



THE IMPACT OF TRAUMA ON SENSORY PROCESSING

Children who have experienced trauma in the early development stages of life may have missed out on key movement experiences. Therefore, this may lead to developmental delays in any of the seven senses but particularly the vestibular, proprioception and tactile systems. Furthermore, these are the building blocks of the central nervous system. Moreover, without a well developed central nervous system children find it harder to interact and understand the world around them.
