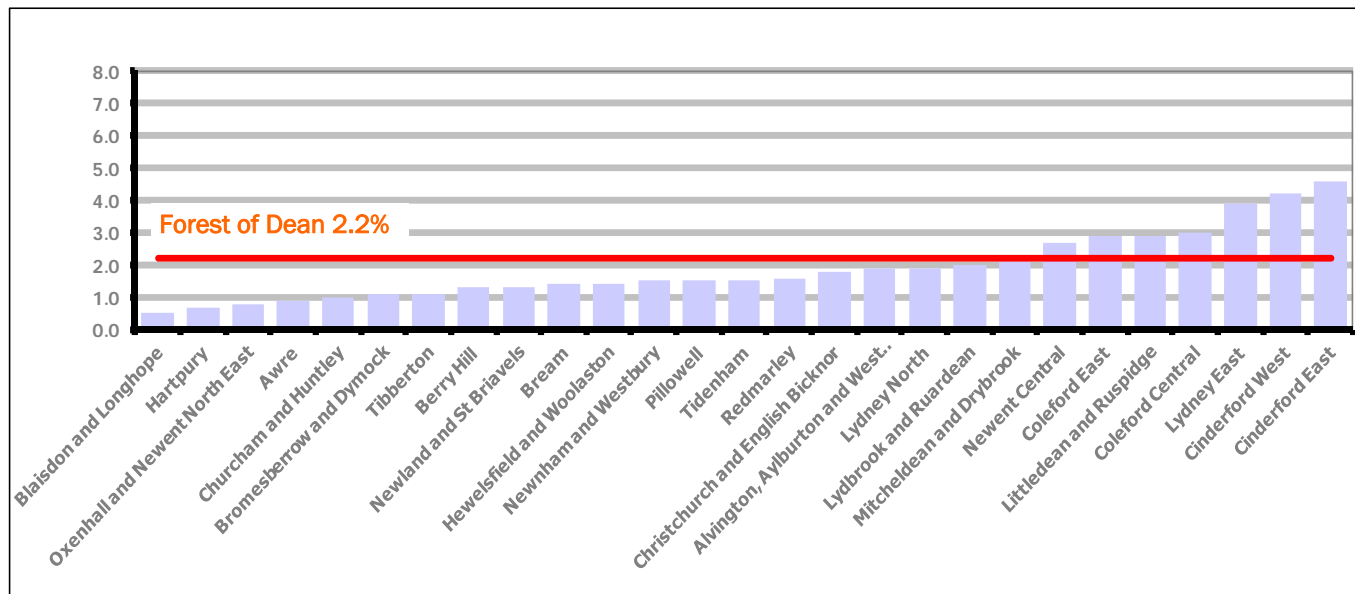
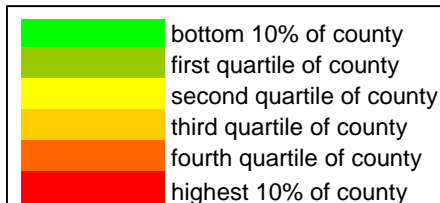

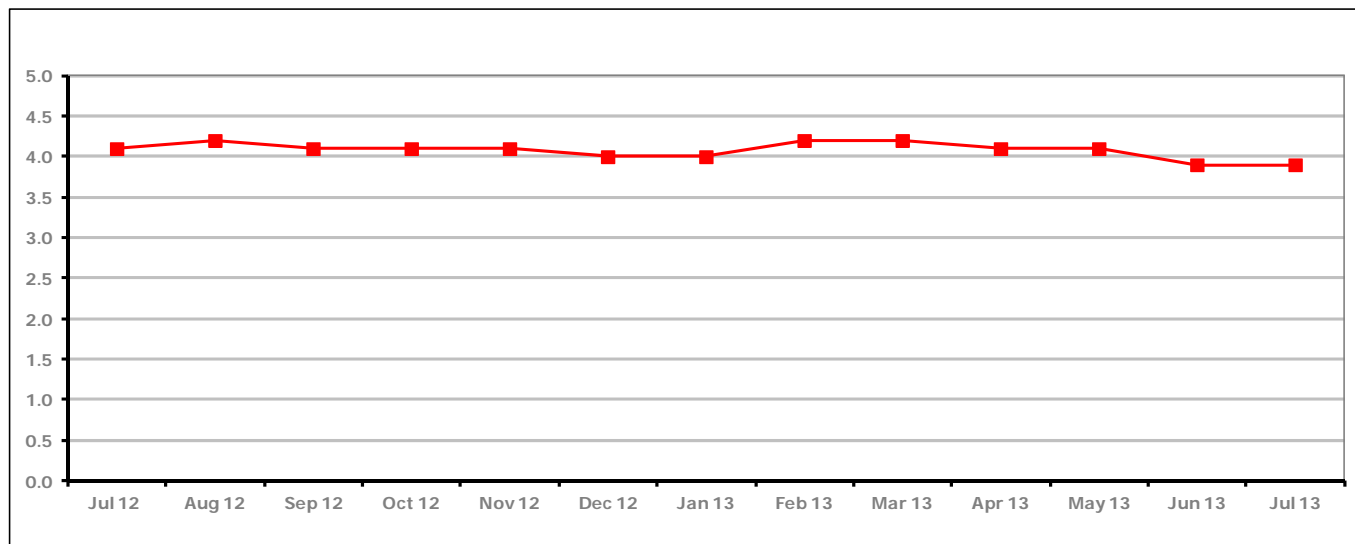

Figure 14: Gloucester City claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

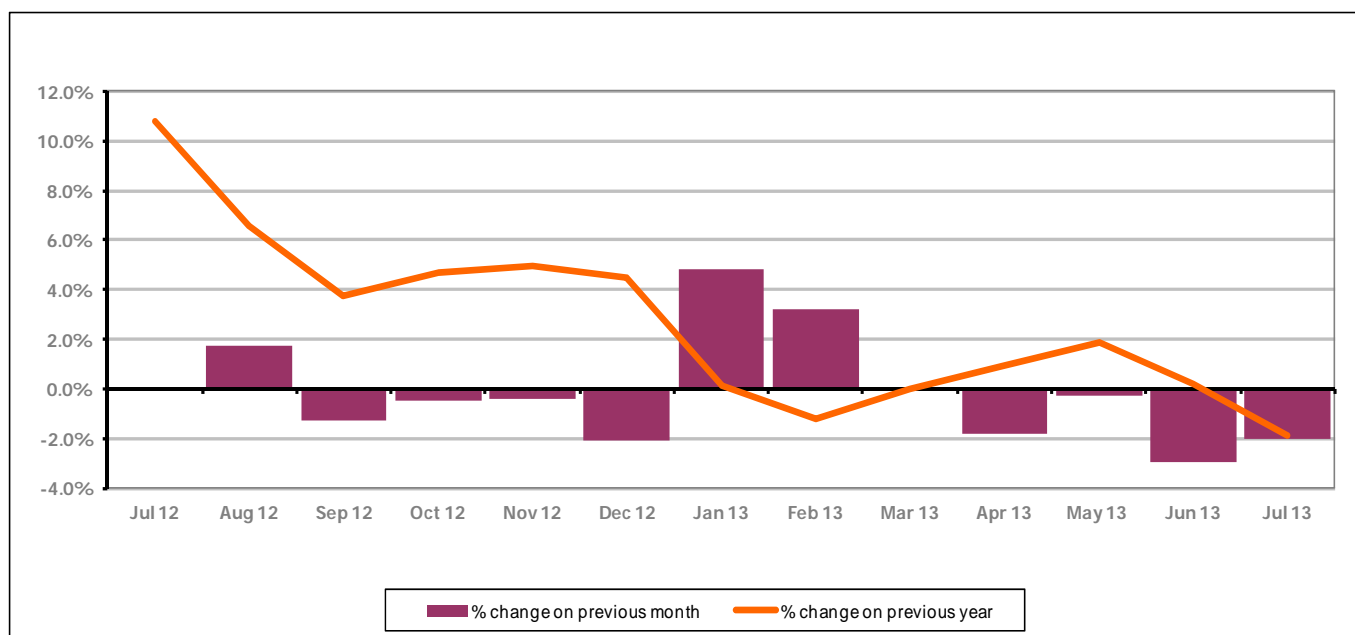

Figure 15: Claimant rates across Gloucester City wards - July 2013

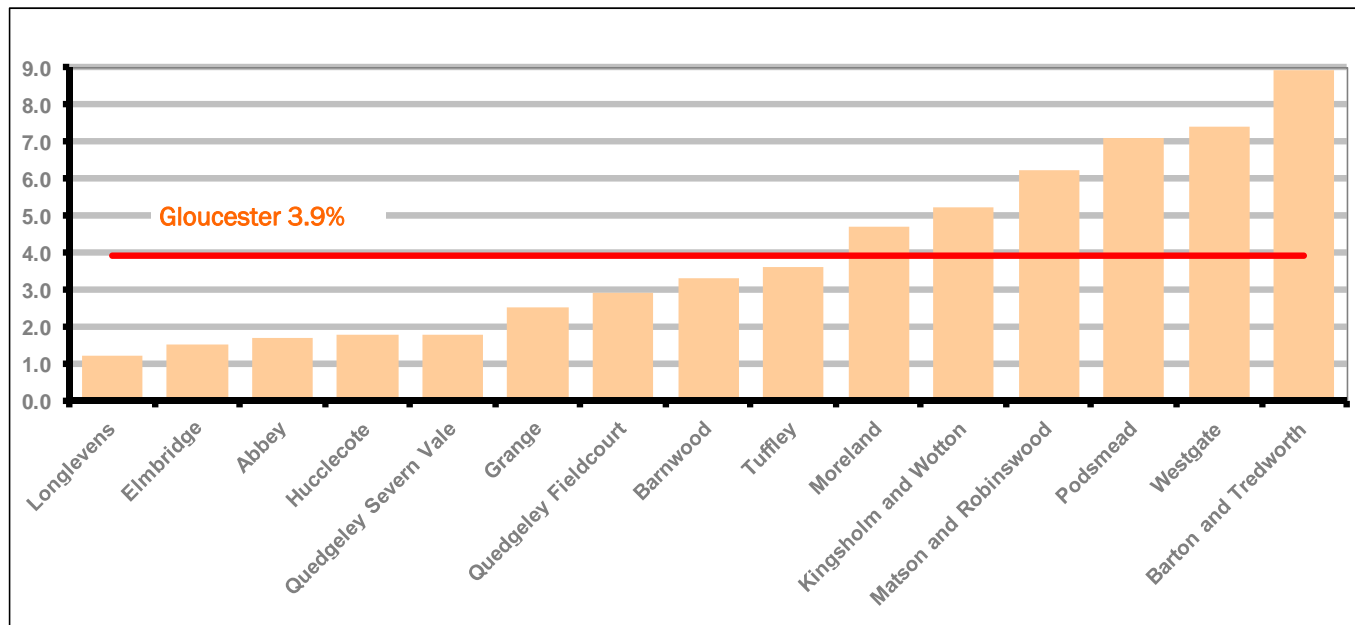
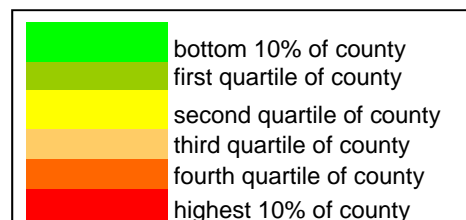

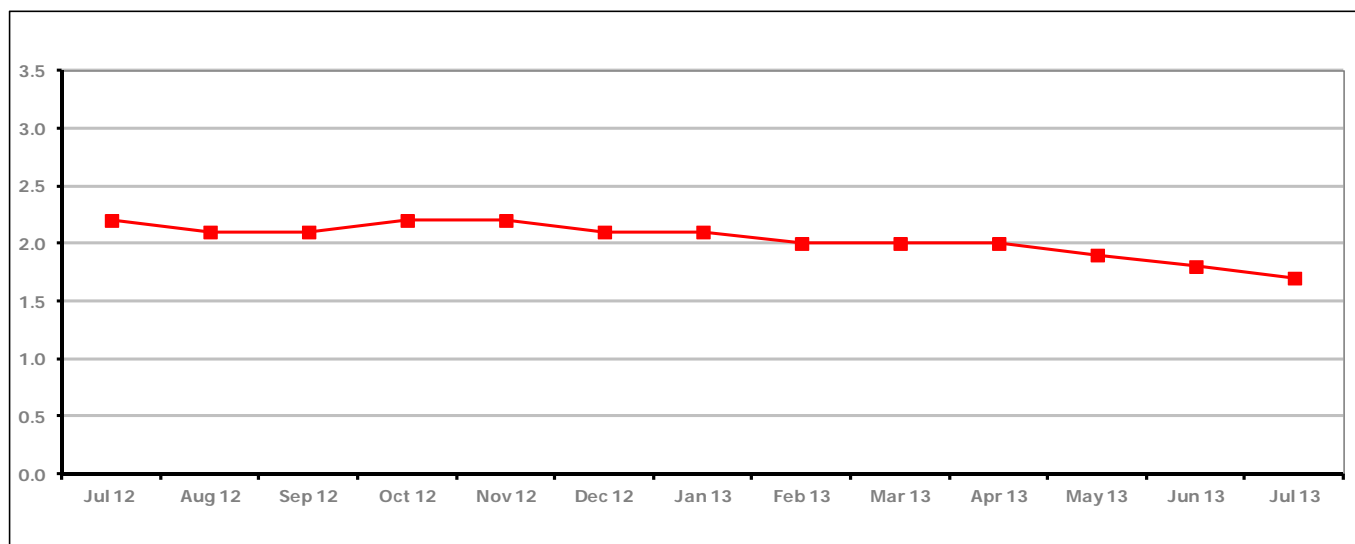

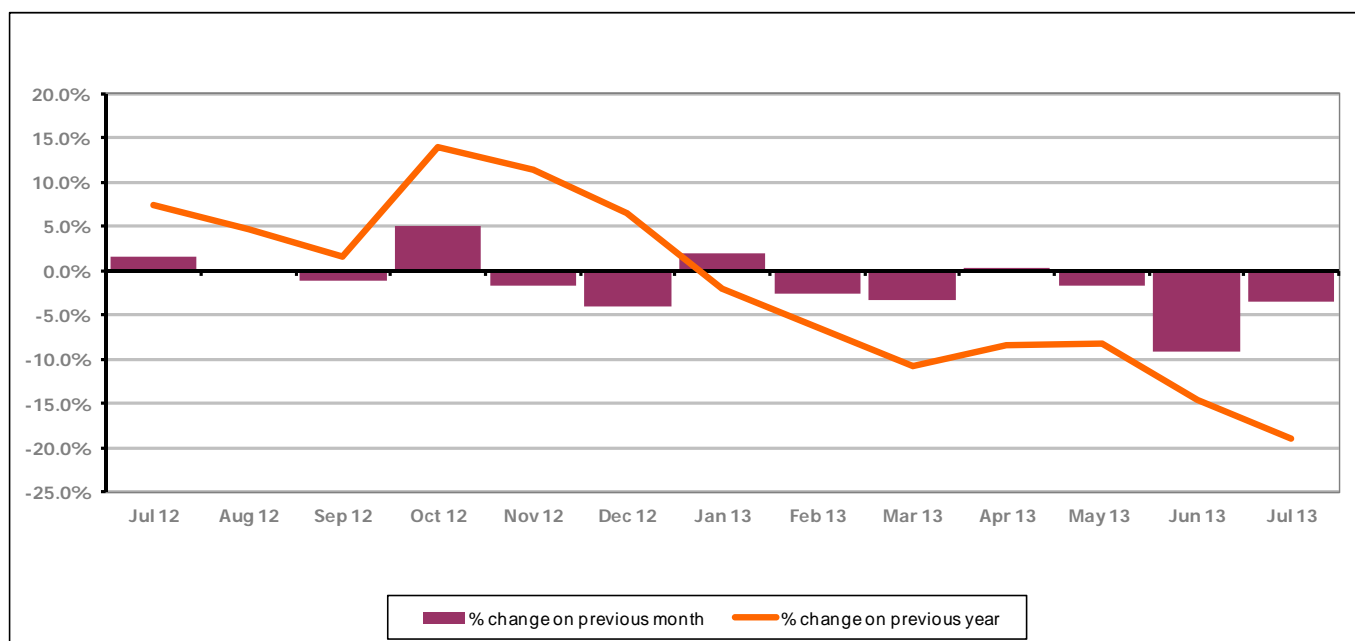
Figure 17: Stroud District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

Figure 18: Claimant rates across Stroud District wards - July 2013

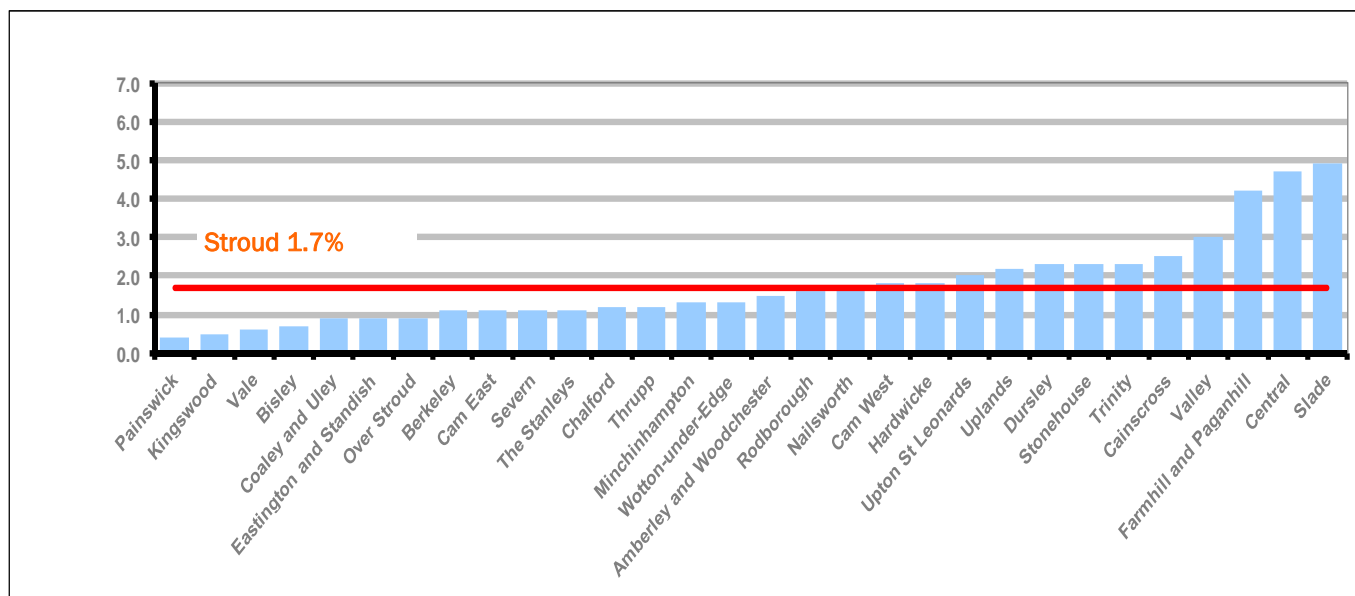
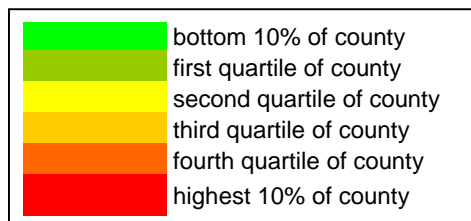

Figure 19: Tewkesbury District claimant rate over the last year

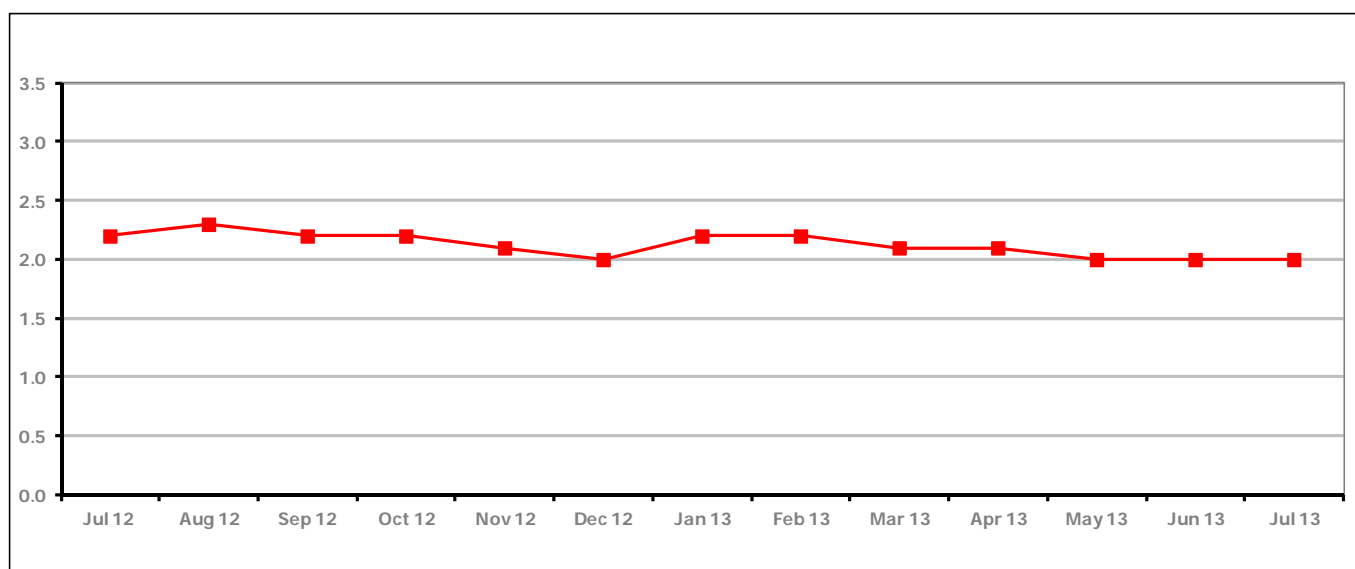

Figure 20: Tewkesbury District claimants - Month on Month and Year on Year change

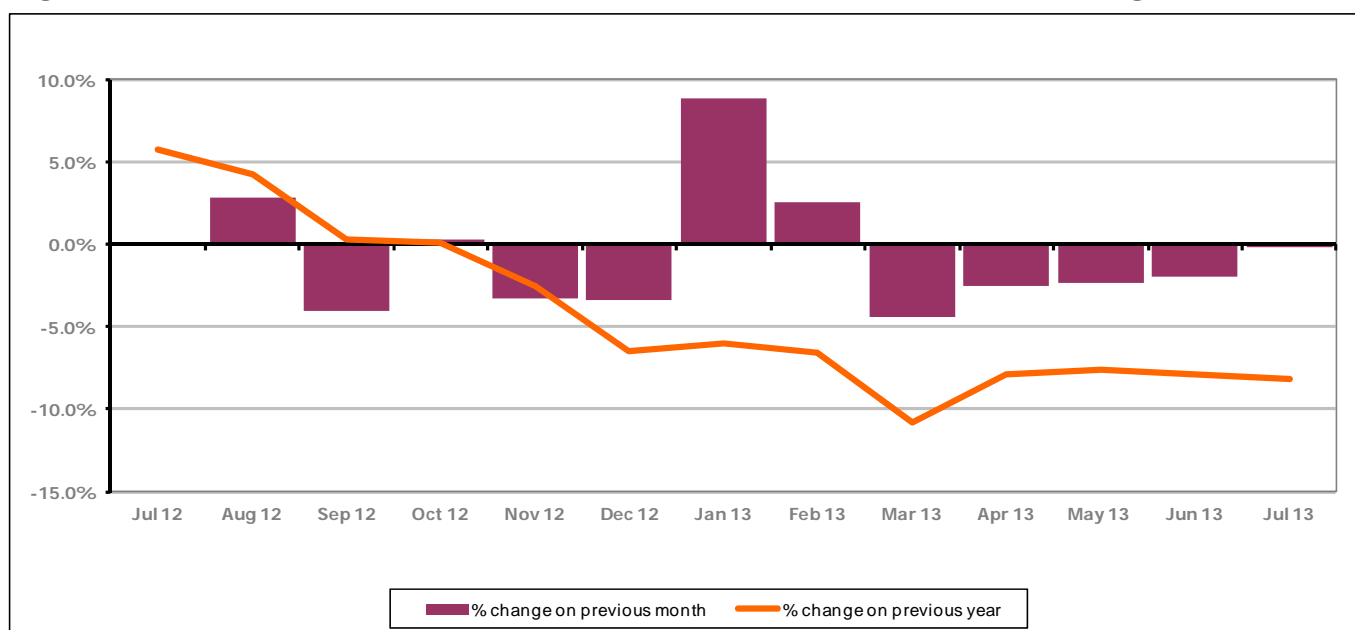

Figure 21: Claimant rates across Tewkesbury District wards - July 2013

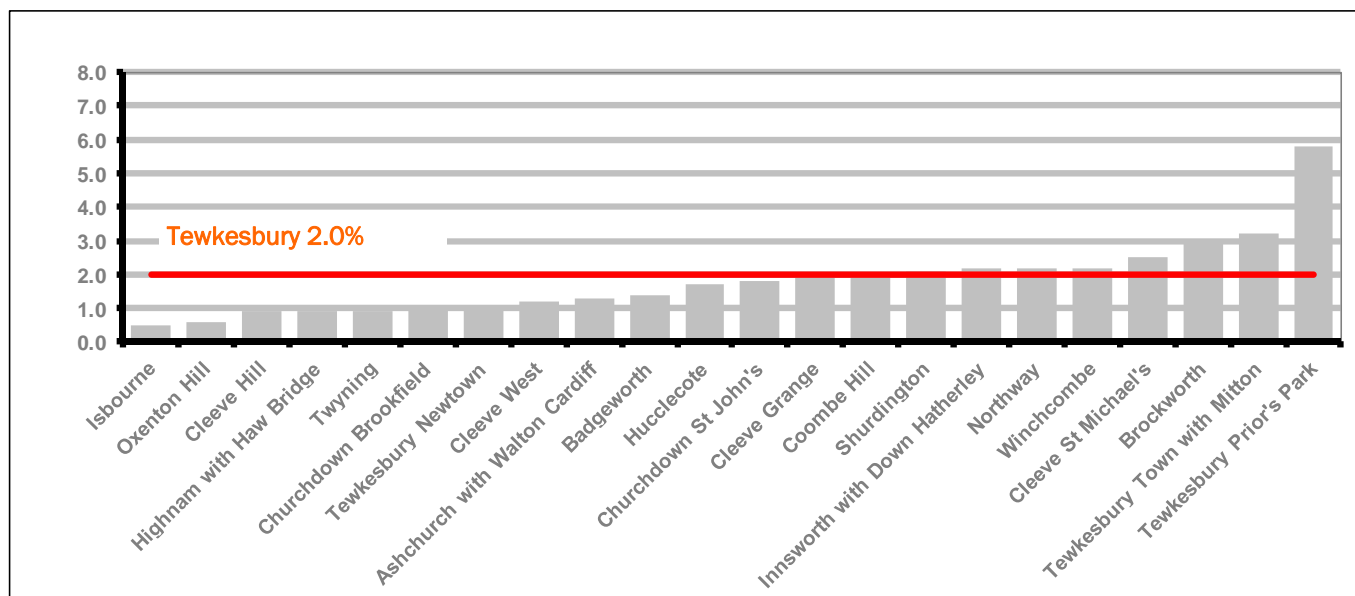
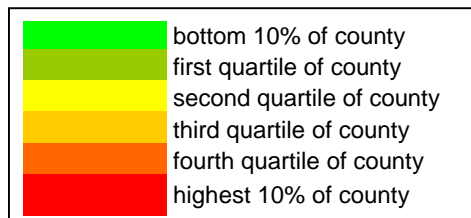

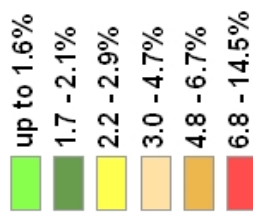

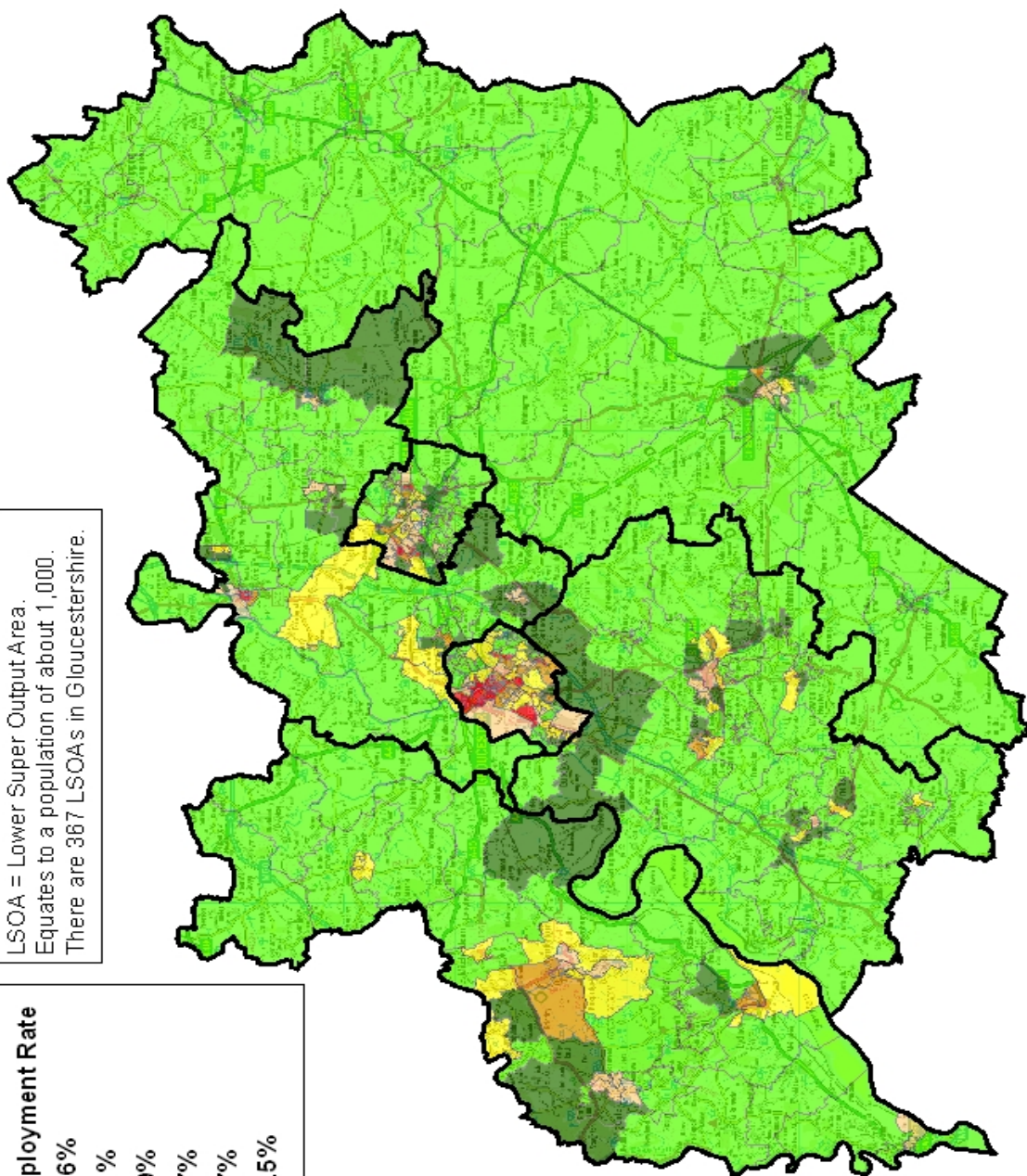

Claimant Unemployment Rate by LSOA in Gloucestershire July 2013

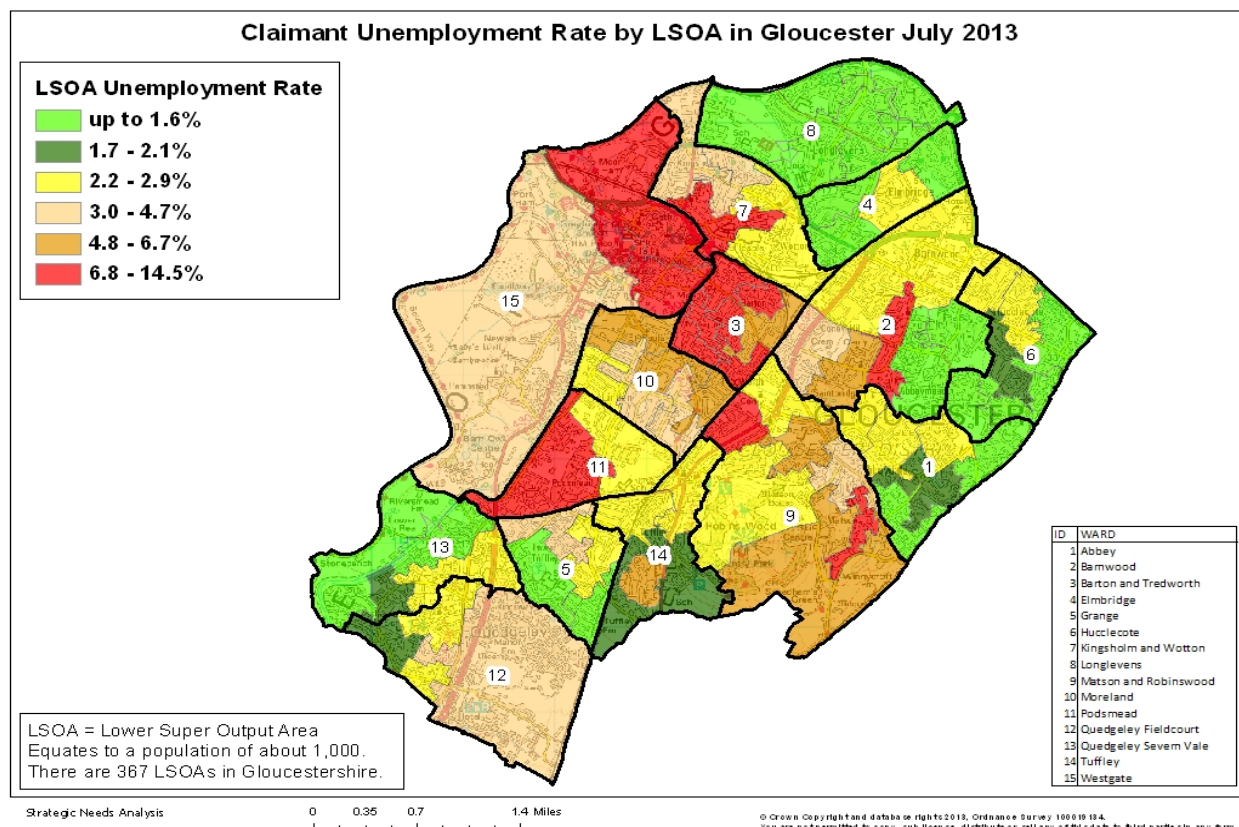
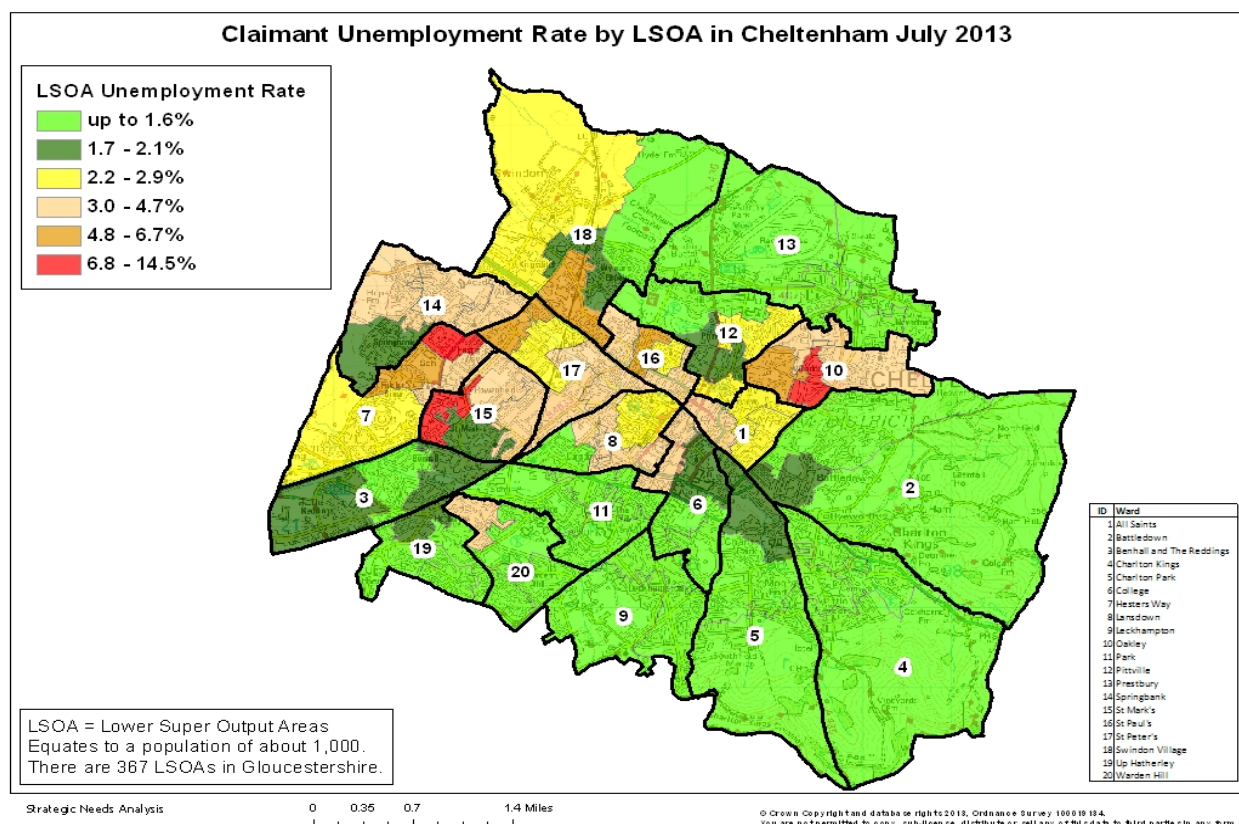

PART 6: YOUNG PEOPLE NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET) IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Data provided by Prospects, the Connexions service in Gloucestershire on the situation of young people (16-18) in Gloucestershire who are not in education, employment or formal training.

Connexions Gloucestershire is required to report performance with the 16-18 age range against nationally defined criteria for counting the NEET group. The NEET group includes young people actively seeking education, employment or training as well as those young people who are either not yet ready or who are unable to access these opportunities because of their personal circumstances. The figures quoted below include young people in both of these categories.

Summary

At the end of July 2013 there were 580 young people aged 16-18 not in education, employment or training in Gloucestershire and this figure translates into an adjusted (*) 16-18 NEET population of 4.5%. The total number of NEET decreased by 2 young people in July 2013 compared to June 2013. Three districts saw a increase in their NEET figures and three districts saw a decrease.
